Mr. House presented petitions in favor of amending the constitution of the State, so that women may exercise the right of suffrage.

Which were read, and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Mr. Hunkele presented a petition from citizens of South Orange, in favor of the bill regulating roads therein.

Which was read and referred to the Committee on Municipal Corporations.

Mr. Gurney presented a petition in favor of the repeal of Sec. 61, of "An act for the punishment of Crimes," approved April sixteenth, eighteen hundred and forty-six.
