

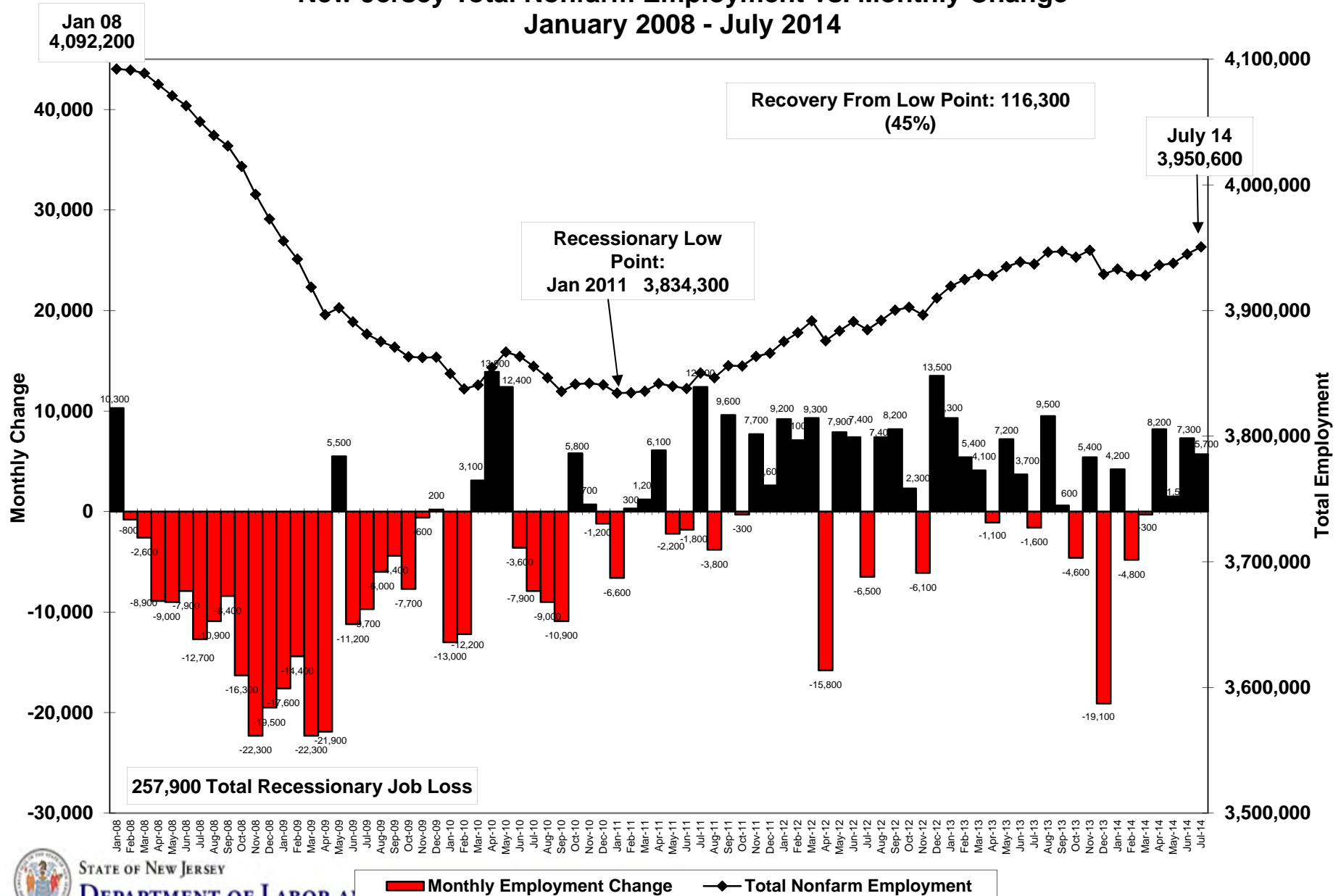

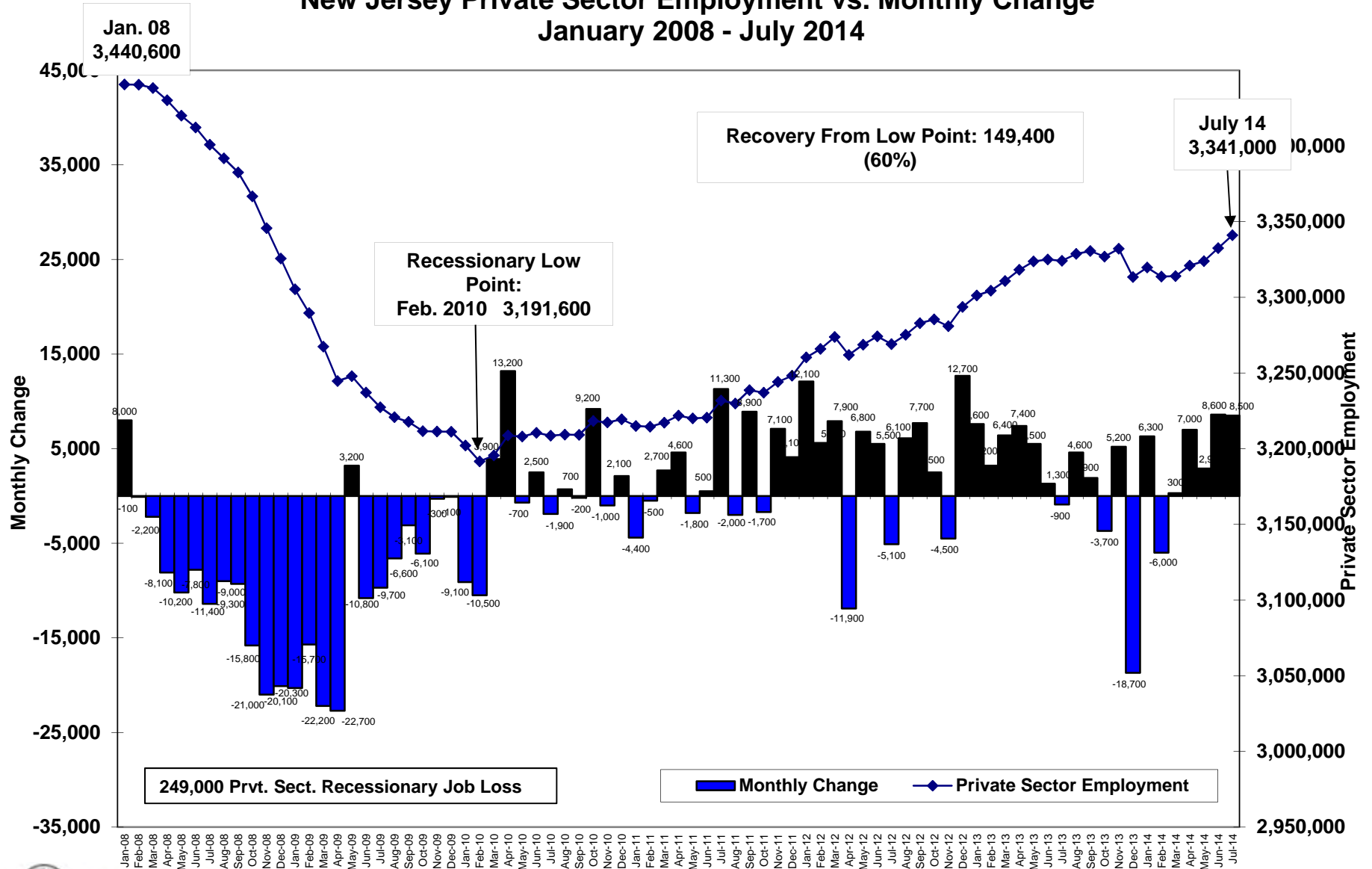


New Jersey Total Nonfarm Employment vs. Monthly Change January 2008 - July 2014

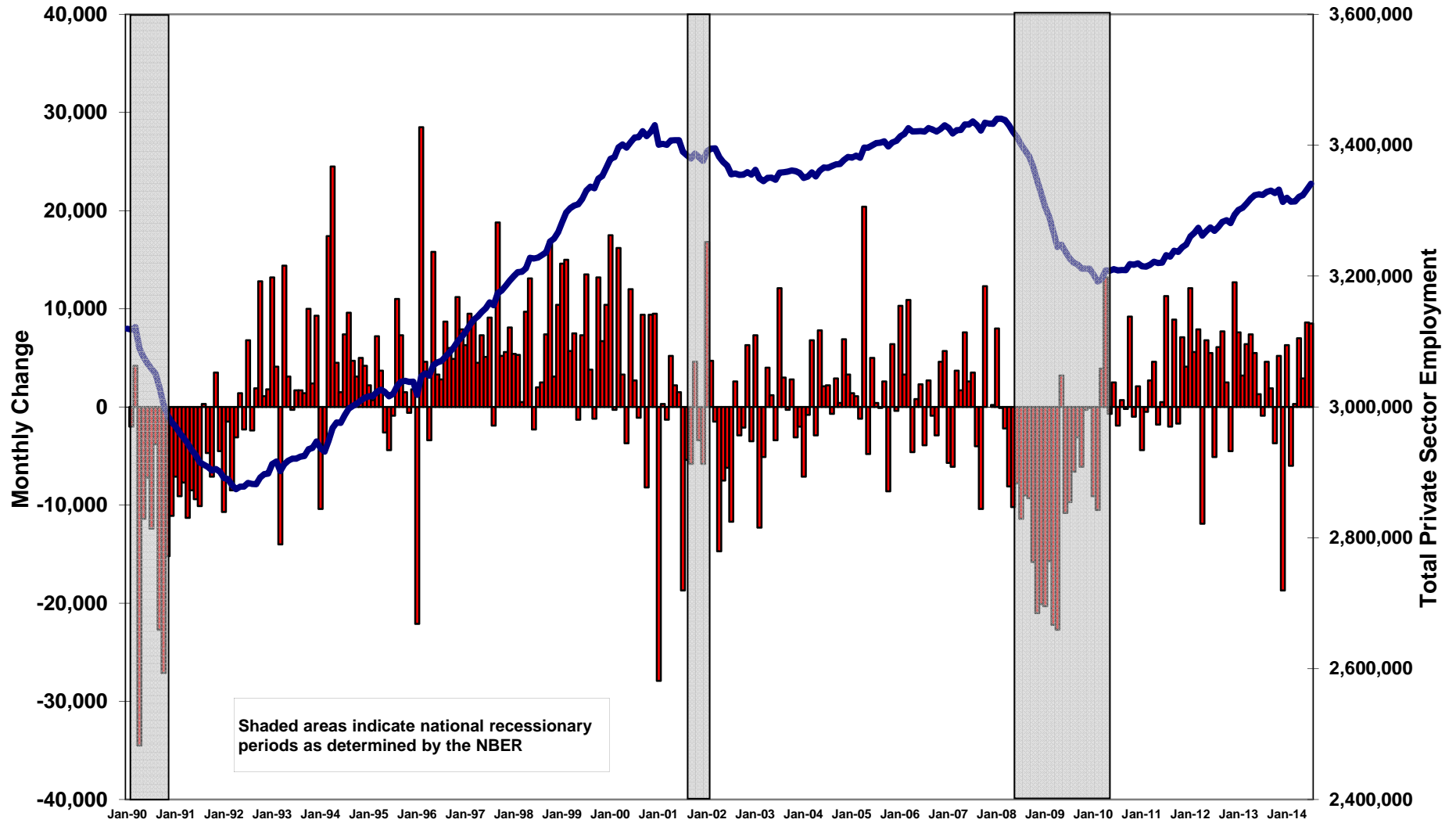


Monthly Employment Change Total Nonfarm Employment

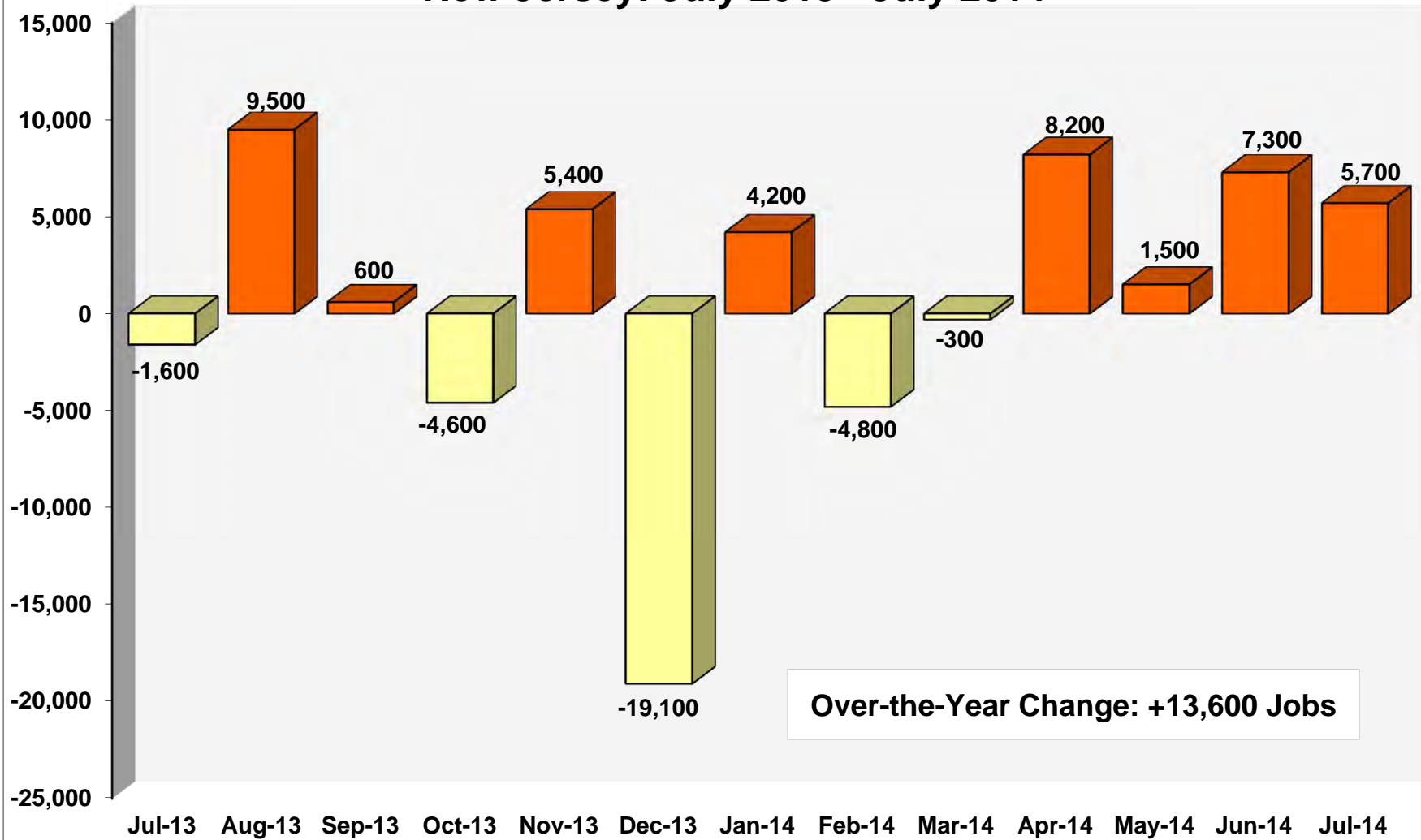

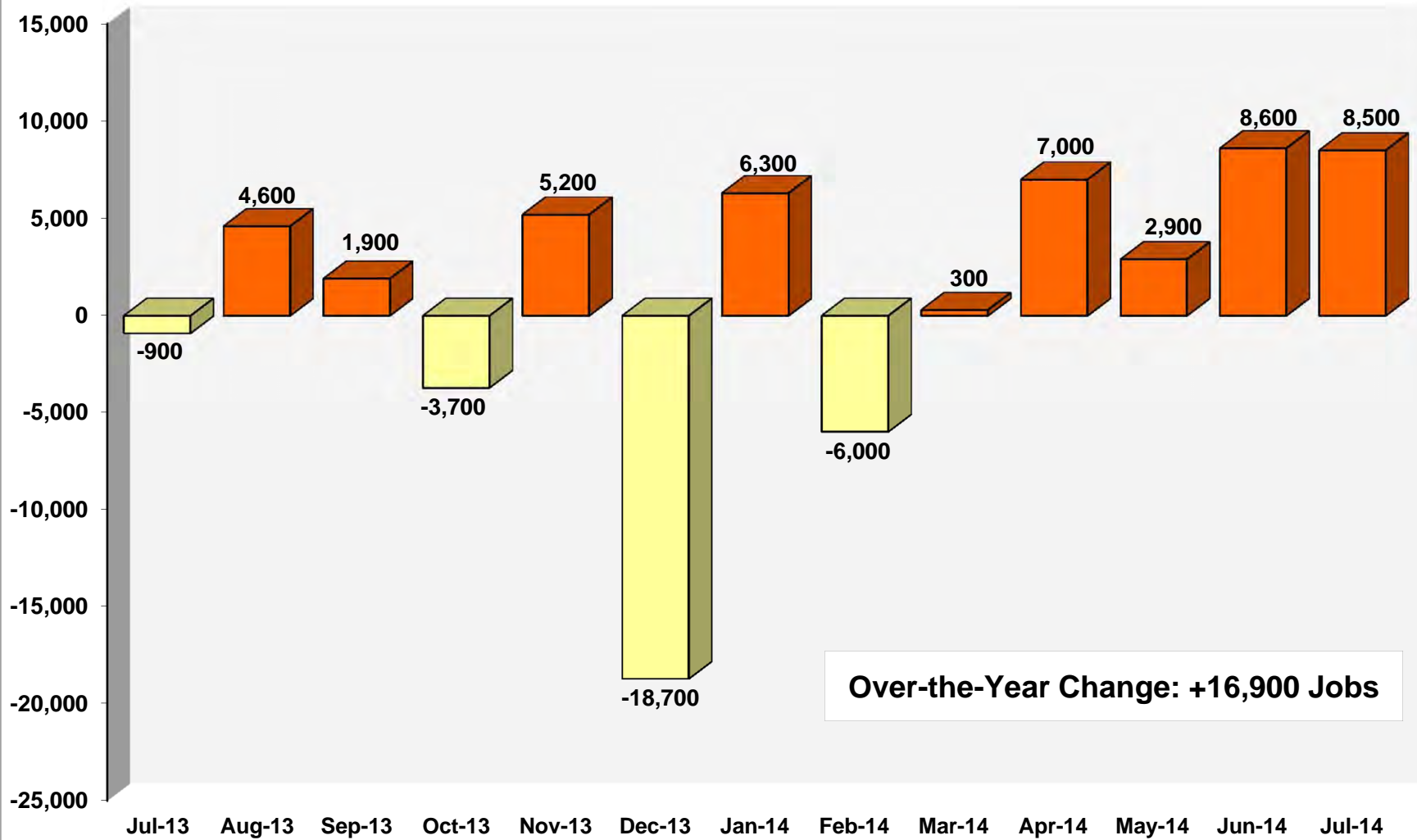
Monthly Total Employment Change New Jersey: July 2013 - July 2014



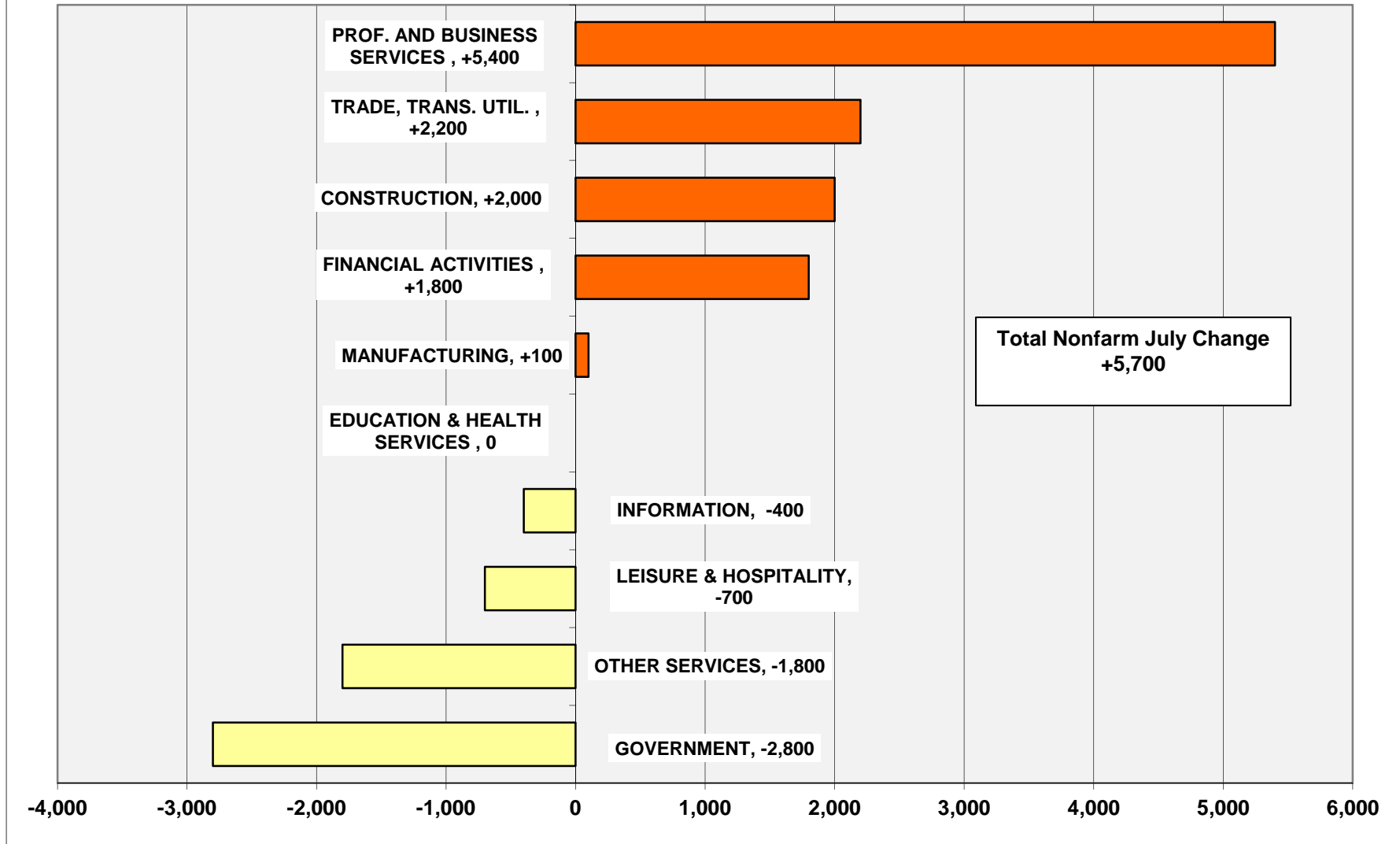

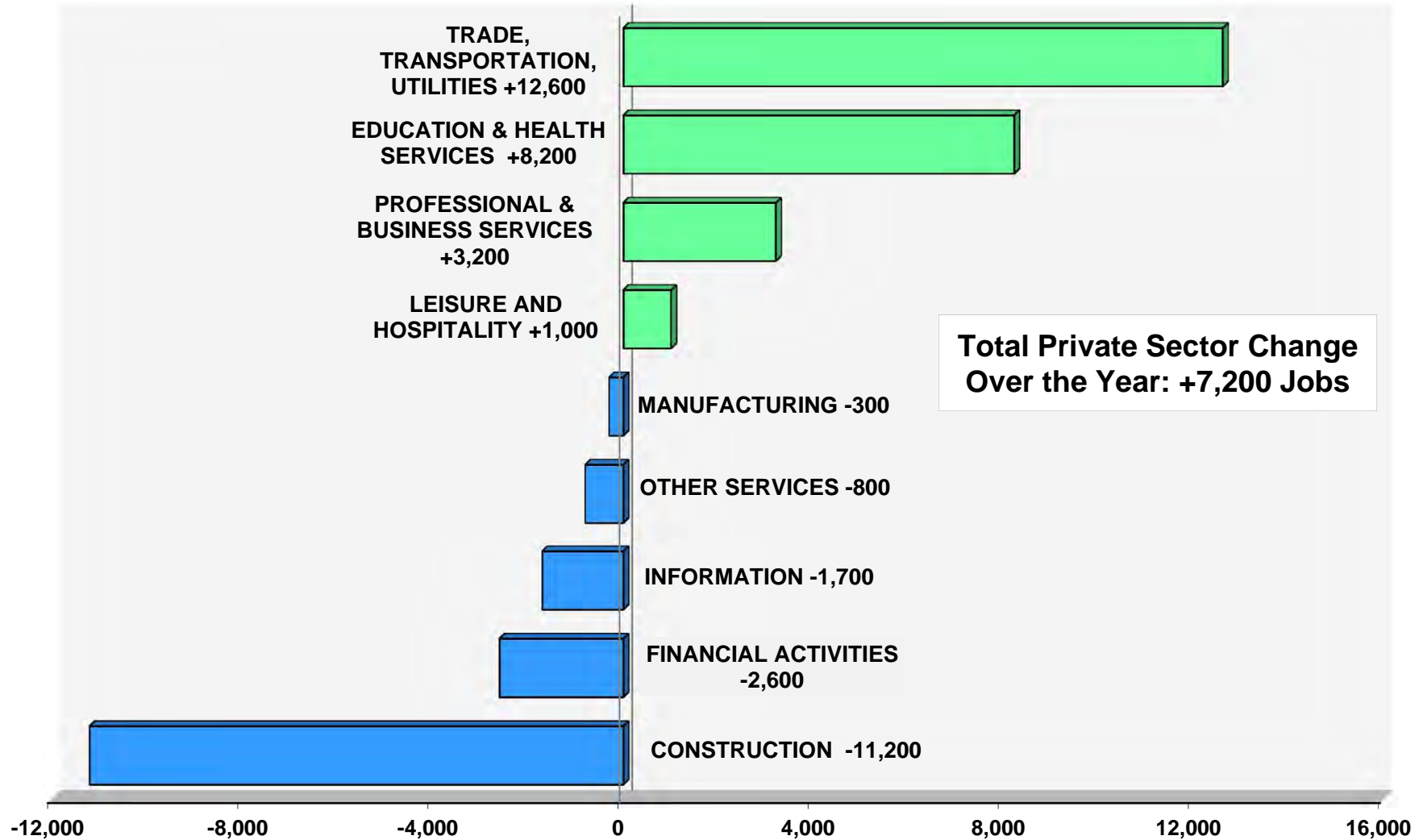
Monthly Private Sector Employment Change July 2013 - July 2014



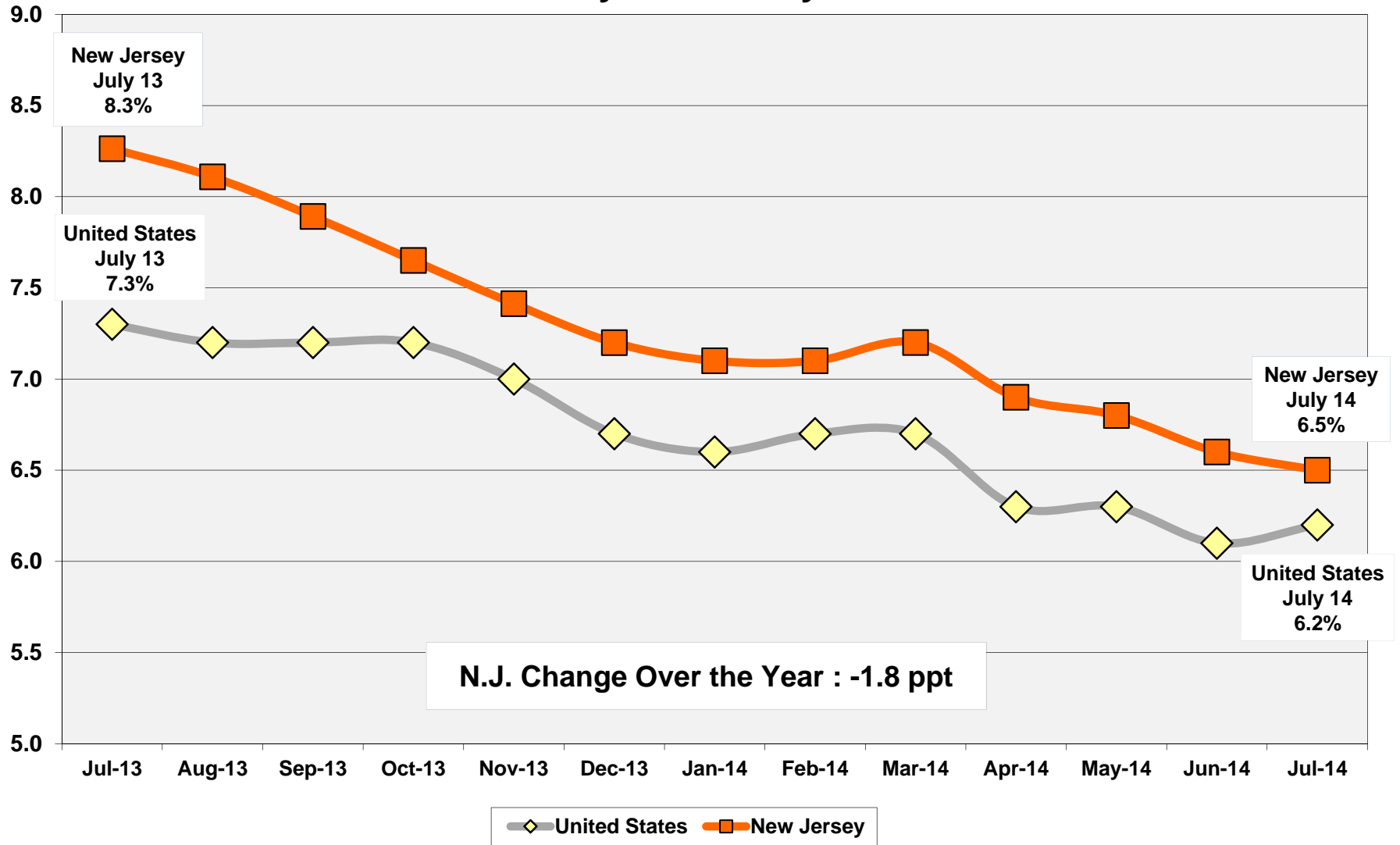
Monthly Employment Change: July 2014



New Jersey Private Sector Employment Change by Industry June 2013 - June 2014



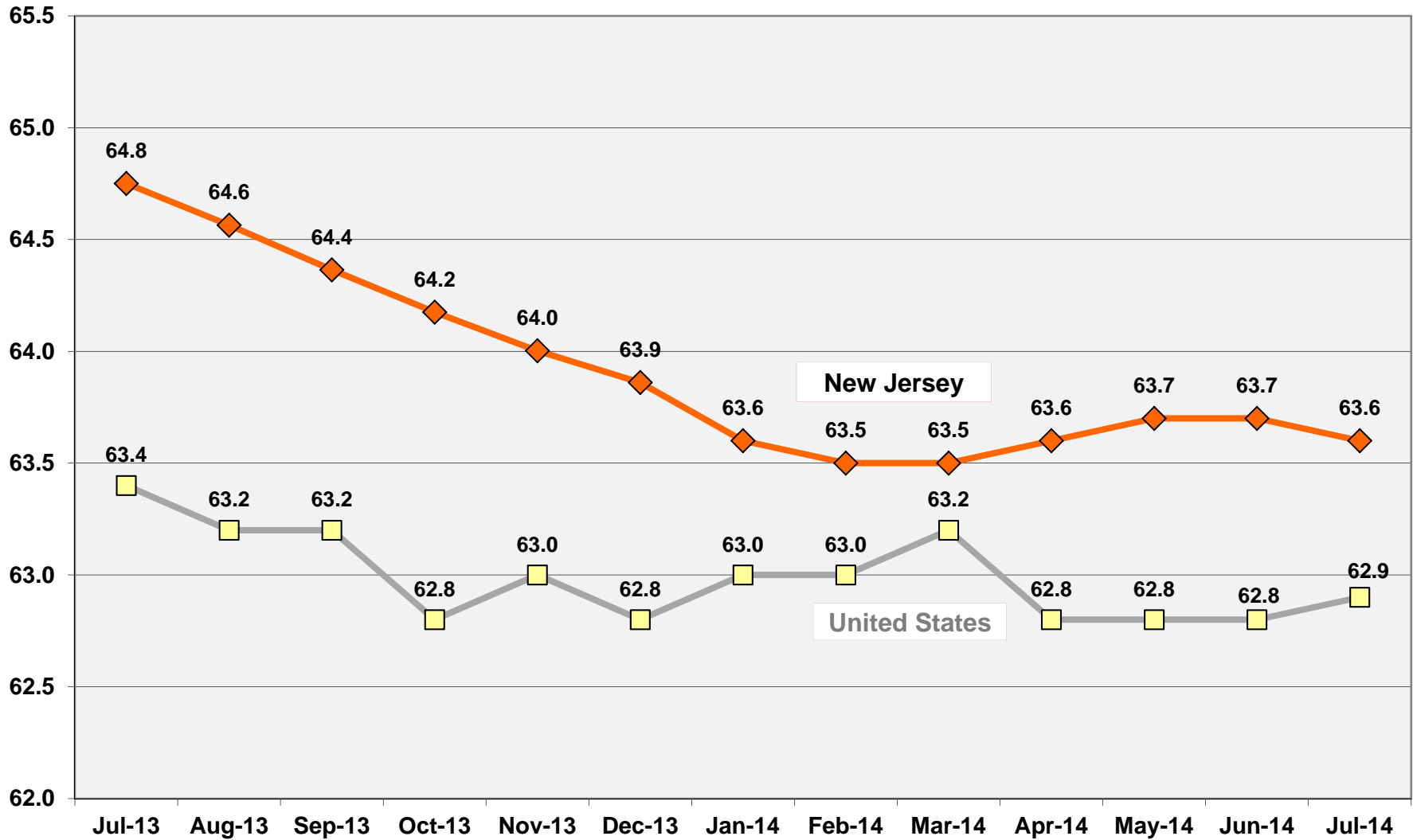
Unemployment Rates, New Jersey vs. United States: July 2013 - July 2014

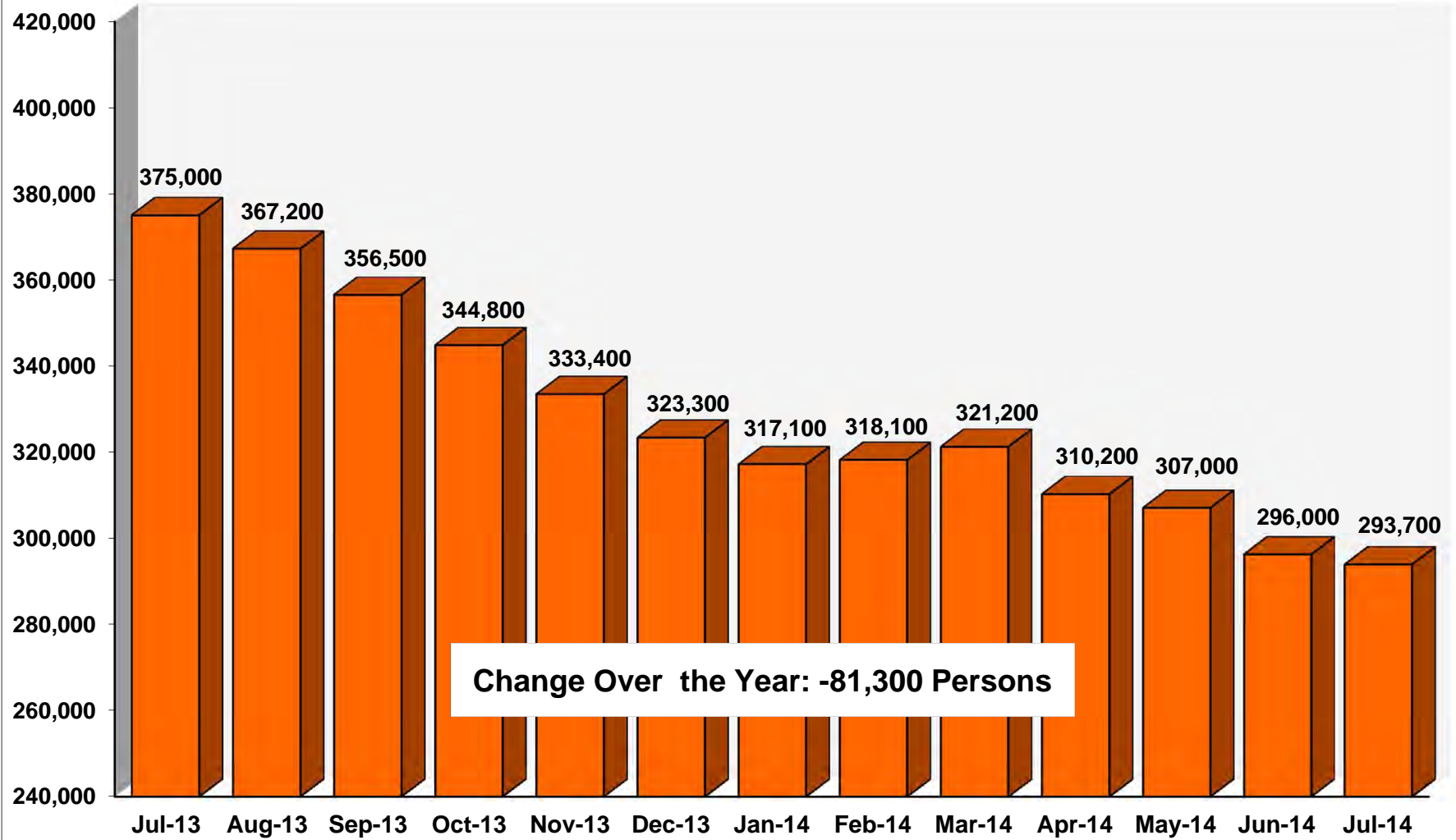
New Jersey vs. United States, Labor Force Participation Rate: July 2013 - July 2014

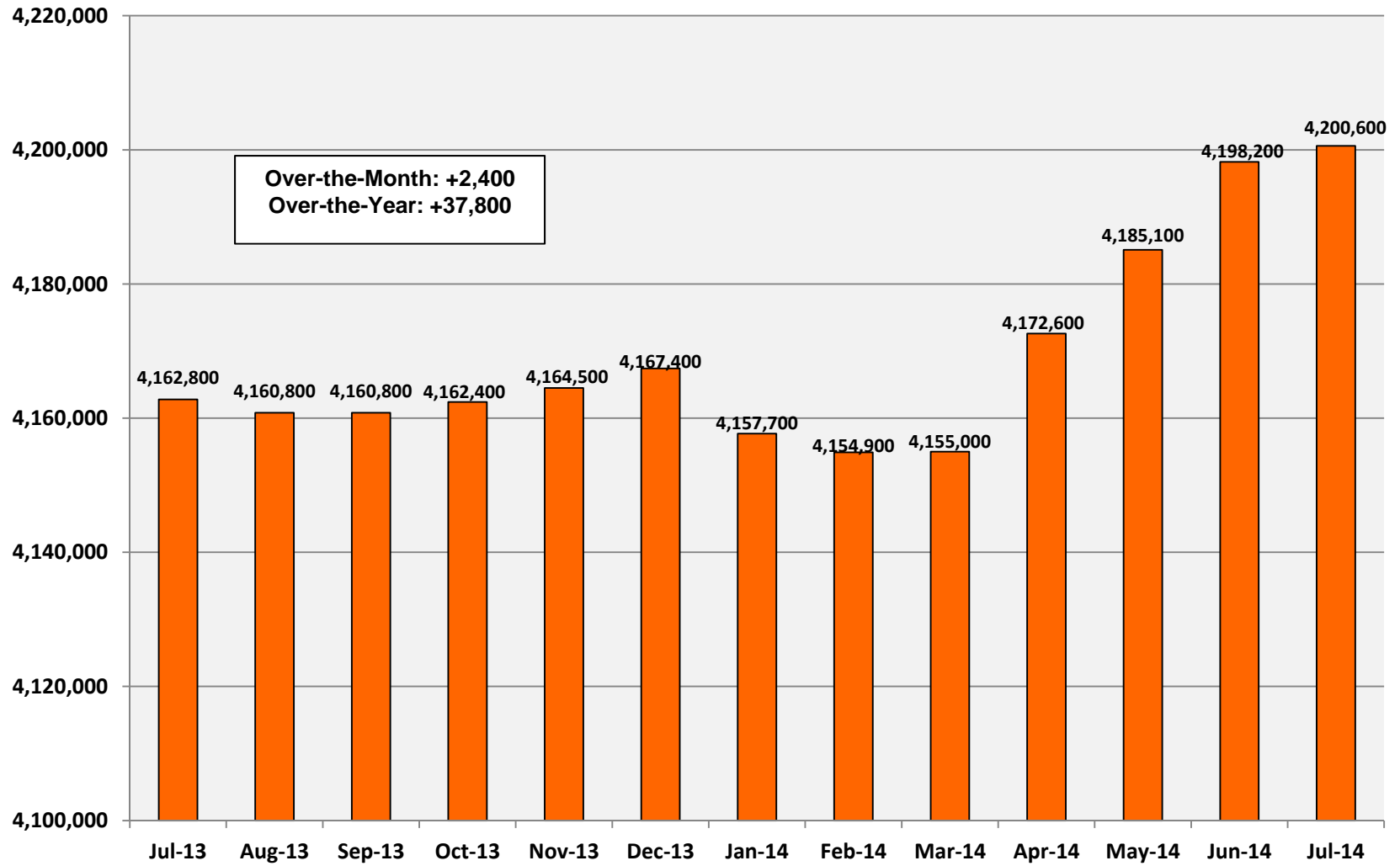
Unemployed New Jersey Residents July 2013 - July 2014

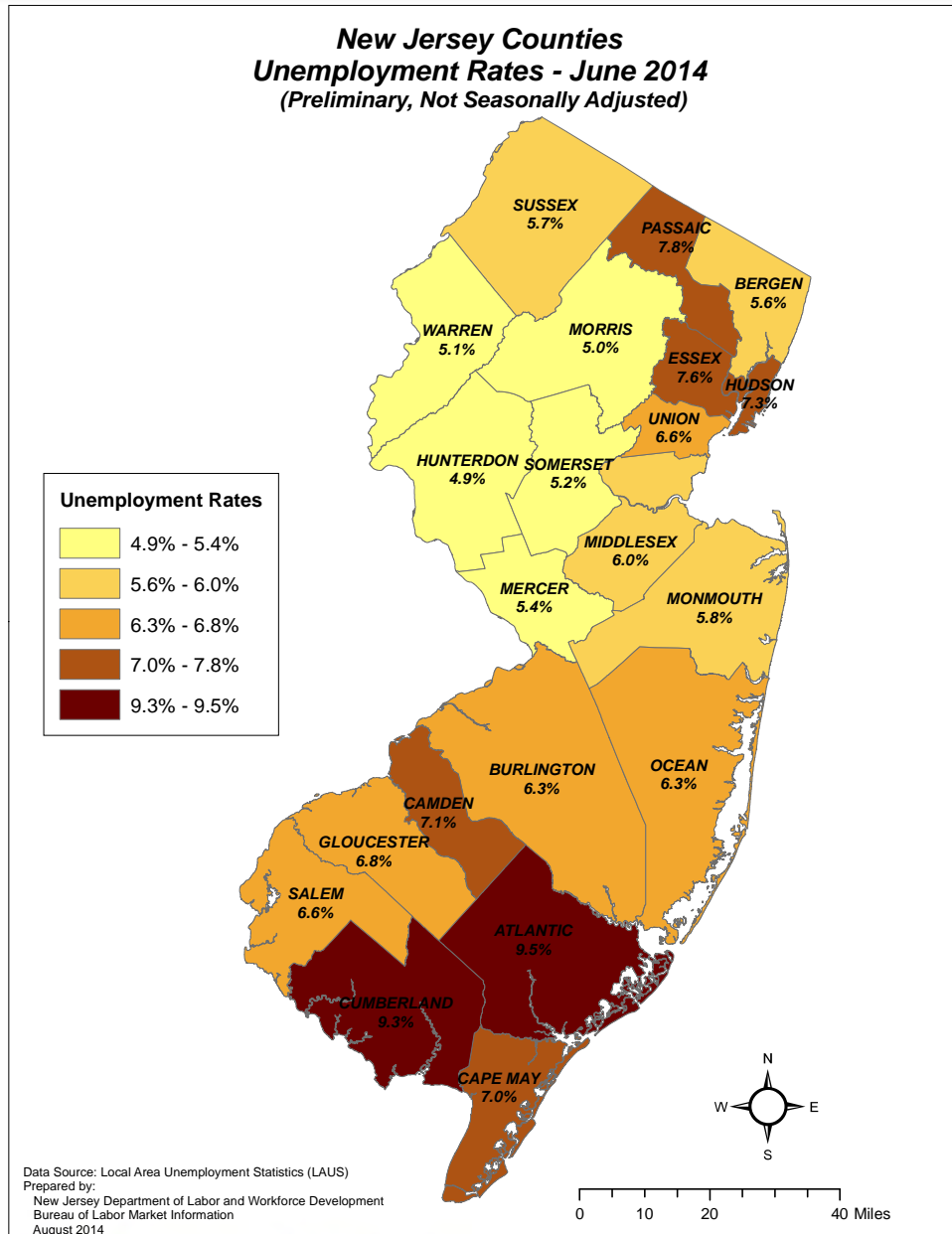

New Jersey Employed Residents: July 2013 - July 2014

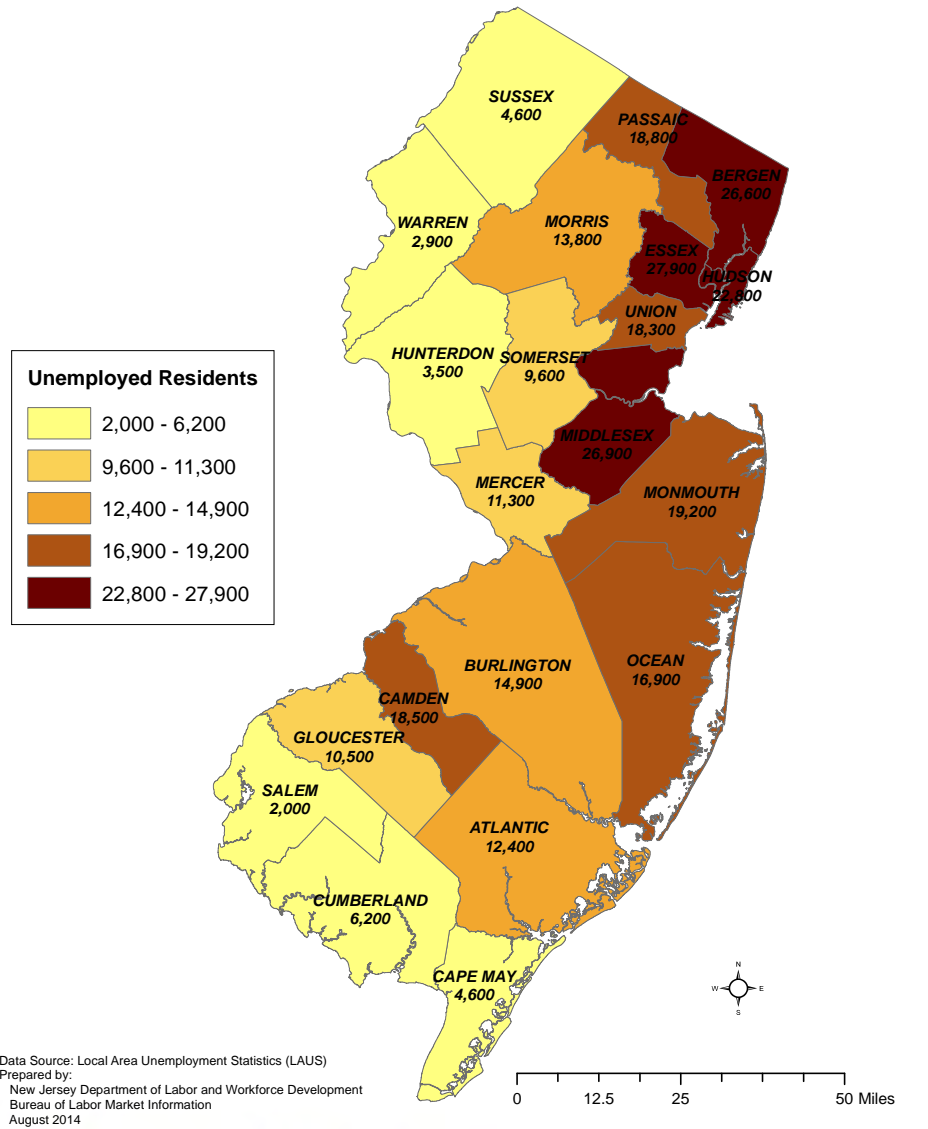

New Jersey Counties Unemployed Residents - June 2014 (Preliminary, Not Seasonally Adjusted)

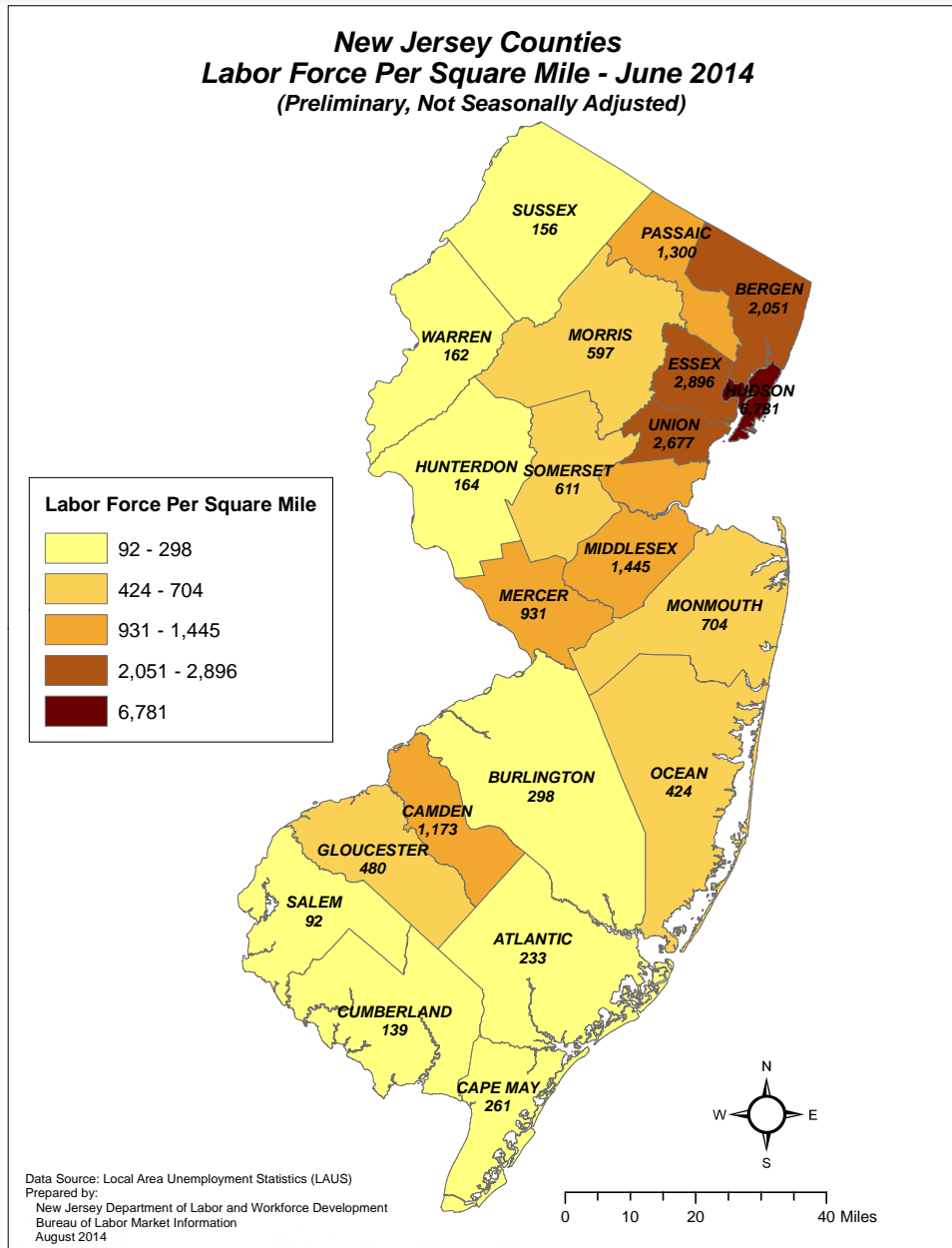

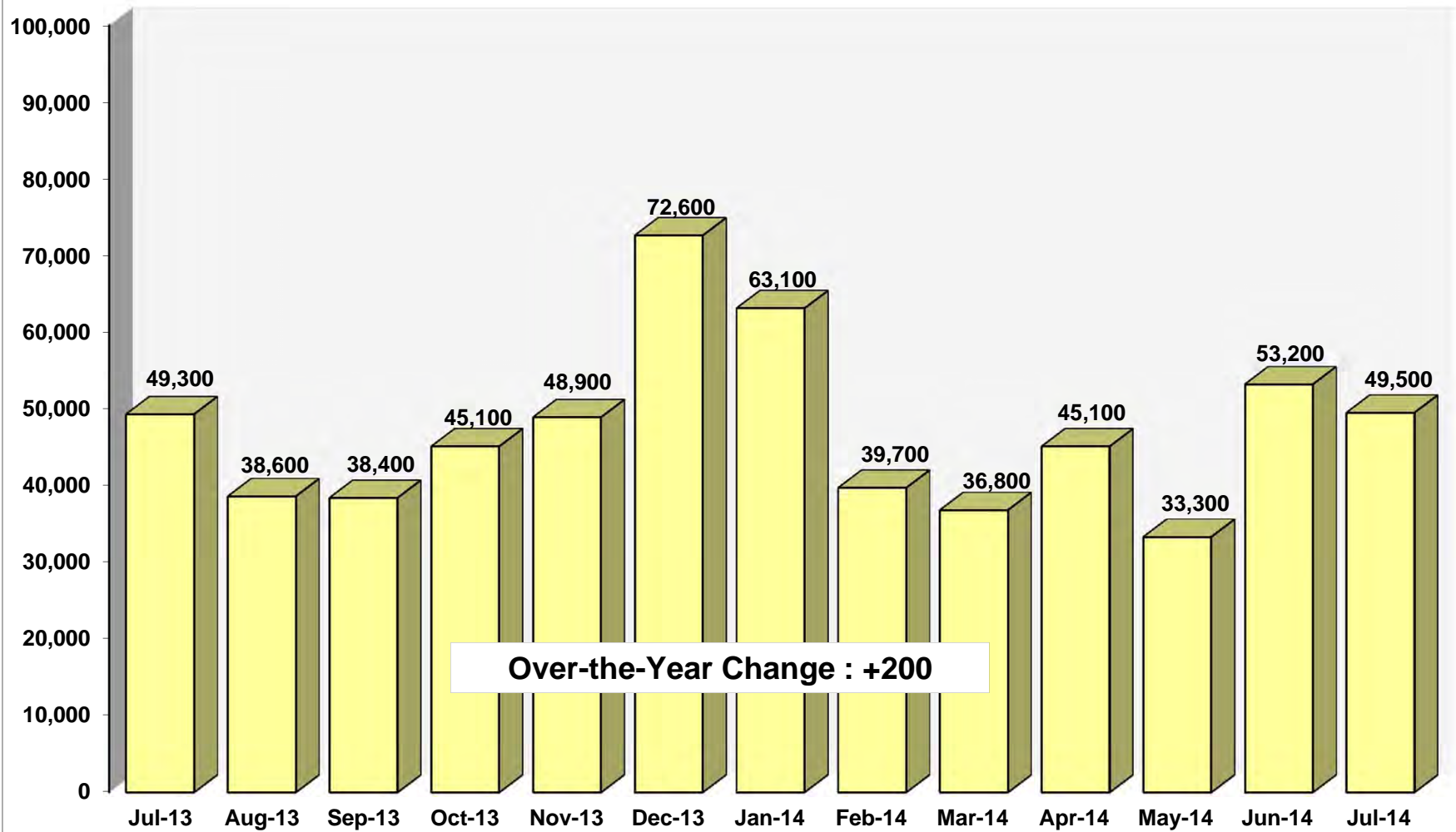
