INTRODUCTION

The 1978-79 edition of Vital Educational Statistics has been divided into two volumes. Volume II is devoted entirely to staff personnel data collected from the local school districts. Volume I contains school district, school, student and facilities data.

This publication, (Volume II) contains both certificated and non-certificated staff personnel data. The certificated staff data (Section I) deals with staff employed on a full-time basis; academic degrees held; certificates held; staff mobility; racial/ethnic composition and sex. The non-certificated data (Section II) are essentially the following: numbers of staff employed by professional and non-professional classifications; the number employed in the various support service program areas, and, the racial/ethnic distribution of full-time personnel.

Certificated staff personnel are those personnel who are required to hold certificates issued by the State Board of Examiners. Non-certificated staff are those support service personnel who are not required to hold State certification from the State Board of Examiners (educational).

The development of a separate publication devoted to staff personnel matters comes in response to the many requests for data received by the Office of Management Information. With the mounting importance of staff accounting and the rapid improvements being made in school personnel management systems, the availability and utilization of staff information will need to be improved from time to time. Hopefully, those improvements will be reflected in future editions of this publication as a response to the changing needs of the 1980's.

The Office of Management Information wants to acknowledge the efforts of the District Data Analysts and the personnel officers who supplied the staff data reported in this publication.

We also want to acknowledge the efforts of the County Data Analysts listed on the following page. Their efforts in organizing workshops and coordinating the distribution, collection and edit of the Survey instruments is largely responsible for the credibility of the information contained in this publication. The Office of Management Information staff who were responsible for editing the instruments, the computer printouts and the tables contained in this publication, were supervised by Terri Bolla and Elaine Ailey.

Alex Aderer was responsible for the development and machine edit of the many computer runs required to produce the school, district, county and State level reports generated in support of the publication.

SECTION I

CERTIFICATED STAFF INFORMATION

CERTIFICATED STAFF INFORMATION

The 11 tables in this section contain data on the certificated staff employed in the public schools of New Jersey on September 29, 1978. The tables are organized to reflect staff employed systemwide by the major position categories: administrators/supervisors; classroom teachers and special educational services personnel. Racial/ethnic data are also provided for the major position categories.

Table I is the basic table in this series. The full-time certificated staff employed appear in three categories: administrators/supervisors; classroom teachers, and, special educational services personnel. On September 29, 1978 there were 97,522 full-time certificated staff employed in the State. That total was 482 greater than the number reported last year. Increases were in the following categories: administrators/supervisors 137 and 613 special educational services personnel. The number of classroom teachers decreased by 268. The majority of increases in the administrator/supervisor category were due to a certification change that required "department heads" to be classified as subject supervisors.

Increases in the support services personnel area were largely a result of the various State administered Federal Programs authorized by the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965.

Table II shows those certificated staff members who are assigned to either the elementary or secondary level and those who serve in systemwide positions. The latter may include administrators, classroom teachers or special educational support services personnel. In some instances the personnel serving systemwide are identified as "itinerants" or personnel "unclassified" in terms of specific school or educational level.

There were 9,490 persons serving systemwide in 1978-79. That was an increase of 405 over 1977-78.

Table III takes a look at the certificated staff personnel assigned exclusively to elementary schools. The data show that of the 51,059 certificated staff serving the elementary schools 44,369 (86.9 percent) are classroom teachers, 4,366 (8.6 percent) are educational support services personnel, and 2,324 (4.5 percent) are administrators or supervisors.

Compared to last year there was an increase of 205 educational support services personnel serving elementary schools. There was an increase of seven (7) administrators or supervisors and a decrease of 559 classroom teachers.

Table IV reflects full-time certificated staff personnel assigned exclusively to the secondary schools. The data show that of the 36,973 certificated staff serving secondary schools, 30,621 (82.8 percent) are classroom teachers, 3,769 (10.2 percent) are educational support services personnel, and, 2,583 (7.0 percent) are administrators or supervisors.

Compared to last year there was an increase of 204 educational support services personnel serving secondary schools, an increase of 97 administrators or supervisors, and, an increase of 123 classroom teachers.

Table V is the first of three (3) tables dealing with the degree and certificate status of the three major certificated staff categories used in this publication. Each of the three categories: administrators/supervisors, classroom teachers and educational support personnel are also reported by sex.

Approximately 81.8 percent of all administrators and supervisors are male and 18.2 percent are female. Of the 137 increase in administrators and supervisors, over last year, 88 were female and 49 were male.

Approximately 84.6 percent of the administrators or supervisors held the master's degree and 7.7 percent were holders of a doctor's degree. Master's degree holders were up again over last year whereas the holders of the bachelor's degree dropped from 477 to 439, a drop of approximately eight (8) percent.

"Regular" certificates were held by 99 percent of the administrators and supervisors in their first or major assignment (up from 98.9 percent last year).

In terms of numbers and percentages, the degree and certificate status of administrators and supervisors improved over last year.

Table VI repeats the same data elements as the previous table, however, the data are for classroom teachers. This year again, an improvement is reported in the degree and certificate status of classroom teachers. Of the classroom teachers, 23,670 (30.1 percent) held the master's degree and 275 (0.4 percent) held the doctor's degree. Both of those categories were up compared to last year. Compared to last year there was a decline in the number of classroom teachers without a degree. Teachers without degrees are primarily those serving in areas where experience, in lieu of formal education, is one of the qualifying prerequisites to employment.

The number of classroom teachers reported as having no certificate in the first or major assignment decreased from 374 in 1977-78 to 313 in 1978-79.

Approximately 63.7 percent of the classroom teachers are female and 36.3 percent are male.

Compared to last year there was a decrease of 240 male classroom teachers and a decrease of 28 female teachers.

Table VII is the last of the series reporting on the degree and certificate status of certificated personnel. This table reports on the educational support services personnel, a category that has been on the increase over the past decade. The increase of 613 over last year brought the total number to 11,991 as of September 29, 1978.

The special educational support services group described in this table includes such titles as librarian, nurse, psychologist, counselor, remedial instructor, etc. Females constitute 74.4 percent of the educational support services group. Males account for 25.6 percent of the total support services group.

Table VIII is the first of three tables reporting on the racial/ethnic composition of certificated staff. Of the administrators and supervisors serving full time, 6,347 (91.2 percent) were White, 570 (8.2 percent) were Black and 41 (0.6 percent) were Hispanic. Compared to last year there were increases in each of the major racial/ethnic categories as well as a percentage increase in the "minority" group.

Table IX reports on the racial/ethnic distribution of classroom teachers. Of the 78,569 classroom teachers employed full-time, 70,440 (89.7 percent) were White, 6,923 (8.8 percent) were Black, 982 (1.2 percent) were Hispanic, 198 (0.3 percent) were Asian or Pacific Islander and 26 were American Indian or Alaskan Native. Compared to last year there was an increase in the group classified as "minority".

Table X is the last of three tables reporting on the racial/ethnic characteristics of certificated staff. In this table, the educational support services group is reported by racial/ethnic categories: 10,740

(89.6 percent) were White, 1,071 (8.9 percent) Black, 140 (1.2 percent) were Hispanic and there were 40 full-time personnel in the two remaining categories. The minority group is 10.4 percent of the total. That represents an increase over the percentage reported last year.

Table XI summarizes the mobility characteristics of full-time certificated staff including the three major categories: administrators and supervisors, classroom teachers, and special educational support services personnel. Statewide the data again show more certificated staff "leaving" than "entering". Of the three major categories, only the educational support services group shows a larger number entering than those leaving.

The terms "entering" and "leaving" are a composite of approximately 21 coded explanations (reasons) supplied to respondents to facilitate identification of sources of staff supply, and, the destination of those who either transfer from school to school, resign, retire, or accept employment in non-teaching positions etc.

Statewide, the mobility rates for 1978-79 were the highest in the last three years. As in the past three years the mobility rates were highest for the educational support services group, followed by classroom teachers and administrators/supervisors respectively. The mobility rate for total certificated staff leavers exceeded the 1977-78 rate by approximately 0.6 percent, and, the entering rate for total certificated staff exceeded the 1977-78 rate by one and four tenths percent.

SECTION II

NON-CERTIFICATED STAFF INFORMATION

NON-CERTIFICATED STAFF

This section contains three (3) tables reporting data on non-certificated staff personnel. The tables report data by support service program areas, the number of professional and non-professional personnel, the racial/ethnic distribution of full-time (non-certificated) staff, and the full-time equivalent (FTE) of all non-certificated support services personnel.

Table XII shows that of the 43,100 full-time non-certificated support services personnel the majority (42,003) were reported in the non-professional category. There were 1,097 professionals in the non-certificated support services group.

Of the eight (8) support services program areas, business services accounted for 24,812 (58 percent) of the non-certificated support personnel. School administration and instructional services combined, accounted for 26 percent of all non-certificated support personnel.

Table XIII is a racial/ethnic distribution of full-time non-certificated support services personnel. Of the group classified as "minority" 6,866 (15.9 percent) were Black, 991 (2.2 percent) were Hispanic and there were 75 personnel in the two remaining categories. Of the total number of full-time non-certificated support staff, 18.4 percent were "minority".

Of the total number of full-time non-certificated support staff, 27,129 (62.9 percent) were female and 15,971 (37 percent) were male.

Table XIV is a composite of the full-time equivalent of all non-certificated support services personnel. Column ten (10) shows that of the 51,643.1 full-time equivalent staff 57.5 percent were assigned to business services, 14.5 to instructional services and 10.6 to school administration. The remainder were reported in general administration, pupil services, community services and "other". The full-time equivalent of part-time non-certificated staff at the time of the report was 8,543.1.
