ries in the cities of this state ; ” the election officers of said city shall return to the canvassing board of the same a true and correct statement in writing under their hands the result of said election, the same to be entered at large upon the minutes of said body.

4. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect immediately.

CHAPTER CXVI.

An Act giving the right of suffrage to all persons, whether male or female, in any school meeting in any school district of the state.

1. BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey*, That every citizen of the United States of the age of twenty-one who shall have been a resident of this state for one year, and of the county in which he or she claims a vote for five months next before said meeting, shall have the right to vote at any school meeting in any school district of the state wherein they may reside; *provided*, that no person in the military, naval or marine service of the United States, by being stationed in any garrison, barrack or military or naval force or station within the state, and no pauper, idiot, insane person, or person convicted of a crime, which now excludes him or her from being a witness, unless pardoned or restored by law to the right of suffrage, shall enjoy the right to vote in any school meeting.
