NJ Guard supports Hurricane Katrina relief effort.

Under the Emergency Management Assistance Compact (EMAC), Lt. Gen. H. Steven Blum, Chief, National Guard Bureau, has authorized the National Guard in all 50 states and four territories to provide essential personnel and critical equipment support to the states affected by Hurricane Katrina through their respective state emergency management agencies. The NJ National Guard has answered that call and is ready to provide personnel, equipment and assistance to those areas affected.

Currently, the states impacted by this catastrophe are assessing their situation, identifying specific needs, and requesting appropriate equipment and personnel. Both New Jersey Army and Air National Guard assets have been mobilized and will be providing requested assistance.

The initial request for support centers on potable drinking water. Aircraft and personnel from the 108th Air Refueling Wing at McGuire Air Force Base and soldiers from the 250th Forward Support Battalion headquartered at Sea Girt are prepared to collect, package and deliver bottled water. Those citizens wishing to assist in this effort can bring only packaged bottled water in cases to the armory locations listed. Logistical restraints require that the bottled water be no smaller than case size. This can be done between 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. through Monday, September 5th. No other donations will be accepted at this time until we have further information on what the states need. For additional information, please contact 609-530-7010.

In addition to assisting the citizens of those devastated areas, the National Guard is a family that takes care of its own. Thousands of National Guard troops currently deployed to Southwest Asia in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom come from those states most severely affected by Hurricane Katrina. Their own homes and families were not immune to the destruction caused by the flooding and extremely high winds. We are equally committed to assisting our fellow citizen soldiers and the members of our extended Guard family.

Members of the New Jersey Army and Air National Guard attended Professional Development Training at the 34th Annual Conference of the Enlisted Association of the National Guard of the United States (EANGUS) in Orlando, Florida from 21-24 August 2005. Training was conducted by the Chief, National Guard Bureau, Army and Air National Guard Directors, the NGB CSM, Army National Guard CSM, Air National Guard CCM, and a special presentation by the Command Chief Master Sergeant of the Air Force. First-time attendees were TSgt Tammy Hickerson and SSgt Jeff Pilgrim from the New Jersey Air National Guard. Additionally, MSgt Don Newlin, 108th Air Refueling Wing, attended as a guest of EANGUS, and was recognized as the 2005 Air National Guard Base Honor Guard Program Manager of the Year.

Servicemember closes in on USAF Rifleman's Badge.

A New Jersey servicemember attended the National Rifle Championship at Camp Perry, Ohio, on August 1-7. Senior Master Sergeant Joseph Burkel, a Chief Radio Operator with the 227th Special Operations Flight, is ten points closer to earning his USAF Distinguished Rifleman's Badge as a result of his participation. Burkel has been a member of the 108th Marksmanship Team since May 2001, and has been with the 108th since 1985. During the Excellence in Competition Match, he shot his way into the top 10% of 1,222 competitors, earning 10 points. In accordance with AFI 34-227, a total of thirty points are needed to earn the USAF Distinguished Rifleman's Badge. Currently, less than 300 Air Force personnel have achieved this mark since 1947. Burkel also placed high enough in the Springfield and Garand Matches to be awarded Gold and Bronze medals respectively.

Gifts from the Homefront. The "Gifts from the Homefront" program was begun last year by the Army and Air Force and enables people from all walks of life to rally around America's troops by purchasing gift certificates designed to lift the morale of deployed troops around the world. The certificates, which can be purchased by any individual or civic organization, allow service members to purchase items of necessity and convenience at PX and BX facilities around the world. "Gifts from the Homefront" certificates can be addressed to "any service member" or individual service members. Because the gift certificates can be used for merchandise already stocked at contingency locations, "Gifts from the Homefront" are a safe alternative to traditional care packages that can strain the military mail system and present force protection issues. Those wishing to send a "Gift from the Homefront" can simply log on to the AAFES website, www.aafes.com, or call 877-770-4438 toll-free to buy gift certificates in \$10 or \$20 denominations. From there, the "Gift from the Homefront" may be sent to an individual service member designated by the purchaser or distributed to "any service member" through the USO, American Red Cross, Air Force Aid Society, or Fisher House.

Operation Mail call is a program initiated by New Jersey Assemblymen Jack Conners and Herb Conaway that enables citizens to donate postage stamps for use by our troops and their families. Over 30,000 stamps have been donated to our National Guard soldiers and airmen and Family Readiness Programs. Fat “Burning” Foods

I was asked if there are certain foods that can actually help the body utilize fat for energy. It is important to note that a nutrition program that is varied and balanced across the three macro-nutrients (protein, carbohydrates, and fats) will ensure your body is the healthiest it possibly can be and any excess weight will come off as a result of healthy eating habits and sensible exercise routines.

The foods that have been suggested to be more beneficial for fat burning are as follows, however, this is by no means an exhaustive list. These foods may only encourage weight loss when used within a well-balanced diet.

Fruit: Apples, Bananas, Lemons, Oranges, Grapes, Leeks, Melons, Grapefruit, Pears, and Pineapple.

Vegetables: Broccoli, Cabbage, Cauliflower, Celery, Lettuce, Root Vegetables, and Peppers.

Grains: Whole meal bread, Wholegrain Pastas, Brown or Japanese Rice, and Air Popped Corn.

Protein Sources: Soya Beans, Low fat Soymilk, Mushrooms, Eggs, Low fat lean beef, fresh fish, fresh tuna, and lean chicken.

The right fats, consumed in small quantities have the effect of slowing the digestion of carbs and protein, thus causing the body to expend more energy in the process of digestion.

Polyunsaturated Oils: Cottonseed oil, Nut Oils, Safflower Oil, Soya Oil, and Sunflower Oil.

Foods High in Omega-3 Fatty Acid: Bass, Herring, Cod, Oysters, and Sardines.

The foods contained in the above fat-burning foods list, when put together, form solid grounding for a fat-burning diet – and the best thing about these foods is that they are all in plentiful supply and are not expensive.
