## RESOLUTION 1955-22

# ADOPTION OF REGULATIONS 2 AS REVISED GOVERNING USE OF GARDEN STATE PARKWAY

WHEREAS, Resolution 1954-31, dated March 25, 1954, adopted Regulations 2, Governing Use of the Garden State Parkway effective April 10, 1954, after having duly investigated the need for and desirability of each such regulation; and repealed all regulations governing the use of the Parkway adopted prior to April 10, 1954; and

WHEREAS, certain amendments to Regulations 2 have been effected by actions of the Authority at the meetings of June 29, September 28 and October 14, 1954, and February 8, 1955; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 1954-67 adopted June 28, 1954, deleted through error the words "and Processions" from the title of Article 1.2.4 and the words "or other processions" from the body of Article 1.2.4; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to file with the Secretary of State Regulations 2 as revised to incorporate the amendments and corrections in order to make them effective:

BE IT RESOLVED by the New Jersey Highway Authority and the members thereof that the Authority does hereby make, adopt and promulgate revised "Regulations 2 Governing Use of the Garden State Parkway" annexed hereto and made a part hereof.

All heretofore adopted Authority regulations governing the use of the Parkway which are inconsistent with these regulations are hereby repealed.

#### REGULATIONS 2

#### GOVERNING USE OF THE GARDEN STATE PARKWAY

#### AUTHORIZATION AND DEFINITIONS

## A. AUTHORIZATION:

These regulations are entitled and may be referred to as "Regulations 2" governing Use of the Garden State Parkway and have been adopted under authority of the New Jersey Highway Authority Act. L. 1952, c. 16, as amended, and particularly Sections 5 (i) and (q), 14, 17, 18 (g) and 20 of the said Act.

#### B. DEFINITIONS:

The following words and terms in these regulations have the following meanings unless the context shall indicate another or different meaning or intent:

(a) Authority: The New Jersey Highway Authority created by L. 1952, c. 16 and its statutory successors.

(b) Garden State Parkway: The highway project known as the Garden State Parkway as defined and described in L. 1952, c. 16 and particularly Section 20 thereof.

(c) Parkway: The Garden State Parkway.

(d) Passenger Motor Vehicle: A motor vehicle primarily designed for passenger use, and designed to carry nine or fewer passengers, while not used to transport merchandise or freight.

) Omnibus: A motor vehicle designed to carry ten or more passengers while not used totransport merchan-

dise or freight.

# ARTICLE 1.1.1. SPEED LIMITS

The maximum speed at which vehicles may be operated on the Parkway shall be sixty (60) miles per hour except where otherwise posted.

#### ARTICLE 1.1.2. UNIFORM DIRECTION OF TRAFFIC

No vehicle shall be operated, pushed, or otherwise caused to move in a direction which is against the normal flow of traffic on any traffic lane, deceleration lane, acceleration lane, access ramp, shoulder, or other readway on the Parkway.

# ARTICLE 1.1.3. "U" TURNS PROHIBITED

The making of a "U" turn at any point on the Parkway is prohibited, except as otherwise provided herein. Excepted from the provisions of this section are police vehicles, the Authority's maintenance and official vehicles, and vehicles authorized on the Parkway for construction, maintenance, or repair, or to furnish towing and other service to disabled vehicles, and all other vehicles discharging emergency functions, such as: ambulances and fire engines, when performing official emergency duties, provided, however, that this exception shall be for the sole purpose of crossing to a roadway carrying traffic bound in the opposite direction, and provided further that no such excepted vehicle shall make crossings so as to create a hazard to other vehicles.

# ARTICLE 1.1.4. USE of MEDIAL STRIP and ROADSIDE AREAS PROHIBITED

Except in service, maintenance or police areas of the Parkway, the medial strip between roadways and the roadside areas beyond road shoulders shall not be used by vehicles for any purpose whatsoever, except as otherwise provided by Article 1.1.3. of these Regulations. Use of the medial strip outside of service, maintenance or police areas by persons on foot or by vehicles, other than persons or vehicles authorized by the Authority for the performance of official duties, is prohibited.

## ARTICLE 1.1.5. PARKING, STANDING or STOPPING on PARKWAY PROHIBITED EXCEPT in CASES of EMERGENCY

No parking, standing or stopping is permitted on the Parkway except in areas designated by the Authority or in cases of emergency. In cases of emergency, as hereinafter defined, vehicles shall be permitted to park, stop and stand on the shoulders to the right of the travel lane facing in the direction of tragel with all wheels and projecting parts of any such vehicles, including the load thereof, completely clear of the travel lanes.

For the purposes of this regulation, an "emergency" shall be defined as existing only when and so long as the vehicle in question is physically inoperable.

Parking of any vehicle which is physically inoperable on the said shoulders for more than two (2) hours continuously is absolutely prchibited. Vehicles violationg this provision may be towed away at the cost of the owner.

## ARTICLE 1.1.6. LIMITATIONS on USE of PARKWAY

- A. No person or vehicle shall enter upon or leave the Parkway except at access points and drives designated by the Authority.
- B. Use of the Parkway and entry thereon by the following is prohibited at all times:
  - (1) pedestrians except on walks or in park areas specifically designated by the Authority for that purpose,

(2) vehicles drawn by animals,

- (3) bicycles with or without motors, and motor scooters, (4) animals led, ridden or driven on the hoof other than horses on bridle paths and leashed dogs,
- (5) vehicles loaded with animals or poultry not properly confined,
- (6) vehicles whose condition, equipment or tires creates a probable hazard to such vehicles or others,
- (7) farm implements and farm machinery, whether self-propelled or towed,

(8) vehicles with improperly secured loads,

- (9) vehicles with deflated pneumatic, metal or solid tires, and vehicles with caterpillar treads,
- (10) construction equipment other than motor trucks except by special permit from the Authority to perform construction, maintenance, repair or service functions on the Parkway,
- (11) vehicles, including any load thereon, exceeding the following maximum dimensions, except under special permit from the Authority: height 13'6", width 8' no inches, length 50' no inches, (12) motor vehicles in tow, except as provided in Article 1.1.5.
- of these Regulations,

(13) vehicles operated at such a slow speed as to impede or block the normal and reasonable movement of traffic except when reduced speed is necessary for safe operation thereof,

(14) vehicles with loads extending more than four (4) feet

beyond the rear of the body or other sipporting member,

(15) passenger cars carrying sport, recreation, camping or similar equipment on the top, on the sides, or in the rear with vertical, lateral or horizontal projection in excess of twelve (12) inches,

(16) all traffic except passenger motor vehicles and any attached non-commercial trailer or semi-trailer, omnibuses and taxicabs, not cruising for passengers, and vehicles entitled to toll-free passage under Article 1.3.2. of these Regulations, is excluded from any part of the Parkway north of Interchange No. 90 east of Lakewood in Ocean County,

(17) vehicles while operated by a person under the influence of intoxicating liquors or any narcotic or habit-forming drug.

#### ARTICLE 1.1.7. HITCH-HIKING

Stopping of vehicles on any part of the Parkway for the purpose of picking up or discharging hitch-hikers is prohibited.

# ARTICLE 1.1.8. AIR RAID PRECAUTIONS

In the event of an air raid, either actual or test, no vehicles shall stop or stand on any bridge or overpass on the Parkway. Vehicles shall proceed until they are off the bridge or overpass on to the roadways of the Parkway.

Civil Defense regulations as promulgated by the Department of Defense of the State of New Jersey shall be effective upon the Parkway where applicable.

# ARTICLE 1.1.9. LOAD LIMIT of STRUCTURES

No person shall cause any structure owned or maintained by the Authority to be subjected to a load in excess of load limits which may be posted at the approaches to or upon such structure.

## SECTION II - GENERAL REGULATIONS

## ARTICLE 1.2.1. WASTE and RUBBISH

No person shall throw, drop or discard bottles, cans, paper, garbage, rubbish or other material of any kind or description on the Parkway.

# ARTICLE 1.2.2. DAMAGING of SHRUBS or PLANTS and DEFACEMENT of PARKWAY PROHIBITED

No person shall cut, mutilate or remove any trees, shrubs, flowers, plants, top soil, or sod located upon the Parkway or attempt to do so. Injury, defacement, removal or destruction of the surfaces of the Parkway, or its structures, appurtenences, recreation facilities or property is prohibited.

## ARTICLE 1.2.3. ERECTION of POSTERS PROHIBITED

No person shall erect, place or display any advertising matter, posters or placards of any kind, regardless of character of message, on the Parkway.

# ARTICLE 1.2.4. PARADES and PROCESSIONS PROHIBITED; PICNICS PROHIBITED EXCEPT at DESIGNATED AREAS

Parades or other processions are prohibited. Picnics or other gatherings, games, entertainment or sports, on the Parkway are prohibited except at sites which may be designated for such purposes.

#### ARTICLE 1.2.5. HUNTING and TRAPPING PROHIBITED

No person shall hunt, trap or molest any wild life upon the Parkway, or fish on or from the Parkway except at designated locations.

## ARTICLE 1.2.6. USE OF FIREARMS PROHIBITED

The use, display or discharge of any firearms or other weapons or fireworks on the Parkway except by persons authorized by the Authority or law is prohibited.

## ARTICLE 1.2.7. FIRES PROHIBITED

The igniting of fires for any purpose whatsoever is prhobited on the Parkway except in fireplaces or pits provided for that purpose.

## ARTICLE 1.2.8. SOLICITING of ALMS PROHIBITED

The soliciting of alms or contributions on the Parkway is prohibited.

## ARTICLE 1.2.9. HITCH-HIKING and LOITERING PROHIBITED

The soliciting of rides in vehicles, commonly known as "hitch-hiking", on the Parkway is prohibited and loitering in or about the Parkway for the purpose of "hitch-hiking", or as part of a demonstration or protest, or any other purpose is prohibited.

# ARTICLE 1.2.10. SALES and DISTRIBUTION PROHIBITED

No person shall enter or remain on the Parkway for the purpose of selling food products, beverages, or any other goods, wares, merchandise or services, or offer the same for hire or lease, or for the distribution of samples, pamphlets or advertising matter of any sort except Authority concessionaires.

SECTION III - TOLLS

## ARTICLE 1.3.1. Tolls

Tolls shall be paid for passage of all vehicles on the Parkway in amounts and at the locations designated in the following schedule, except as hereinafter provided.

## ARTICLE 1.3.2. TOLL-FREE PASSAGE

Free vehicular passage upon compliance with such Authority procedures as may be then currently effective will be permitted through the toll collection points set forth in Regulation Article 1.3.1. as follows:

- a. Members, officers, consultants, and employees of the Authority in the actual course of performance of their duties or while traveling to or from the place of the performance of their official duties.
- b. Members of the New Jersey State Police Force in the course of performance of duties for the Authority.
- c. Vehicles carrying persons to or from destinations on the Parkway where such persons are required by law to perform specified functions on the Parkway.
- d. Members of the Fire Department of any local municipality or political sub-division, in the course of performance of duties on the Parkway.
- e. The passage of ambulances or rescue vehicles when driven by authorized members of any public or private ambulance or rescue squad service.
- f. Authorized vehicles when engaged in the performance of service or maintenance contracts when such vehicles are operated by personnel authorized by the Authority to perform duties under the terms of contracts with the Authority.
