### **College and Career Readiness**

This school outperforms 37% of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile ranking and 58% of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile ranking in the performance area of College and Career Readiness. Additionally, this school is meeting 0% of its performance targets in the area of College and Career Readiness.








### **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**






### **Proficiency Trends - Math**









This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.






### **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**















This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.






### **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**















This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.






## **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**















This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.




**Total School Enrollment Trends**




## **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**















This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.






## **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**





















Among the behaviors that research has shown to be indicative of success and college and career readiness are regularly attending school and challenging themselves with rigorous course work. First, the table presents the percentage of students, as measured against the school's enrollment in seventh and eighth grade, who were reported via NJSMART as being enrolled in Algebra I. The table also presents the percentage of students who were chronically absent during the prior school year. A chronically absent student is a student who was not present for any reason for more than 10% of the total days possible for that individual student.

The first column - Schoolwide Performance - represents the outcomes for these particular indicators in this school. The second column - Peer School Percentile Rank - indicates how the school's performance compares to its group of peer schools. For example, a school whose peer school rank is 65 in Algebra I Enrollment has a higher Algebra I Enrollment than 65% of its peer group. The third column - Statewide Percentile Rank - indicates how the school's performance compares to schools across the state. The fourth column - Statewide Target - provides the statewide targets for each of these indicators. The last column - Met Target? - indicates whether the School Performance met or exceeded the statewide target.

The Summary row presents the averages of the peer school percentile ranks, the average of statewide percentile ranks and the percentage of statewide targets met.


