GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY
OF THE
STATE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE COMMISSION

The Commission has a limited fund which it will allocate on an equitable basis to those municipalities whose financial condition is such that they are unable to finance their entire cost of relief during the last six months of the calendar year 1936.

As their financial condition warrants, municipalities will be reimbursed in part for their expenditures in payment of relief commitments made after June 30, provided they shall conduct a humane relief program within their municipality. Standards of relief advocated by the Commission are in preparation which will be released to the municipalities shortly.

Municipalities will be expected to pay any indebtedness or balance due the STATE ERA; keep a separate bank account for relief funds and to pay out of that account only for relief; keep accurate records of relief commitments and expenditures in the manner prescribed by the Commission and promptly render such reports as are required by the Commission.

No municipality will receive financial assistance for expenditures in payment of relief commitments made prior to July 1, 1936, nor for any expenditures for administration.

Neither shall a municipality receive assistance when it shall be found upon investigation that the municipality is capable of bearing their entire relief cost without undue hardship to its taxpayers.

If the municipality has heretofore been classified as "non-participating"; that is, if they have been conducting their own relief without State aid, the Commission will assume that the municipality can continue on a non-participating basis unless reasonable cause can be shown for a change in status.

Financial assistance may be discontinued if the municipality fails to comply with the rules and regulations promulgated from time to time by the Commission.

The Commission will receive requests for reimbursement from the municipalities complying with its policies and will after review make as a part reimbursement an allotment of funds in an amount calculated by the uniform formula adopted by the Commission.

Vouchers for the payment of the allotments to the municipalities shall be presented to the Director of the Commission and such vouchers after approval shall be forwarded to the Comptroller of the Treasury of the State of New Jersey for examination, audit and warrant to the Treasurer of the State to be paid by him in the same manner as other claims against the State.

The formula and method of calculation is set forth in an accompanying memorandum.

UNIFORM FORMULA (REVISED) FOR CALCULATING APPORTIONMENT
OF FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FUNDS TO MUNICIPALITIES

In the act creating the State Financial Assistance Commission, is a declaration of public policy that "every needy persons shall, while in the State of New Jersey, be entitled to receive such public assistance as may be necessary" and that "the furnishing of such public assistance is primarily the duty of the municipality and of civic and charitable organizations".

The State Financial Assistance Commission was created to aid municipalities financially unable to carry their entire cost of relief and funds were appropriated to the Commission for that purpose.

The Commission realizes that it has insufficient funds to pay each municipality in full for their expenditures for relief during the last six months of the current year (1936). Also that some municipalities are in much better financial condition than others and therefore better able to bear a larger proportion of their relief cost.

In order to equalize the difference in the municipal ability to pay, it was necessary to devise a method or formula which at all times can be uniformly applied in the allocation of funds to all municipalities. The problem has but two constant factors. One of these is the ratables of the municipalities and the other the amount of the fund appropriated to the Commission.

Any estimate as to the probable cost of relief is subject to change and the formula or method must be such that it will in its application take care of such change so that the sum of the amounts allocated to the municipalities does not exceed the amount of the fund appropriated to the Commission. In other words the allocations should figure out an even \$7,500,000.

The formula hereinafter described has been applied to a tabulation of all participating municipalities in the State and the resultant total of the municipalities' share is \$2,211,151 or within \$3,349. of the desired total of \$2,500,000. An error factor of only 39/100 of 1%.

Certain factors have been considered. These for all municipalities in the aggregate being:

Total net valuations of participating municipalities..	\$5,482,833,298.

On a flat average basis, each municipality would be called upon to bear that part of their 1936 (estimated) relief cost as would be represented by an .41 mill tax, which is approximately half the average millage of the aggregate 1935 municipal participation of \$4,557,205.

This average millage cannot be uniformly applied to all municipalities due to varying local financial conditions. These conditions are:

1. The collection of taxes
2. Unpaid State and county taxes
3. Defaults in bonds and/or interest payments
4. Credit position - indicated by the percentage of gross debt to their net valuation taxable.

Giving consideration to these factors, municipalities have been graded according to the following table:

Grading of Municipalities

Municipalities are given a primary grading based on the percentage of tax collections to tax levy. (If there are no adjustments, this primary grading becomes their final grading.)

The primary grading is then adjusted as to unpaid State and County taxes and defaults in bond and/or interest payments. The adjustment is calculated by capitalizing the amount of the unpaid taxes and defaults on a 4% interest rate adding that amount to the gross debt and refiguring the relation or percentage of the "adjusted" gross debt to the net valuation taxable.

If the gross debt or the "adjusted" gross debt equals or exceeds 25% of the valuation, the primary tax collection grading is lowered one grade. This method makes for a proportionately greater part reimbursement to municipalities in poor financial condition and decreases the reimbursement to municipalities in good financial condition.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF FORMS NO. FAC-S6

General

The monthly relief report Form No. FAC-S6 is to be filled out each month beginning with April 1936 and forwarded to the Financial Assistance Commission, State House, Trenton, not later than ten days after the end of the month covered by the report. Each report should be certified by the Director of the local relief agency.

Section A of this report should cover the following types of relief:

- (1) Wages paid for work performed
- (2) Cash paid as direct relief
- (3) Food
- (4) Fluid Milk
- (5) Shelter
- (6) Clothing
- (7) Coal
- (8) Other Fuel
- (9) Gas and light
- (10) Medical Service
- (11) Medical Supplies
- (12) Household Supplies
- (13) Other

The following types of relief should be included in Section D and not in Section A.

- (1) Hospitalization and Care in Clinics
- ~~(2) Almshouse care (Welfare Houses)~~
- (3) Burials
- (4) Transportation of relief clients to the place of their legal settlement.
- (5) Sponsors' contribution to projects approved by the State Financial Assistance Commission.

This report should not include the following types of assistance:

- (1) Old age assistance, blind pensions, mothers' pensions, aid to dependent children and veterans' relief
- (2) Federal Surplus Commodities and commodities produced on WPA projects.
- (3) Relief from private funds, such as community chests and family welfare agencies.
- (4) Wages paid to persons for work on WPA or other Federal Work Program projects.
- (5) Loans or grants made by the Resettlement Administration.

Relief is to be reported for the calendar month in which it is issued to recipients regardless of the month in which the bills are paid by the municipality. The number of single person cases to be reported is the number of unattached persons living by themselves in separate households who received relief during

the calendar month. All families and groups of persons maintaining a single household who receive relief during the month are to be reported as family cases.

Specific Instructions

Enter in the space provided at the top of the report the name of the municipality, the name of the county in which it is located and the month for which the report is made.

SECTION A.

This section relates to general relief given during the month in the form of work relief and direct relief. There will be no cases to be reported as receiving both work relief and direct relief in the same month, since the Financial Assistance Commission has ruled that other general relief cannot be given to supplement work relief wages. The only type of supplementary relief that may be given to a person receiving work relief wages is hospitalization, care in clinics and burial expenses.

Direct Relief

Direct relief is all general relief issued which is not cash given in return for work performed. It will therefore include all general relief given in kind and all direct relief given in cash.

Line 1 - Enter in column 2 the total number of families receiving direct relief during the month. Enter in column 3 the total number of persons who share in the relief issued to the families reported in column 2. In column 4, enter the amount of direct relief issued during the month to the families entered in column 2.

Line 2 - Enter in both columns 2 and 3 the total number of unattached persons (non-family persons living by themselves in separate households) receiving direct relief during the month. Enter in column 4, the amount of direct relief issued to the single persons entered in column 2.

Work Relief

Work Relief is to include only cash paid as wages for work performed. It will not include any relief given in kind.

Line 3 - Enter in column 2 the number of families receiving work relief wages. Enter in column 3 the total number of persons who share in the relief reported in column 2. Enter in column 4 the total amount of work relief wages issued during the month to the families entered in column 1.

Line 4 - Enter in columns 2 and 3 the total number of single person cases (non-family persons living by themselves in separate households) receiving work relief wages during the month. Enter in column 4 the total amount of work relief wages issued during the month to the single persons entered in column 1.

Line 5 - Enter in column 2 the total number of cases receiving general relief during the month (sum of lines 1, 2, 3 and 4.) Enter in column 3 the total number of persons receiving work and direct relief during the month

(sum of lines 1,2,3 and 4). In column 4 enter the total amount of work and direct relief issued to families and single persons during the month (sum of line 1,2,3 and 4).

SECTION B.

Enter in column 2 opposite each item the amount of each type of relief specified that is issued during the month. Relief is to be reported in this section, as in Section A, in the calendar month in which it was issued to recipients regardless of the month the bills are paid by the municipality. Enter on line 1 the total amount of cash relief issued to recipients for work performed. Enter on line 2 all other cash issued to recipients as Direct Relief during the month. Do not include on line 10 medical care given by a regular county or city physician or nurse. In column 1, line 13, specify other types of general relief, if any, which are given during the month. Enter in column 2 the amount of those types of relief issued during the month. On line 14 enter the sum of the amounts entered on lines 1 to 13 inclusive. This amount must equal the total amount reported in column 4, line 5, Section A.

SECTION C.

In this section should be reported the costs of administering the relief program reported in Section A and should include salaries, travel expenses, supplies, and rental of office space and equipment. Do not include in this section the administrative costs of alms houses (welfare houses), hospitals or other institutions.

Line 1 - Enter the amount of wages and salaries earned during the month by the persons administering general relief. Do not include earnings of relief persons.

Line 2 - Enter the amounts used for travel expenses.

Line 3 - Enter all other general relief administrative costs.

Line 4 - Enter the total cost of administering general relief during the month. The sum of the amounts entered on lines 1,2, and 3 should equal the amount entered on line 4.

Line 5 - Enter the number of persons on the administrative payroll during the month whose salaries were reported on line 1, Section C.

SECTION D.

Dear Sir:

By resolution adopted July 13, a cash advance for relief requirements for the month of July only was authorized by the Commission for those municipalities who are financially unable to continue to adequately provide relief without assistance.

Municipalities requiring financial assistance are requested to have their governing body adopt the resolution attached hereto. Two typewritten certified copies of the Resolution as adopted should be prepared.

The municipality should also complete the original and duplicate copies of the attached invoice form #100. The name of the municipality with the designation, township, borough, city, etc., and the address to which the check is to be sent should appear in the upper part of the invoice. Opposite the first dollar sign should be entered the amount appearing in the resolution. The Chief Financial Officer or other competent official should take the affidavit at the bottom of the invoice. The section including the words "Approved for \$" and "Approval Officer" are reserved for the State Director's use.

The amount of the municipal share will be calculated in this office and a check for the net amount of the cash advance mailed by the State Treasurer's office soon after August 1st when funds become available.

Qualifications for receiving a cash advance are:

1. The municipality shall have received during 1936 a grant or allocation from the Emergency Relief Administration and shall have paid the Administration any indebtedness or balance due.
2. Shall conduct a humane but economical relief program.
3. Keep a separate bank account for relief funds and pay out of that account only for relief.

4. Keep accurate records of relief commitments and expenditures.

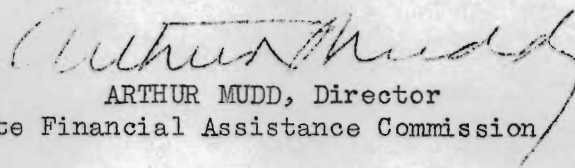
The advance against July relief expenditures does not establish a precedent nor will the amount remitted indicate the amount to be remitted for succeeding months.

You will shortly receive Request for Reimbursement forms which properly filled out will be the basis for calculating a part reimbursement against expenditures for relief commitments made after June 30. The first part reimbursement will be for July expenditures in payment of July commitments. (The reimbursement will be in addition to the cash advance). No reimbursement is contemplated for commitments made prior to July 1st.

The amount of the cash advance will be deducted from the part reimbursement made in the latter months of the year, probably November and/or December.

INSTRUCTIONS

The form is printed and collated in triplicate. Original on white paper, duplicate on buff and triplicate on pink. The pink copy, which will be retained by the municipality, may be used as a work sheet and other copies prepared from it.

How soon the municipality will receive their reimbursement check will depend upon their promptness in preparing their request, which should be submitted about the 5th of the succeeding month. Time is required for the Comptroller's auditor to examine and certify, for the calculation and approval of the reimbursement by the Commission, for the warranting of the payment by the State Comptroller and the preparation and mailing of the check by the State Treasurer.

Pages 2 and 3 should be completed before the invoice (page 1) is prepared.

HEADING — Page 2.

Requests should be numbered serially. The first request will be numbered No. 1. With the name of the municipality should be stated whether City, Town, Borough, etc. Population as of the 1930 census. Date the day prepared. Enter name of month the report covers in space provided.

SECTION "A"

Show in this section disbursements during month analyzed by type of relief and month in which commitment was made. The commitment month is that in which the relief order was issued. The first report will cover only July commitments paid in July. There will be no reimbursement for expenditures in payment of commitments made prior to July 1st.

Relief given non-residents should be entered on line designated and without reference to type of relief.

SECTION "B"

"Total cases" are the sum of "Single Persons receiving relief" and "Families receiving relief." "Average case cost" is determined by dividing "total commitments" by "total cases."

SECTION "C"

Relief expenses other than salaries should be grouped under not more than three headings and classifications typed under the ruled lines between words "total salaries" and "total."

SECTION "D"

This section is generally self-explanatory. With regard to 1936 levy collected, the first quarter means 1936 taxes collected between January 1—March 31, and similarly for subsequent quarters.

SECTION "E"

The first item to be entered will be the balance as of July 1st. If a deficit, show in red. For the first report receipts and disbursements for the month of July only will be entered. Subsequent reports will continue to carry the balance or deficit as of July 1st. In the receipt column will be entered in one amount monies received during the current month. The total receipts of previous months (July and subsequent) will be entered in one amount on the next line. Disbursements will be treated similarly. Current month disbursements will be shown in one amount and previous disbursements from July 1st to the first of the current month will be shown in one amount.

SECTION "F"

Show in this section the total number of approved projects sponsored by the municipality, together with their cost, the contribution made by the municipality and how that contribution was financed.

Also show the effect on the relief roll as to clients taken off, returned and now employed by the WPA. If no supplementary relief is given WPA workers, indicate by the word NONE.

AFFIDAVIT

The Chief Financial Officer of the municipality shall execute the affidavit. His name shall be typed on the first line before the words "Being Duly Sworn" and his title shall appear on the line with the signature. The affidavit may be taken before a notary public or other officer authorized to administer oaths.

COMPTROLLER'S AUDITOR

A Comptroller's auditor will make the necessary examination and certify and stamp both original and duplicate. If any differences are found by the auditor, he will make correction in pen and ink and the same shall be initialed by the Chief Financial Officer.

INVOICE FORM

After the Auditor has completed his examination and certification, the invoice form will be prepared by the municipality. Only the following information need be entered.

1. The name and type of the municipality and the address to which the check is to be mailed.
2. The date of the invoice on the line and to the left of the words, "For relief reimbursement for the month of....."
3. The name of the month followed by the approved total from Section "A" in the amount column.

The "date" and "month of" on the invoice shall be the same as shown at the top of page 2.
