1. STATE REGULATIONS - REGULATION NO. 39 - ANNOUNCEMENT OF CHANGE IN FORM OF OFFICIAL DEFAULT LIST.

TO ALL MANUFACTURERS AND WHOLESALERS SELLING ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES TO RETAILERS:

A change will be made in the Official Default List published pursuant to State Regulation No. 39 commencing with the list effective February 3, 1964. At present, the entire list is being published each week. Beginning with the list effective February 3, 1964, the entire list including all retailers then on default will be published once a month only on a Master List to become effective on the first Monday in the month and such Master List will remain in effect for the entire month subject to changes which will be included on Supplemental Lists to become effective on the succeeding Mondays within the month.

The first Supplemental List will consist of a pink sheet or sheets containing the names of all retailers added to the Default List, effective on the second Monday of the month (the effective date of the first Supplemental List), together with a blue sheet or sheets containing the names of all retailers removed from the Default List, effective on that Monday. The Supplemental List for each succeeding week will consist of a pink sheet or sheets containing the names of all retailers added together with a blue sheet or sheets containing the names of all retailers removed from the list after the Master List for the month was published.

Since each Supplemental List will be cumulative, in that it will include all changes in the Master List, after the first week of any month one need consult only the Master List and the Supplemental List which became effective on Monday of the particular week. When a new Supplemental List becomes effective, all intervening Supplemental Lists should be disregarded. Similarly, when a new Master List becomes effective, the previous Master List and Supplemental Lists should be disregarded.

BY THE ACTING DIRECTOR:

Licensee pleads non vult to the following charges:

"1. On or about January 31, 1963, and on divers dates prior thereto commencing on or about November 23, 1960, you furnished and offered to furnish, directly or indirectly, rebates, allowances of money, and things of value (loans of money and prohibited credit) to the following retailers: Four Corner's Bar (A Corp.), 185 Market Street, Newark, N.J.; Philip Cortese & John Grasso, t/a The Hitching Post, 95 Barclay Street, Paterson, N.J.; Sager's 1056 Inn, Inc., t/a Sager's 1056 Inn, 1238-1242 Springfield Avenue, Irvington, N.J.; Rutger's Liquor Store, Inc., t/a Rutger's Liquor Store, Inc., 576 Milltown Road, North Brunswick, N.J.; John B. & James Delaporte, t/a Delaporte Cocktail Bar, 304 Glenwood Avenue, Bloomfield, N.J.; Spring Liquors, Inc., 380 Westbound Rt. #22, Springfield, N.J.; Robert Moore, t/a Old Homestead, 76 Kearny Avenue, Jersey City, N.J.; Jackson Liquors, Inc., t/a Jackson Liquors, 64 Jackson Street, South River, N.J.; and Natale, Inc., t/a B. & M. Bar, 913 Broad Street, Newark, N.J.; in violation of Rule 11 of State Regulation No. 34.

"2. Within three days after Jackson Liquors, Inc., t/a Jackson Liquors, 64 Jackson Street, South River, N.J., and Robert Moore, t/a Old Homestead, 76 Kearny Avenue, Jersey City, N.J., retail licensees, each became in default to you under Rules 1 and 2 of State Regulation No. 39, on January 16, 17, 20 and 23, 1961, (for deliveries of alcoholic beverages on December 15, 17, 20, 21 and 23, 1960 to Jackson Liquors, Inc.) and on February 13, 26, April 9, 16 and June 4, 30, 1962 (for deliveries of alcoholic beverages on January 10, 24,

March 8, 16 and May 3, 31, 1962 to Robert Moore), you failed to file notices of default with the Director of the Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control; in violation of Rule 5(b) of State Regulation No. 39.

"3. On or about March 29, 1963 and on divers dates prior thereto, commencing on or about December 16, 1960, you sold and delivered alcoholic beverages other than for payment in cash on delivery to retail licensees, viz., Sager's 1056 Inn, Inc., t/a Sager's 1056 Inn, 1238-1242 Springfield Avenue, Irvington, N.J., and Rutger's Liquor Store, Inc., 576 Milltown Road, North Brunswick, N.J., each of whom, on the dates of such deliveries, was listed on the Default List published by the Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control; in violation of Rule 4(a) of State Regulation No. 39."

Reports of investigation on which the foregoing charges are based indicate that, during the period November 23, 1960 to January 31, 1963, the licensee directly and indirectly, by a variety of devices, lent money and extended prohibited credit to nine retailers in a total amount of approximately \$32,000; failed on several occasions to report two of the nine in default; and sold on credit to two others of the nine when they were listed in default.

The regulations violated are in direct implementation and support of the basic provision of the Alcoholic Beverage Law interdicting the "tied house" (R.S. 33:1-43) which results in the captivity of a retailer by a manufacturer or wholesaler and the evils which may be engendered by such captivity. Thus they go to one of the principal bases of sound liquor control, and their violation is tantamount to repudiation of the very law to which the licensee owes its existence.

Licensee has a previous record of suspension of license for twenty-five days effective January 15, 1959, for similar violations. Re Jersey National Liquor Company, Bulletin 1262, Item 3.

Considering the matters alleged in mitigation, but also considering the aggravating circumstances that the licensee apparently resumed its unlawful conduct almost immediately after suffering a penalty of suspension for the same type of activity, the license will be suspended for sixty days, with remission of five days for the plea entered, leaving a net suspension of fifty-five days.

Permittee has a previous record of suspension of permit for forty-five days, effective November 15, 1959, for similar violation. Re Schlosser, Bulletin 1262, Item 7.

The prior record considered, the permit will be suspended for one hundred days, with remission of five days for the plea entered, leaving a net suspension of ninety-five days.

- "2. On or about March 21, 1963, you hindered and delayed, caused the hindrance and delay and attempted to hinder and delay an investigation, examination and inspection being conducted by Investigators of the Division of alcoholic Beverage Control; in violation of R.S. 33:1-35."

Reports of investigation on which the charges are based indicate that, as to the first charge, the solicitor acted as an intermediary in the furnishing of a loan of \$500 to retailer Cortese & Grasso by his employer, wholesaler Jersey National Liquor Company, and that, as to the second charge, he attempted to persuade the retailer to withhold evidence.

Absent prior record, the permit will be suspended on the first charge for fifty days (Re Goldstein, Bulletin 1262, Item 4) and on the second charge for ten days (cf. Re Three Star Tavern, Inc., Bulletin 1536, Item 4), or a total of sixty days, with remission of five days for the plea entered, leaving a net suspension of fifty-five days.

Licensee pleads non vult to charges alleging that on October 24, 1963, it (1) sold a quart bottle of vodka cocktail below filed price, in violation of Rule 5 of State Regulation No. 30, and (2) displayed prices of bottles of various vodka cocktails other than those filed with the Director, in violation of Rule 6(d) of State Regulation No. 30.

Licensee has a previous record of suspension of license by the Director for eighty-five days effective January 22, 1962, for various violations including sale below filed price. Re Rogers Liquor Corporation, Bulletin 1438, Item 4.

Were this a first offense, the license would be suspended for ten days on both charges in view of their relationship. Cf. Re Bartolini Bar & Liquor Store, Inc., Bulletin 1541, Item 6. However, considering the licensee's prior record of suspension of license within the past five years for similar violation, the minimum penalty will be doubled and the license suspended for twenty days (Re Markowitz, Bulletin 1538, Item 1), with remission of five days for the plea entered, leaving a net suspension of fifteen days.
