

## **Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent**






## **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**








## NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy - Grade Level - 03















## **Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent**






#### Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup











## Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent






## **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**








### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 06






## NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 06









# **Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent**






# **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**








### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03






# NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03









# **Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent**






# **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**








# NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy - Grade Level - 03






### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03







# **Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent**






# **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**



































# Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent






# **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**























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



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









# Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent






# **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**









# Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent






#### **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**














#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 07




# NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03




# NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 05






# NJASK Proficiency Trends - Science - Grade Level - 04







## Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent






### **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**



























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









## **Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent**






### **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**





















### Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent






### **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**















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



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



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














### **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**



























This graph presents the percentages of enrollment for each subgroup defined by the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001




### Enrollment Trends by Program Participation































#### **Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent**






#### **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**













### **Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent**






### **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**













### **Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent**






### **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**














### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03






