BUDGET MESSAGE.

To the Legislature:

In accordance with the requirements of the Budget Act of 1916, as amended by the Laws of 1918, I am herewith transmitting to you a summary of the requests and reports made by the various State Departments, together with my recommendations thereon.

The total of such requests is \$22,570,914.61 and I recommend total appropriations of \$18,705,522.42; of this latter amount \$14,318,852.49 will be appropriated from General State Funds. The balance of \$4,386,669.93, represents appropriations from School Funds, Motor Vehicle Fees, Fish and Game Receipts, etc., to be expended for such purposes as are by law properly chargeable against such funds.

The estimate of available revenues as submitted by the State Comptroller and State Treasurer under date of December 31, 1924, shows available from General State Funds, \$14,320,191.70. As required by the law, my recommendations are within that sum.

The difficulties of previous years have again been repeated. As in former years, I have found it impossible to comply with all of the requests, because they exceeded the available funds by \$3,864,052.98, and the law requires that the budget shall balance.

Total Expenditures as above recommended, \$18,705,522 42

Although the sums requested no doubt included many that were not necessary, I am sure that most of the requests had merit, and the inability to include them necessarily deprives the departments of the opportunity for improving their work and giving increased facilities. It is, however, inevitable that this should occur, when more money is asked for than is available. Of necessity, someone must suffer.

The practice which provides for automatic increases of salaries, which I called to your attention last year, was again a stumbling block to the conservation of State funds for other purposes.

I felt in conscience bound to reduce the application for legislative employees, made by the officers of last year's Legislature, in the sincere hope that your body would see the wisdom of abolishing the deplorable custom of spending these State funds for political favors.

I trust that your body will inaugurate the custom of selecting only so many employees as are necessary, and selecting them for merit. In this way perhaps a new custom will be established and hereafter these moneys now wasted, will be saved. In addition to this, the members of the Legislature will no doubt find it much more convenient, personally, to be served by qualified employees, in place of those who know nothing about their duties, care less, and many of whom are seldom present.

I shall be glad to co-operate with you in this, not in any spirit of criticism, but one of mutual advantage, to practice economy.

I called your attention last year to the necessity of having all State funds paid into the State, but the Legislature did not react to my suggestion.

I am somewhat inclined to think that the Constitution requires that these funds should all be put into the State Treasury and appropriated by the Legislature.

The Legislature should be jealous of the authority placed in its hands by the fundamental law, and enact legislation to bring this about.

In the meantime, with this view in mind, in fixing the budget, for instance:

In the case of the Fish and Game Commission I have allowed for their disbursements this year the amount of their estimated receipts, in the belief that this department, as others, should balance its own budget. In order to secure the additional sums which they desire to spend this year over and above the \$267,000 which represents their receipts, they are appropriating from a reserve fund, which they have built up to over \$100,000. This reserve fund should be put into the general funds of the State, and could be used, among other things for the protection of our forests and the increase of our forest reservations, both of which are useful in the propagation and protection of game.

In my Annual Message I am again calling attention to the necessity for a continuation of the present State tax for the rehabilitation of our institutions and for the continuance of the institutional program. If such a law is enacted it will release some of our State funds for use in general State activities, and will provide funds for those who have had to be refused in this budget by reason of lack of funds.

This Budget Act has had a salutary effect upon our State finances, and is a useful instrument of efficiency and economy. With the experience gained since its enactment, much progress has been made. Heretofore, investigations and casual examinations have been made during the year, and in preparation for the budget hearings.

I believe there can be an extension of these activities which will bring beneficial results, and they will be pursued by the Budget Commissioners in cases where it is believed that additional information will produce greater economy, and at the same time not impair the efficiency.

With the passing of another year and the observations made during that time, together with the experience gained in the preparation of the budget, I am again impressed with the fact that public affairs cannot be conducted as prudently or as efficiently as private business. If they could, it would add much to our welfare and happiness. I am sure, however, that much more could be done to bring about this condition, if we could but convince those in authority that they should forget partisan politics, and think along business lines.

It is impossible to call to your attention, specifically or in detail, all the work done under the Budget Act.

SOLDIERS' BONUS BONDS.

Pursuant to Chapter 159, Laws of 1920, \$12,000,000.00 5% bonds of the State of New Jersey were issued for the payment of a bonus to Soldiers and Sailors of our State in the late war with the German Empire, and a Sinking Fund created for the purpose of paying the principal of the bonds as required by the act. This issue was made previous to the current fiscal year.

STATE HIGHWAY EXTENSION BONDS.

Pursuant to Chapter 352, of the Laws of 1920, bonds of the State of New Jersey were issued in the sum of \$5,000,000.00 during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1922, \$7,000,000.00 issued during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1923, and \$5,000,000.00 additional issued during the year just closed, making a total of \$17,000,000.00 for the purpose of paying the cost of extending

the system of State highways by the construction of bridges and tunnels for vehicular or other traffic across the Delaware and Hudson Rivers. A Sinking Fund was created as provided by this act for paying the principal of the bonds.

STATE HIGHWAY FUND BONDS, ROADS AND BRIDGES.

Pursuant to Chapter 262, Laws of 1922, bonds of the State of New Jersey were issued in the sum of \$8,000,000.00 during the fiscal year just closed, \$6,000,000.00 of which sum was for the construction and improvement of roads, and \$2,000,000.00 for bridges. A Sinking Fund was created as provided by said act for paying the principal of the bonds.

The condition of the Sinking Funds created by the three acts above referred to, is shown by statements of the balance sheet in the preceding pages.

CERTIFICATES OF THE STATE ISSUED TO THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE.

Pursuant to Chapter 417 of the Laws of 1895, certificates amounting to \$116,000.00 were issued to the Commissioners of the Agricultural College.

Under an act of Congress of the United States, approved July 2, 1862, entitled "An act donating public lands to the several States and Territories which may provide colleges for the benefit of agriculture and the mechanic arts," there was invested for the benefit of the State Agricultural College the sum of \$116,000.00 in the war bonds of the State, being the proceeds from sales of land script. The war bonds have all matured and been paid. Owing to the inability of the Commissioners to invest the said sum of \$116,000.00 conformably to the said act of Congress, which provides, "That all moneys derived from the sale of the lands aforesaid by the States to which the lands are apportioned, and from the sales of land script hereinbefore provided for, shall be invested in stocks of the United States, or of the States, or some other safe stocks, yielding not less than five per centum

upon the par value of said stock," the Legislature, at the session of 1895, passed an act authorizing the Commissioners to transfer and pay over, as money shall be by them received, to the Sinking Fund of this State, and authorizing the State Treasurer and Comptroller to issue and deliver therefor to said Commissioners a certificate of this State to the effect that the State will pay to said Commissioners five per centum annually of the amount so paid into or transferred to the Sinking Fund.

Under an act approved April 8, 1903, the Sinking Fund has been assigned and is now a part of the permanent School Fund of the State.

The assets of the State Fund consist of 1,887 shares of stock of the United Railroad and Canal Company of New Jersey, the market value of which amounts to about \$370,000.00.

SUPPLEMENTAL ESTIMATE OF FUNDS AVAILABLE FOR APPROPRIATION FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 1926.

Hon. George S. Silzer, Governor:

At the conclusion of the first six months of the fiscal year beginning July 1st, 1924, I beg to submit to you an increase in the estimate of moneys devoted exclusively for State purposes, payable from the general fund of the State in excess of that stated in my annual report, submitted July 1st, 1924.

At that time it was estimated by this department that the miscellaneous receipts of the State for the fiscal year ending June 30th, 1925, would be \$16,675,635.00, which estimate included moneys appropriated from sources other than miscellaneous receipts, being the appropriation made for educational purposes, Motor Vehicle Department, Fish and Game Commission, Department of Commerce and Navigation and Elimination of Toll Bridges totaling \$4,039,486.10.

Deducting this sum from the gross estimate above mentioned leaves the net sum to be devoted exclusively to the general State appropriation, \$12,636,148.90.

In addition to the above estimate of receipts my report submitted on June 30th indicated a surplus above all liabilities of \$984,042.80, which sum was increased September 30th, 1924, through lapsing of appropriations no longer needed in a sum of \$700.000. The total of the free balance on June 30th, 1924, and the additional lapses of September 30th, leaves a free balance of \$1,684,042.80, which together with the estimated receipts for the next fiscal year equivalent to that of the previous year of \$12,636,148.90 will make available for appropriation exclusive of the five departments herein mentioned, the sum of \$14,320,191.70.
