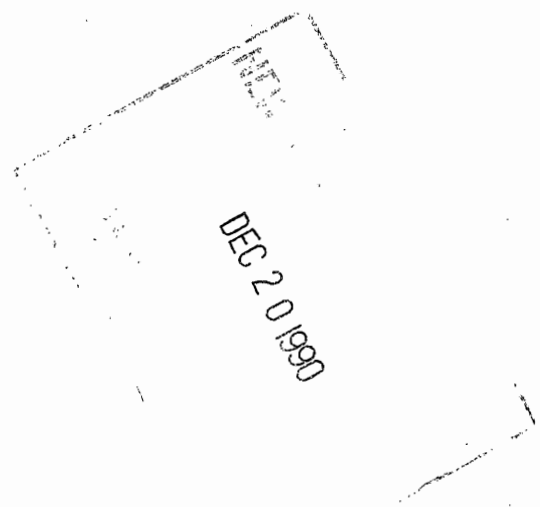

INTRODUCTION

This report has been developed to provide information regarding the Average Daily Population (ADP) in each Correctional Complex, Major Institution and Satellite Housing Unit under the jurisdiction of the Department of Corrections during Fiscal Year 1990 (July 1, 1989 to June 30, 1990). In addition, Average Daily Population (ADP) and end-of-month counts are reported for the Community and Residential Juvenile Programs.

The Prison Complex includes New Jersey, East Jersey, Bayside and Northern State Prisons and Mid-State, Southern, Riverfront and the Edna Mahan Correctional Facilities and the Adult Diagnostic and Treatment Center.

The Youth Correctional Complex consists of Garden State Reception and Youth Correctional Facility, Albert C. Wagner Correctional Facility and Mountainview Youth Correctional Facility.

The Juvenile Facilities include New Jersey Training School for Boys, Lloyd McCorkle Training School for Boys and Girls and Juvenile Medium Security Facility.

The Average Daily Population for each major institution reported in Table I includes the number of inmates housed at the main institution plus those inmates who are assigned to each of the respective satellite units and prefabricated modular units, where applicable. Average Daily Population counts for each of the individual housing units are reported in Tables II through V.

NOTES ON FISCAL 1986 - 1990 TRENDS.

During Fiscal Year 1990 there was an Average Daily Population of 20,716 offenders in the Department of Corrections, 11,430 of whom were housed in State Prison Facilities while 3859 were housed in Youth Correctional Facilities and 729 were housed in Juvenile Facilities. Three hundred forty-one were housed in Halfway Houses, 714 in Community and Residential Programs and 3625 were housed in County Facilities.

From Fiscal 1989 to Fiscal 1990 the ADP for the Department as a whole increased 12% from 18,538 to 20,716 offenders. The ADP during Fiscal 1990 was greater than the peak populations experienced in 1985 through 1989. The following are the changes within the various correctional complexes or facilities:

- The County Waiting list increased 32% from 2259 to 2983.
- The State Prison Complex count increased 11% from 10,280 to 11,430.
- The Youth Correctional Complex count increased 6% from 3655 to 3859.
- The Juvenile Facilities population increased from 725 to 729, with virtually no change.
- The Community Residential Juvenile Programs increased 8% from 679 to 732.

The continued increase in adult institutional population resulted from ongoing impact of Title 2C and legislative enhancements to the Criminal Code. There also was an increase in the total number of juvenile offenders assigned to the department. (Juvenile Facilities plus Community and Residential Programs.) The average daily population of Juveniles went up from 1404 in Fiscal 1989 to 1461 in Fiscal 1990, an increase of 4%. Since 1986, there has been a 27% increase in Juveniles (1146 to 1461).

PRISON COMPLEX AVERAGE DAILY POPULATION

New Jersey State Prison (main and satellites) had an average daily population of 2411 residents during Fiscal 1990 which represented 21% of those offenders housed in all prison facilities. New Jersey Main had an average daily population count of 2014 with West Trenton minimum security satellite accounting for an additional 208 daily residents. The maximum security Vroom Readjustment Unit maintained an average population of 135 during the 1990 Fiscal Year. The Central Medical Unit had an average daily count of 54 offenders.

Of the 11,430 average daily offenders housed in State Prison Facilities during the year, 2123 or 19% were resident at East Jersey State Prison. The main institution had an average population of 1876 with minimum security units averaging an additional 247.

Bayside State Prison accounted for approximately 16% of the residents housed in the Prison Complex with an average count of 1795. Bayside Main (medium unit) maintained an average population of 957 while the minimum security satellite units housed an additional 751 residents on a daily basis. An average of 87 inmates were housed at the new Bayside Reception Unit. Capacity in the reception facility is approximately 150. The lower figure here is a factor of being operational for only part of the year.

The average population for Mid-State Correctional Facility during Fiscal 1990 represented approximately 5% of those offenders housed in all prison facilities with an average daily population of 538.

The average daily population for Southern Correctional Facility was 1302 or 11% of those offenders housed in Prison Facilities.

Riverfront Correctional Facility accounted for 5% of the daily residents housed in the Prison Complex with an average daily count of 602.

Northern State Prison accounted for 12% of the daily residents housed in the Prison Complex with an average daily count of 1367.

The average daily population for the Adult Diagnostic and Treatment Center was 574 or 5% of those housed in Prison Facilities.

The Edna Mahan Correctional Facility accounted for approximately 6% of the residents in the Prison Complex, with an average count of 718. Of the 718 residents, 39 were male offenders and 679 were female offenders.

There was an average count of 3859 offenders resident in the Youth Correctional Facilities during the 1990 Fiscal Year. Thirty-one percent or 1190 inmates were resident in the Garden State Reception and Youth Correctional Facility, of which 1118 were in the main institution and 72 were in minimum custody satellite units.

Albert C. Wagner Youth Correctional Facility maintained an Average Daily Population of 1289 which represented 33% of the residents housed in youth facilities. One thousand one hundred fifty residents were housed in the medium facility at the main institution with the remaining 139 residents housed in minimum security satellite units at New Lisbon and North Princeton Developmental Center (NPDC).

Mountainview Youth Correctional Facility accounted for approximately 36% of the total offenders housed in youth facilities, with an average daily population of 1380 inmates. Mountainview Main averaged a resident count of 1119 while the institution's satellite units accounted for an additional 261 daily residents.

NOTES ON FISCAL 1990 AVERAGE DAILY POPULATION

A/ Residents include offenders in the institution and on furlough on the last day of the report period. For the Prison Complex and Youth Complex, number on furlough is included in the total complex counts and not in the counts for separate units.

Also note that, for this report, offender counts are based on physical location and not on correctional jurisdiction (e.g., prison offenders housed in Youth Correctional Facilities are included in Youth Correctional Counts).

B/ MEDIUM/MAXIMUM UNITS: Footnote "B" identifies units providing medium or maximum custody. The count provided includes all offenders resident in units which primarily house offenders requiring more than minimum custody. Thus these counts are not a count of offender custody status but are a count of the total number of offenders resident in designated units.
