# REPORT.

*To His Excellency Joel Parker, Governor of New Jersey:*

SIR:—I have the honor to transmit the annual report of the number and condition of the arms and equipments belonging to the State of New Jersey, remaining in the State Arsenal on the thirty-first day of October, A. D. eighteen hundred and seventy-four, with the issues and receipts at the Arsenal since the thirty-first day of October, eighteen hundred and seventy-three, the date of my last annual report. The operations of the past year have been of the same nature as the necessary routine business during the years succeeding the late war, and have not been increased by any calls upon the State forces for active service. The Arsenal is well supplied with camp and garrison equipage, and with sufficient ordnance and ordnance stores of the calibre .58 to meet any emergency. The following statement will show the quantity of muskets on hand at the Arsenal, serviceable and unserviceable:

## ARMS IN THE STATE ARSENAL.

The whole number of arms, serviceable and unserviceable, in the Arsenal, is sixteen thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight (16,858,) as follows:

## ISSUES.

There have been issued from the Arsenal, for the use of the uniformed companies of the National Guard, upon requisitions and bonds, pursuant to the statute, one thousand stand of arms. Sixteen companies of the National Guard have been armed during the year, and two independent companies have been armed by this department, one located at Cape May city, armed under a concurrent resolution of the Legislature, the other located at Phillipsburg, was armed under special authority of your Excellency. For a detailed statement, showing to what companies these arms have

been distributed, you are respectfully referred to statement E, in the appendix.

RECEIPTS.

There have been turned into the Arsenal during the past year, eight hundred and thirty-one (831) arms. For a particular statement showing from whom these arms were received, you are respectfully referred to statement D, in the appendix.

ANNUAL RETURNS.

Section eighteen of the "Act for the organization of the National Guard of New Jersey," directs the captains or commanding officers of every uniformed corps, furnished with arms and equipments, the property of the state, to make annual returns on or before the first day of December in each year, of the actual situation, condition, and number of the arms and accoutrements, and the number of men actually enrolled, equipped, and in uniform, doing military duty of the respective corps: and in case of failure of such commanding officer to make such returns, or, if the number of arms loaned to such corps does not fully appear on the respective returns, or their good condition is not manifest, the Quartermaster General shall cause the said arms and equipments to be returned to his care. Fifty-six companies have made returns to this office. Without these reports, it is impossible to make the comparison, in order to be informed either of the number and condition of the public property, or the care and preservation of the same in the hands of companies, and I see no good reason why the law, so important to the interest of the state, should not be rigidly enforced against all delinquent companies.

The whole number of muskets loaned out to companies of the National Guard, is four thousand nine hundred and eighteen (4918), and the returns from fifty-six companies show that they have in their possession two thousand five hundred and sixty (2560) stand.

To this should be added the arms supposed to be in possession of those companies delinquent in not making returns, as required by the law above referred to, as follows:

Making a total in the hands of the National Guard of three thousand four hundred and eighty-seven (3,487) arms, leaving a balance of one thousand five hundred and thirty-one (1,531) to be accounted for.

#### THE MILITIA.

The importance of an efficient and well disciplined militia force has been admitted, and in the early days of the Republic, statesmen recommended it to the consideration of legislators. At the commencement of the session of Congress in 1793, Washington in his annual message used the following language :

“The documents which will be presented to you will show the amount and kinds of arms and military stores now in our magazines and arsenals; and yet an addition even to these supplies cannot, with prudence, be neglected, as it would leave nothing to the uncertainty of procuring a warlike apparatus in the moment of public danger. Nor can such arrangements, with such objects, be exposed to the censure or jealousy of the warmest friends of Republican government. They are incapable of abuse in the hands of the militia, who ought to possess a pride in being the depository of the force of the Republic, and may be trained to a degree of energy equal to every military exigency of the United States.”

Again, in 1794, he said :

“The devising and establishing of a well regulated militia would be a genuine source of legislative honor, and a perfect title to public gratitude. I therefore entertain a hope that the present session will not pass, without carrying to its full energy the power of organizing

arming, and disciplining the militia, and thus providing, in the language of the constitution, for calling them forth to execute the laws of the Union, suppress insurrections, and repel invasions."

The militia of the country should be considered as the first efficient force to repel invasion and suppress insurrection in case of hostility. As a preservative of the public peace, it should be encouraged to the fullest extent compatible with the character and resources of the people of the state. The militia is divided into two classes, the active and reserve. The active is composed of the National Guard, containing sixty-six companies of infantry, two batteries of artillery, and two companies of cavalry, numbering about three thousand men in uniform, and fully armed and equipped. The reserve is composed "of persons between the ages of eighteen and forty-five years, who are liable to perform military duty."

#### THE NATIONAL GUARD.

This organization consists of two brigades, divided into nine regiments, and two battalions of infantry, two batteries of artillery, and two troops of cavalry; also, one regiment of colored infantry unassigned.

First regiment, Col. James Peckwell commanding, consists of six companies, numbering about two hundred and ten men in uniform, having charged against them on the books of the Arsenal, three hundred and nine stand of arms. Five companies made annual returns of the condition and care of the arms and accoutrements in their possession. These returns show that these five companies have in their possession, two hundred and one stand of arms.

Co. A, which made no return, is charged with fifty-five stand, making a total of arms in possession of this regiment, two hundred and fifty-six, leaving a balance of fifty-three to be accounted for.

Second regiment, Col. William Allen commanding, consists of six companies, numbering about two hundred and thirty-five men in uniform, having charged against them on the books of the Arsenal, four hundred and seven stand of arms. Four companies made annual returns. The returns show that these four companies have in their possession two hundred and sixteen stand of arms. It is proper to state here that two of the companies of this regiment were armed subsequent to the first of December, 1873, and annual returns were not required of them. Companies B and F, returns from which were not required, are charged with one hundred and twenty-eight stand, making a total of arms in possession of this regiment of three hundred and forty-four, leaving a balance of sixty-three to be accounted for.

Third regiment, Col. William A. Morrell commanding, consists of eight companies, numbering about three hundred and seventy men in uniform, having charged against them on the books of the

Arsenal, five hundred and ninety-five stand of arms. Seven companies made annual returns, and one company armed since December 1st, 1873. The returns show that these seven companies have in their possession three hundred and eighty-six stand of arms.

Co. H, a return from which was not required, is charged with fifty stand, making a total of arms in possession of this regiment of four hundred and thirty-six, leaving a balance of one hundred and fifty-nine to be accounted for.

Fourth regiment, Col. Dudley S. Steele commanding, consists of six companies, numbering about three hundred men in uniform, having charged against them on the books of the Arsenal, four hundred and thirteen stand of arms. Five companies made annual returns. The returns show that these five companies have in their possession two hundred and sixty-seven stand of arms.

Co. C, which made no return, has no arms in its possession, a portion of them being returned to the State Arsenal, and the remainder destroyed by a fire at its armory. The balance to be accounted for by this regiment is one hundred and forty-six.

Fifth regiment, Col. Levi R. Barnard commanding, consists of eight companies, numbering about three hundred and twenty men in uniform, having charged against them on the books of the Arsenal four hundred and forty-four stand of arms. Seven companies made annual returns. The returns show that these seven companies have in their possession three hundred and thirty-six stand of arms.

Co. C, which made no return, is charged with eighty stand, making a total in possession of this regiment, of four hundred and sixteen arms, leaving a balance of twenty-eight to be accounted for.

Sixth regiment, Gen. William J. Sewell commanding, consists of seven companies, numbering about two hundred and ninety-five men in uniform, having charged against them on the books of the Arsenal three hundred and seventy-seven stand of arms. Five companies made annual returns, one company armed since December 1st, 1873. The returns show that these five companies have in their possession two hundred and ninety stand of arms.

Co. D, which made no return, is charged with fifty-two stand. Co. F, from which no return was required, is charged with forty-three stand, making a total of arms in possession of this regiment of three hundred and eighty-five. From this total is to be deducted eighty stand which were returned to the State Arsenal during the year, leaving a balance of seventy-two to be accounted for.

Seventh regiment, Col. Ashbel W. Angel commanding, consists of seven companies, numbering about three hundred and ten men in uniform, having charged against them on the books of the Arsenal four hundred and forty-seven stand of arms. Five companies made annual returns. The returns show that these five companies have in their possession two hundred and sixty-three stand of arms.

Companies A and D, which made no returns, are charged with one hundred and thirty stand, making a total of arms in possession of this regiment of three hundred and ninety-three, leaving a balance of fifty-four to be accounted for.

Eighth regiment, Col. George B. Carse commanding, consists of seven companies, numbering about two hundred and fifty men in uniform, having charged against them on the books of the Arsenal three hundred and twenty-six stand of arms. Four companies made annual returns. Five have been armed since December 1st, 1872. The returns show that these four companies have in their possession two hundred and six stand of arms.

Companies A, C, D, E, and I, which were armed during the year, are charged with two hundred and thirty-one stand, making a total of arms in possession of this regiment of four hundred and thirty-seven. From this is to be deducted one hundred and eleven returned to the State Arsenal during the year, leaving the total now in possession of that regiment, three hundred and twenty-six, the exact number charged against it.

This regiment was formed under the act approved March 21st, 1872, for the organization of colored companies.

Nine companies have been organized, and two have been disbanded, leaving at present seven companies, all of which have been armed; five of them making requisition and being supplied with arms during the past year. The delay in companies of this regiment in making requisitions for arms was occasioned by the fact that they had not been able to clothe and equip themselves as required by law, before making requisition. The difficulty seems to be the want of means on the part of the men to clothe themselves, and the appropriation by the state, the payments of which are made semi-annually, in April and October, is inadequate to supply a sufficient number of uniforms for the men mustered in, and to defray other necessary expenses incident to newly organized companies. Arms and accoutrements are furnished only upon satisfactory evidence that the men are clothed according to law.

Ninth regiment, Col. B. F. Hart commanding, consists of five companies, numbering about two hundred and five men in uniform, having charged against them on the books of the Arsenal two hundred and thirty stand of arms. Three companies made annual returns: two were armed since December 1st, 1872. The returns show that these three companies have in their possession one hundred and twenty-seven stand of arms.

Companies D and E, from which returns were not required, are charged with one hundred and eight stand, making a total of arms in possession of that regiment of two hundred and thirty-five. From this is to be deducted six stand returned during the year, leaving a balance of one stand to be accounted for.

Second battalion, Major James V. Moore commanding, consists of

three companies, numbering about one hundred and thirty-five men in uniform, having charged against them on the books of the Arsenal one hundred and seventy stand of arms. Two companies made annual returns. The returns show that these two companies have in their possession one hundred and twenty stand of arms. Company B, which made no return, is charged with fifty stand, making a total of one hundred and seventy, the exact number charged against the battalion.

Fourth battalion, Major Edward M. DuBois commanding, consists of four companies, numbering about one hundred and sixty-five men in uniform, having charged against them on the books of the Arsenal one hundred and ninety-six stand of arms. Three companies made annual returns. The returns show that these three companies have in their possession one hundred and fifty-one stand of arms.

Company C, which made no return, has no arms in its possession. The balance to be accounted for by this battalion is forty-five stand.

Battery A, Capt. George Kahlert commanding. This battery numbers about eighty-five men in uniform, having a four gun battery, with carriages, caissons and implements complete, in good order.

Battery B, Capt. Emmor D. French commanding. This battery numbers about fifty-five men in uniform, having a four gun battery, with carriages, caissons and implements complete, and fifty-four muskets and accoutrements in good order.

Cavalry troop A, Capt. John A. Engel commanding. This troop numbers about forty men in uniform, having forty sabres and forty sets of horse equipments complete.

Cavalry troop B, Capt. Isaac Roumer commanding. This troop numbers about forty-five men in uniform, having fifty sabres and forty-three sets of horse equipments in as good condition as when taken from the Arsenal.

#### EXPENSES ON ACCOUNT OF MILITIA.

In the appendix you will find a statement of the amount paid by the State Treasurer, on account of the State Militia, from November 1st, 1873, to October 31st, 1874; also, a statement showing what part of this account was contracted last year, and for what purpose, and also what portion of this sum is for appropriation for armory rent, and for the purchase of ordnance, and ordnance stores, and equipments, showing the actual sum expended for current expenses of the Militia this year, independent of the sum laying over from last year, as follows:

Although the aggregate expenditures for this year are greater than the preceding one, it must be borne in mind that there are more organizations entitled to the appropriation for armory rent, and that the sum of five thousand eight hundred and twenty-one dollars and forty-five cents was incurred in the year 1873; two hundred and twenty-three dollars and ninety-three cents were expended for claims of officers of the New Jersey Rifle Corps, for pay for services, under the act approved April 6th, 1865, bills for which were not presented in time to be paid during the last fiscal year, and nine thousand six hundred and seventy-six dollars and seventy-nine cents were expended in the purchase of ordnance stores, and camp and garrison equipage now on hand, making the current expenses of the Militia fifteen thousand five hundred and thirty-two dollars and eighty-two cents.

BREECH LOADERS.

I had hoped to have been able to report the receipt during the present year of a sufficient number of breech-loading muskets to re-arm the National Guard, but they have however been promised at an early day, as will appear from the following communications from the War Department:

*Quartermaster General State of New Jersey:*

SIR:—I am instructed by the Chief of Ordnance to acknowledge your reference of the letter from the Governor of the State of New Jersey, dated the 11th instant, and would respectfully state, in reply, that requisitions for the calibre .50 breech-loaders on account of quota due the state under the law for arming the militia, can be filled at any time. It is expected that the calibre .45 breech-loaders will be ready for issue sometime during the present fiscal year.

To this communication an answer was returned saying, that your Excellency "respectfully declined to receive, on account of quota due this state, any breech-loaders other than those of calibre .45," and asking "about what time during the present fiscal year" the department "will be prepared to furnish this state her quota in muskets of calibre .45."

SIR:—In reply to your letter of the 6th inst., you are respectfully informed that the precise time when calibre .45 rifles can be issued to the State of New Jersey cannot positively be stated, but it is thought that some can be issued before the expiration of the present year.

The indebtedness of the United States for quotas due this state under the act of Congress of 1808, appropriating two hundred thousand dollars annually for arming the Militia, payable in arms, including the quota for the present year, is about sixty thousand dollars. They have been promised to be furnished "as soon as they can be got ready." This sum will produce about three thousand five hundred stand, which, together with the amount of fifty thousand one hundred and twenty-nine dollars and seventeen cents, standing in the treasury of this state to the credit of the State Arsenal, the proceeds from sales of old ordnance, sold under the act approved April 17th, 1868, and to be specifically applied to the purchase of ordnance and ordnance stores, will be sufficient to re-arm the National Guard with the most improved arm known, without a charge of one dollar to the State Treasury. In tabular statement F, will be found a statement in detail of the indebtedness of the United States, on account of the annual quotas, and the several amounts drawn from the Ordnance Department annually, from the year 1854 to 1874.

## WAR CLAIMS.

The claims of this state against the United States, referred to in my previous reports, stand precisely in the same condition as they did at the date of my last annual report, none of them having been adjusted or allowed by the United States during the year. They are in a condition to be examined on a review or re-examination of the whole account, with the explanations from this department now on file, together with a statement in detail of the several amounts still claimed by the state. It is impossible to state when any portion of these claims will be realized by this state, it depending entirely whether the explanations will be satisfactory, and the time the department will be occupied in their examination. The objections raised in the prosecution of these claims are, that they are of such a nature as do not properly come under the rules of the Treasury Department, prescribed for the settlement of state claims, some of which are for expenditures for arming and equipping troops not recognized by the regulations of the service, and others for the want of property vouchers. These objections can only be overcome by personal explanations of the reasons and necessity for the expenditure of each particular item disallowed and suspended, or by such arguments as will satisfy the department to modify the rules so as to admit the particular claims rejected or suspended.

Vouchers of purchase or issues defective in form, or the want of sub-vouchers, expenditures not recognized by the army regulations or in excess of prescribed allowances; also, all expenditures for state bounties, pay and premiums for the encouragement of enlistments to enable the state to avoid a draft, and expenses incident thereto, such as services, clerk hire, printing, transportation, telegraphing, &c.; all expenses paid for volunteer surgeons and nurses, provisions, clothing, and delicacies furnished the sick soldiers in hospitals, expenses in aid to wounded, and transportation to soldiers killed in battle or dying in hospitals, as well as every expense of a voluntary or gratuitous character, are disallowed under the rules of the treasury.

It would be an endless task to enumerate the different expenditures made by the state in enrolling, arming, and equipping eighty thousand men, and the various objections raised by the accounting officers in the suspensions and disallowances, and explanations upon the same vouchers, to meet and answer quibbles for delay, as well as interrogatories for information. There have been made over thirty distinct settlements, yet there is no state in any better condition, in respect to her war claims, than New Jersey.

Since the date of my last annual report, a re-examination and revision of the entire account, comprised in sixteen installments, has been made in this office; a number of the disallowances have been admitted as being improperly charged against the United

States, and the balance claimed at this date is thirty-two thousand nine hundred and eleven dollars and twelve cents.

Statement G, ordnance and ordnance stores, and clothing, camp and garrison equipage, issued from the State Arsenal during the year ending October 31st, 1874.

Tabular statement A, ordnance and ordnance stores, clothing, camp and garrison equipage, and quartermaster stores, dropped by affidavits, during the year ending October 31st, 1874.

Tabular statement B, ordnance and ordnance stores, &c., transferred during the year ending October 31st, 1874.

Tabular statement C, clothing, camp and garrison equipage, and quartermaster stores in possession of the National Guard, on the 31st day of October, 1874.

Tabular statement D, ordnance and ordnance stores in possession of the National Guard on the 31st day of October, 1874.

Tabular statement E, ordnance and ordnance stores, clothing, camp and garrison equipage, &c., in possession of old organizations, militia, and sundry persons, on the 31st day of October, 1874.
