BY THE NUMBERS: SEASIDE HEIGHTS RECOVERY SINCE SANDY

\$45,573,155

Seaside Heights residents and businesses have received approximately ***\$45.5 million*** in payouts from the National Flood Insurance Program.

\$16,756,533

FEMA has obligated over ***\$16.7 million*** in federal funds through the Public Assistance program to Seaside Heights (and other municipal entities) for eligible debris removal, emergency services and rebuilding activities.

\$12,320,000

Seaside Heights residents have received approximately ***\$12.32 million*** in FEMA Individual Assistance, which includes repair costs, replacement costs, rental assistance and other needs assistance.

\$4,920,000

Seaside Heights has received ***\$4.92 million*** through the FEMA Community Disaster Loan (CDL) program and Seaside Heights School District received ***\$1.04 million*** through the program

\$2,450,000

The Federal Highway Administration has identified roadway projects in Seaside Heights worth approximately ***\$2.45 million***.

\$6,220,000

40 Seaside Heights homeowners signed RREM program grants totaling ***\$4.75 million***. Approximately 147 Seaside Heights residents received Resettlement grants totaling ***\$1.47 million***.

\$503,412

EDA Stronger NJ Business Grant has approved 13 grants to Seaside Heights businesses worth ***\$503,412***.
