ACTION ITEM:

A. RESOLUTION 2026-07-0074: APPROVAL TO AWARD A CONSTRUCTION CONTACT FOR DEMOLITION OF THE SPRINKLER PIPING IN THE A AND B BUILDINGS AT BROADWAY MARINE TERMINAL

REQUEST

Staff is requesting Board approval to award a construction contract for demolition of the sprinkler piping in the A and B Buildings at the Broadway Marine Terminal.

BACKGROUND

By Resolution Number 2017-3-0034, the Board awarded a sprinkler installation contract to the low bidder Harring Fire Protection for \$882,063. The systems were installed in Buildings A, A-2, B, B-2, and AB at the Broadway Marine Terminal.

The existing sprinkler piping from the A and B Buildings were not removed at that time due to a variance being obtained, and the difficulty of working around the tenant's manufacturing operation. However, in subsequent meetings with the NJ DCA Bureau of Fire Safety, they have requested that this piping be removed.

Therefore, we solicited competitive bids for the removal of the legacy sprinkler piping from the A and B Buildings. The RFQ was posted on the SJPC website and was also sent to 12 potentially interested firms. A Pre-Bid meeting was held on Thursday, June 18, 2026. Two firms attended. Two addenda were issued. Four bid packages were received on Friday July 10, 2026. Two of those bids failed to acknowledge the addenda and were disqualified. The two acceptable bids were as follows:

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff is therefore requesting Board approval to award a construction contract for demolition of sprinkler piping in the A and B Buildings at the Broadway Marine Terminal to Harring Fire Protection, Folsom, NJ, in the amount of \$ 340,200.

B. RESOLUTION 2026-07-0075: APPROVAL TO AWARD A SERVICES CONTRACT FOR ANNUAL FIRE SPRINKLER SYSTEMS AND FIRE EXTINGUISHER INSPECTIONS AT BALZANO AND BROADWAY MARINE TERMINALS

REQUEST

Staff is requesting Board approval to award a services contract for fire sprinkler systems and fire extinguishers inspections, preventative maintenance, and emergency repair services for one year with options to renew for up to two additional years at the Balzano and Broadway Marine Terminals.

BACKGROUND

Pursuant to Resolution 2026-06-0062: APPROVAL TO ISSUE A REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS FOR ANNUAL FIRE SPRINKLER SYSTEMS AND FIRE EXTINGUISHER INSPECTIONS, an RFP was prepared and posted on the SJPC website. In addition, it was sent to 12 potentially interested firms.

Bids were opening on Friday, July 10, 2026, with two bids received as follows:

Firm	Amount
Harring Fire Protection	\$115,891
Independence Fire Sprinkler	\$157,355

The term for the proposed services contract will be for a one-year duration with the option of two additional one-year extensions.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff requests Board approval to issue a services contract for fire sprinkler systems and fire extinguishers inspections, testing, preventative maintenance, and emergency response services for one year with options to renew for up to two additional years at the Balzano and Broadway Marine Terminals to Harring Fire Protection of Folsom, NJ, in the amount of \$ 115,891.

C. RESOLUTION 2026-07-0076: APPROVAL TO PURCHASE MODULAR RESTROOMS AT THE BROADWAY MARINE TERMINAL

REQUEST

Staff is requesting Board approval to award a purchase order for a modular restrooms structure to replace existing bathroom trailer at the Broadway Marine Terminal.

BACKGROUND

The existing men's / women's restrooms, located outdoor adjacent to the Y-2 warehouse, is severely deteriorated. Currently, the SJPC is placing temporary outdoor restroom units when a ship is in port. These restroom facilities are used by port field personnel as well as materials transport truckers. SJPC had prepared the design criteria and engaged the services of Boxx Modular, a manufacturer of modular buildings, for a pricing proposal and preliminary floor plan design for the Balzano Marine Terminal in 2022. Those design drawings and specifications will be used for the restrooms at the Broadway Terminal. The removal of the existing restrooms and installation of the new unit will be performed by SJPC staff.

We have received a quotation from Boxx Modular for this project through the Sourcewell National Cooperative Purchase contract #120822-BXX (SJPC member # 171928) in the amount of 101,944.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff is recommending Board approval to award a purchase order to Boxx Modular of Exton, PA for the modular restrooms trailer in the Lump Sum Bid Amount of 101,944.

D. RESOLUTION 2026-07-0077: APPROVAL TO ISSUE AN RFP TO PREQUALIFIED ELECTRICAL, CIVIL, AND GEOTECHNICAL ENGINEERING FIRMS FOR DESIGN OF ONE HIGH MAST LIGHT POLE AT THE BALZANO MARINE TERMINAL

REQUEST

Staff is requesting Board approval to issue an RFP to the prequalified list of Electrical, Civil, and Geotechnical Engineering Firms for the design of one high mast light pole with high efficiency LED luminaires.

BACKGROUND

The Balzano Marine Terminal is in need of additional site lighting to support current and future operations and to ensure a higher level of safety and efficient outdoor cargo handling. Installation of a new high mast lighting pole with high efficiency LED luminaires will provide additional uniform lighting in the area adjacent to Front Street for the expanded cargo storage.

This project is partially funded with a \$250,000 Community Project Funding grant from the USDOT MARAD Port Infrastructure Development Program.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff requests Board approval to authorize the issuance of a Request for Proposals to the prequalified list of Electrical, Civil, and Geotechnical Engineering Firms to provide these design services.

E. RESOLUTION 2026-07-0078: APPROVAL TO ISSUE AN RFP FOR DESIGN SERVICES TO DEMOLISH Y-2 BUILDING AND SITE WORK RESTORATION AT THE BROADWAY MARINE TERMINAL

REQUEST

Staff is requesting Board approval to issue an RFP to our list of pre-qualified civil engineering firms to perform design and construction phase services for the demolition of Y-2 Building and the site restoration at the Broadway Marine Terminal.

BACKGROUND

The existing Y-2 Building, constructed circa 1943, is a three-story steel and concrete warehouse with a leaking roof, nonfunctional elevators, an inoperable fire suppression system, and column spacing that limits cargo movement and storage. The scope of work includes demolishing the building, grading the site, and installing selective pavement suitable for outdoor cargo storage.

The design engineer will prepare two construction contracts, one for the building demolition and a second for the site plan restoration with selective pavement areas for cargo placement.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff requests Board approval to issue a Request For Proposals to our list of pre-qualified civil engineering firms to perform design and construction phase services for the demolition of the Y-2 Building and the site restoration and pavement at the Broadway Marine Terminal.

F. RESOLUTION 2026-07-0079: APPROVAL TO ISSUE AN INVITATION FOR BIDS FOR THE DEMOLITION OF BUILDING Y-2 AT BROADWAY MARINE TERMINAL

REQUEST

Pursuant to the Board's Authorization: RESOLUTION 2026-07-0078 APPROVAL OF DESIGN SERVICE TO DEMOLISH BUILDING Y-2 AND PREPARE AN OUTDOOR PORT YARD STORAGE AREA AT THE BROADWAY MARINE TERMINAL, Board approval is hereby requested to issue an IFB for public bids to perform construction services to demolish Building Y-2 at the Broadway Marine Terminal. A separate IFB to construct the site improvements for outdoor cargo storage will be advertised after the building demolition is complete.

BACKGROUND

Building Y-2 is a 40,000 square foot, three-story concrete and steel-framed warehouse built circa 1942 with exterior masonry and window walls that is in deteriorating condition. The roof leaks, the fire sprinkler system is nonfunctional and requires replacement, the elevators serving the upper floors are inoperable, and the column spacing limits efficient indoor cargo storage. Demolishing the Y-2 structure and converting the site to outdoor cargo storage was determined to be the most cost-effective solution. Should the market demand shift to indoor storage cargo in the future, the construction of a warehouse with little to no interior columns can be erected on the resulting open space.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff request Board approval to publicly advertise a construction contract for the demolition of the Y-2 Building at the Broadway Marine Terminal.

REQUEST

MATTERS INVOLVING LITIGATION, PERSONNEL MATTERS & SPECIAL MATTERS

The subject matter is covered by one or more of the following legal exemptions:

- Matters made confidential by state, federal law or rule by court.
- Disclosure would result in an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy, unless the person affected consents in writing.
- Disclosure would impair the body's right to receive federal or state funds.
- Collective bargaining.
- Lease or acquisition of property, setting of banking rates, investment of public funds if disclosure would harm the public interest.

- Personnel matters affecting employees of the public bodies, unless all parties request or consent to a public hearing. Prior to discussion of personnel, affected employees must be given notice, known as a Rice notice, which gives the employee the right to request a public hearing.
- Proceedings that could result in a suspension, civil penalty, or loss of a license or permit.
