## Court-Authorized Electronic Surveillance

2010

The New Jersey Wiretapping and Electronic Surveillance Control Act requires the Attorney General to report annually on the use of court-authorized intercepts. To accomplish this, the Act directs the Attorney General to collect and maintain records of all court-authorized intercepts, regardless of whether the intercept is carried out by the Attorney General's Office, a county prosecutor's office, or a local law enforcement agency.

Data reported pursuant to *N.J.S.A. 2A:156A-23* were compiled to report on the operation of the New Jersey Wiretapping Act. As required by statute, this report contains data concerning:

- (1) The number of applications made.
- (2) The number of orders issued.
- (3) The effective periods of such orders.
- (4) The number and duration of any renewals.
- (5) The crime in connection with electronic surveillance orders.
- (6) The name of the applicants.
- (7) Indictments resulting from each application.
- (8) The crime which each indictment charges.
- (9) The disposition of each indictment.

In addition to the detailed information provided for 2010 applications and orders, supplemental follow-up data is provided for electronic surveillance orders reported in previous calendar years.

## APPLICATIONS

In 2010, 217<sup>1</sup> applications for electronic surveillance orders were reported statewide pursuant to the Wiretap Act.<sup>2</sup> The applications made were authorized by prosecution officials as follows.

<sup>1</sup>Originally 219 applications were authorized, however, it was determined that two Orders applied for by the New Jersey State Police and Cumberland County Prosecutor's Office [AJGCUM01-10 & AJGCUM04-10] were improvidently granted. The Cumberland County Prosecutor's Office has advised it is in the process of filing an application to withdraw those Orders. Thus the total reported count of wiretaps is 217.

<sup>2</sup>The Federal and New Jersey AOC report orders in the year that they are filed. The State Attorney General reports orders in the year that the investigation is completed. For instance, the 55 wires attributed to Attorney General Milgram were authorized in the years 2007 through 2009, while the investigations were completed in 2010. These 55 wires were previously reported on the Federal Report in their respective years of authorization, but appear in the State Report for 2010 since that is the year the investigations were completed.

## ORDERS FOR ELECTRONIC SURVEILLANCE

In all, 217 court orders were entered granting court authorization for electronic surveillance in 2010.<sup>3</sup>

*Atlantic County.* The federal report lists four wires, AO#2009-2 to AO#2009-5 that were reported by Atlantic in the 2009 state report: AJGATL1109, AJGATL1909, AJGATL2209 and AJGATL2309.

*Bergen County.* Bergen reports seven orders that were not reported by the US AOC: HGCBER2709 (12/21/09, CDS); HGCBER2809 (12/21/09, CDS); HGCBER2909 (12/21/09, CDS); HGCBER3009 (12/21/09, CDS); BHCBER3109 (12/21/09, CDS); HGCBER3209 (12/21/09, CDS); and HGCBER3309 (12/21/09, CDS).

*Burlington County.* The US AOC report lists one wire, AO#2009-1, reported last year: REBBUR0109.

**Camden County.** The federal report lists 10 orders, all of which were reported by the US AOC or Camden in 2009. Seven of the wires were reported by the US AOC on Table B-1 in 2009 and are erroneously re-reported this year with corrections submitted to US AOC in 2010. AO# 2009-11, SDNCAM0109 was previously AO#2009-1 in 2009; AO#2009-12, SDNCAM0209, previously AO#2009-2; AO#2009-13, SDNCAM0509 previously AO#2009-5; AO#2009-14, SDNCAM0609 previously AO#2009-6; AO#2009-16, SDNCAM1009 previously AO#2009-7; AO#2009-19, SDNCAM1609 previously AO#2009-9 and AO#2009-20, SDNCAM1709 previously AO#2009-10. The federal report lists three orders that Camden reported in 2009 but were not on 2009 Table B-1: AO#2009-15,SDNCAM1109; AO#2009-17, SDNCAM1309 and AO#2009-18, SDNCAM1509.

**Cape May County.** The US AOC reports two duplicate orders. AO#2010-1 is a duplicate of MADCPM0810 and AO#2010-3 is a duplicate of MADCPM0910. The federal reports lists three orders Cape May reported in 2009: AO#2009-2, AJGCPM2009 (although offense should be weapons); AO#2009-3, AJGCPM2109 and AO#2009-4, AJGCPM2409.

**Cumberland County.** The US AOC reports two duplicate orders. AO#2010-6 is a duplicate of AJGCUM0110 and AO#2010-8 is a duplicate of AJGCUM0410. The federal report lists eight orders reported by Cumberland in 2009: AO#2009-1, AJGCUM0109; AO#2009-2, AJGCUM0209 (date listed as 1/21/09 in error); AO#2009-3, AJGCUM0309; AO#2010-1, AJGCUM1309; AO#2010-2, AJGCUM1409; AO#2010-3, AJGCUM1509; AO#2010-4, AJGCUM1709 and AO#2009-4, AJGCUM1809. Three of the Cumberland orders were listed erroneously under Gloucester on the federal report: WLMCUM1910, WLMCUM2010 and WLMCUM2410. Cumberland reported five additional orders not listed on the US AOC report: AJGCUM3208 (6/24/08, murder); AJGCUM3308 (6/24/08, murder); AJGCUM3408 (6/24/08, murder); AJGCUM4809 (3/3/09, murder); and WLMCUM1110 (8/26/10, murder). Two orders have motions to suppress, AJGCUM0110 and AJGCUM0410.

**Essex County.** The Essex Prosecutor office reported 10 orders as regular telephones with authorized lengths of 20 days. In actuality they were stored jail communications which should be listed as one day. These include AO#2010-1, PJVESS0110; AO#2010-2, PJVESS0210; AO#2010-3, PJVESS0310; AO#2010-4, PJVESS0410; AO#2010-5, PJVESS0510; AO#2010-6, PJVESS0610; AO#2010-7, PJVESS0710; AO#2010-8, PJVESS0810; AO#2010-13, PJVESS1310 and AO#2010-16, PJVESS16-10.

**Gloucester County.** Three of the orders reported on the US AOC report under Gloucester are from Cumberland: AO#2010-10 (WLMCUM1910, prosecutor should be AP Branco); AO#2010-11 (WLMCUM2010, prosecutor should be AP Branco) and AO#2010-12 (WLMCUM2410, prosecutor should be First Assistant Shapiro). The US AOC reports one duplicate order. AO#2010-8 is a duplicate of WLMCUM1610. Three additional orders reported under Gloucester are duplicates of three Cumberland orders that were already reported on Table B-1 under Cumberland: AO#2010-5 (WLMCUM1510); AO#2010-6 (continued...)

(WLMCUM1610) and AO#2010-7 (WLMCUM1710). The federal report includes a 2010 order, AO#2010-13 that was not in Gloucester's inventory for 2010. AO#2010-2 is a stored jailed communication. AO#2010-3 should list Prosecutor Dalton, not Pyffer and is a stored jail communication. AO#2010-4 should list offense as attempted murder, not firearms. Gloucester reports four additional orders not listed on the US AOC report: WLMGLO1410 (9/2/10, arson); WLMGLO0810 ((6/8/10, arson); WLMGLO1310 (9/2/10, arson) and WLMGLO2210 (10/20/10, assault).

**Middlesex County.** Middlesex reports one additional order not listed on the federal report, JPDMD0710 (10/5/10, murder). Four orders filed in Middlesex are reported under Somerset as part of a joint investigation: YCSOM0210, YCSOM0310, YCSOM0510 and YCSOM0610.

**Morris County.** The US AOC report lists AO#2010-13, TVMMOR1810, as Prosecutor Bruno and the offense as narcotics. It should be Prosecutor Bianchi and terroristic threats. Thirteen of the orders listed on the federal report under Morris are duplicates: AO#2010-1, AO#2010-3, AO#2010-7 through AO#2010-10, AO#2010-12, AO#2010-14, AO#2010-19, AO#2010-21, AO#2010-22, AO#2010-25 and AO#2010-27. AO#2008-10, KGCMOR8108, was reported on the state report last year.

**Ocean County.** The federal report includes one order that was reported on the state report in 2009: AO#2009-5, AJGOCE1209. AO#2009-6 is a duplicate of AJGOCE1209. AO#2010-1 should be dated 11/18/10. AO#2010-2 should be dated 12/09/10 and AO#2010-3 should be dated 12/22/10. All three were orders for stored jail communications.

**Passaic County.** The federal report does not include any orders from Passaic County. Passaic reported nine orders: MCCPAS010C0 (2/11/10, CDS); MCCPAS0210 (2/26/10, CDS); MCCPAS0310 (4/9/10, CDS); MCCPAS0410 (3/26/10, CDS); HGCPAS0510 (7/16/10, leader narcotics network); HGCPAS0610 (7/16/10, CDS); HGCPAS0710 (7/28/10, CDS); MCCPAS0810 (8/12/10, CDS) and MCCPAS0910 (8/25/10, CDS).

**Salem County.** The federal report includes one order that was reported on the state report in 2009: AO#2010-1, AJGSAL0909. The federal report includes a 2010 order, AO#2010-9 that was not in Salem's inventory for 2010. AO#2009-1 and AO#2009-2 should list Judge Marshall, not Judge Garofolo.

**Somerset County.** The federal report includes one order that was reported on the state report in 2009: AO#2010-1, LRF SOM1709. The US AOC report includes two duplicates: AO#2010-2 is a duplicate of YCSOM0110 and AO#2010-5 is a duplicate of YCSOM0410. Four orders listed under Somerset were reported under Middlesex by the state. All four were part of a joint investigation and involve: AO#2010-4, YCSOM0210; AO#2010-7, YCSOM0310 (date should be 2/16/10); AO#2010-8, YCSOM0510, and AO#2010-9, YCSOM0610.

**Union County.** The federal report includes one order that was reported on the state report (continued...)

Extensions were requested and granted for 48 intercept orders. In addition to the first extension granted in 48 instances, second extensions were granted in 17 instances, third extension in four instances and fourth extensions in three instances, and a fifth extension in one instance.

- . Of the 217 orders requesting interception of communication, 204 authorized wire (telephone) intercepts, four authorized oral intercepts, and 24 authorized electronic intercepts. Note that 15 of the orders granted more than one type of intercept.
- . There were a total of 82 requests for stored communications: 57 for pre-recorded jail conversations, 14 for text messages, four for video, three for a pager, two for a computer, and one each for fax and electronic voice mail.
- . Of the 217 orders requesting electronic surveillance, 215 were installed and utilized. Two intercepts were never installed or utilized.
- . Of the total 217 original orders, 79 authorized use of intercepts for 30 days, 69 authorized use of intercepts for 20 days, three authorized use for one day, while there was one order each for 11

in 2009: AO#2009-25, JPDUNI2009. AO#2010-6 should list the Prosecutor as Romankow, not Kaplan. Union reported two orders that were not on the federal report, JPDUNI2209 (10/02/09, CDS) and JPDUNI0210 (3/17/10, CDS).

*State Attorney General.* The US AOC reports 124 intercept orders; the state Attorney General's Office reports 73 intercept orders. AO#2010-3-5, AO#2010-23-26, AO#2010-28-31, AO#2010-33-47, AO#2010-49, and AO#2010-51-67 refer to intercepts used in conjunction with ongoing investigations and were not reported by the state in 2010. These 44 intercept orders will be reported by the Attorney General's Office at the conclusion of the investigations. The US AOC report includes seven duplicates: AO#2010-6 (KGCHUD14009); AO#2010-9 (KGCHUD16109); AO#2010-10 (KGCHUD16209); AO#2010-12 (KGCHUD16209); AO#2010-16 (KGCHUD0110); AO#2010-18 (TLFMID0110) and AO#2010-19 (TLFMID0210). AO#2009-22 should be dated 2/25/2009, have Judge Clark as the judge and CDS as the offense. AO#2008-47, LMLMON2908, should have an authorized length of 20 days, not 30 days. AO#2008-51 is a stored jail communication. It was reported as 120 days in length with three extensions. This is not necessary for a stored communication.

days and 15 days respectively. The remaining 64 orders involved only stored communications, so number of days authorized is not applicable.

Section 8 of the Wiretap Act specifies the crimes for which electronic surveillance may be granted. Offense data collected and analyzed for court-authorized electronic surveillance consider the most serious offense investigated.

Overall, electronic surveillance orders were granted in connection with investigations involving the following offense categories: controlled dangerous substance offenses, racketeering, murder offenses, leader of a narcotics network, money laundering, terroristic threats, assault, arson, robbery, child endangerment and gambling.

- . Of the 217 orders authorizing electronic surveillance, considering the most serious offense, the majority, 110 (51%), involved controlled dangerous substance offenses.
- . In addition, 44 (20%) of the orders involved racketeering, 41 (19%) involved murder offenses, and 7(3%) involved robbery.
- . Arson and leader of a narcotics network were the most serious offense in three orders each. Gambling, assault and child endangerment were involved in two orders each while bribery, terroristic threats and money laundering involved one order each.

## DEFENDANT INDICTMENTS AND DISPOSITIONS

Summary information concerning defendant indictments resulting from electronic surveillance applications is provided below with detailed information on the following pages.<sup>4</sup> The information provided concerns defendant indictments resulting from each application, the offenses charged, and indictment dispositions.

- . At the close of the report year, a total of 519 defendants were arrested of which 305 were indicted statewide as a result of electronic surveillance applications and orders.
- . At the close of the report year, 189 defendants were awaiting grand jury, 197 defendants were awaiting trial and two defendants were listed as deceased while 131 defendants indicted reached final disposition.
- . Of those defendants reaching final disposition, 92 were convicted through guilty pleas, 18 were admitted into a pre-trial intervention program and seven defendants were dismissed or no billed
- . Of those 305 defendants indicted, 283 (93%) were indicted for controlled dangerous substance offenses.
- . In addition, six defendants were indicted for murder offenses, and three each were indicted for leader of a narcotics network and robbery.
- . Of the remaining 10 defendants indicted, two each were indicted for arson, assault and obstructing justice. One each were indicted for forgery, money laundering, terroristic threats and weapons offenses.

MEMORANDUM TO: THE HONORABLE CHRIS CHRISTIE  
AND  
THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY

The New Jersey Wiretapping and Electronic Surveillance Control Act (N.J.S.A. 2A:156A-1 to - 34) requires the Chief Justice to submit an annual report to the Governor and the Legislature (N.J.S.A. 2A:156A-23E). In accordance with that section, I am submitting this report to inform you of the operation of the Act during 2010.

N.J.S.A. 2A:156A-2(i) provides that only Superior Court judges designated by the Chief Justice are authorized to hear wiretap applications. For the year 2010, the following judges were authorized wiretap judges: by order dated April 26, 1994, Judge Kevin G. Callahan; by order dated July 22, 1997, Judge Linda R. Feinberg; by order dated December 3, 1997, Judge Samuel D. Natal; by order dated June 11, 1999, Judge Albert J. Garofolo; by order dated July 22, 1999, Judge Marilyn C. Clark; by order dated December 27, 2004, Judge Maurice Gallipoli; by order dated July 1, 2005, Judge Maria M. Sypek; by order dated May 26, 2007, Judge Travis L. Francis and Judge Lawrence M. Lawson; by order dated July 14, 2008, Judge Peter J. Vazquez; by order dated February 1, 2009, Judge Joseph P. Donohue and Judge Thomas V. Manahan; by order dated February 18, 2009, Judge Peter E. Doyne and Judge Harry G. Carroll; by order dated September 1, 2009, Judge Ronald E. Bookbinder, Judge Ernest M. Caposela, Judge Yolanda Ciccone, Judge Francis R. Hodgson, Jr. and Judge Walter L. Marshall, Jr.; by order dated March 1, 2010, Judge Pedro J. Jimenez, Jr.; by order dated June 1, 2010, Judge Michael A. Donio and Judge Bernard E. DeLury, Jr.; by order dated September 1, 2010, Judge Liliana DeAvila-Silebi; and by order dated October 4, 2010, Judge Greta Gooden-Brown.

The data for the year 2010 includes reports of all orders granting permission to intercept wire, electronic and/or oral communications, or to perform electronic surveillance, for any period that ended in 2010. It is the actual termination date of the surveillance that governs which reports are included within the reporting year. During 2010, the reports to the Administrative Office of the Courts reflected 206 applications<sup>1</sup> seeking permission to intercept wire, electronic or oral communications. No applications were denied. Thus, in 2010 the authorized judges entered 206 orders granting permission to intercept wire, electronic and/or oral communications.

<sup>1</sup> Note that the Office of the Attorney General reports 217 applications. The numbers differ because of differences in reporting methods for the two reports. The Judiciary reports a wiretap in the year that it terminated. The Attorney General does not report a wiretap until the investigation in the case is complete.

Of the 206 orders entered, 143 permitted interception of wire communications, 9 permitted interception of electronic communications, and 2 permitted interception of oral communications. In addition, 52 applications were authorized for the retrieval of stored communications, rather than for the interception of wire, electronic and/or oral communications. There were 3 orders authorized for 90 days each, 70 orders authorized for 30 days each, 113 were specified for 20 days each, and 20 others were authorized for less than 20 days each. Additionally, 83 extensions of previously entered orders were granted during the reporting year. Of these, 18 extensions were for 90 days, 35 extensions were for 30 days and 1 extension was for 20 days. There were another 29 extensions for 10 days or less.
