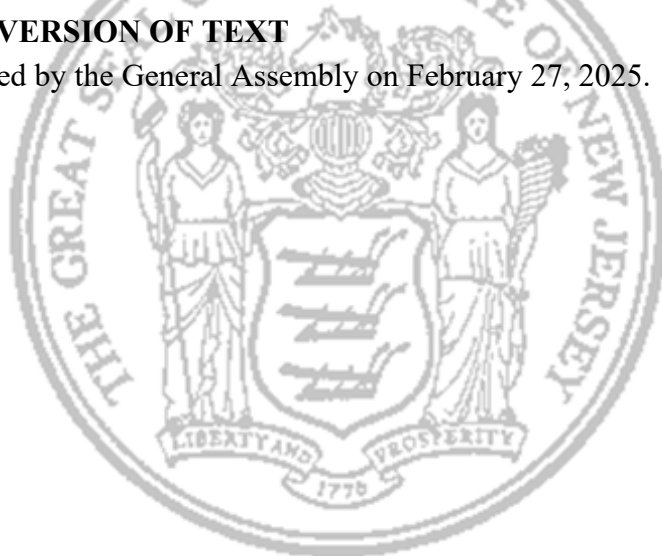

SYNOPSIS

Requires public institution of higher education to invite Council on Compulsive Gambling of New Jersey on institution's campus.

CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT

As amended by the General Assembly on February 27, 2025.

1 AN ACT concerning ²**[sports wagering partnerships at]** compulsive
2 gambling support at² public institutions of higher education and
3 supplementing Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes.

5 **BE IT ENACTED** *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
6 *of New Jersey:*

8 1. ²**[a.** A public institution of higher education participating in a
9 sports wagering partnership with a sports wagering operator or
10 intermediary shall establish a gambling addiction prevention program
11 which provides students with educational materials that promote
12 responsible gambling behavior. The institution shall provide students
13 with information on a hotline for individuals with a gambling problem.
14 The hotline shall be posted on the website of the institution and in each
15 sports facility, dormitory, library, and student center, and any other
16 facility or area on campus that the institution determines to be
17 appropriate.]² ¹At least once per semester, and as often as the
18 institution determines to be appropriate, ²**[the]** a public² institution
19 ²of higher education² shall invite and facilitate the presence of the
20 Council on Compulsive Gambling of New Jersey on the institution's
21 campus for the purpose of providing information and resources
22 relevant to compulsive gambling which shall include, but shall not be
23 limited to, information regarding the potential risks associated with
24 gambling, compulsive gambling counseling services, and options for
25 gambling self-exclusion programs.¹

26 ²**[b.** As used in this section, “sports wagering partnership” means
27 a partnership or contractual agreement between a sports wagering
28 operator or intermediary and an institution of higher education,
29 including an athletic department or booster club of the institution, for
30 access to advertise in the institution’s stadiums and other facilities, in
31 digital and broadcast sports content, and through other means.]²

33 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
