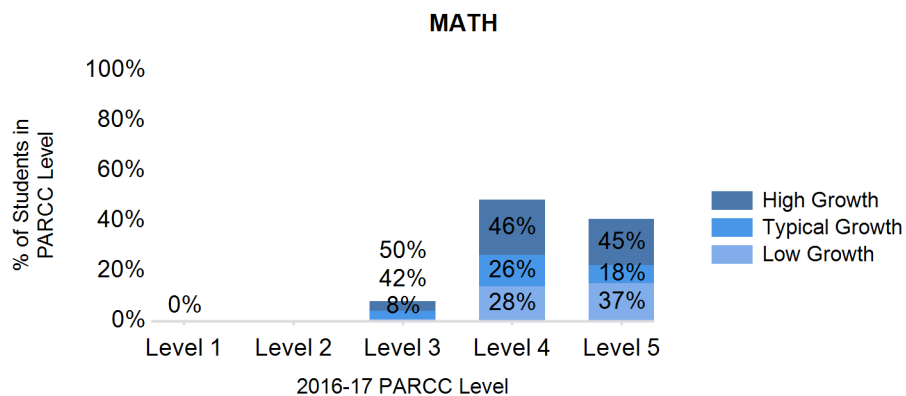
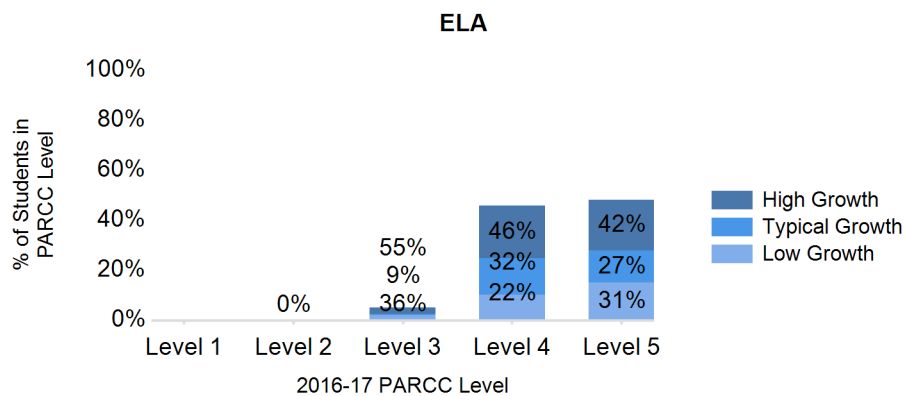

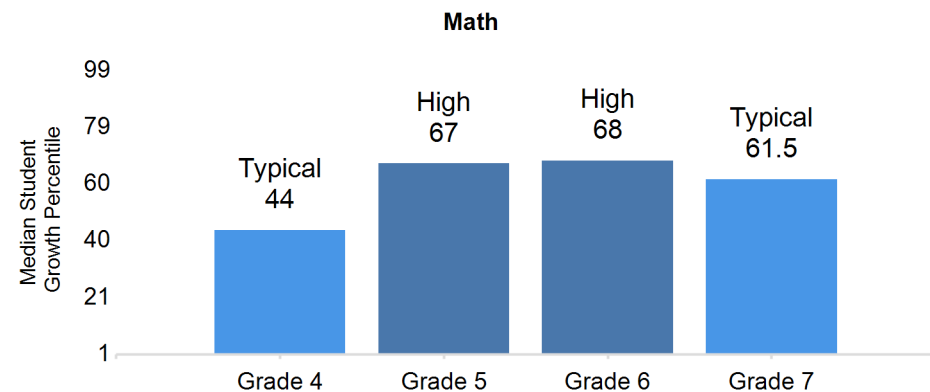
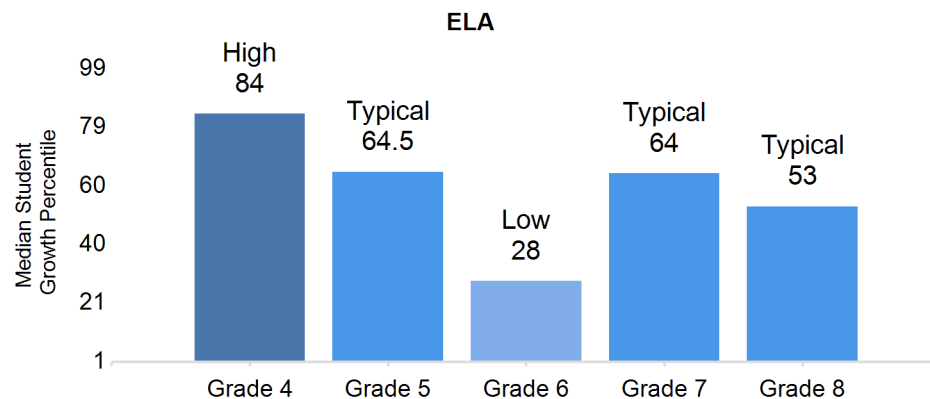
Student Growth by Performance Level

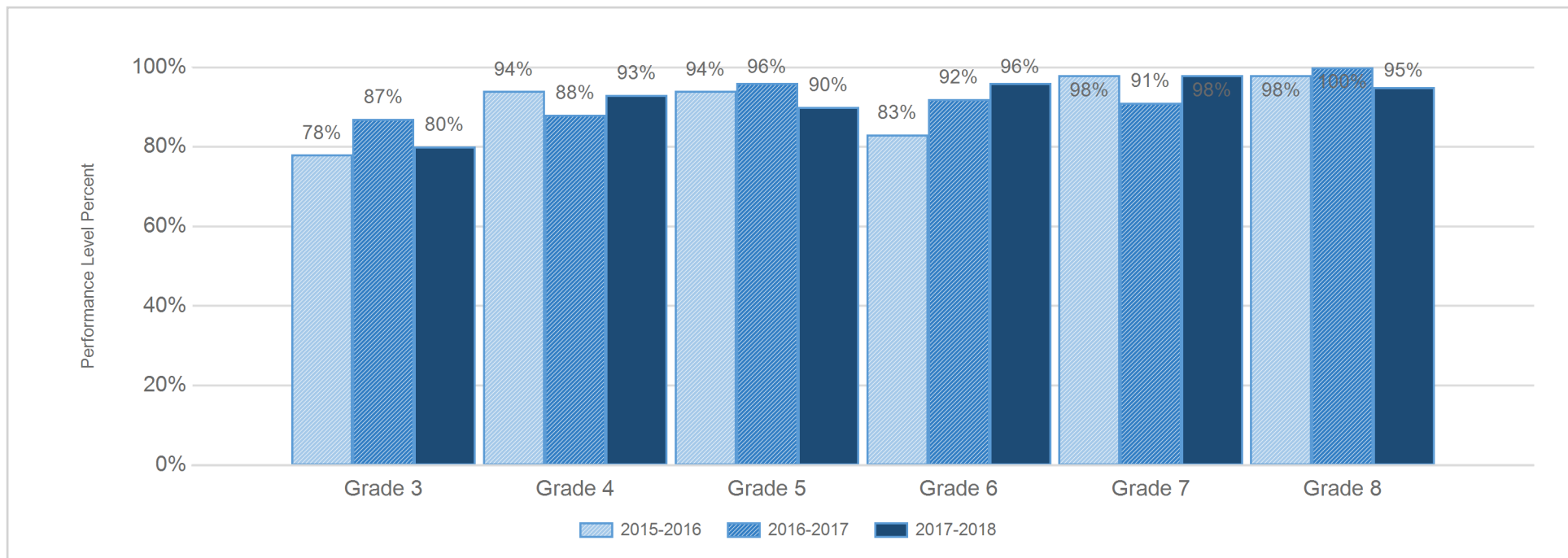

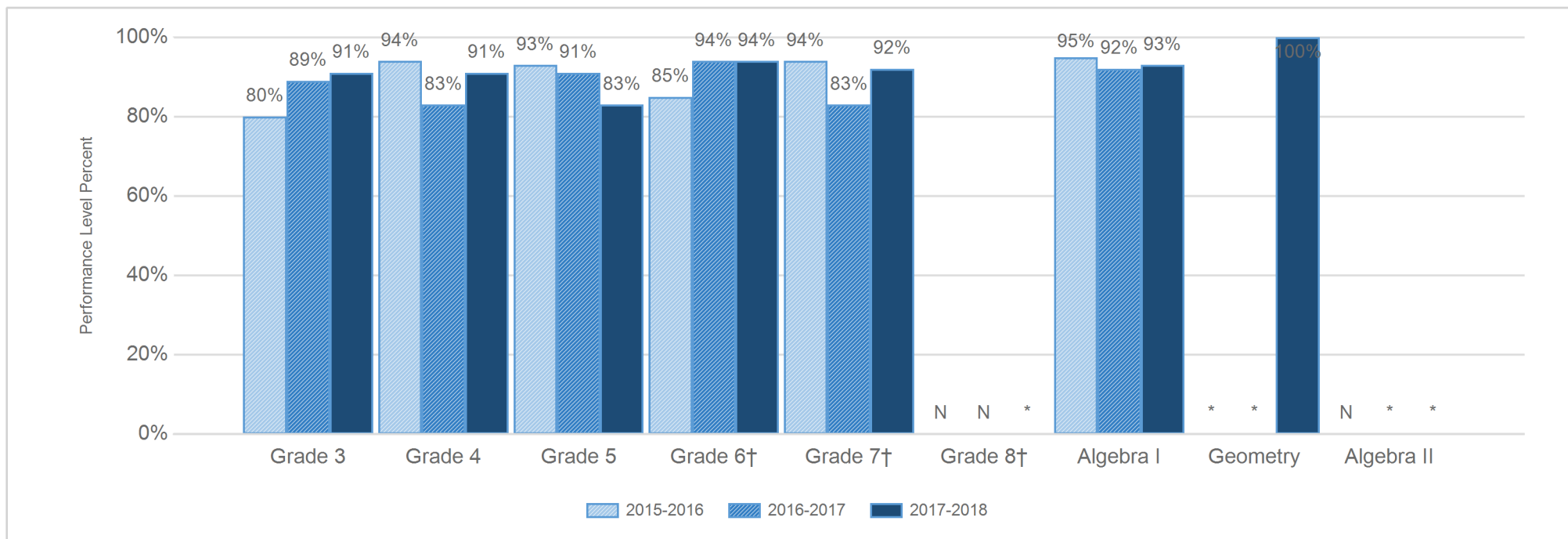

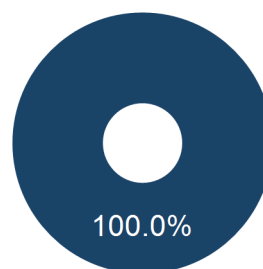

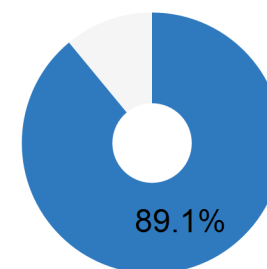

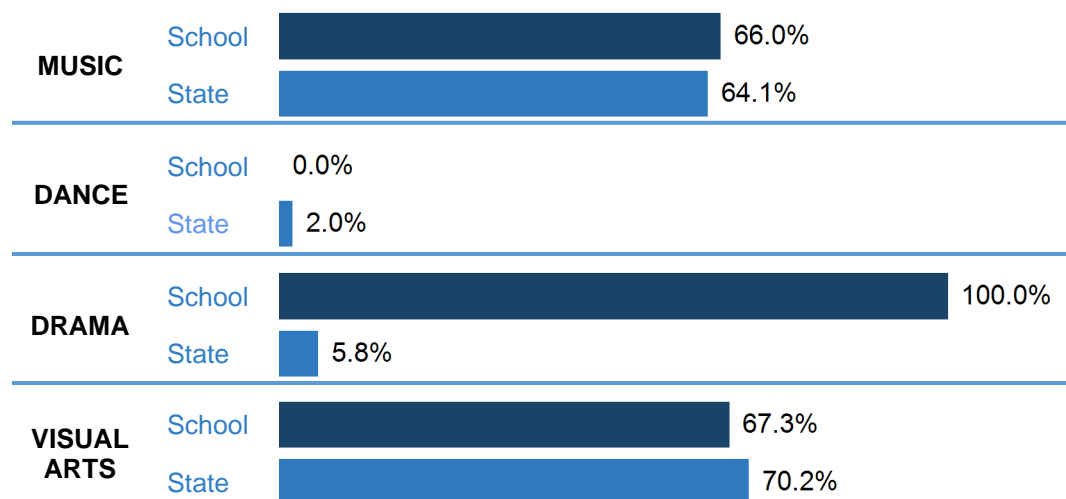

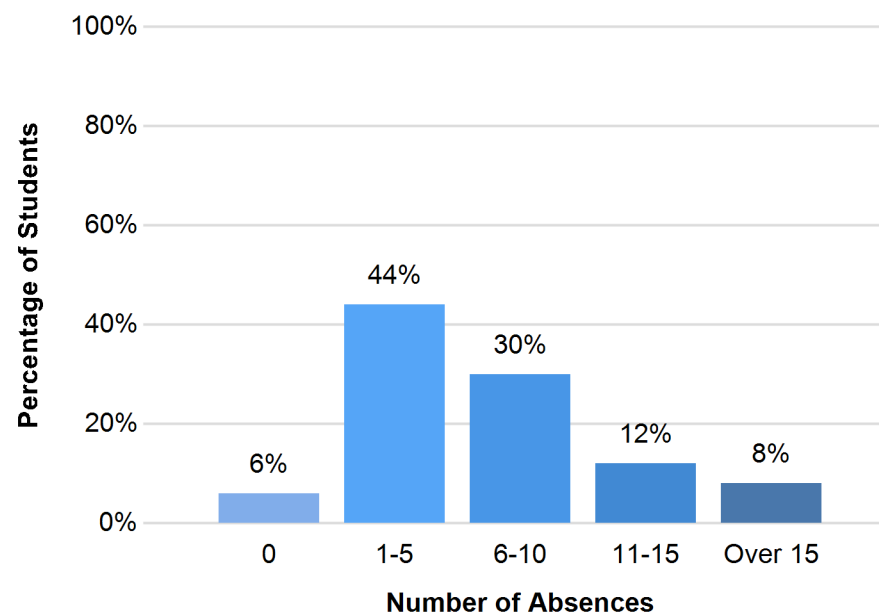

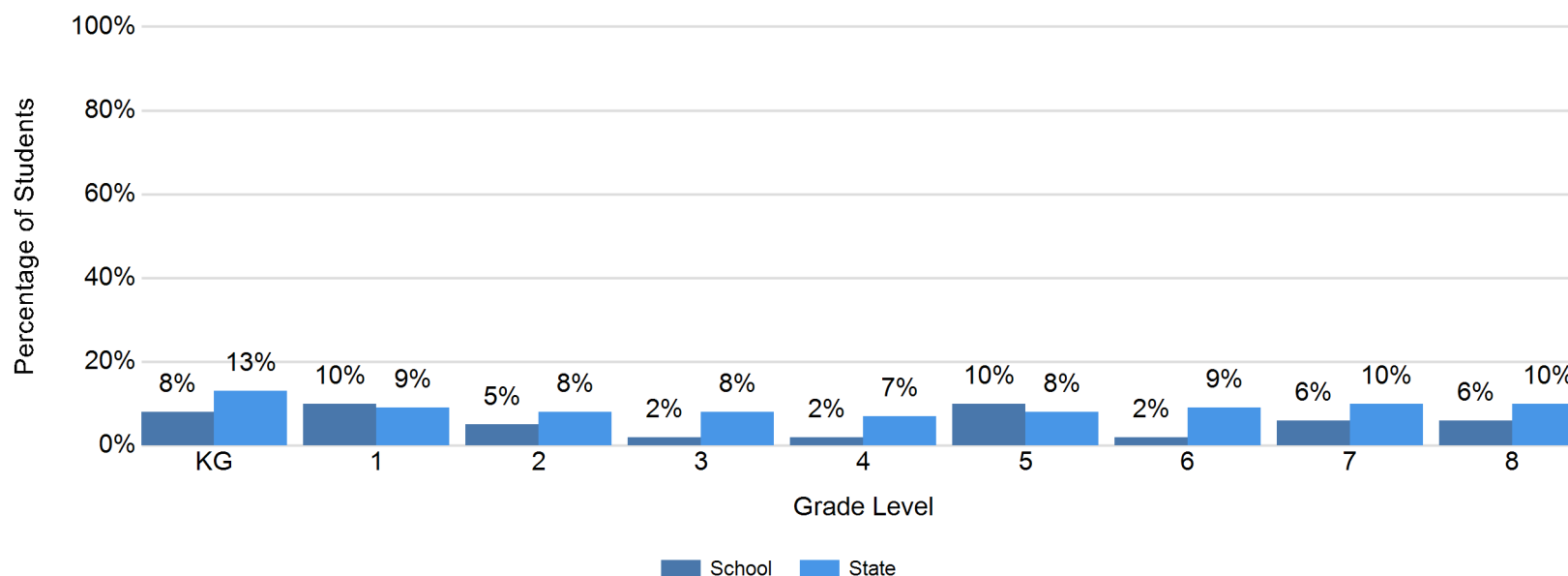

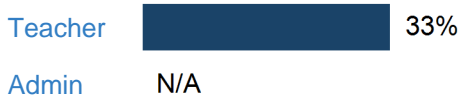

Student Supports and Services:

PCS is committed to supporting every student to meet the challenges of the PCS curriculum. The first level of support for learners who are having difficulty is teacher support outside of the regular class time. We may also assemble an I&RS team to develop more targeted interventions. The school has a full Child Study Team, and we provide a full range of services including Speech, Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, pull out instruction, and counseling.



Student Health and Wellness:

Students participate in P.E. twice a week. In addition every student has the opportunity to go outside for three 15-minute recess period a day. A full health curriculum is taught addressing a range of health and wellness issues. The school counseling program is prevention oriented. It teaches social skills to all students K-8, so that students will be able to interact in an emotionally healthy manner. Students who need additional support are seen in individual and group settings.

We embrace technology as an essential learning tool and as necessary skills for our students to develop in order to be highly effective in future study and work. In order to develop these skills, we integrate technology into our teaching and learning experiences as well as in our internal systems.
