Nonfarm wage and salary employment in New Jersey dropped on a seasonally adjusted basis by 2,100 from October to a November level of 3,053,800. Over-the-month increases in services and construction could not offset further recession-related losses in manufacturing.

Since the July 1981 pre-recession peak, New Jersey has lost 68,500 factory jobs. Partially offsetting this decline in manufacturing have been gains of 38,500 jobs in nonmanufacturing, particularly in the service sector, which is up by 23,300 jobs. In total, nonfarm payroll employment in New Jersey has dropped by 30,000 jobs during this recession.

Jobholdings in manufacturing decreased for the third consecutive month to a seasonally adjusted November total of 707,900, which was the lowest factory employment level since July 1949. The loss of 4,200 jobs from October to November was primarily due to a number of scattered layoffs throughout manufacturing, especially in the durable goods sector. The largest decreases in durable goods were in fabricated metals; non-electrical machinery; primary metals; and transportation equipment, where layoffs were recorded at an automotive assembly plant. In nondurable goods, employment in chemicals and printing/publishing experienced the largest declines.

Nonmanufacturing employment rose by 2,100 jobs on a seasonally adjusted basis to 2,345,900 in November. Service employment, a mainstay of the nonfactory sector, reached another record high in November. Services increased by 1,900 from October to a seasonally adjusted level of 660,200. Construction rose by 1,300 jobs over the month to a seasonally adjusted total of 110,000, reflecting some hiring in the special building trades segment.

Wholesale and retail trade, down by 1,300 from October to a seasonally adjusted level of 693,900 in November, posted the largest nonfactory decline. Department stores and specialty retailers hired fewer people than in previous years and restaurant employment decreased more than seasonally expected.

The Department of Labor survey also revealed that the average production worker in New Jersey's manufacturing industries earned \$358.16 during the November survey week, \$5.20 more than in October. After seasonal adjustment, the average workweek rose slightly by 0.1 hours to 40.3 hours in November. This is the second monthly advance in the average workweek, and would have been greater but for a larger-than-seasonal decline in the transportation equipment industry, due to an automotive assembly plant lay-off.

LABOR AREA COMMENTS (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

Total nonagricultural wage and salary employment increased less than seasonally expected in November in 7 of the state's 10 major labor areas, while 3 areas decreased more than usual. The largest gain in jobholdings was recorded in the Paterson-Clifton-Passaic Labor Area, which rose by 1,600 over the month. Following closely were the New Brunswick-Perth Amboy-Sayreville and Camden Labor Areas, rising by 1,400 and 1,200, respectively. The largest decrease in November was registered in the Jersey City Labor Area, down by 1,400 jobs.

Since the pre-recession peak in July 1981, 9 areas have lost from 2,800 to 8,400 jobs, while only the Camden Labor Area, up by 100 jobholdings, posted an increment.

Seasonally Adjusted

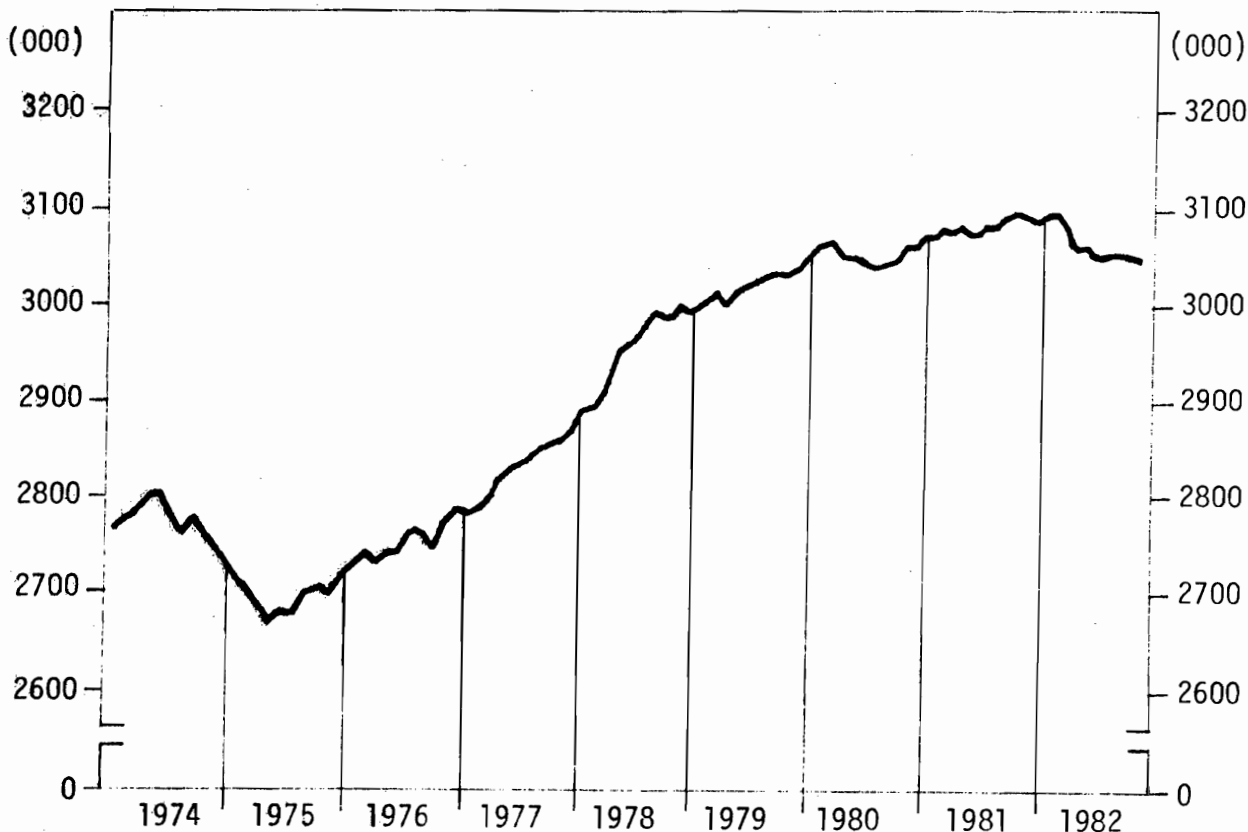

TECHNICAL NOTES

Nonfarm Wage and Salary Employment

Employment data refer to persons on establishment payrolls who received pay for any part of the pay period which includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude proprietors, the self-employed, unpaid family workers, farm workers, and domestic workers in households. Salaried officers of corporations are included. Government employment covers only civilian employees; federal military personnel are excluded.

Persons on an establishment payroll who are on paid sick leave (when pay is received directly from the firm), on paid holiday or paid vacation, or who work during any part of the pay period but are unemployed or on strike during the rest of the period, are counted as employed. Not counted as employed are persons who, during the pay period which includes the 12th, are laid off, on leave without pay or on strike for the entire period, or who are hired but do not work during the period.

Average Hours and Earnings

Hours and earnings data are derived from reports of payroll and man-hours for production and related workers in manufacturing. When the reported pay period exceeds one week, the payroll and man-hour figures are reduced to a weekly basis.

Average hourly earnings for manufacturing are on a "gross" basis, reflecting not only changes in basic hourly rates, but also such variable factors as premium pay for overtime and shift work, and changes in output of workers paid on an incentive plan. Excluded from average earnings are irregular bonuses, retroactive items, payments of various welfare benefits, and payroll taxes paid by employers.
