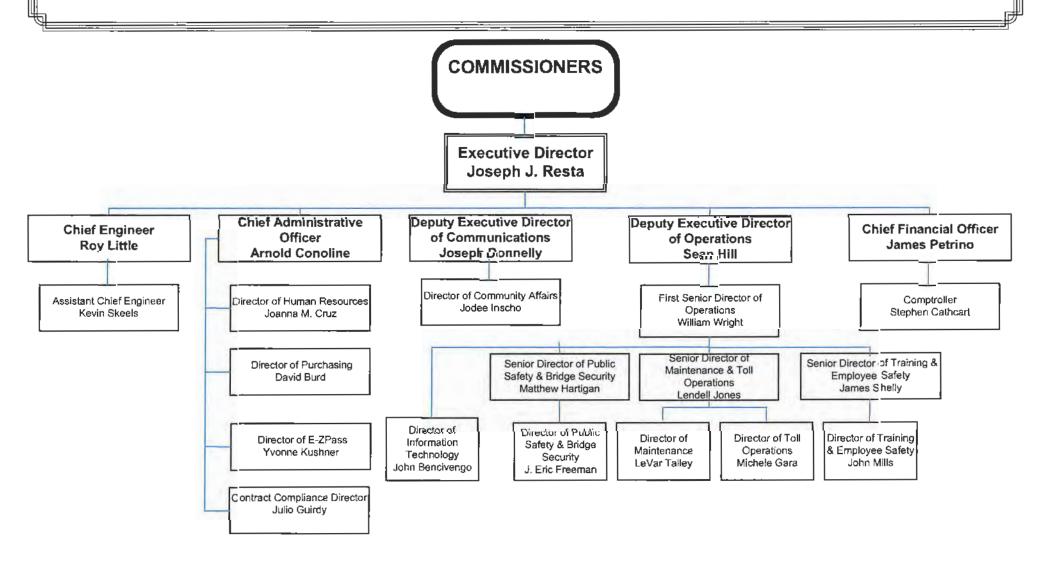

At the conclusion thereof, reported that there was a quorum present-there being four members present from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and five members present from the State of New Jersey.

#### WELCOMING REMARKS OF CHAIRMAN

Chairman Lavery welcomed those persons whose identities are set forth hereinabove under "Appearances".

#### INTRODUCE ANY COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Chairman Lavery addressed the meeting and invited any comments from the public on items pertaining to today's Agenda. No questions were presented.

#### Meeting of December 18, 2017

#### EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS REPORT

Joseph Resta, Executive Director, addressed the meeting and said;

"Thank you, Mr. Chairman. Christmas is a week away and Commission maintenance crews already have handled three system-wide winter storm events. Each of these has been a low-accumulation snowfall. Forecasters predict that a La Nina atmospheric pattern this winter will cause more of these low-volume snow events in the weeks and months ahead. Regardless of how the winter unfolds, our crews are at the ready in all three operational districts;

"Looking ahead to 2018, next year's operating and capital program budgets are on the agenda for consideration today. Together, these budgets will guide the Commission in fulfilling its service mission to the public over the course of the next year. Today's action will culminate months of preparation and review by staff and Commissioners. There are a lot of people to credit, but I particularly want to thank Comptroller Steve Cathcart and Accounting Staff for constructing the operating budget and making all the refinements that arose during the review process. Likewise, I want to recognize Chief Engineer Roy Little and his staff for their work on the capital plan. Finally, I want to thank the Commissioners for their engagement in this process. Our Commissioners serve without compensation and it takes an extraordinary amount of time on their part to review the various budget drafts, the corresponding spread sheets, and the array of back-up documents;

"Today's agenda also includes an additional important action item for the coming year: the renewal of the Commission's business insurance policies. The 2018 package involves 14 different lines of coverage, including general liability, bridge and flood coverage, and environmental insurance. While our business insurance costs have been trending downward in recent years, the Commission's 2018 coverage is projected to increase by about \$40,000 over this year's property and liability coverage. Two factors are at work here, first, potential opportunities for premium reductions are disappearing in the wake of the losses arising from hurricanes Harvey, Irma and Maria this year, Second, we are expanding our insurance plan to include cyber liability coverage - a relatively new form of insurance that covers network security breaches, privacy liability, business interruptions, and a variety of other untoward situations. Our insurance broker, Aon Risk Services, warns that it takes months and sometimes years for the final costs of catastrophes to be assessed, settled and tabulated. Fitch Ratings has warned that the insurance industry's losses from 2017 could reach \$190 billion. This could lead to a "Hard Market" of higher premiums as the global reinsurance sector's entire premium base gets wiped out by payouts for 2017's catastrophes;

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"Moving to our capital program, two of our current projects are winding down while work on a third project is ramping up for the winter. Travel lane closures associated with the I-78 Bridges and Approach Slabs Rehabilitation Project were lifted last Wednesday. The project's remaining work activities for 2017 will wrap up on Friday, at which time the contractor will be on hiatus through the winter holiday period. The contractor expects to reevaluate the potential for resuming work activities on or about January 8. Construction activities for the replacement of lighting components on the Lower Trenton Toll-Supported Bridge's "Trenton Makes. The World Takes" sign are expected to be substantially complete this week. An official lighting of the sign, however, remains several weeks away - at the earliest. The sign, which has been fully outfitted with a new energy-efficient, state-of-the-art LED light system, must undergo 30 days of testing and calibration. Once that is completed, training will be provided for Commission employees authorized to operate the new lighting system. In light of those activities and the onset of the coldest winter weather, we may need to postpone an official relighting ceremony until warmer temperatures make their return in March. Finally, work on the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project is steadily intensifying despite the onset of cold temperatures and periodic snow. Work is currently taking place at approximately 10 separate sites in the 4.4-mile long project area. Meanwhile, the pace of construction on the upstream span of the replacement bridge is continuing from both sides of the river. Two major all-day concrete pours for the new bridge span occurred this month at land-based bridge piers in Pennsylvania and New Jersey. Over 100 truckloads of concrete were placed for these massive foundations. Work on the new bridge's New Jersey and Pennsylvania abutments also is progressing. And out in the Delaware, the first inriver pier is nearing the point where the rebar framework for the footing can be completed for a major concrete pour either late this week or early next week. Within a month or two, enough substructure work may be completed to allow for construction of the first elements of the new bridge's steel superstructure. In the short-term, all travel lanes in the project area will be open for the upcoming Christmas holiday weekend. Project-related travel restrictions are to be lifted no later than 6 a.m. Friday and not resume until after noon on Tuesday, Dec. 26;

"Looking ahead to the approaching Christmas weekend, we could have yet another busy holiday travel period if there is favorable weather. As always, please enjoy the safest of holidays and please drive carefully."

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# DELAWARE RIVER JOINT TOLL BRIDGE COMMISSION Meeting of December 18, 2017 TOLL TRAFFIC AND REVENUE STATISTICS (November, 2017)

Summary: The Commission experienced an increase in total toll revenue for November 2017 in comparison to the November 2016 traffic and revenue statistics. Total toll traffic also reflected an increase for the month of November. [It should be noted that 2016 was a leap year, and that Year-to-Date totals for 2017 reflect one less day].

#### Analysis of November 2017 / November 2016 toll revenue data comparison:

- An overall toll revenue increase of 1.87 percent was recorded at the Commission's seven toll bridges for the month.
- Commercial-vehicle toll revenue reflected a 2.47 percent increase.
- Passenger-vehicle toll revenue generated a 0.17 percent increase.

#### Analysis of November 2017 / November 2016 traffic data comparison:

- Total toll traffic increased by 5,747 vehicles, or 0.17 percent for the month.
- Commercial-vehicle traffic increased by 2,473 vehicles, or 0.53 percent.
- Passenger-vehicle toll traffic increased by 3,274 vehicles, or 0.11 percent.
- Average daily toll traffic for the Commission's seven toll bridges for November 2017 was 111,564 total vehicles as compared to 111,373 total vehicles in November 2016.
- Total recorded westbound traffic volume at the eleven vehicular toll supported bridges for November 2017 increased by 27,047 vehicles, or 1.05 percent when compared to November 2016. Average daily westbound traffic at these bridges for November 2017 was 86,361 vehicles as compared to 85,460 for November 2016.

#### Traffic analysis for 2017 YTD:

- Total YTD toll traffic for the seven toll bridges is reflecting a 0.88 percent increase through the first eleven months of 2017 as compared to the same period in 2016. This has generated a 2.46% increase in total toll revenue for YTD 2017.
- Westbound traffic on the eleven toll supported bridges is reflecting a 0.68 percent increase through the first eleven months of 2017 as compared to last year.

#### DISTRICT REVIEW

#### District 1

Total toll traffic at Trenton-Morrisville (TM) for November 2017 reflected a 3.22 percent increase compared to November 2016 as the result of the increase of 13,749 cars and the decrease of 723 trucks. At New Hope-Lambertville (NHL), an increase of 3,109 cars combined with a decrease of 1,523 trucks to generate an overall increase in total toll traffic of 0.97 percent for the month of November 2017 as compared to November 2016.

#### **District II**

The I-78 Toll Bridge experienced a decrease of 0.59 percent in total toll traffic for the month of November 2017 compared to November 2016 as the result of the decrease of 13,884 cars and the increase of 7,925 trucks. At the Easton-Phillipsburg (EP) Toll Bridge, decreases of 1,875 passenger vehicles and 3,815 trucks combined to generate a 1.29 percent decrease in total toll traffic for November 2017.

#### **District III**

Portland-Columbia (PC) experienced a 1.89 percent increase in total toll traffic during November 2017 as a result of the increase of 2,947 automobiles and the decrease of 984 trucks compared to November 2016. At the Delaware Water Gap (DWG) Toll Bridge, the decrease of 1,643 passenger vehicles and the increase of 2,013 trucks combined to generate an overall increase of 0.05 percent in total toll traffic for November 2017 as compared to November 2016. At Milford-Montague (MM), an increase of 871 cars and a decrease of 420 trucks combined to produce a 0.44 percent increase in total toll traffic for the month of November 2017.

#### **E-ZPass** Penetration Rates

The table below provides a comparison of the E-ZPass penetration rates for the Commission's seven (7) toll bridges for the months of November, 2017 and November, 2016, and the year-to-date periods ending November 30, 2017 and November 30, 2016.

## Meeting of December 18, 2017

#### STATISTICAL SUMMARY OF EXPENDITURES

This includes reports entitled "Budget vs Actual" covering the month of November 2017 and the eleven month year-to-date ("YTD") operations of fiscal year 2017 relative to Toll Bridges, Toll Supported Bridges and Administration departments.

Total expense plus encumbrance totaled \$4,414,611 for the month of November. For the 2017 fiscal period, total expense plus encumbrances amounted to \$54,248,497 or 93.3% of the YTD operating budget.

Most of the expense line categories are within their normal line item budgets. Overtime wages are currently exceeding budget by \$55,056 or 13.2%, mainly due to a need to fill-in for a number of full-time staff vacancies. This line item is more than offset by budget surplus in Regular Employee Salaries and Part-Time Salary budgets. Professional Services are exceeding their YTD operating budget by \$129,377 or 11.0% due to higher non-retainer legal fees and investment advisor fees. And business insurance expense is exceeding the YTD budget by \$19,689 or .8% due to higher than anticipated Workers Compensation expense.

There were no unusual expense items or charges during the month of November.

#### MONTHLY PURCHASING REPORT

#### Month of November 2017

This report itemizes all orders for purchases made for the month of November, 2017, showing the divisions chargeable for the expense and the source of authority for issuance of the purchase order. This authority is broken into three categories:

- (1) By authority of the Commission
- (2) By authority of the Executive Director or his designate
- (3) By authority of the Superintendent

The purchasing activities for the month of November 2017, culminated in the preparation and placement of 51 purchase orders in the total amount of \$333,015.91. To secure competitive prices on items being purchased, 15 price inquiries were sent out for 5 of the requisitions leading to purchase orders, an average of 3.0 per order (15/3= 3.0).

Procurements of over \$5,000.00 during the period of November 2017 are shown below:

- > Seven (7) Purchase Order were issued, in the total amount of \$195,212.40, for the procurement of seven (7) 2018 Ford Explorer Police Interceptor vehicles to be used at our Toll Bridge Facilities as First Responder Vehicles.
- ➤ A Purchase Order was let, in the total amount of \$24,806.72, for the purchase of one (1) vertical mower for the Morrisville Facility.
- ➤ One Purchase Order was issued, in the total amount of \$13,583.19, for bathroom dividers at the I-78 Facility.
- > A Purchase Order was let, in the total amount of \$12,475.79, for the procurement of two (2) snow pusher boxes, for the Morrisville Facility.
- > One Purchase Order was issued, in the total amount of \$10,000.00, for guide rail repairs at the Easton-Phillipsburg Facility.

- 1. TransCore is addressing punch list items, final project documentation and as-built drawings. Project Provisional Acceptance was issued on August 16, 2017 and the project is transitioning into the maintenance phase.
- 2. A call with Commission Staff and Executive Staff from TransCore occurred to review the system performance. It was noted that the vehicle classification and capture of license plates is not meeting the performance requirements. TransCore implemented a plan that included revisiting each lane, checking all equipment connections/configurations and tuning the equipment to increase performance levels.

#### IBE PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission (Commission) established an IBE Program (MBE/WBE/SBE/DBE/DsBE/VBE) with a target of 25% for all Professional Services and Construction contracts awarded by the Commission effective July 1, 2014. To date, the Commission has awarded forty-three (44) contracts, with the IBE Program requirements.

#### **Elation Systems**

The Commission began using Elation Systems effective January 2017, as the online system for Payment Verification and Certified Payroll Reporting (CPR). All contracts awarded by the Commission to a Prime Consultant/Prime Contractor and their Subconsultants and Subcontractors use this service free of charge. Online training is available to users on how to use Elation Systems. The Contract Compliance Department and Elation Support Staff are available to assist all users.

The Contract Compliance Department (CCD) monitors, posts and reports all data in regards to all payments. The CCD also reviews all Certified Payrolls submitted into Elation Systems.

#### The following are all mandatory requirements:

#### **Company On-Line Registration:**

- i. All Primes must register their company and activate an account in Elation Systems; and
- ii. All Primes must also ensure that all Subconsultants and Subcontractors register their company and activate an account in Elation Systems.

#### **Payment Verification:**

- i. All Prime Contractors must post all payments to their Subconsultants and/or Subcontractors in Elation Systems; and
- ii. All Prime Contractors and their Subconsultants and/or Subcontractors must confirm all payments received in Elation Systems.

#### **Certified Payroll Reporting:**

- All Prime Contractors are responsible for assigning someone from their staff with the responsibility to review, approve, and upload their CPR(s) on a weekly basis into Elation Systems; and
- ii. All Prime Contractors must also ensure that their Subcontractors upload their CPR(s) on a weekly basis into Elation Systems.

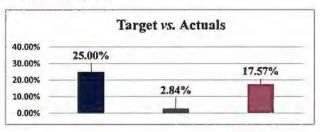

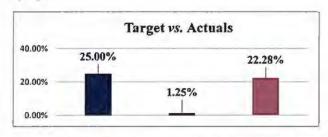

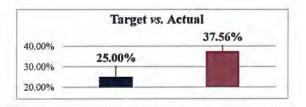

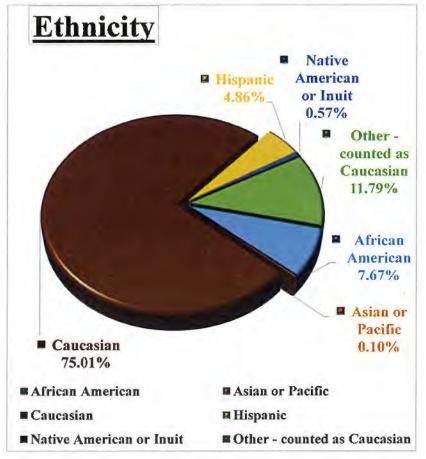

#### MINORITY, WOMEN AND SMALL BUSINESS ENTERPRISE PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission implemented a one-year Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) pilot program, with a 7% participation goal, and the Women Business Enterprise (WBE) pilot program with a 3% goal. These goals applied to consultants and contractors' participating in the Commission's Capital Program and were effective on September 1, 2008.

At its December 2008 Commission Meeting, the Commission revised the pilot program to specify a 25% Small Business Enterprise (SBE) goal to New Jersey assigned consultant contracts in lieu of the previously specified 7% MBE and 3% WBE goals.

At its December 2010 Commission Meeting, due to the success of the Commission's MWSBE Pilot Program, the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission adopted a resolution for permanent status of the Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) program, with a 7% participation goal, and the Women Business Enterprise (WBE) program with a 3% goal, and the Small Business Enterprise (SBE) program with a 25% goal. These goals apply to consultants and contractors' participating in the Commission's Capital Program.

The Contract Compliance Department continues to monitor, update and analyze the payments for the MWSBE diversity program.

a) PA Assigned Professional Services Contracts:	7% MBE and 3% WBE
b) No State Assigned Professional Services Contracts:	7% MBE and 3% WBE
c) Capital Plan Construction Contracts:	7% MBE and 3% WBE
d) NJ Assigned Professional Services Contracts:	25% SBE

Numerous diversified businesses have benefited and continue to benefit from the Commission's previous M/W/SBE Program. The number of Contracts awarded during the MWSBE Program are as follows:

A project kick-off meeting was held with Carr & Duff on July 14, 2017. Carr & Duff have commenced field activities and are currently performing tasks related to replacing the sign lighting elements.

#### LOWER TRENTON TOLL-SUPPORTED BRIDGE

#### NJ APPROACH TRAFFIC SIGNAL UPGRADES

Contract No. C-627B-4

French & Parrello Associates (FPA) prepared a change of plans to include additional pedestrian signal heads on all four corners of the New Warren Street and William Trent Place intersection. The conduits beneath the roadway are full and new wiring cannot be pulled to support the additional signal heads. Upon further investigation with Carr & Duff, there are several existing wires within the conduit that are not being used. Carr & Duff submitted a price for this work and a change order was issued.

#### Construction Contract No. TS-699A

Carr & Duff, Inc. (C&D) was awarded this contract at the Commission's March 2017 meeting and issued their full Notice to Proceed effective April 21, 2017.

During this reporting period C&D installed an auxiliary cabinet to house the UPS system on the existing control cabinet at the intersection of New Warren St. and William Trent Place; and began the pedestrian signal upgrades at the intersection of New Warren St. and William Trent Place.as requested by the Commission.

#### SCUDDER FALLS BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT

FINAL DESIGN Contract No. C-660A

During the November reporting period Michael Baker Jr., Incorporated (Baker) of Hamilton New Jersey, continued their coordination and support with the utility relocation effort in PA and NJ; continued to review and respond to various Requests for Information (RFIs) and submittals from the Contractor and the Construction Manager; and, attended the following meetings: two (2) T-668A Progress Meetings; and, various technical meetings involving design issues with the contractor and CM-CI team.

### Construction Contract No. T-668A

Trumbull Corporation of Pittsburgh, PA (Trumbull) was awarded the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Construction Contract T-668A in the amount of \$396,000,000.00 at the Commission's January 30, 2017 Meeting. The Commission issued a full Notice to Proceed on March 3, 2017.

Coordination Meetings continued between the Contractor and the Commission's Project team to discuss Project schedule, progress, and planning for ongoing and/or upcoming construction activities. Trumbull continued to submit Requests for Information (RFI's) and make required project submittals throughout this reporting period. To date there have been a total of 242 Contractor RFIs and 383 Contractor Submittals. Trumbull and the Construction Manager (Hill/Jacobs) have also been coordinating the submittal and review of the preliminary construction schedule. The Preliminary Baseline Schedule was approved in August and then updated in September. A Recovery Schedule was then requested and subsequently submitted by Trumbull since the contractor was at least 10 days behind schedule on certain items of work. The CM has provided comments to Trumbull on Schedule Update No. 3R and those comments have been addressed in the latest Schedule Update No. 4 that is currently being reviewed by the Construction Manager.

Ongoing construction activities continued, along with the startup of new activities in PA, NJ and the Delaware River. Trumbull has work areas extending throughout the project limits in order to complete parallel activities on the project. During the month of November Trumbull continued with the Main River Bridge trestle causeway in-river construction on both the NJ and PA sides of the river. Work progressed on the Main River Bridge Abutments, and the Pier 6 construction in NJ, as well as the Pier 1 construction in PA. Work also began on the Pier 5 cofferdam construction within the PA portion of the Delaware River and on the Taylorsville Road Bridge construction. In addition, work continued on the T-Wall construction within the median of I-95 in PA as well as the NJ I-95 access Ramp C Bridge and Ramp G Bridge Pier construction work.

The Hill team continues to supply construction management personnel as necessary, monitor Trumbull's performance and progress, conduct bi-weekly progress meetings, oversee and coordinate the three (3) construction inspection firms, perform utility coordination in NJ & PA, perform schedule reviews, conduct bi-weekly scheduling meetings, maintain document control, perform health and safety inspections, adjust project staffing as required, address material testing and inspection plan requirements, prepare monthly contractor invoices and manage overall project budget.

#### Construction Inspection of PA Approach Contract No. CI-671A

This Contract is for Construction Inspection (CI) Professional Services for the PA Approach Roadway Improvements portion of the Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project, Contract T-668A. TRC Engineers, Inc. (TRC) of Plymouth Meeting, PA was awarded this contract at the February 27, 2017 Commissioners' Meeting; and issued a full Notice to Proceed effective March 29, 2017.

During this reporting period TRC continued supplying inspectors to work on the Project under the supervision of the Construction Manager with now four (4) Inspectors on board. Additional Inspectors will be provided as the need arises based on the Contractor's schedule.

GF inspectors are also performing the quality control tests on the concrete that is poured within the New Jersey approach portion of the project.

MT organized and participated in the March 15, 2016 Open House/ No Net Loss Public Hearing held in Ewing Township and April 27, 2016 Pennsylvania Noise Walls Update Meeting. MT organized and participated in the July 19th & 21st District I Open House/Toll Hearings held in Ewing Township (NJ) and Lower Makefield Township (PA) respectively. MT also organized and participated in August 2<sup>nd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> District II Toll Hearings in Easton (PA) and Phillipsburg (NJ) respectively also and the August 9th & 11th District III Toll Hearings held in Montague (NJ) & East Stroudsburg (PA) respectively. During this reporting period, SCI was solicited to provide a cost to decommission the water well at the Commission's 1149 Woodside Road property, where the Commission owned house was recently demolished by Trumbull under their Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement contract. Sparwick's efforts are the most expeditious means to completing this work in support of the SFB Project schedule.

#### COMMISSION ADMINISTRATION BUILDING AT SCUDDER FALLS

Design Contract No. C-707A

The Purchasing Department issued two (2) requests for quotes (RFQ) for advance work. The first RFQ includes the tree cutting for the site. In order to comply with environmental regulations, it is necessary to complete all tree cutting between September 30<sup>th</sup> and November 1<sup>st</sup> to protect the Indiana Bat. A second RFQ includes the removal and disposal of asbestos containing materials located within the 1799 House. RFQ's were issued to contractors from state lists. Price proposals were received and are under review.

The design team prepared and submitted to the Bucks County Conservation District an application for the NPDES Permit. Pennsylvania has not passed legislation for renewing the General Permit application process, therefore it is critical that we receive the permit by December 7, 2017. Documents associated with the permit application process were also prepared and submitted to Bucks County and Lower Makefield Planning Commission. The Commission received PAC090109 from the Bucks County Conservation District.

An exterior survey of the 1799 House, including a pressure washing test of the exterior stucco was completed to determine how best to proceed with the exterior finish.

The design team submitted the pre-final design plans and specifications package and the documents were review by Commission Staff. Commission Staff and the design team met to complete a review of the building systems and discuss review comments.

## NEW HOPE-LAMBERTVILLE TOLL BRIDGE FLOOR SYSTEM REHABILITATION DESIGN SERVICES

This design has been incorporated into the I-78 Bridges & Approach Slab Rehabilitation Construction Contract T-644A by Gannett Fleming, under Professional Services contract C-644A.

During this reporting period, M&S continued their post-design services phase of this Task Order Assignment for construction contract T-644A.

#### DECEMBER 18, 2017 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

#### EASTON-PHILLIPSBURG TOLL BRIDGE

SALT STORAGE FACILITY CONCEPT STUDY Task Order Assignment No. C-702B-1

This Task Order Assignment is to perform a feasibility study for constructing a new salt storage facility to meet the needs at E-P Toll Bridge and to evaluate three potential sites for placement.

Field assessments were performed in March and a draft feasibility report was submitted in April. Comments have been generated and shared with the Consultant. This Task Order Assignment is to perform final design for constructing a new salt storage facility to meet the needs at M-M Toll Bridge in the general footprint of the existing damaged/undersized building.

The designer submitted final construction bid documents and assisted with bid review/evaluations IH provided the Commission final conformed documents and are currently providing post-design, post-award services.

CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT Task Order Assignment No. C-703A-3

Urban Engineers was issued Notice to Proceed effective October 16, 2017. A project kick-off meeting was held with Urban on October 16, 2017. Urban is providing a part time Project Manager, full time Resident Engineer/Inspector and part time Scheduler through this task order assignment. Urban attended a kick-off meeting with the contractor (Bracy), is conducting job progress meetings and performing construction management and inspection activities.

#### DECEMBER 18, 2017 PROJECT STATUS REPORT

CONSTRUCTION Contract No. T-717A

At the September 25, 2017 Commissioners Meeting, the Commission awarded Contract T-717A, Milford-Montague Toll Bridge, Salt Storage Building to Bracy Construction, Inc. The Commission issued a Limited Notice to Proceed effective September 25, 2017.

An on-site project coordination meeting was held with Bracy and their subcontractors on October 3, 2017. The Commission issued the full Notice to Proceed effective October 12, 2017.

A project kick-off meeting was held with Bracy on October 19, 2017. Bracy has commenced field activities and have demolished the old salt storage building and are currently performing tasks related to the construction of the new structure.

## APPROACH ROADWAY IMPROVEMENTS AT THE CENTRE BRIDGE - STOCKTON, NEW HOPE - LAMBERTVILLE, AND UHLERSTOWN - FRENCHTOWN TOLL-SUPPORTED BRIDGES

#### (DESIGN)

Task Order Assignment C-715A-1

Under this Task Order Assignment (TOA) the Consultant, Pennoni, Inc. (Pennoni), is providing professional services for the design of approach roadway improvements at the Centre Bridge – Stockton, New Hope – Lambertville, and Uhlerstown – Frenchtown Toll-Supported Bridges. Improvements include select roadway repaving, re-striping, three (3) ADA ramps, replacement of six (6) inlets, curbing repair and patching/coating of a retaining wall. Notice to proceed was given on September 25, 2017. A kick off meeting was held on October 3, 2017. Field visits occurred September 28 through October 3. Progress Meeting No. 1 was held on Friday, November 3. 60% Preliminary Design documents were submitted to the Commission and are currently under review by staff.

A Purchase Order was issued to Signal Service, Inc., West Chester, PA for the traffic counters, server and additional materials. Signal Service is a member of the Pennsylvania Department of General Services COSTARS Program (Cooperative Purchasing Contract No. 4400012659). The COSTARS Program sets the pricing for the traffic counters, auxiliary equipment, and software to be purchased.

A training session was completed for Commission staff on the use of the TrafiAlert program. The server currently resides with RTI for on-going configuration and we are accessing the data remotely. RTI is upgrading the software on the server. Upon completion of the upgrade, the server will be delivered to the Commission.

A field training session is being planned for the eight (8) Commission Maintenance staff members who are also members of the Traffic Count team.

## ELECTRONIC TOLL COLLECTION SYSTEM REPLACEMENT DESIGN, BUILD AND MAINTAIN Contract No. DB-540A

TransCore is addressing punch list items, final project documentation and as-built drawings. Project Provisional Acceptance was issued on August 16, 2017 and the project is transitioning into the maintenance phase.

(Berger), is providing professional services for the design of the installation of overweight / oversized vehicle detection linked to alarms, signage and camera to discourage the passage of these vehicles over selected bridges. Notice to proceed was given on December 15, 2015; kick off meeting was held on January 15, 2016. Existing plans were transmitted to Consultant in order to start construction plan preparation. Consultant conducted field visits to all five bridge sites February 18 & 19, 2016. A Meeting was held with IT and ESS on March 7, 2016 to discuss possible location of over height sensors and connectivity to existing communication systems. Plans showing proposed location of over height sensors, cameras and new weight restriction signing have been submitted and reviewed.

Based on review comments, locations will be adjusted and a field meeting with ESS will be scheduled to verify and finalize camera locations. Due to the departure of personnel, Berger submitted the name and qualifications of a new project manager which has been accepted by the Commission. Meeting is being scheduled to revise scope and discuss utilization of new communication infrastructure. As a result of the recent critical fracture of a truss member resulting in the closing of a PA Turnpike bridge, the scope of this contract was expanded. It has been decided to install sensors on all five bridges in the task order and to add the Milford Montague Bridge to the assignment. #### Meeting of December 18, 2017

#### PUBLIC SAFETY AND BRIDGE SECURITY MONTH OF NOVEMBER 2017

The below-listed items represent meetings, communications, tasks, and projects involving the Public Safety and Bridge Security Department:

#### Radio System

- During the month of November 2017, PSBS personnel continued working to complete the radio upgrade. Motorola completed a structural analysis on the Solebury tower, however negotiations to procure space continue.
- During the month of November 2017, negotiations to update the existing lease agreement with the owner of the Gravel Hill IR site have progressed to the point where counsel will be asked to prepare a draft agreement.
- During the month of November 2017, a radio fee audit was conducted with the New Jersey State Police (NJSP) in an effort to reduce the number of radios the Commission is being billed for on the NJSP radio system. Thirteen radios were removed from the system.
- PSBS personnel alone, and in conjunction with the New Jersey State Police investigated various other DRJTBC radio issues both during and after normal working hours.
- PSBS personnel continue to work with the Districts and IT to update the Cartegraph radio inventory database.

#### Access Control System

- During the month of November 2017, the cut over to the new access control system was completed. PSBS personnel are currently working with Engineering to utilize the employee ID badge in conjunction with the new "Gas Boy" fuel distribution system.
- During the month of November 2017, PSBS personnel worked with General Supply (Commission's locksmith) to address various lock issues and complete the yearly door lock maintenance.
- In November 2017, PSBS personnel created ID badges and toll cards for new employees and consultants.

- During the month of November 2017, the ACS database was audited and the system was purged of invalid employees and contractor cards. Various other employee ACS rights were updated and/or changed at the request of supervisors.
- Various door alarms and ACS issues were addressed both during and after normal working hours.

#### **PSBS**

- During the month of November 2017, PSBS personnel continued to work with Schneider Electric on various new Capital Projects, pending projects and current construction projects.
- During the month of November 2017, PSBS personnel continued working with Engineering on the new Scudder Falls facility and the renovations to the I-78 administration building.
- During the month of November 2017, the PSBS Primary Control Center started monitoring and evaluating Telegra analytics.
- During the month of November 2017, PSBS cameras were installed at the Scudder Falls Park and Ride.
- PSBS personnel reviewed and purged the PSBS video storage database that contains copies of videos requested by DRJTBC personnel and outside agencies.
- PSBS personnel worked during, and after normal working hours on numerous PSBS issues and problems raised by Commission members.
- The PSBS Primary Control Center (PCC) continues to operate 24/7 and detected, documented, and assisted the District bridges with various emergencies, traffic, and security related incidents.
- During the month of November 2017, PSBS personnel worked with several police departments and DRJTBC personnel on various inquiries and investigations. 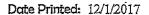
