










NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03




NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03






Chronic Absenteeism Trend



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

Enrollment by Grade






Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup












NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03









Enrollment by Grade












Proficiency Trends - Math



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








Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup


This graph presents the percentage of students who scored in the Advanced Proficient, Proficient and Partially Proficient categories of the statewide Math assessment over the prior four years.






















Chronic Absenteeism Trend



Enrollment by Grade






Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup








NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03








Chronic Absenteeism Trend



Enrollment by Grade






Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup








NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03




NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03




Chronic Absenteeism Trend
