

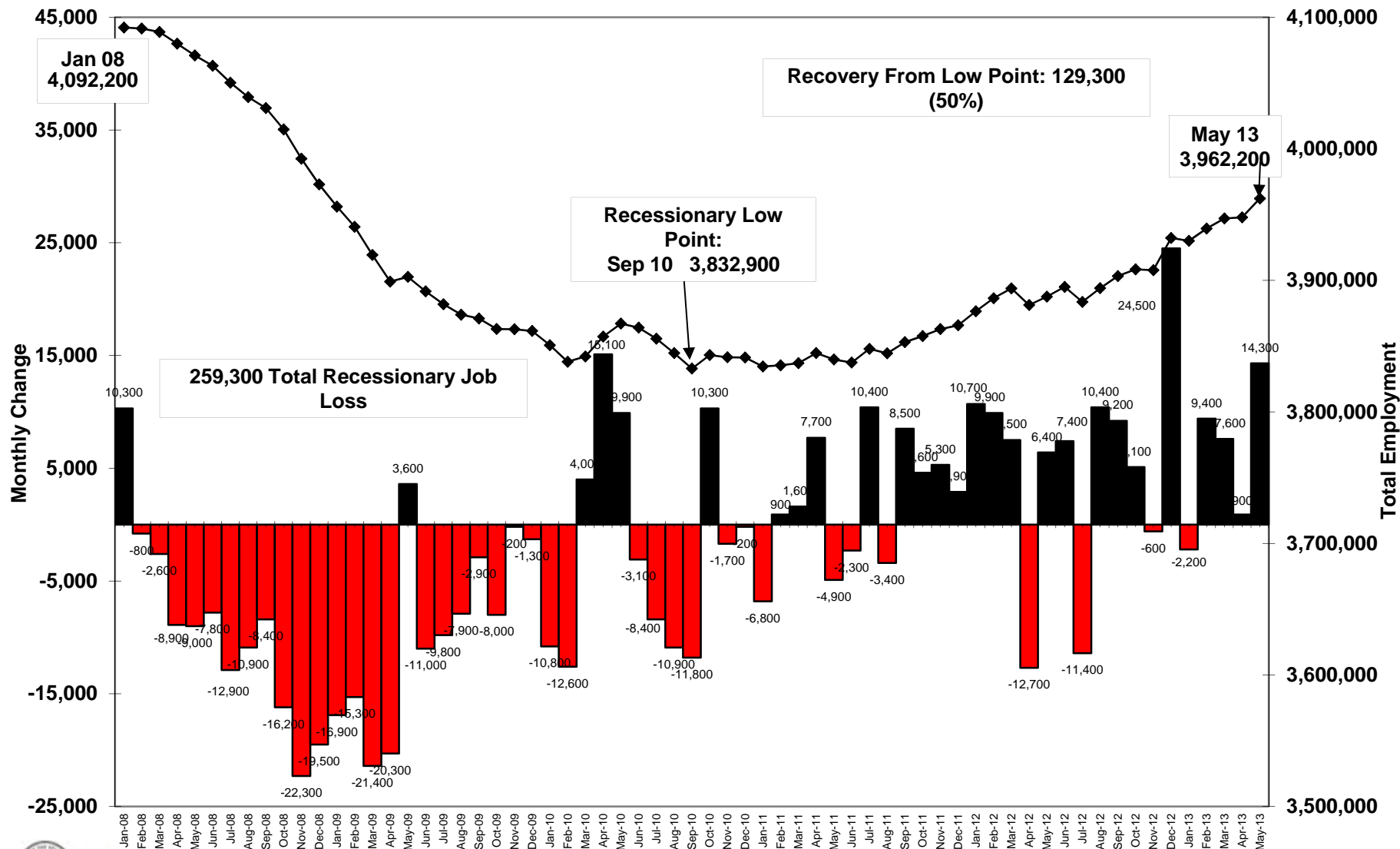

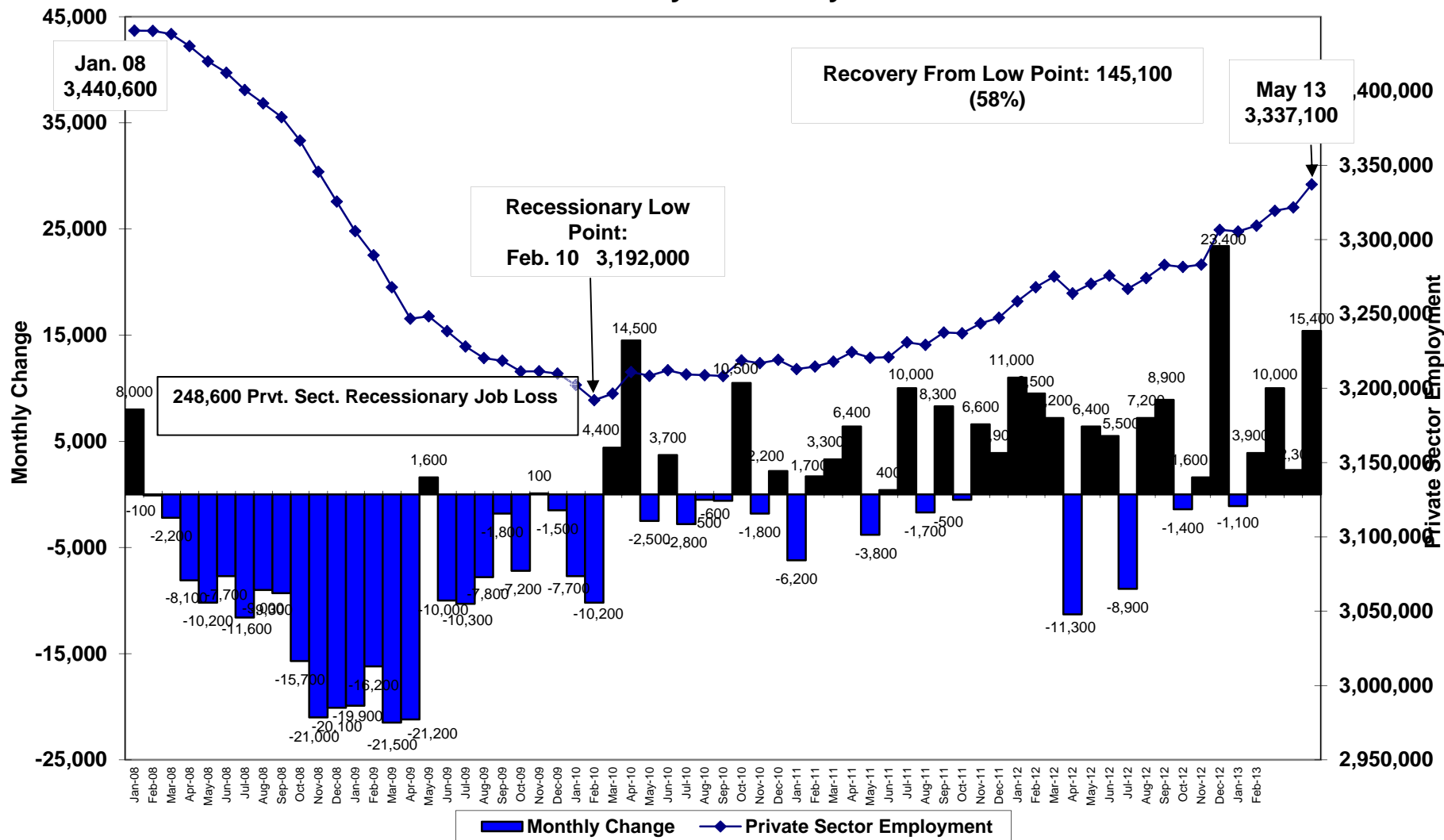


New Jersey Total Nonfarm Employment vs. Monthly Change January 2008 - May 2013

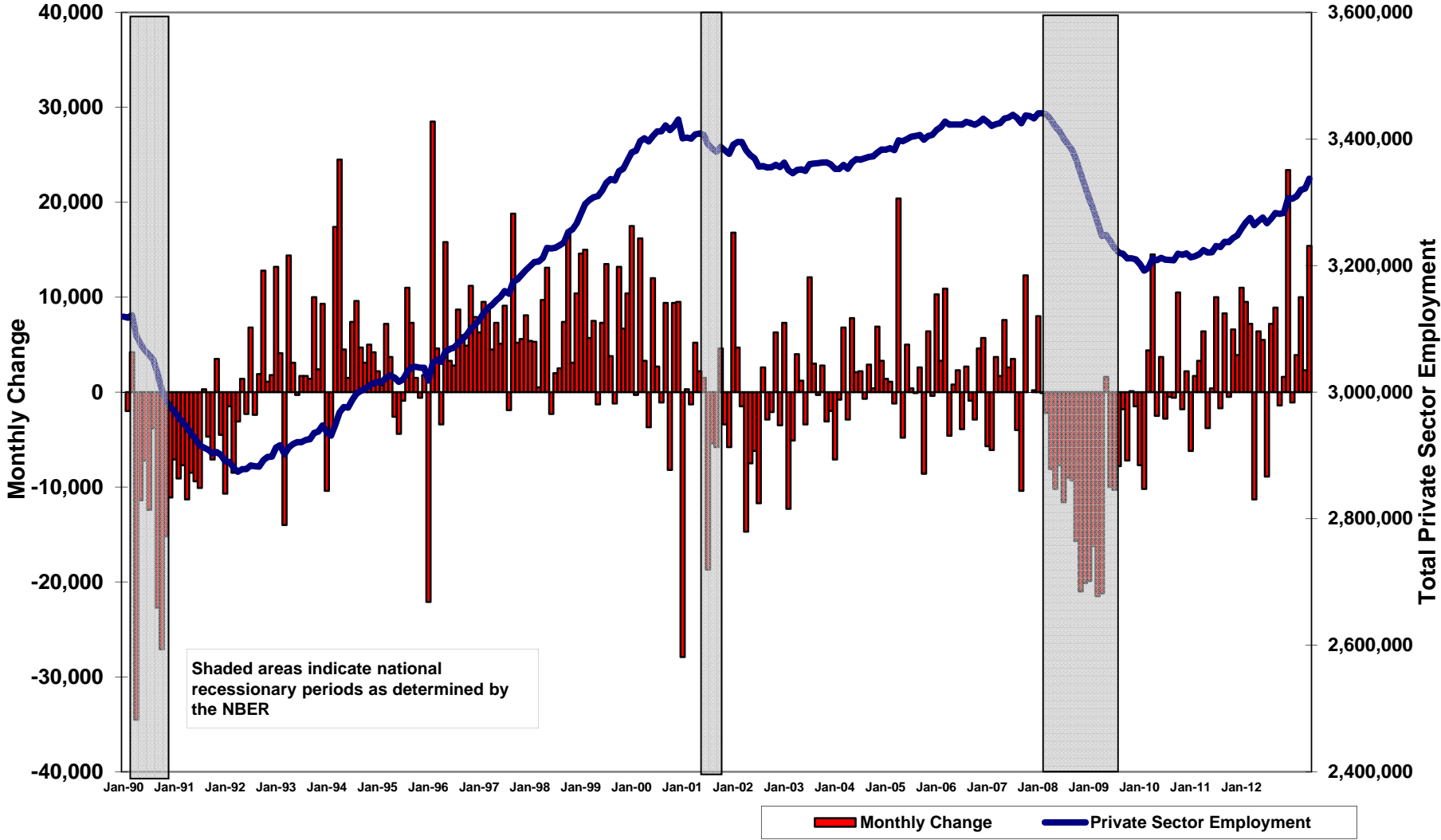

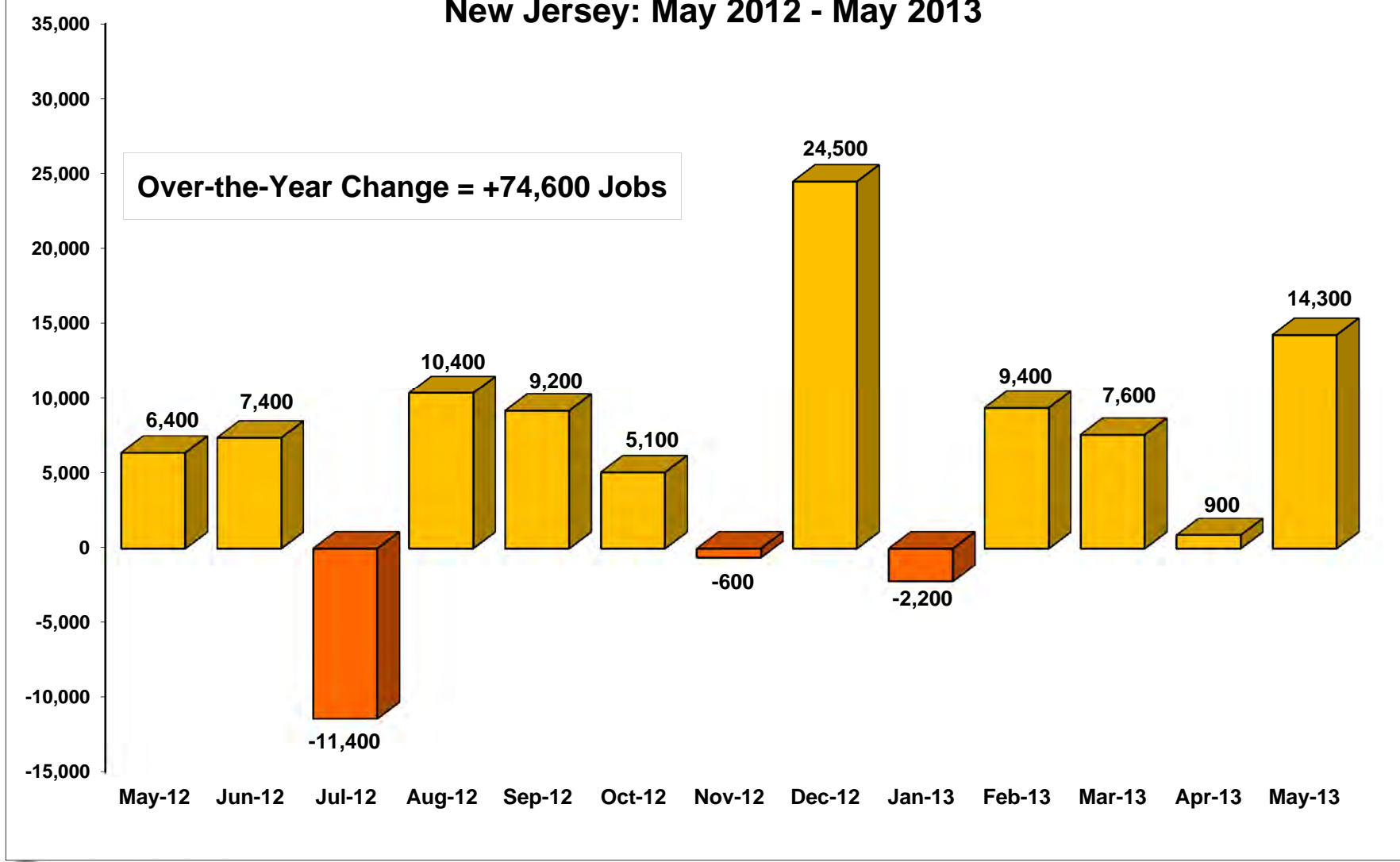
New Jersey Private Sector Employment vs. Monthly Change January 2008 - May 2013



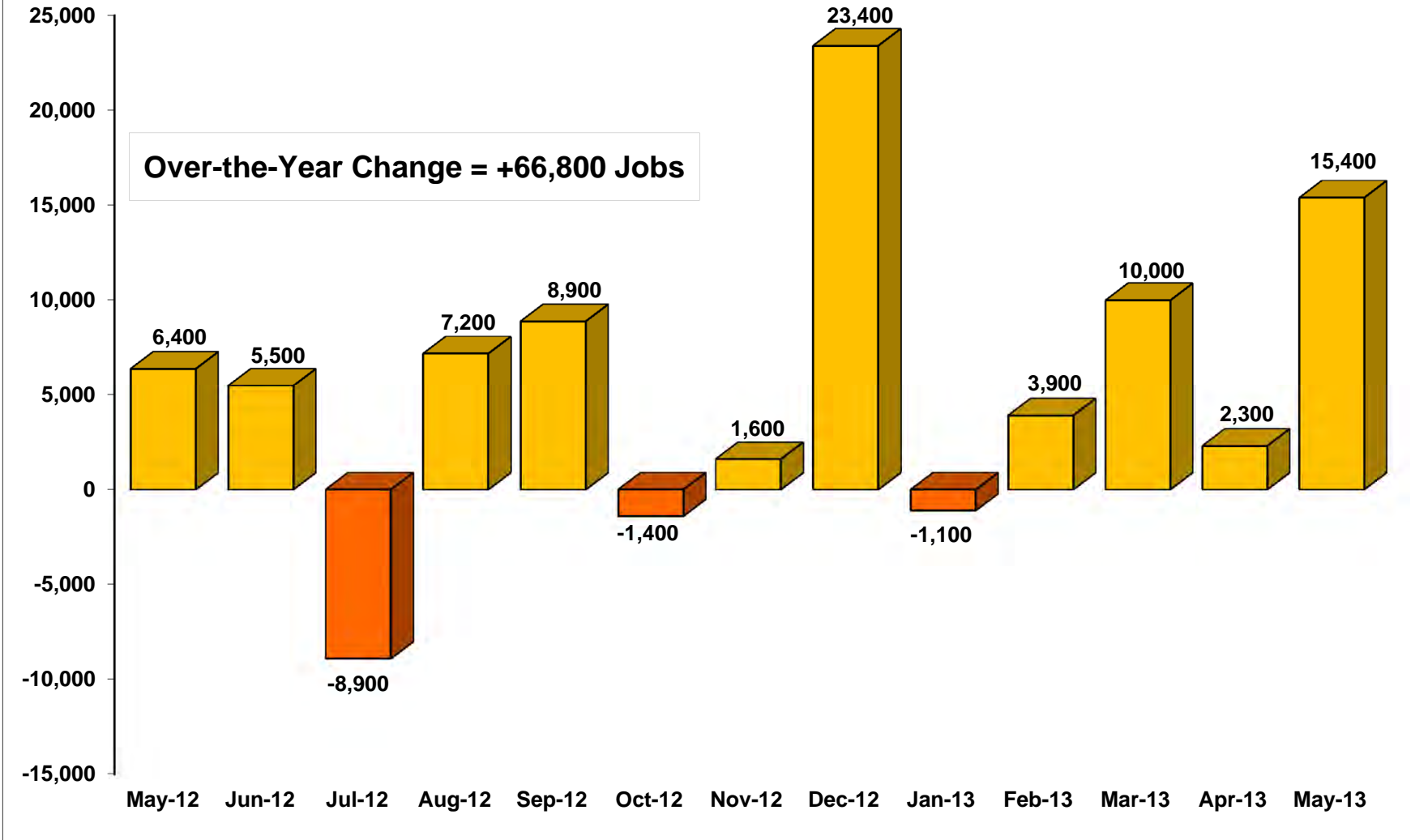
New Jersey Private Sector Employment vs. Monthly Change January 1990 - May 2013



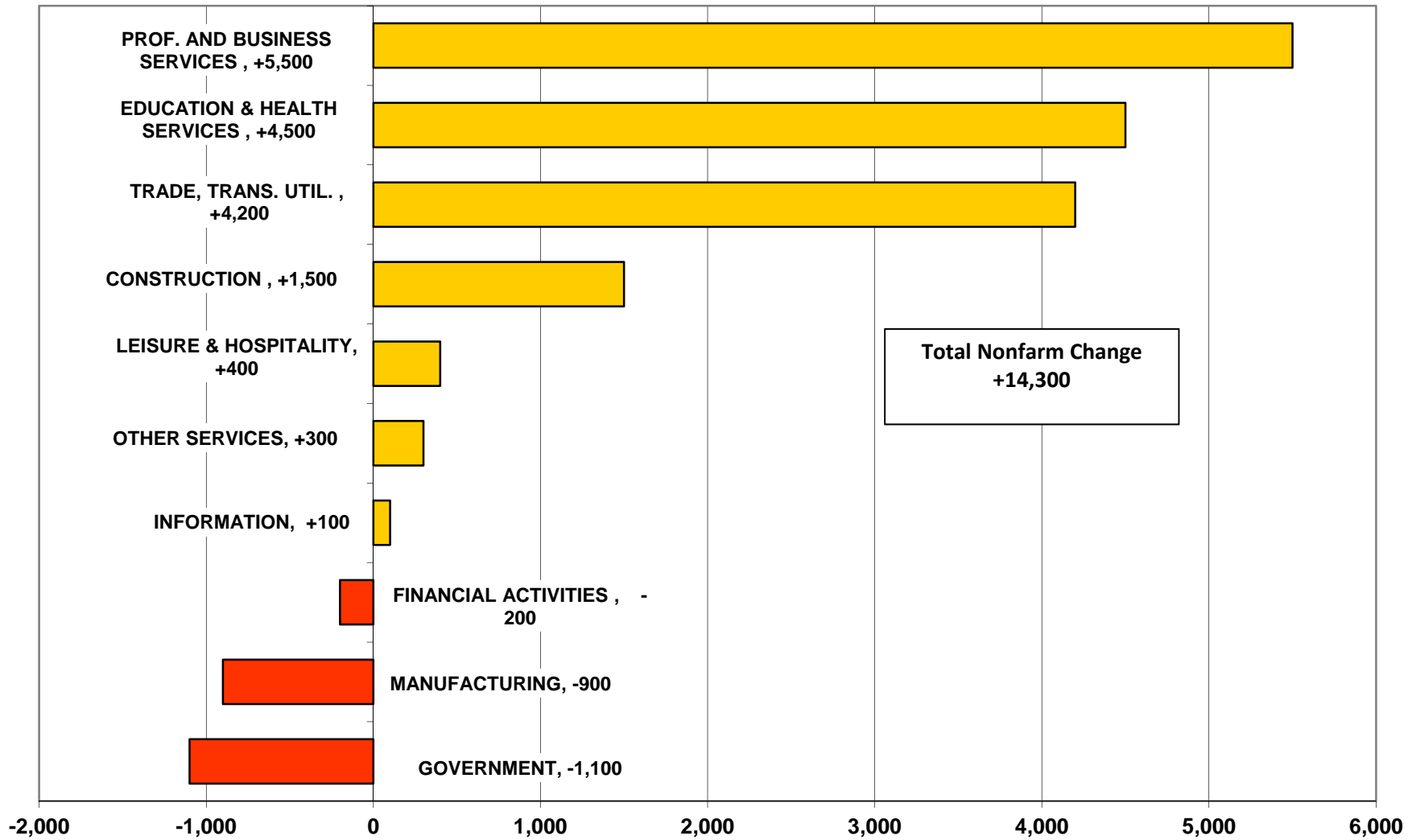
Monthly Total Employment Change New Jersey: May 2012 - May 2013



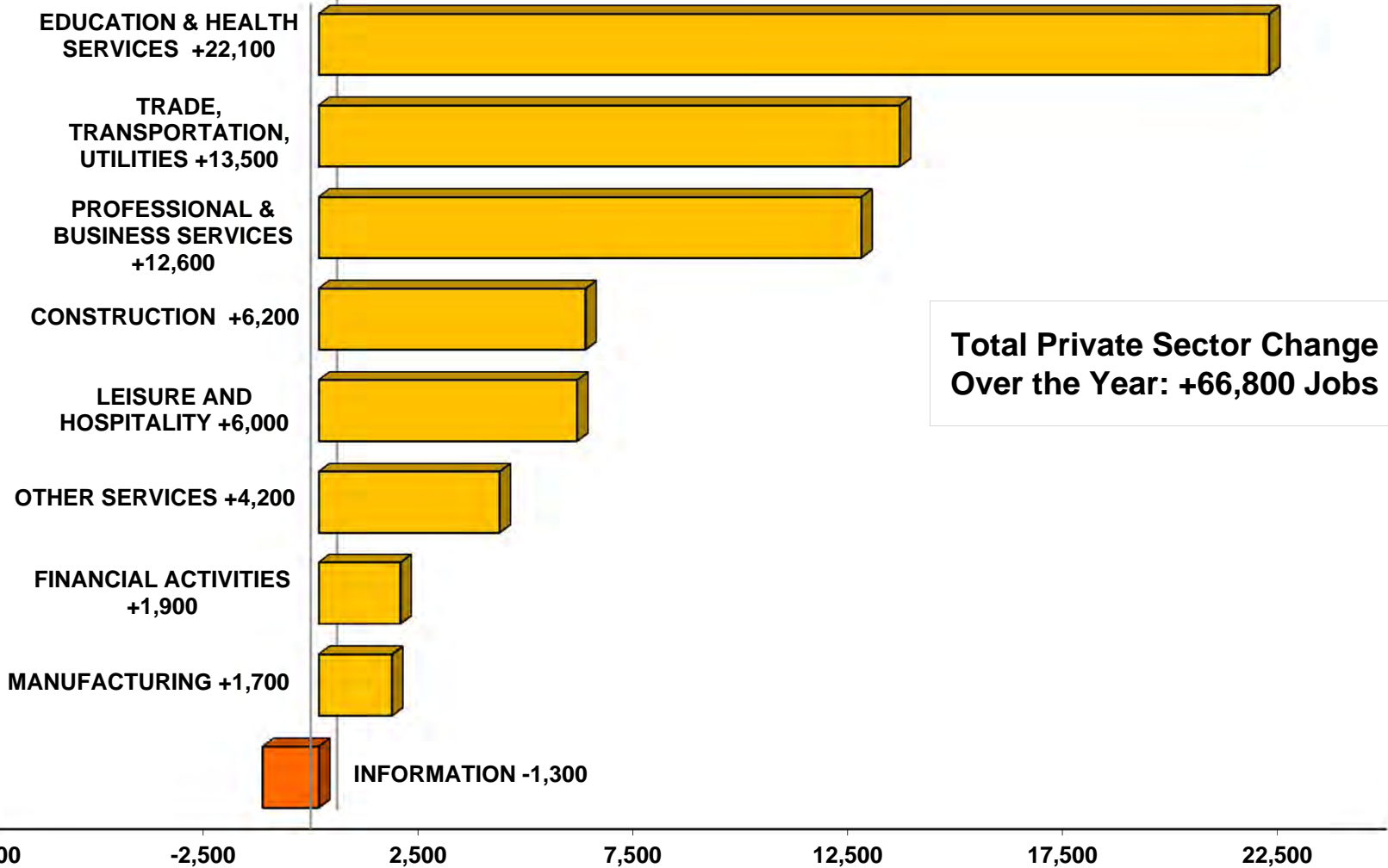
Monthly Private Sector Employment Change May 2012 - May 2013



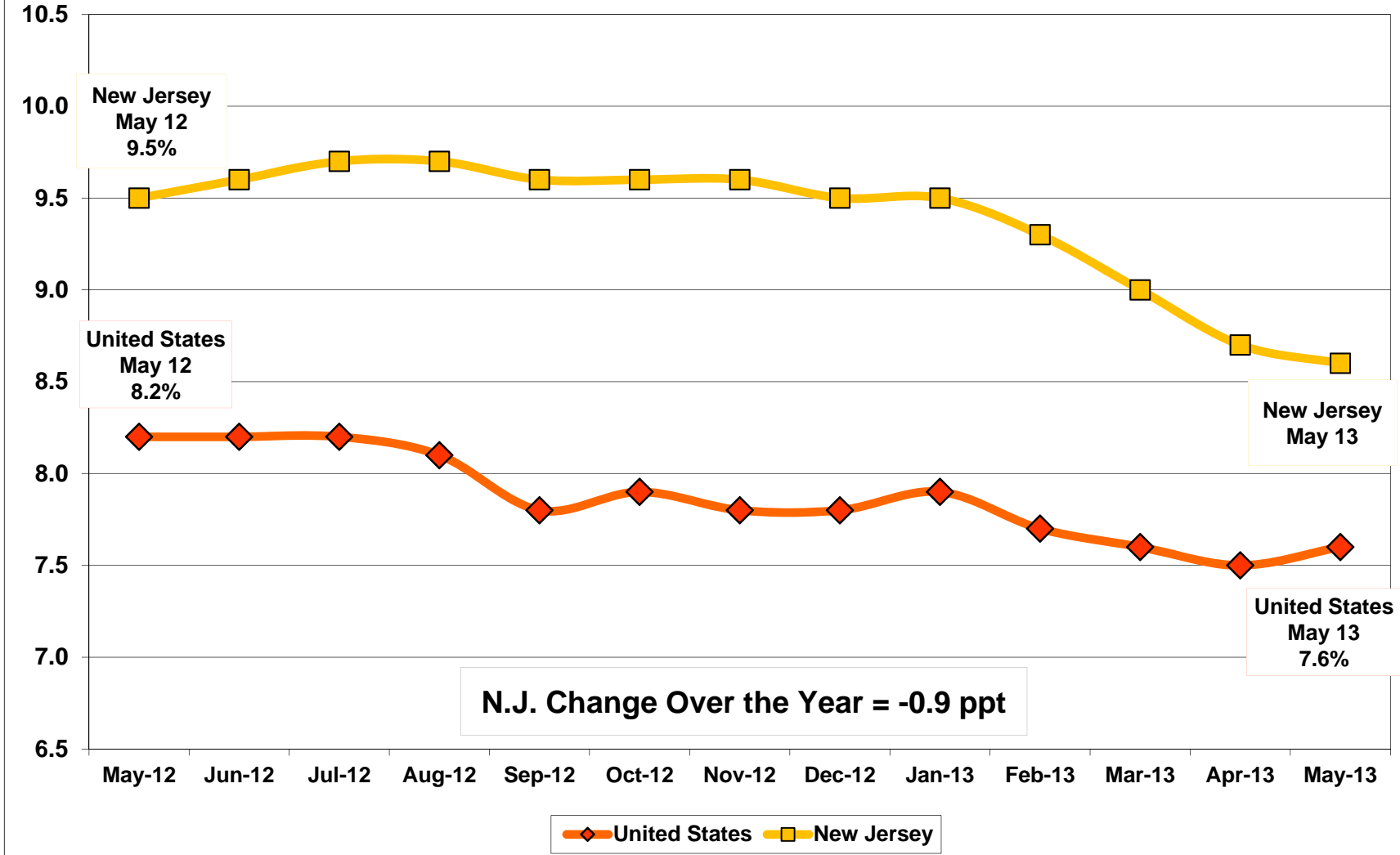

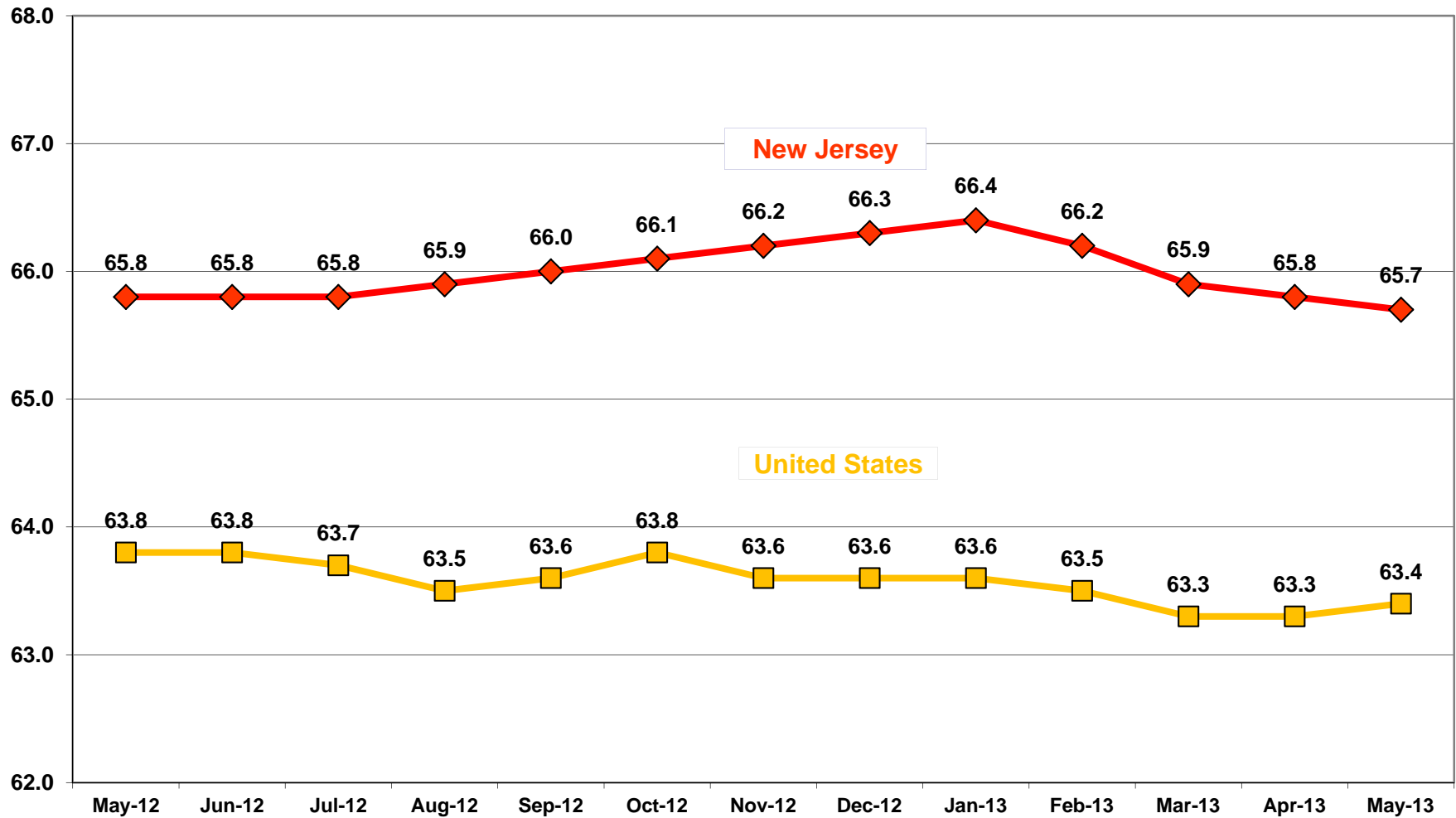
New Jersey Private Sector Employment Change by Industry May 2012 - May 2013



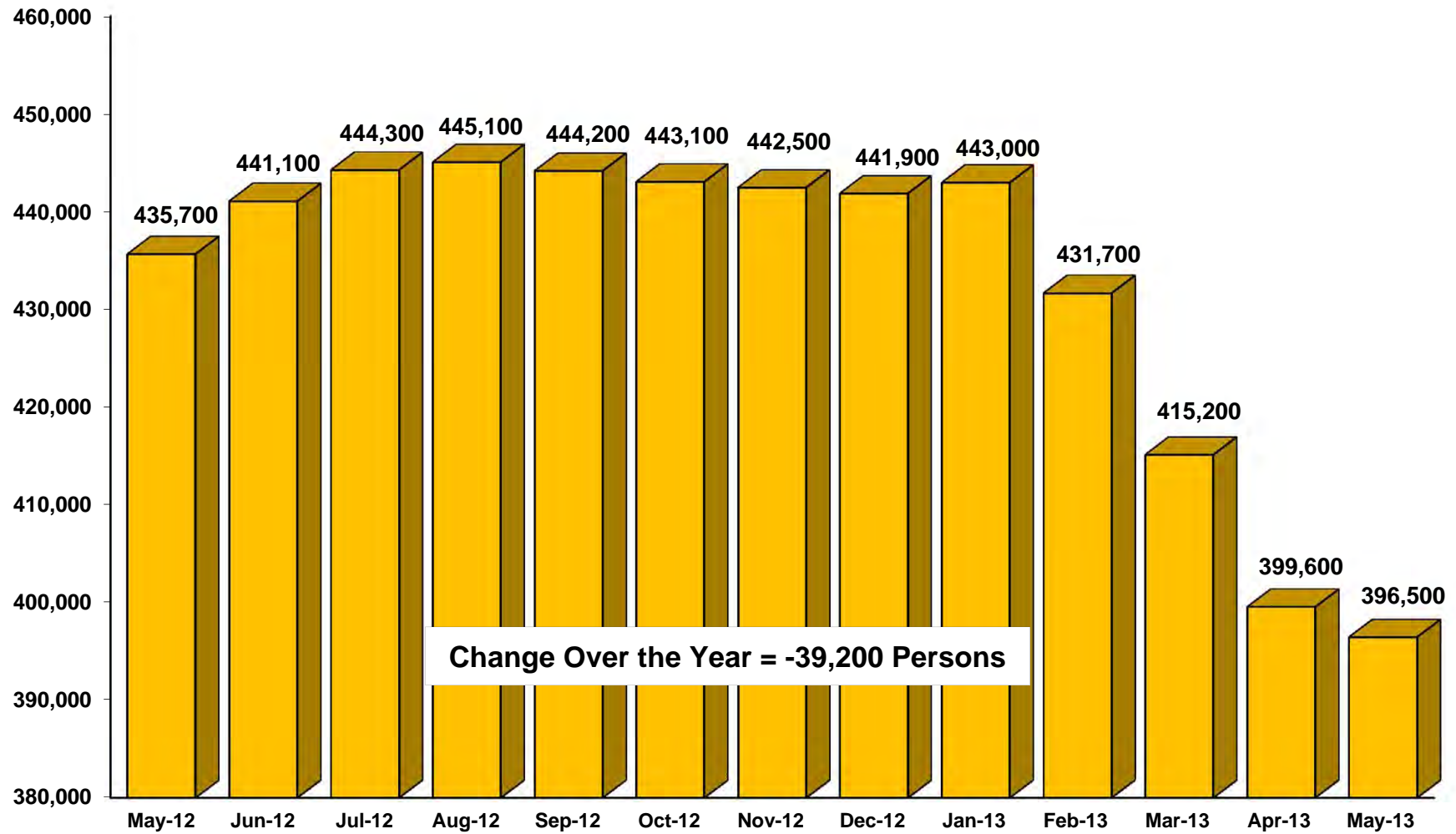
Unemployment Rates, New Jersey vs. United States: May 2012 - May 2013



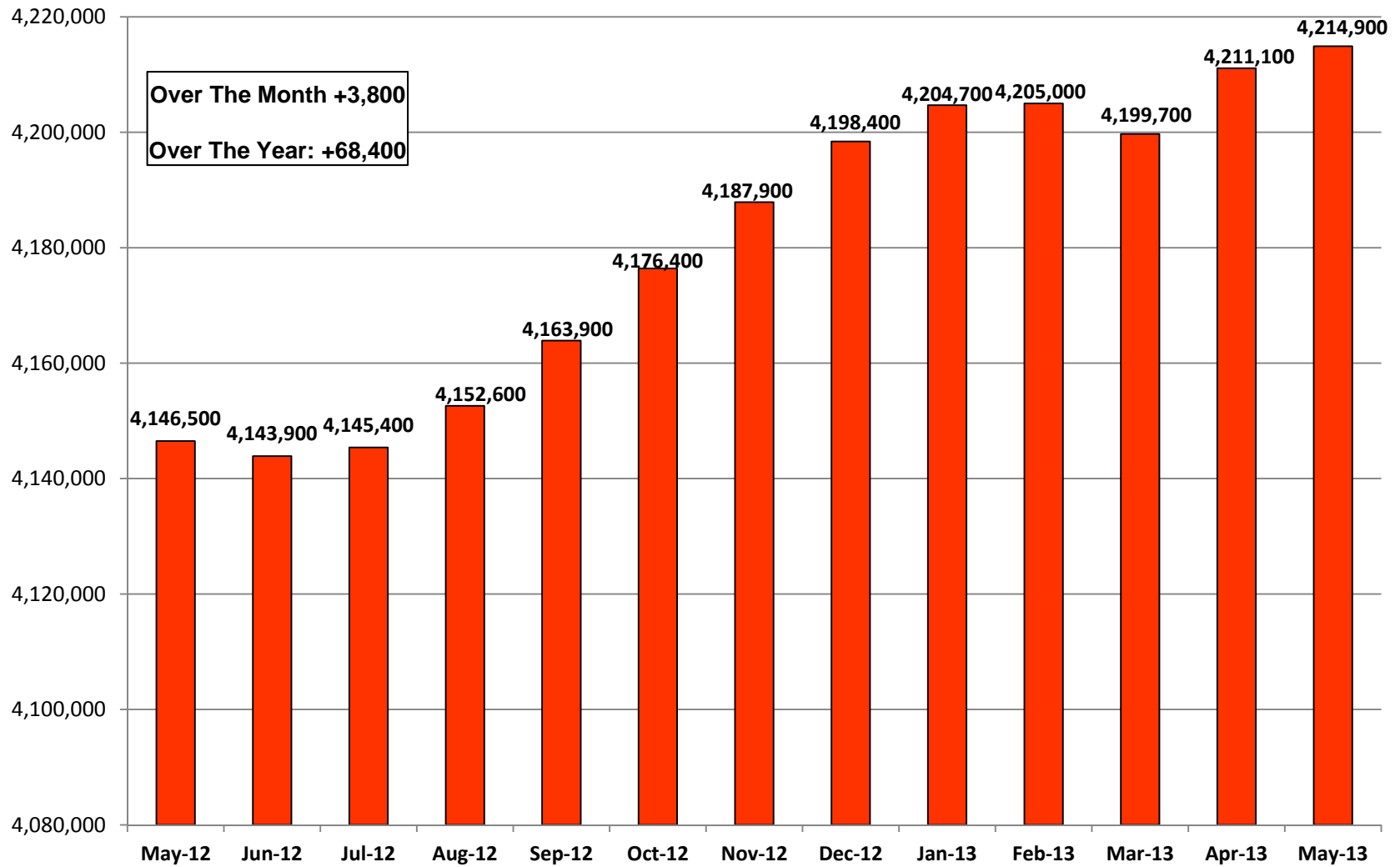
New Jersey vs. United States, Labor Force Participation Rate: May 2012 - May 2013

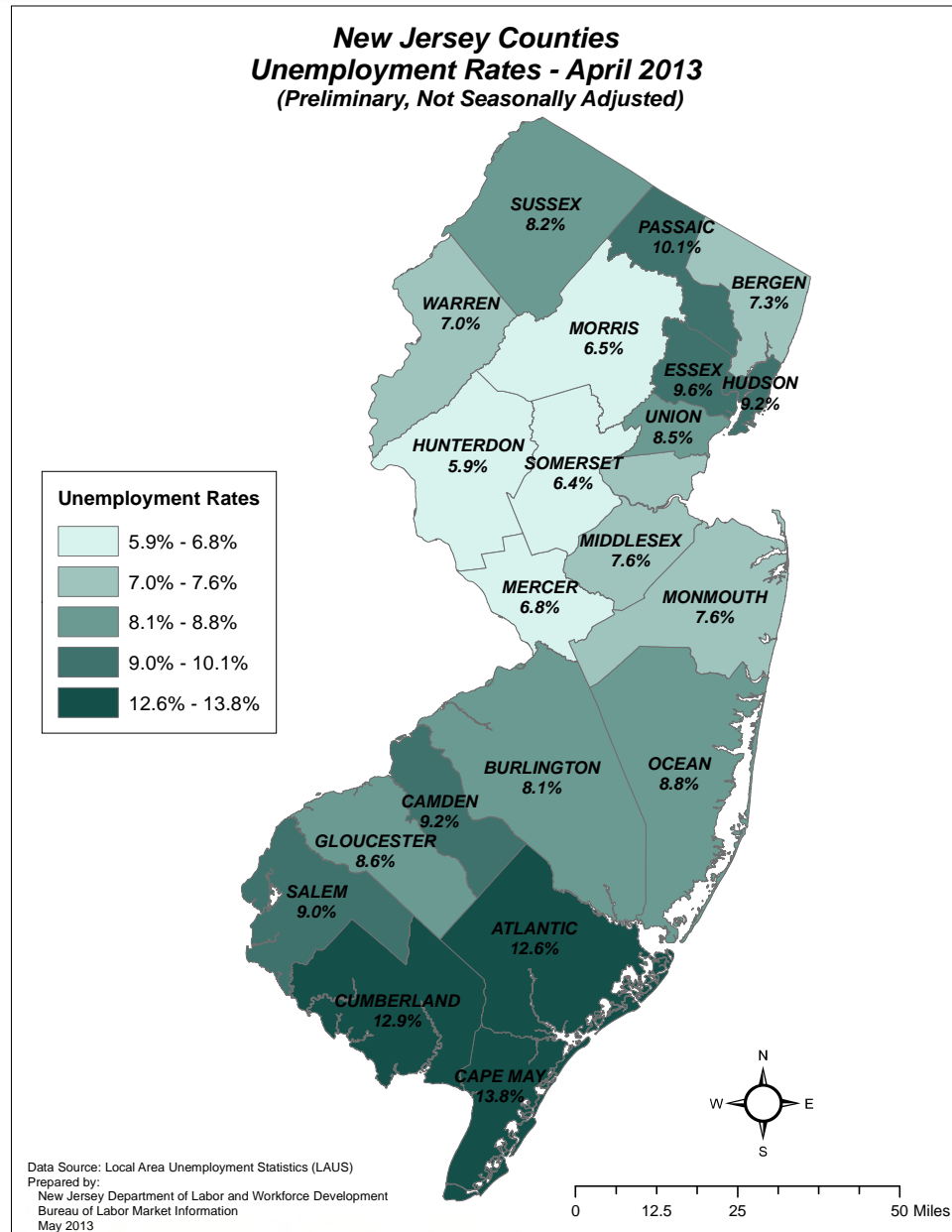


Unemployed New Jersey Residents May 2012 - May 2013



New Jersey Employed Residents: May 2012 - May 2013

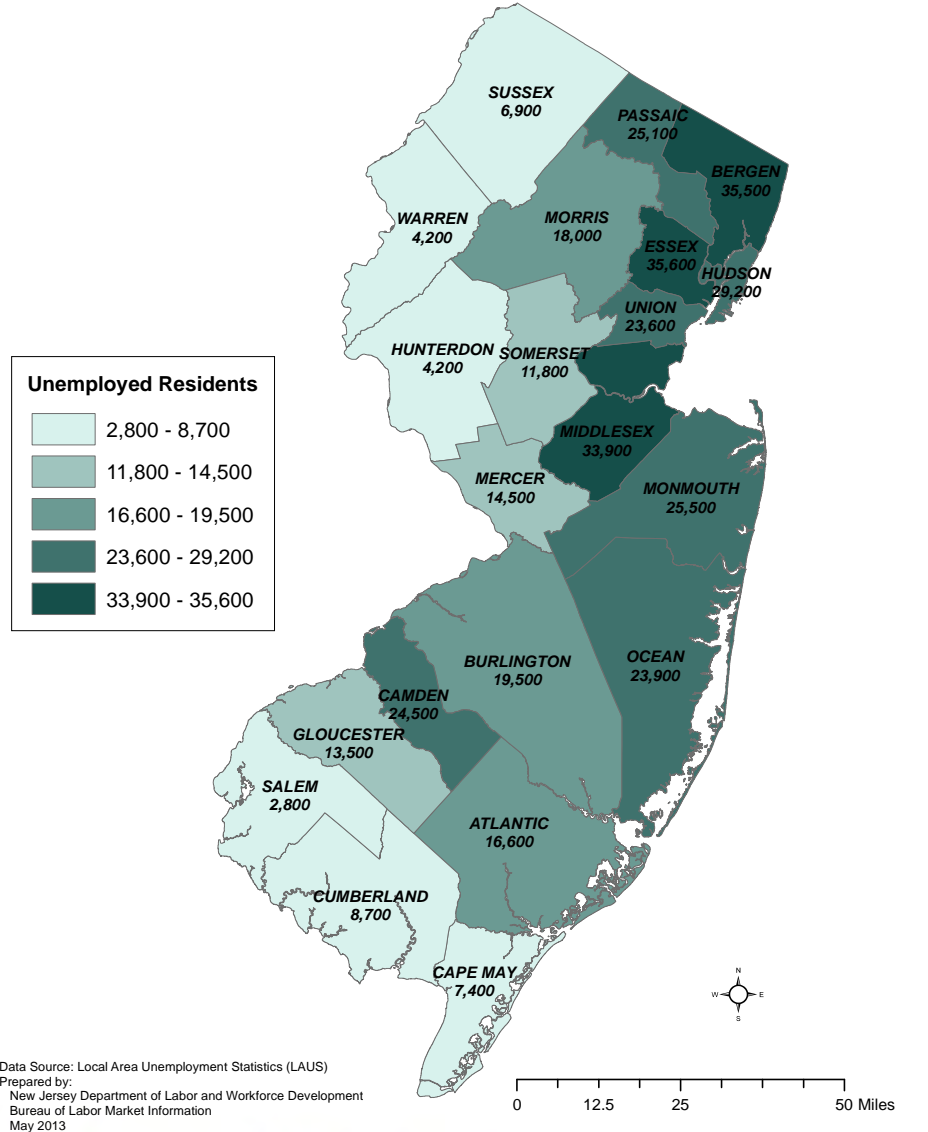

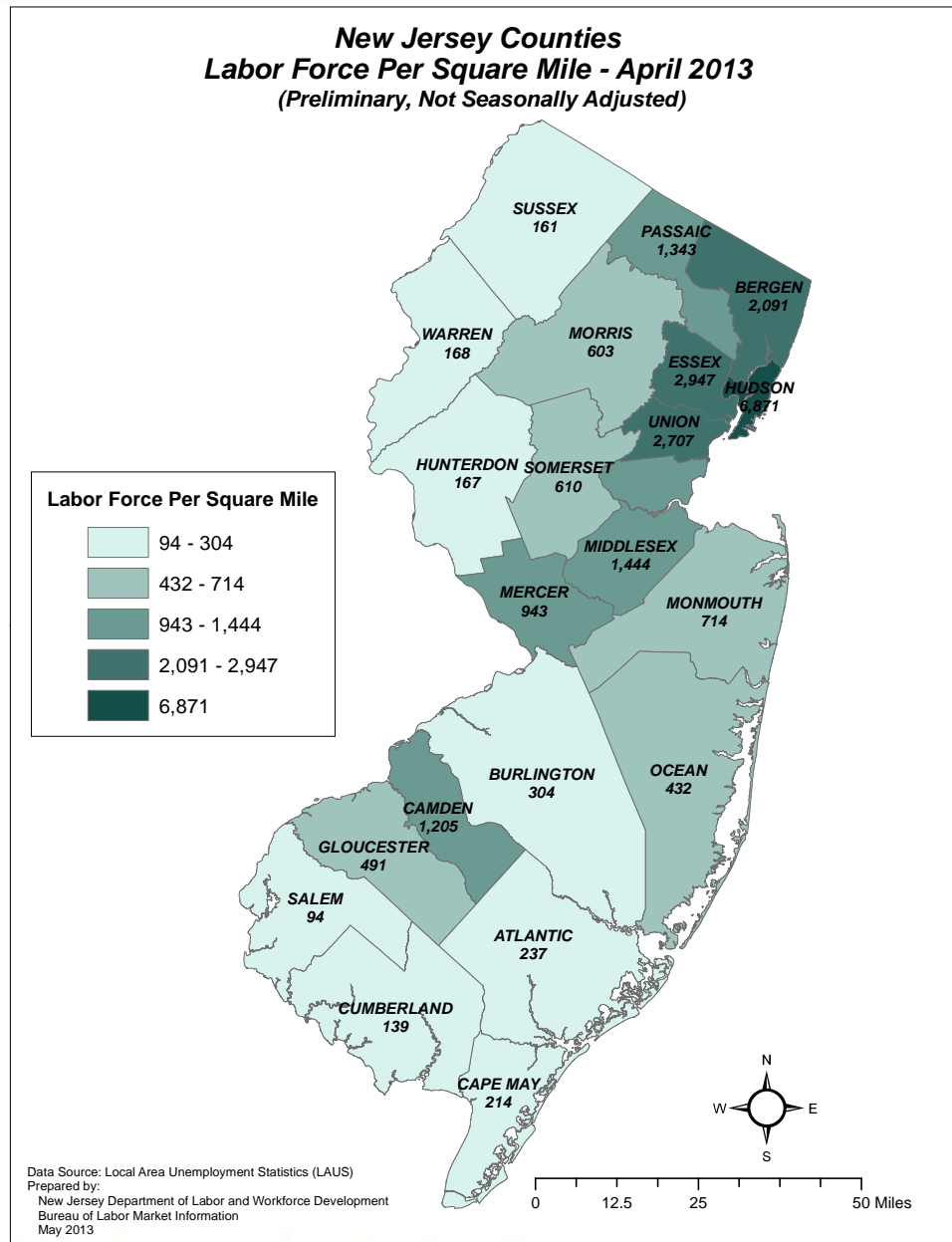

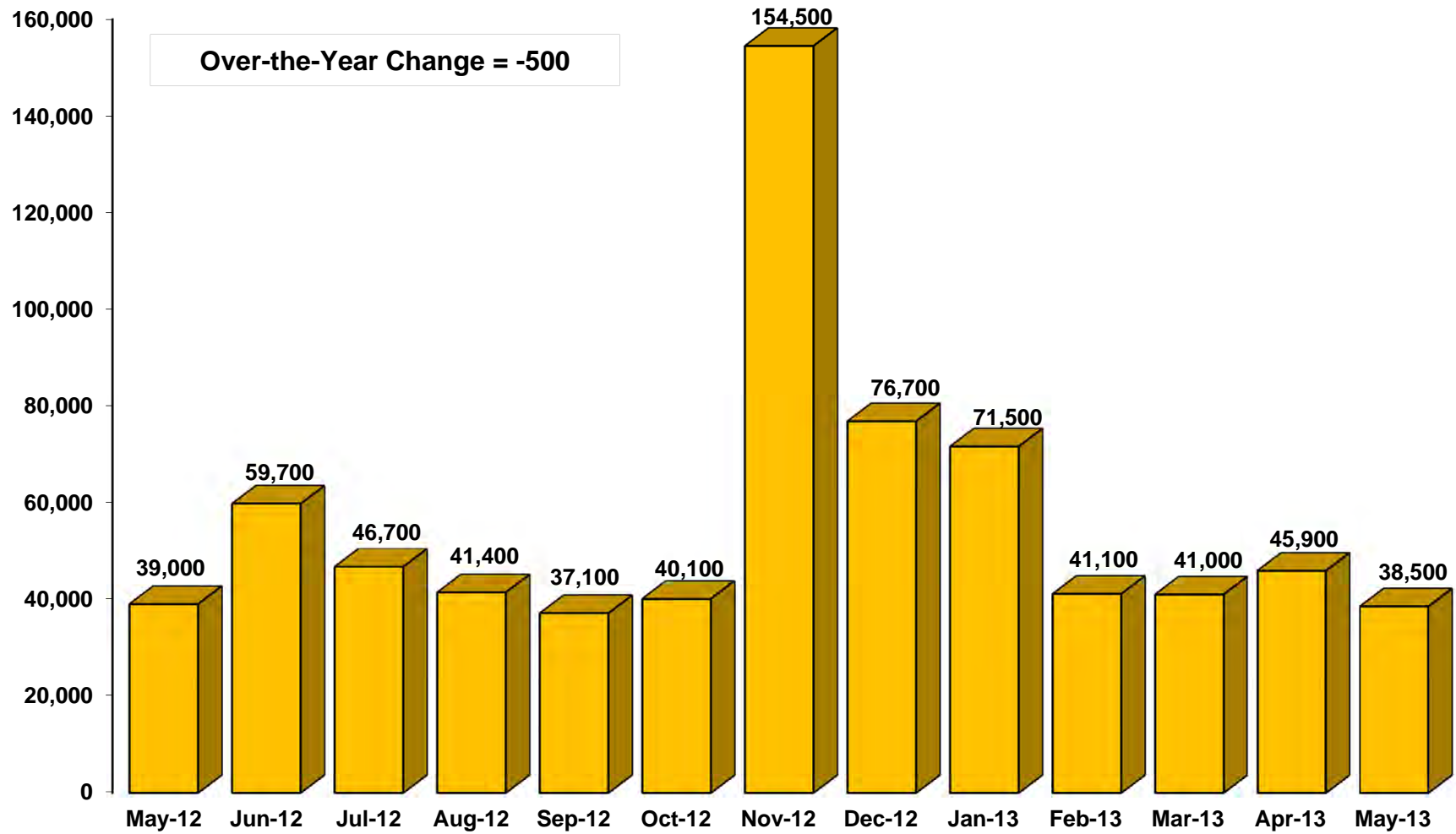
