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DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS MARCH 2014

Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of March, the TANF caseload had decreased by 4,394 cases, from 38,642 in March 2013 to 34,248 in March 2014, a decrease of 11.4%.
- The counties where the family caseload percentage increased since March 2013 were Atlantic (2.0%), Burlington (3.7%), and Cumberland (4.0%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since March 2013 were Bergen (-18.1%), Camden (-21.7%), and Passaic (-23.5%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 7,848 or 22.9% were child-only in March 2014.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,192), Camden (1,044), and Hudson (918).
- Essex (18,700), Hudson (10,029), Passaic (9,623), Camden (8,679), and Atlantic (5,535) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in March 2014.

NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In March 2014, there were 432,131 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households increased by 3,701, or 0.9%, since March 2013.
- There were 863,850 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of March 2014, a decrease of 405 or 0.0% since March 2013.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since March 2013 are Monmouth (8.2%), Hunterdon (5.6%), and Ocean (5.4%).

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 6,565 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in March 2014, an increase of 1 or 0.0% since March 2013.
- In March 2014, EA payments were made for 1,836 SSI recipients.

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

GA Emergency Assistance

- There were 5,512 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA cases in March 2014, a decrease of 1,027 or 15.7% since March 2013.
- The three counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Burlington (46.8%), Atlantic (9.2%), and Cumberland (9.1%).

GA Program

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 39,918 to 32,524 since March 2013, a decrease of 18.5%.
- There were 20,278 Employable GA and 12,246 Unemployable GA cases in March 2014.
- Warren (5.8%) and Middlesex (5.3%) counties showed the highest percent increase for GA cases since March 2013.
- In March 2014, GA cases showed a 2.9 percent decrease since February 2014.

CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$324 million from January 2014 to March 2014, a decrease of 0.1 percent over the same period for FFY 2013.
- Total distributions decreased 0.4% from March 2013.


WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

- During the report month of March 2014, there were 3,480 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 454 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (837), Hudson (417), and Camden (346).
- There were 3,275 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.





Work Participation Rates Achieved Over 12 Month Period Ending With MARCH 2014








ACRONYMS

CASS: Consolidated Assistance and Support System

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

NJ SNAP - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

NJKiDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (PRWORA) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, WFNJ/TANF for families with children, and WFNJ/GA (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
