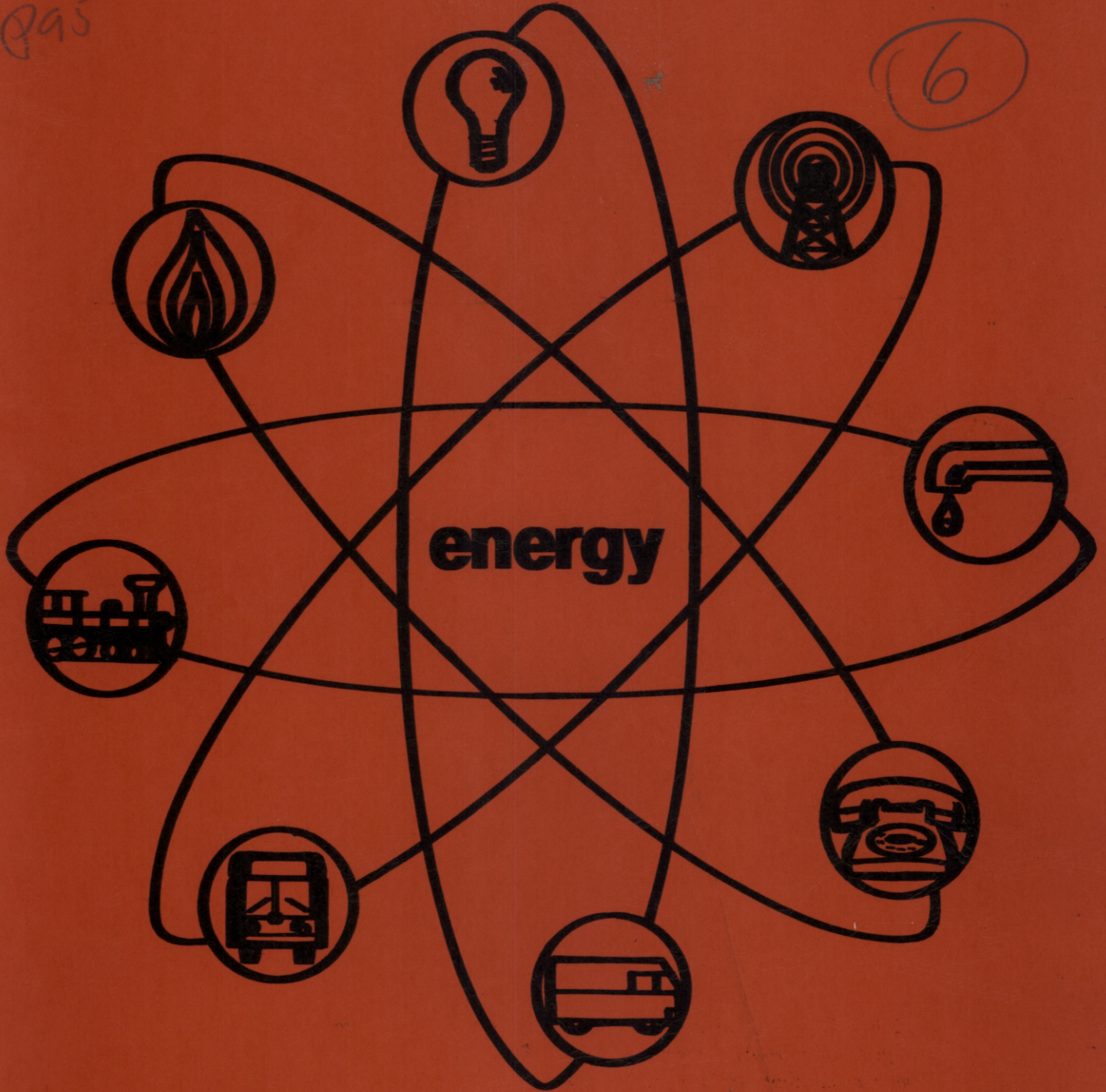

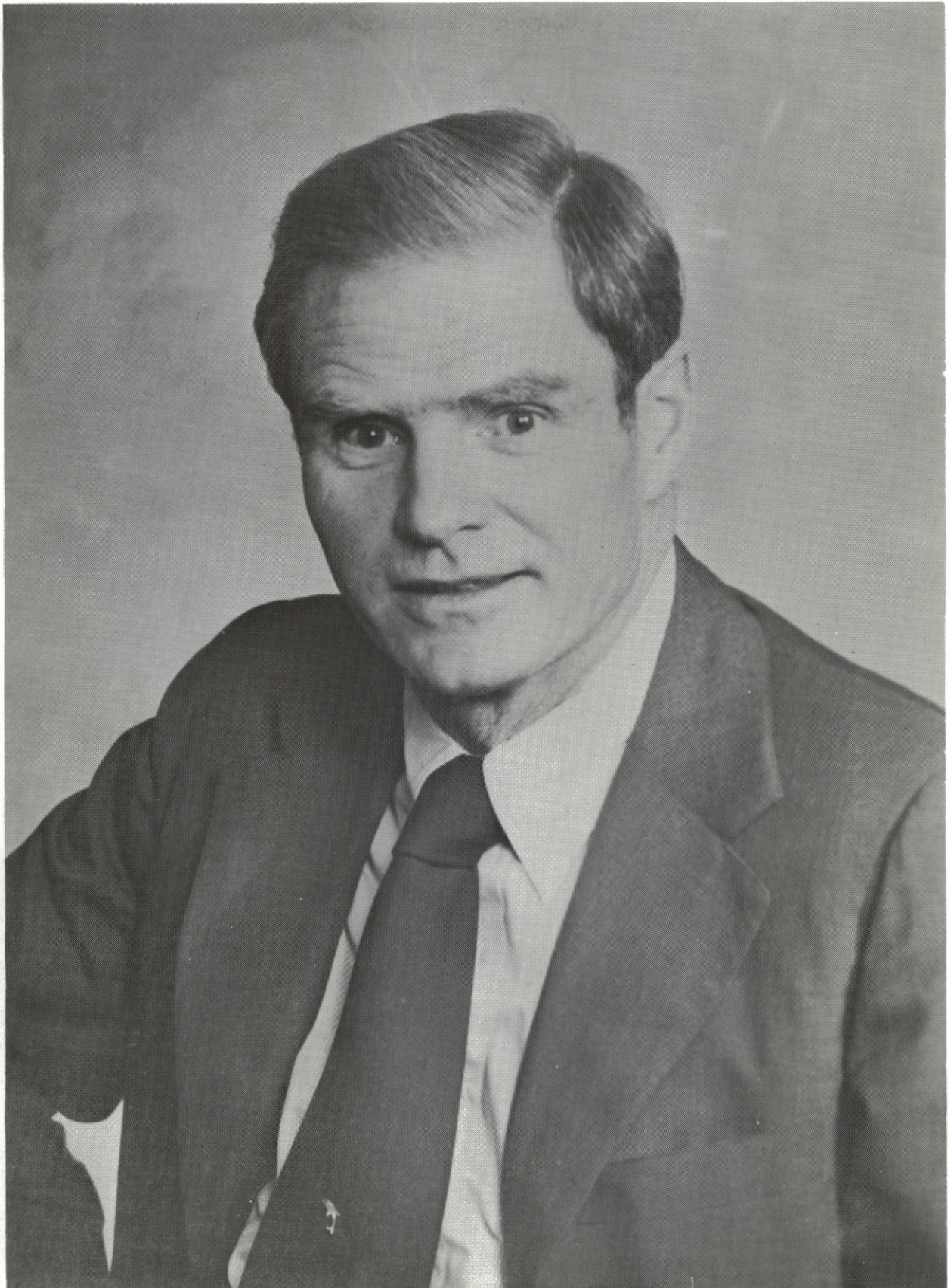

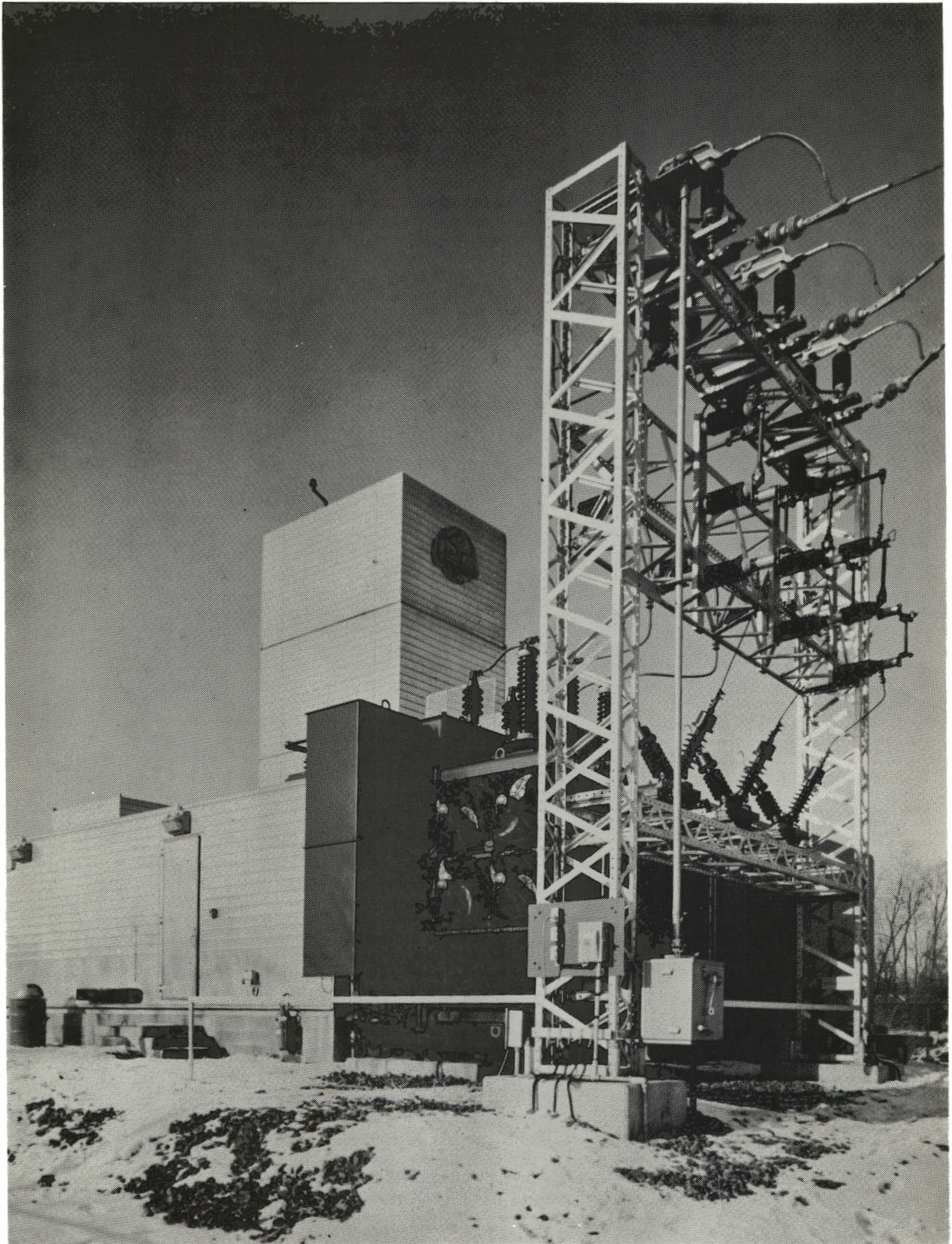

## I. INTRODUCTION

“Children in winter clothing huddle in the classroom—their gloved hands raised in response to a teacher’s question . . . gas turbines built to generate electricity for hours of peak demand go unused . . . a glass factory shuts its doors and lays off 800 workers . . . a new hospital never opens . . . New Jersey—the entire northeast—does not have enough (energy) to meet its needs”.

This accurate prediction of America in 1973 was made in the Annual Report of the New Jersey Board of Public Utility Commissioners . . . in 1970! If some of the blame for the current energy crisis is placed on government agencies who could not foresee shortages of essential fuels, the New Jersey PUC must declare its innocence.

To simply say that you are aware of a pending crisis, however, is not enough. Plans must be drawn and actions must be taken in the face of these predictions to insure that the citizens to whom the government agency is responsible are protected from harm and that the state in which the agency has jurisdiction is able to continue its economic growth. Thus, the Board of Public Utility Commissioners, faced with the prospects of an energy crisis in the immediate future, began to take steps to meet the crisis head on.

Through its own efforts, and through the efforts of its staff, the Board determined the methods by which the utilities under its jurisdiction could meet the demands of New Jersey’s rapid growth while at the same time insuring that reasonable rates would be charged for continued good service. This was achieved through closely monitored plant expansion and improvement. Of course, any new construction must be paid for, so the Board ordered rate increases to finance the projects. The increases, however, were kept at a minimum and were aimed strictly at financing the needed plant.

This document is more than just the annual report of a state agency. Rather, it is the story of how a group of dedicated men and women work to insure that the citizens of New Jersey receive the vital services which they require and are protected from the inconvenience, hardship, and danger of one of the most serious problems facing modern man.

## II. THE PUC AND THE ENERGY CRISIS

Just as the 1960's gave us phrases like "the media is the message" and "radical chic", 1973 will go down in history as the year which was responsible for putting the phrase "energy crisis" in everyone's vocabulary.

Responsible for the regulation of electric and gas utilities—two of our nation's biggest sources of energy—the PUC soon found itself squarely in the middle of the crisis. Since the major factor which brought about the crisis was a shortage of oil, the PUC was put in a position in which it had to play a key role in the state's efforts to relieve the situation for its citizens without having any jurisdiction over the flow of the fuel which was causing the problems or any controls over the corporations which refined it. (Ed. note: Toward the end of 1973, Assemblyman Kenneth Gewertz (D-Gloucester) introduced legislation which would give the PUC jurisdiction over New Jersey's oil refineries with respect to supply and prices.)

Each division of the PUC played its part in the overall effort. Since time and space prevent us from going into great detail on the jobs each individual performed, we can only present a summary of the work done.

### THE ENGINEERING DIVISION

Because of its responsibility to supervise the service provided by public utilities, and because of the knowledge and expertise of its staff in the area of energy planning, the Engineering Division and its Bureau of Energy Resources bore the brunt of the work done by the PUC during the energy crisis.

The Division, under the directorship of Robert G. Peschel, and the Bureau, with Joseph W. Ferraro, Sr. in charge, compiled statistics on gas and electric being supplied by the New Jersey utilities and monitored their supplies. Reports were prepared for the State Legislature and Governor William T. Cahill on both the short-term and long-term capabilities of the state's electric and gas utilities. These reports proved valuable to the legislature and the authorities created by the Governor to guide the state through the crisis. Special attention was given to the electric utilities during the critical summer months when it appeared that a demand for electricity to run air conditioners and other appliances would outstrip the utilities' capacity to generate the power. Similarly, a close eye was kept on the gas utilities during the winter months—their critical period—to insure that the shortage of natural gas would not cause an interruption of service to any customers.

In addition, staff members participated in the analysis of the nuclear power requirements of New Jersey and in matters relating to the siting of proposed nuclear plants in the state. Nuclear Engineer Charles Sheppa, a member of the Bureau of Energy Resources, worked directly with the state Office of Petroleum Allocation for three months late in the year in establishing procedures and organizing a staff for implementing the Federal Mandatory Middle Distillate Petroleum Allocation Program. During this time, Sheppa served as the Assistant State Fuel Allocation Officer.

The Engineering Division also aided the Board in putting pressure on the Federal Power Commission to gain favorable action on two proposals to bring additional supplies of natural gas into the state. As a result, the FPC approved both proposals. One permitted the Elizabethtown Gas Com-

pany to transmit via pipeline a large quantity of natural gas which one of its subsidiaries had discovered in Louisiana and Texas. The action allowed Elizabethtown Gas to lift its restriction on sales to new gas customers on a limited basis. The second action permitted the Public Service Electric and Gas Company and a Boston gas utility to purchase over 4 trillion cubic feet of natural gas from the Algerian government and transport it by ship to the United States. In a related matter, members of the engineering staff served on the Liquid Natural Gas Task Force created by the Governor to investigate and report on the matter of the safety of the transmission, handling, and storage of liquefied natural gas in New Jersey.

In all, over 1600 man hours were spent researching matters dealing with load requirements and fuel supplies.

## **DIVISION OF COMMON CARRIERS**

Because of the severe gasoline shortage which occurred at the end of 1973, the Division of Common Carriers found itself in the difficult position of regulating an industry which was being crippled by the high price and short supply of the fuel which is its lifeblood. The Division had to insure that the buses, trains, moving vans, limousines, and solid waste collection vehicles (garbage trucks) in New Jersey were supplied with enough gasoline to keep rolling and thus provide continued safe, adequate, and proper service. Although some bus operators, solid waste collectors, and movers

saw their gasoline supplies dwindle to a precious few gallons, the Division is proud of the fact that not once did the Board have to approve a curtailment of service because of a lack of fuel. This was accomplished through both fuel conservation by drivers and operators and requests by the Division for emergency fuel supplies through the State Office of Fuel Allocation.

While the Division was battling this problem, it also had to deal with the sudden need for the improvement and greater availability of mass transit in New Jersey. Thousands of Garden State residents—unable to purchase gasoline for their private cars—turned to mass transit as an immediate answer to the question of how to get to work. Previously underused mass transit systems were suddenly operating at full capacity while normally popular systems were experiencing overflows. Ridership on the Penn Central and Jersey Central commuter rail lines increased by up to 10%. Popular commuter bus lines, such as Transport of New Jersey, experienced similar increases.

In order to meet the new demand, the Board approved the addition of extra passenger cars on the railroads and, where fuel shortages allowed, the addition of extra buses on heavily-travelled commuter routes during peak hours. Staff studies were also made on the feasibility of re-arranging bus schedules so as to provide more buses during peak commuter hours while cutting back on off-hour runs, thus increasing each line's average of passenger-miles-per-gallon. In addition, the Board also is exploring the possibility of permitting interstate buses to pick-up and discharge passengers on an intrastate basis. The Interstate Commerce Commission has placed the implementation of this proposal in the hands of the Board, which is currently seeking to establish intrastate service on interstate runs in areas not already served by local routes.

## DIVISION OF RATES AND ACCOUNTS

The energy crisis—and the subsequent skyrocketing cost of oil—played havoc with New Jersey's electric utilities and its customers. The fuel adjustment clause, which permits electric utilities to pass the cost of the fuel it uses to generate electricity to its customers, soared at an uncontrollable rate. Despite the fact that many people cut back drastically on their usage, electric bills continued to rise because of rapidly increasing oil prices. Had not the State Department of Environmental Protection decided to temporarily lift its ban on the burning of high sulfur fuel oil and coal, the utilities—and the consumer— would have been in even more dire financial shape.

Because of the automatic "pass through" nature of this clause, the Division of Rates and Accounts and the Board was not in a position to do anything about the steadily-mounting increases. The problem was compounded when it became obvious that electric conservation measures practiced by consumers would cause a drop in a utility's anticipated revenues. This factor has been cited by one large electric utility in a petition for a rate increase which is currently pending and is expected to be repeated by others in future rate cases.

The Rates Bureau, under Anthony J. Zarillo, is now being assigned the responsibility for all rate increase requests dealing with the 1,500 refuse collectors and landfill operators in the state. Since the Bureau presently handles requests for fare increases on all non-subsidized New Jersey bus lines, the Bureau is being placed in the position of having to make key decisions as to what effect the increasing cost of gasoline and diesel fuel will have on the prices which the consumer pays for solid waste collection and mass transportation.

### III. THE BOARD'S OTHER MAJOR ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF 1973

**HOLDING THE LINE ON INFLATION:** While the Board did grant several rate increases during the year, it kept in mind the current economic situation. All the increases granted to utilities covered such items as increased operating and labor costs, proposed construction programs, or improvement of service. Inflationary increases and rates of return were rejected by the Board.

**FULL TIME STATUS:** A legislative measure signed by Governor Cahill in the latter part of 1973 requires that all Board members serve full-time after January 1, 1974. The new law also provides for commensurate increases in salary for the previously part-time Board.

**ISSUED FIRST GRANDFATHER\* CERTIFICATE FOR CATV FIRM:** In October, 1973, the Board issued the Atlantic Coast Cable Television Corporation its first so-called "grandfather" certificate for operation under the Cable Television Act. Since then, dozens of other "grandfather" certificates have been issued by the Office of Cable Television under the direction of John P. Cleary.

**ASSUMED JURISDICTION FOR REGULATING CHARTER BUS OPERATIONS:** On June 7, 1973, the Board took jurisdiction over all charter bus and special bus operations in New Jersey. "Grandfather" certificates are in the process of being issued to all charter and special bus operators in the state.

**FACED PROBLEMS OF SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL:** The Board is confronted with a number of problems in the area of solid waste. These include the right of out-of-state solid waste collectors to use New Jersey landfill sites, the dwindling number of available dumping areas, and environmental considerations such as recycling and pollution. The Board is encouraging utilities to study the possibilities of using processed solid waste as a fuel.

**CONDUCTED WALKING INSPECTION OF RAILROAD TRACKS:** The Board, at the request of Governor Cahill, conducted a complete inspection of the almost 1,000 miles of passenger railroad track in New Jersey. The Board hired two outside consulting firms to walk every mile of the track and report its findings to the PUC. The Board then evaluated these findings and issued appropriate recommendations to the railroads on track improvement.

**PIONEERED THE COMPREHENSIVE ADJUSTMENT CLAUSE FOR TELEPHONE COMPANIES<sup>o</sup>:** New Jersey became the first state in the nation to adopt a comprehensive adjustment clause for the New Jersey Bell Telephone Company. This clause allows the company to pass along a portion of its uncontrollable costs in several categories to the consumer without being forced to go through lengthy and expensive hearings in which the costs referred to above would have to be granted.

**RESOLVED A RECORD NUMBER OF CONSUMER PROBLEMS:** The Board's Service Inspection Bureau, which acts much like an ombudsman between consumers and utilities, resolved some 8,750 complaints during 1973, almost 2,000 more than the previous year. Most of the complaints involve high bills, service problems, and the like. The Board feels it is important to maintain this contact with the public.

## IV. SIGNIFICANT ACHIEVEMENTS OF THE PUC'S DIVISIONS

### ENGINEERING

During 1973, members of the Division participated in formal hearings as staff members or hearing examiners and prepared drafts of orders in connection with these hearings, and other formal matters assigned to the Division. These matters included eminent domain proceedings, approvals of municipal consents, orders to show cause with respect to the rendering of safe, adequate, and proper service, approvals of the sale or lease of property by utilities, promulgation of new regulations, the granting of certificates of convenience and necessity for the construction of utility facilities, etc.

Investigative matters involved field inspections to determine the adequacy of utility facilities; testing programs, including gas pipeline tests, testing of the accuracy of gas, electric, and water meters and the review of reports on utility meter testing programs; service interruptions and accidents which were reported to the Division during the year and reviewed and investigated by staff members; and construction program reports involving the review of data filed by utilities. Staff members conducted 304 field inspections during the year.

Research matters involved studies on future load requirements and fuel availability.

In 1973 the Board's rules and regulations covering electrical inspection authorities became effective and since April 12, 1973, approximately 120 individual applications for electrical inspector licenses and 17 applications for electrical inspection authority certificates have been processed. A total of 7 electrical inspector license examinations have been administered. The Board's regulation of this industry will prohibit the creation of monopolies and help to ensure timely inspections of electrical inspection work.

Also, in 1973 regulations were formulated for utilities delivering oil in pipes through the streets to individual residential customers. Public hearings prior to the adoption of these regulations will be held in 1974.

Engineering Division personnel were also involved in the writing of gas safety regulations during the year and, as a result of the investigation of seven explosions, an amendment to N.J.S.A. 2A:170-69.4 was proposed to require that contractors notify the gas company before digging on private property so that the company may notify the contractors on the location of its lines.

### DIVISION OF COMMON CARRIERS

The Board created the Division of Common Carriers in May of 1972, as a result of restructuring, to include the former Division of Motor Carriers, Division of Railroads, and the Division of Movers and Refuse. The latter came into existence in May of 1970 at the time of enactment of the Solid Waste Utility Control Act and its personnel included inspectors whose duties related directly to the regulation of public movers. Thus, the Division now is composed of two Bureaus. The Bureau of Rail and Motor Carriers and the Bureau of Movers and Refuse.

The past year has seen the Division make every effort, with the manpower and staff available, to regulate the utilities and public movers in a manner which recognizes the public awareness of the impact of recommended actions on the safety, adequacy and cost of service. Governmental units

(municipalities, counties, state agencies and authorities) were apprised of all actions affecting their interests and these agencies were afforded every opportunity to express their views, comments and suggestions to better regulate the utilities under the Division's auspices.

This Division has achieved stability in the rates charged for solid waste collection and disposal services; stressed the filing by utilities of necessary information and documents to complete all applications for Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity in order to properly process same; encouraged utilities to give primary concern to maintain regular service without interruption; and responded to public needs by taking appropriate action on complaints as to service and rates.

A number of meetings were held with the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP), Bureau of Solid Waste Management, and the Hackensack Meadowlands Development Commission (HMDC) to discuss mutual problems on out-of-state solid waste disposal, coordination or activities between agencies, and discussions on enforcement and compliance with the Solid Waste Utility Control Act and the Solid Waste Management Act. A joint coordinated approach resulted from our mutual consideration of these problems.

There are more than 2500 miles of main and secondary track in the State of New Jersey, of which approximately 940 miles are used for the operation of both freight and passenger trains. Because of the high incidence of recent train derailments, the Board ordered an immediate, detailed inspection of the tracks used in passenger service. It retained the services of two consultant engineering firms and, utilizing personnel temporarily assigned to the Board for the purpose, supervised the walking inspection of all the tracks in the state used in passenger train operations. The inspection began in July and was completed in October. The results may be summarized as follows:

Additional inspections of freight and passenger tracks by Board inspectors totaled 133 miles. In all, 1,073 miles of track were inspected during the year.

As a result of this activity, numerous unsafe track conditions were identified and corrected, and others are programmed for correction in the railroads' regular maintenance programs.

In addition, the Board issued a Show Cause Order to the Erie Lackawanna railroad initiating an investigation into complaints of noise pollution of the environment in several communities.

Chapter 158, Laws of 1973 approved on June 7, 1973, brought all charter or special bus operations under the Board's control. The law provided a "Grandfather" clause which gave bona fide operators as of that date a six month period to file applications with the Board. Within the time limit, three hundred eighty-nine applications were received.

During the 1973 year, the Motor Carrier staff enforced the requirements as set forth by the Department of Environmental Protection for exhaust emissions of diesel engines. Using smoke opacity meters, 10,877 exhaust emissions were checked and 431 buses were rejected and removed from service until minor repairs were made. Ninety-six were entirely removed from service. This is part of a continuing program.

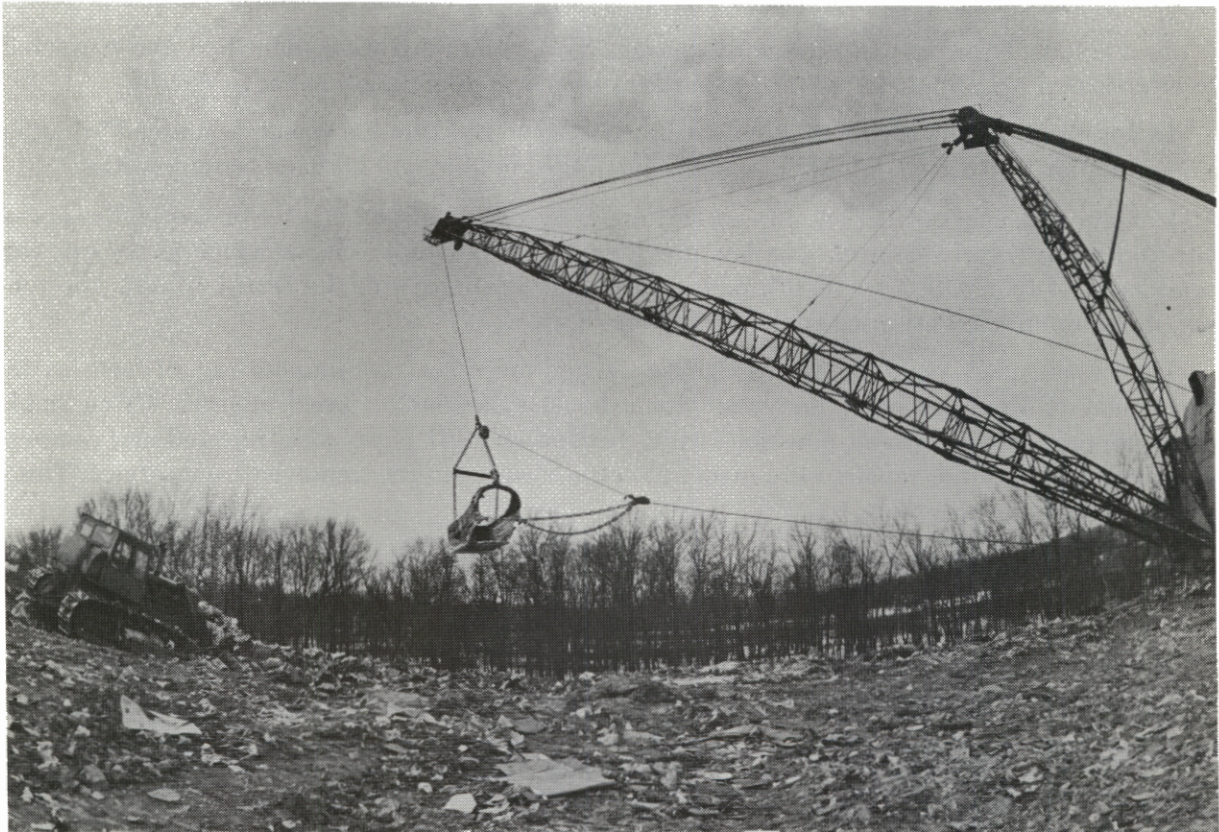
The financial condition of bus transportation in New Jersey is further deteriorating due to loss of riders, increased operating costs due to inflation, and inability to purchase modern equipment. Twenty-two bus operations are now subsidized, in part, by the Department of Transportation in the State's effort to insure that basic transportation is supplied in those areas where service is needed but volume riding will not completely support the operation.

Initially this year, the Bureau of Movers and Refuse issued decals for each vehicle registered by public movers. The decals are renewable each year together with the Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity. Early in the year an intensive three-day surveillance was instituted at the end of each month to locate public movers operating without a certificate. Surveillance proved to be effective and the Bureau proposes to continue this practice by utilizing all available enforcement field personnel.

The year saw 509 permanent certificates being issued to solid waste collectors. Field inspectors are being used to assist in clearing the backlog of pending applications for certificates.

New applications for Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity for Solid Waste Collection are being processed administratively and hearings will be held when deemed necessary.

Staff members participated in meetings with the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP), Hackensack Meadowlands Development Commission (HMDC), and the Solid Waste Advisory Council (SWAC). The Bureau staff also assisted Rutgers University students in a study of the solid waste industry and its attendant problems.

The Bureau had available a part time Deputy Attorney General to assist in handling the backlog of cases regarding alleged illegal operations, hearings on new applications and other formal matters.

Two solid waste collection utilities were ordered to roll back unauthorized increases in rates and to refund the excess collected to customers. Another case involving a landfill is pending.

During the year, Orders to Show Cause were issued to three landfill operators who failed to obtain necessary DEP registration. Upon conclusion of public hearings, one operator was ordered to close and decisions are still pending on two operators as of the end of the year.

The Bureau filed a complaint in District Court against a landfill operator who operated without authorization. The operator was found guilty and a fine totalling \$500 was collected and forwarded to the State Treasurer.

Orders to Show Cause were issued to four landfill operators for alleged violations of law and the Board's Rules and Regulations. Public hearings were held. In one case, the Board ordered the operator to be penalized by a fine of \$50,000 and a three-year prison term. Copies of the orders were forwarded to the Attorney General requesting prosecution in all cases.

### DIVISION OF RATES AND ACCOUNTS

The year 1973 found no relief in the workload of the Bureau of Rates. As the national economy remains in the grip of the worst inflationary spiral since the 1940's, higher prices or charges for utility services are constantly being requested. Although some economists are predicting an easing off of the inflationary spiral in the latter half of 1974, all indications are that this Bureau will be processing at least as many requests for rate relief as were handled in prior years.

During the past year the Bureau processed 762 formal cases involving 183 days of hearing. In addition to the responsibility of processing rate cases, the Bureau was involved in an investigation of a cost of service study for New Jersey Bell Telephone; the purchased gas adjustment clauses of our gas utilities; the implementation of a comprehensive adjustment clause for the telephone industry; the rate effect and the economic impact of elimination of the lower rate blocks for large volume electric users due to the energy crisis; review of tariffs for the implementation of charter and special bus operations; participation in the promulgation of rules and regulations and appropriate tariffs regarding the recently enacted law providing for reimbursement of school fares to bus utilities; and the review and comments on any proposed legislation which would affect the Board's regulatory powers.

The cost of service study is still in the hearing stage while the gas adjustment clause is presently being reviewed and considered by the Board. A major precedent-setting decision rendered by the Board involved approval of a comprehensive adjustment clause on an experimental basis for the New Jersey Bell Telephone Company. The clause is designed to save money for phone customers by reducing costly rate case proceedings while at the same time allowing the company to recoup any losses sustained as a result of rising expenses.

New Jersey is the first state in the nation to adopt such a clause for a telephone company. The Board indicated that the customer will ultimately benefit from this plan because timely smaller increments are more economical than future major increases and will eliminate many costly rate proceedings for which he now pays.

The plan allows New Jersey Bell's rate to fluctuate within a limited range of its present level. Fluctuations, which will be calculated on an annual basis, will be based on the cost incurred by the company under four categories: (1) salaries, wages, and fringe benefits; (2) depreciation expenses; (3) taxes; and (4) other expenses. According to the plan, New Jersey Bell will be allowed to adjust its rates, subject to close review by the Board, each January based on its actual changes in expenses for the preceding year subject to certain restraints. For example, the adjustment clause is going into effect in January, 1974, for the calendar year 1974, based on expenses incurred by the phone company between September 30, 1972, and September 30, 1973. One of the restrictions

included in the plan is the rate of return allowed in the most recent case involving the utility. At no time will the plan allow a rate of return to exceed that found by the Board in its last order.

The plan will only involve New Jersey Bell. New Jersey's independent telephone companies chose not to participate in this case. The Board stated that the other telephone companies in their next rate cases may provide testimony and exhibits so that the appropriate yardsticks may be developed for an adjustment to their rates based upon changes in the four major categories of expenses for an appropriate twelve month period.

It should be noted that rate counsel appealed the Board's decision in this matter to the Superior Court of New Jersey and requested a stay of the increased rate. The request for a stay was denied by the Court and briefs and answering briefs are to be filed by the parties. The Court has indicated that upon receipt of the briefs it will schedule this matter for oral argument at the earliest possible date.

The unprecedented number of requests for rate relief, coupled with other formal and informal filings, complaints and inquiries leaves very little time for research. Even more important than the lack of research in the area of rate regulation, other duties and responsibilities have been severely curtailed.

The continuing surveillance of all utilities' earnings, accomplished through the annual rate of return analysis, was not implemented in the past year. While this was one major area of yearly responsibility, the present case load requires that we curtail or eliminate certain areas of responsi-

bility to adequately handle the current work. Very little, if anything, substantive has been developed by the staff in other areas of rate regulation. At a time when rate requests have become common and more complex, research has been limited, if not eliminated. The recently-added responsibility of handling the refuse and landfill rate cases and related matters will require staff introduction and orientation to a new utility industry, as well as research into the nature of its operation, the establishment of benchmarks relating to the reasonableness of the level of operating expenses, investment in facilities, and the capital used to finance these facilities. All of the foregoing requires dedication of both time and staff. Under current conditions this will be very difficult, if not impossible.

The preceding year saw the promulgation of the Uniform System of Accounts for the accounting regulation of the solid waste industry, and establishment of financial standards for this industry through the Board's decisions and orders. During 1973 the Bureau of Accounts felt the full impact of the increase in the Board's jurisdiction, from approximately 700 to approximately 2,700 public utilities, particularly due to the regulation of the solid waste industry. This 300% increase in regulated utilities and businesses means that the Bureau of Accounts now has three times the amount of annual reports to be examined; preliminary rate of return studies to be made; assessments to be calculated and processed; and formal docketed matters relating to financial transactions, stock transfers, consolidations, mergers, and sales of assets to be investigated and processed.

Another major accomplishment of the Bureau during 1973 was the implementation of L. 1972 c. 210 which provided for reimbursement to autobus companies of up to 1/3 of the difference between their adult fare and student fare. In accordance with the Act, members of the Bureau staff are making field examinations of the books and records of the bus utilities claiming reimbursement. This is to assure that the proper certification of the reimbursement requested by the bus companies complies with the intent of the law. The Legislature appropriated \$950,000 during 1973 for this reimbursement.

Members of the Bureau of Accounts are currently promulgating a Uniform System of Accounts for the cable television industry. New Jersey is one of the first states to regulate CATV. Considerable time was devoted by members of the Accounting Bureau in conferences and research regarding accounting and financing matters pertaining to this newly regulated industry.

During 1973 members of the Bureau staff cooperated with auditors of the Federal Power Commission in conducting compliance audits of the books and records of Rockland Electric Company and Public Service Electric and Gas Company. These audits take approximately four months and are an excellent example of Federal and State cooperation which should inure to the benefit of the people of New Jersey.

The issuance of securities by the electric, gas, telephone and major water companies serving New Jersey remained at record levels last year due to large construction programs necessary to provide consumers with adequate and sufficient utility service while keeping within prescribed environmental guidelines. The following table indicates the magnitude of the financing petitions processed by this Bureau and approved by the Board:

In addition, the Bureau processed various financial petitions of the solid waste industry amounting to another \$18,438,000 during 1973.

## OFFICE OF CABLE TELEVISION

The Office of Cable Television was created by legislation approved on December 15, 1972 as an independent entity. On April 23, 1973, the Office promulgated rules and regulations governing the operation of CATV systems in New Jersey. During the past year, the Office issued the first of many Certificates of Approval under the so-called "grandfather clause" of the statute, which permits the certification of systems in operation prior to the Office's creation. Present construction by these systems, located in all areas of the state, is being monitored on a regular basis in order to ascertain that proper equipment is being utilized and a designated schedule is being followed.

The staff has been involved in the investigation of consumer complaints regarding signal quality, interference, etc. The engineering staff has examined and evaluated design specifications and plans of CATV systems to assure adequate service, and has also reviewed system extension programs and examined system performance testing reports.

A Uniform System of Accounts is being set up for cable television. Accountants and engineers have been studying the rate structures of CATV systems in order to ascertain that rates are non-discriminatory and that the rate of return is within acceptable limits. Two rate changes were approved during the past year. Hearing examiners have heard matters ranging from transfers of stock to rate changes caused by technological progress in CATV.

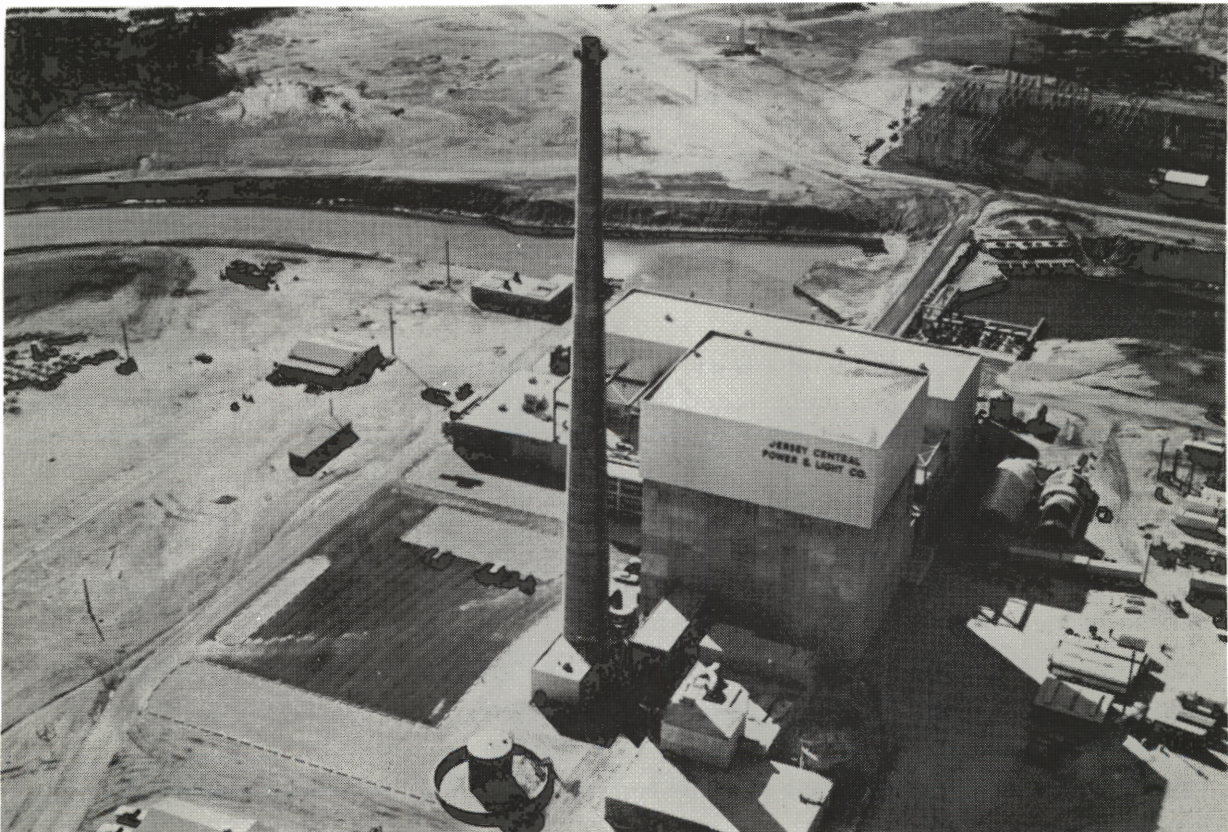
The office staff has answered informal complaints and requests for information. Professional staff has been required to do continuing research in the technical and financial aspects of cable television, and to be present as staff members of hearings. Additional personnel which have been promised for 1974 will serve to greatly ease the Office's current backlog of cases.

## V. PROJECTIONS FOR 1974

“The future isn't what it used to be”

Arthur C. Clarke

Energy experts have made it clear to us that we will be facing shortages in oil, gasoline, and other fuels in the years to come. The Board is thus faced with the responsibility of continuing the efforts it began this past year to insure that New Jersey's utilities are supplied with enough fuel to provide continuing safe, adequate, and proper service at reasonable rates. The Board will be carefully monitoring the various indicators to anticipate shortages and lessen their effects. This will also require an effort on the part of the utilities to keep abreast of trends and patterns and to avoid getting caught in a fuel squeeze. Self-sufficiency in the area of energy production appears to be the answer but, unfortunately, this country seems to be quite some time away from achieving that goal. For now, we must insure that utilities are permitted to construct the plant needed to keep up with rising customer demands. Environmentalists must modify their positions somewhat if this nation is to continue to prosper and the economy is allowed to grow. The Board will be directly involved with business, environmental, and governmental agencies in reaching a fair balance between

industrial growth and conservation of our natural resources. At the same time, the Board will also be involved in insuring that utility rates do not skyrocket out of sight as a result of the needed expansion and improvement.

The Divisions and Bureaus within the PUC also face many challenges in the future. Rates Bureau Chief Anthony J. Zarillo views his staff's challenge this way:

“All of the complexities normally associated with those of rate regulation, coupled with our spiraling inflationary economy, efforts to conserve energy and protection of the environment, will require a new look into some of the techniques and principles generally accepted as utility rate dogma. This research will be necessary if regulation is to remain an effective vehicle in providing to the public quality service at the most reasonable level of rates. Unless some of the budgetary restraints are liberalized the responsibility of adequately serving the public in the area of rate regulation will be greatly hampered.”

For the Division of Common Carriers, the approach in the future will follow closely the goals accomplished during this period with every effort being made to get necessary appropriations to expand its force of inspectors (Motor Carriers, Railroads, Movers and refuse), clerical and professional personnel; establish programs which will intensify compliance, enforcement and administration of the appropriate statutes, reduce the backlog of formal matters pending and permit the promulgation and revision of rules, regulations and Administrative Orders in order to regulate each segment efficiently and with dispatch.

The Division proposes to continue to work with other agencies and the regulated industries to foster a cooperative approach in serving the public interest; expand its staff to meet all added responsibilities, improve the work capabilities of its staff and complete the processing of pending applications for the issuance of Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity for public movers, solid waste collectors, solid waste landfills, new bus routes, and charter and special bus service.

This will assist in the elimination of delays being experienced at this time by utilities filing petitions for rate relief, route changes, transfers of Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity, and complaints between utilities as to operating practices which may not be in the best interest of good utility service to the public.

During 1974, considerable emphasis will be directed by the Bureau of Rail and Motor Carriers to the inspection of rolling equipment started the latter part of 1973. It is felt this area merits special consideration in view of the ever increasing breakdowns and recent accidents involving piggy-back cars.

In addition the Bureau expects to expand railroad track inspections to include those in freight service. These inspections were started late last year but did not progress very far because of the Bureau's limited force. The authorization of additional personnel currently being processed should furnish the needed manpower to complete this program.

The Engineering Division recognizes that it will be given great responsibility in the area of energy planning. However, it realizes that other major utility problems still exist in New Jersey and must be dealt with in addition to the energy situation.

In the area of water supply, one problem continues to exist which leads to the expenditure of a disproportionate amount of time by Division personnel in investigating service deficiencies. Experience proves that many small water systems cannot finance the treatment plants necessary to provide proper service. Yet many water utilities are created by municipal mandate when a developer

seeks municipal permission to construct new homes. The water systems thus created become utilities after-the-fact and their failure becomes a problem for the Board to deal with.

Legislation is required to prevent the establishment of such economically and environmentally unsound systems.

With respect to the underground electric and telephone construction Regulations 14:435 and 14:439, which were issued to guide the electric utilities in arriving at proper cost differentials between overhead and underground construction, our experience has shown that merely setting criteria is not enough. The tariffs subsequently filed by various utilities were too complicated, contained too many variables, and were not comparably consistent. Developers and ultimate home owners, who paid the cost differential, were not provided with practical working formulae as to what the cost per house would be for underground construction. Developers, faced with this uncertainty in costs, deluged the Board with requests for exemptions from the underground construction requirements. The Board then revised the regulations and established a simple and uniform tariff, which properly reflected the additional costs for undergrounding. Accordingly, and contrary to precedents, the Board directed the utilities as to how and what it could charge the customers for the cost differential in providing underground service in lieu of the traditional overhead service.

The Board anticipates the challenge of the future and is prepared to meet it.
