Purpose:

To assist state institutions to develop new library services programs or to expand and/or enhance existing library services programs which will provide library services to persons in New Jersey State institutions who are without public library services and/ or who do not receive the full benefits of library service due to disadvantages related to institutionalization.

Eligible Applicants:

All state institutions operated by or substantially supported by state funds that provide or plan to provide library services as defined in the federal Library Services and Construction Act (PL 101-254, sec. 3(9) and in the New Jersey Administrative Code (N.J.A.C. 6:68.7.1-2).

Eligible Projects:

Institutional library services programs, eligible for funding under this grant, must provide adult and/or juvenile non-fiction and fiction materials and services similar to those provided by public libraries.

Public Library Literacy Programs continued

Purpose: To strengthen local public library services, resources and programs

to meet the literacy needs of adults, young adults and families in the library's community by developing new programs or by

strengthening existing programs.

Eligible Applicants: New Jersey public libraries are eligible to respond to this RFP,

individually or in groups, except for the public libraries located in Belleville, Camden City, East Orange, Elizabeth, Newark and

Old Bridge, who received grants in FY 1995.

Eligible Projects The intent of literacy projects funded by this program is to ex-

pand efforts in the community to break the cycle of illiteracy. Public libraries may offer programs for literacy instruction of fam-

ily literacy.

LIBRARY SERVICES TO SPECIAL POPULATIONS

Amount Available: \$100,000 Maximum Grant: \$10,000

DEADLINE: JUNE 4, 1996

Purpose: To assist public libraries in developing a new service or expand-

ing and/or enhancing library and information services to a targeted special population which is unserved or inadequately served and/or which does not receive the full benefits of library service due to disadvantages related to handicaps, age, lack of education, limited English-speaking ability, economic deprivation or other

factors.

Eligible Applicants: All New Jersey public libraries are eligible to respond to this RFP,

individually or in groups.

Eligible Projects: Projects must assist public libraries to develop a new service or

expand and/or enhance an existing library and information service for **one** targeted population within their library community. Projects eligible for funding under this grant **must** provide services to one of the following targeted special populations: persons with visual handicaps, at-risk children and young adults, persons with limited reading ability, unemployed persons, and persons for whom English is a second language.

TO REACH THE NEW JERSEY STATE LIBRARY

To reach the State Library via the New Jersey Turnpike:

Take NJ Turnpike to Exit 7A. Take Route 195 West to Rt. 129. Follow signs for Route 29 North. Take Route 29 north to the Calhoun Street exit. Exit Right. At first light, turn right on West State Street. The New Jersey State Library will be on your right at 185 West State Street.

From the North:

Enter Trenton on Route 1. Stay on Route 1 to the last New Jersey exit, immediately before the toll bridge to PA.

Exit right to New Warren Street. Turn right onto New Warren to first light (Market Street) where you turn left; this will take you to Route 29 North. Go one exit to Calhoun Street and then follow the directions above.

From the South

Enter Trenton on Route 206 or Rt. 295. Follow signs for Rt. 129, Trenton. Follow directions to Route 29 and the State Library above.

From the East:

Take I-195 West to Rt. 129. Follow directions above under NJ Turnpike.


Take Route 33 to Trenton. When Route 33 becomes Nottingham Way, watch for Olden Avenue. Turn right on Olden Avenue to Route 1. Turn left to Route 1 South and follow the directions above.


Parking:

Limited visitor parking is permitted in the new State Parking Garage located between the State Library and the State House Annex. All visitors must enter the Garage from the South through the old State Parking Lot behind the State House. This lot is reached from Barracks Street or by exiting Route 29 at Willow Street and circling part of the way around the War Memorial Building. At the light at Barracks Street, go straight ahead into the State Lot. The entrance to the Garage is located at the back of the building near the fence along Route 29. An entry to the Library is located on Level 3 of the Garage.

Metered parking spaces may be found on West State Street near the Library. Additional paid parking is available in private parking garages or lots indicated on the map. 11/95
