

**DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS  
APRIL 2009**

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Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, Food Stamps, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance (GA) and Child Support and Paternity. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider.

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**WFNJ/TANF**

- At the end of April, the TANF caseload decreased by 1,182 cases, from 37,699 in April 2008 to 36,517 in April 2009, a 3.1% decline.
- The counties with the highest family caseload percentage increase since April 2008 include Hunterdon (40.0%), Warren (23.3%), and Sussex (22.3%).
- The counties that decreased the most since April 2008 were Passaic (-7.7 %), Hudson (-7.8%) and Union (-10.2 %)
- Of the WFNJ/TANF families, 9,908 or 27.1% were child-only cases in April 2009
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,655), Hudson (1,351), and Camden (1,139).
- Essex (19,955), Hudson (11,705), and Camden (9,697) counties have the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in April 2009.

**FOOD STAMP PROGRAM**

- April 2009 there are 240,355 households receiving food stamps. Food Stamp households increased by 31,038, or 14.8%, since April 2008.
- There were 489,806 persons receiving food stamps as of April 2009, an increase of 60,402 or 14.1 % since April 2008.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since April 2008 are Hunterdon (37.2%), Somerset (24.8%), and Sussex (23.7%)

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE**

- There were 5,009 families receiving emergency assistance (EA) in April 2009, an increase of 167 or 3.4% since April 2008.
- In April 2009, EA payments were made for 1,574 SSI recipients

**GENERAL ASSISTANCE**

**GA Emergency Assistance**

- There were 7,931 emergency assistance payments made to GA recipients in April 2009, an increase of 469 or 6.3% since April 2008.
- The three counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Cumberland (57.0%), Gloucester (44.4%), and Hunterdon (43.9%).

**GA Program**

- The total numbers of persons for GA has increased from 40,828 to 47,003 since April 2008, an increase of 15.1%.
- There were 29,555 Employable GA and 17,448 Unemployable GA recipients in April 2009.
- Essex (73.3%), Hunterdon (39.4%), and Sussex (27.7%) counties showed the highest percent increase for GA persons since April 2008.

**CHILD SUPPORT AND PATERNITY (Quarterly Report)**

- The total collection for the Child Support and Paternity Program was about 290 million dollars from October 2007 to September 2008, an increase of 7.7 percent over the same period for FFY 2007.
- Total distributions increased over 13 percent from September 2007.


**WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)**

- During the report month of April 2009, there were 3,798 families where at least one member is employed and an additional 512 families where WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment – related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active recipients were: Essex (909), Hudson (462), and Camden (318).
- There were 4,157 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.



**WFNJ/TANF Work Participation Rates




APRIL 2009 By County**








**Number WFNJ Families Receiving EA by County

**ACSES:** Automated Child Support Enforcement System

**CASS:** Consolidated Assistance and Support System

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA)** - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if the eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

**FOOD STAMP PROGRAM (FS)** - Authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

**FAMIS:** Family Assistance Management Information System

**GAAS:** General Assistance Automated System

**OMEGA:** Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

**SSI-EA:** Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

**WFNJ:** Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA establishes Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. The emphasis is on achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.

## **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

The Department of Human Services Division of Family Development provides basic income and an opportunity to achieve self-sufficiency for individuals and families served by the Division's programs. The Division provides leadership, direction and supervision to those public agencies responsible for administering those programs and plans for and develops policies to promote self-sufficiency.
