Regulations Governing the Sale and Distribution  
of Strawberry Plants in New Jersey

The fact has been determined by the New Jersey State Board of Agriculture that the so-called "Red Stele" disease of the strawberry constitutes a menace to the strawberry industry of New Jersey.

Now, Therefore, we the New Jersey State Board of Agriculture, under authority conferred by the Revised Statutes of New Jersey, for the purpose of preventing the further introduction and spread of this disease within the state, do hereby forbid the shipment into the State of New Jersey from any outside point or from point to point within the state of all varieties of strawberry plants except under and in compliance with the following regulations.

Regulation 1

Strawberry plants may be brought into the State of New Jersey or moved from point to point within the state only after they have been inspected by an official state inspector of the state in which they were grown, and found to be free from the so-called Red Stele disease (*Phytophthora* sp.), also known as Red Core, Brown Stele or Brown Core.

Regulation 2

All shipments of strawberry plants must have attached hereto a copy of a special certificate issued by the proper state official of the state of origin, attesting that the plants contained in the shipment were inspected by an official state inspector and found to be free of the Red Stele disease. The State Department of Agriculture reserves the right to return to the point of origin any strawberry plants received in the State of New Jersey without such a certificate.
