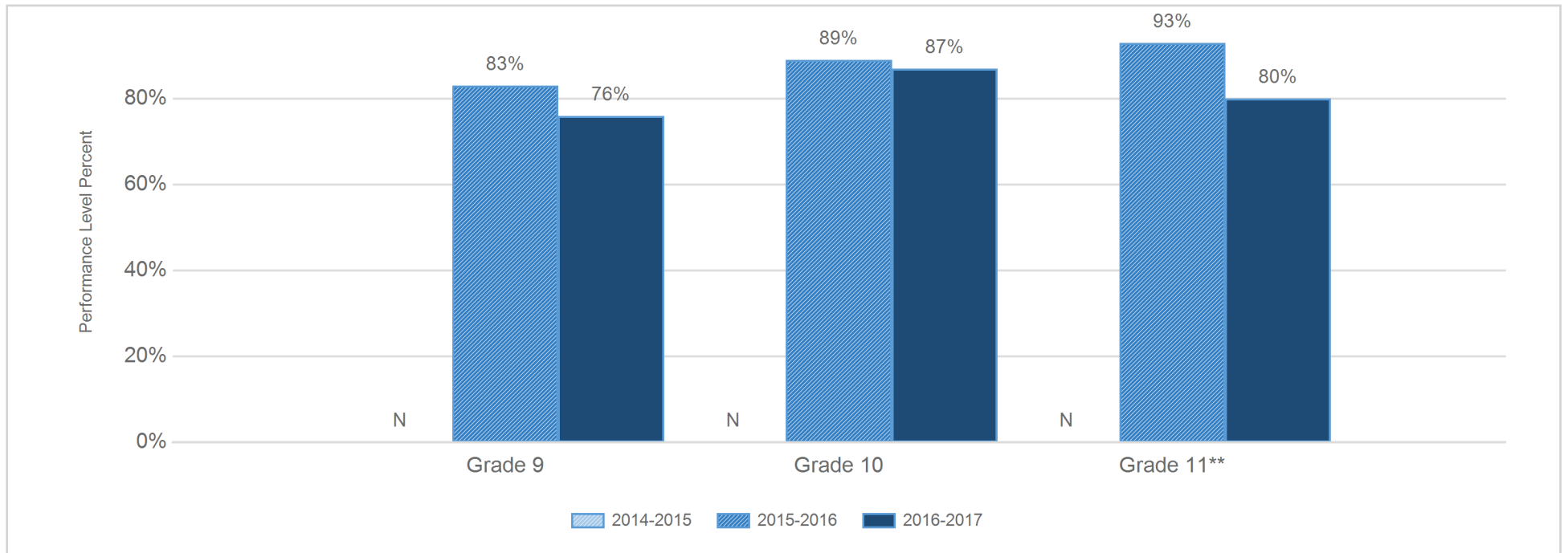

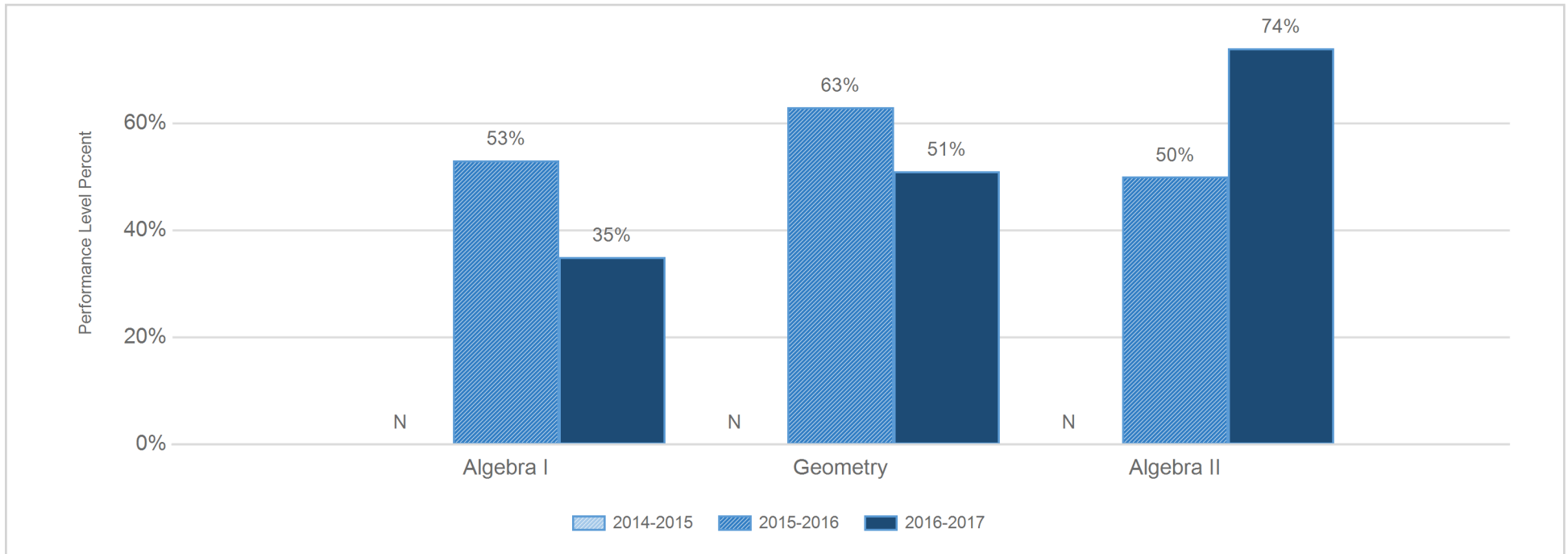

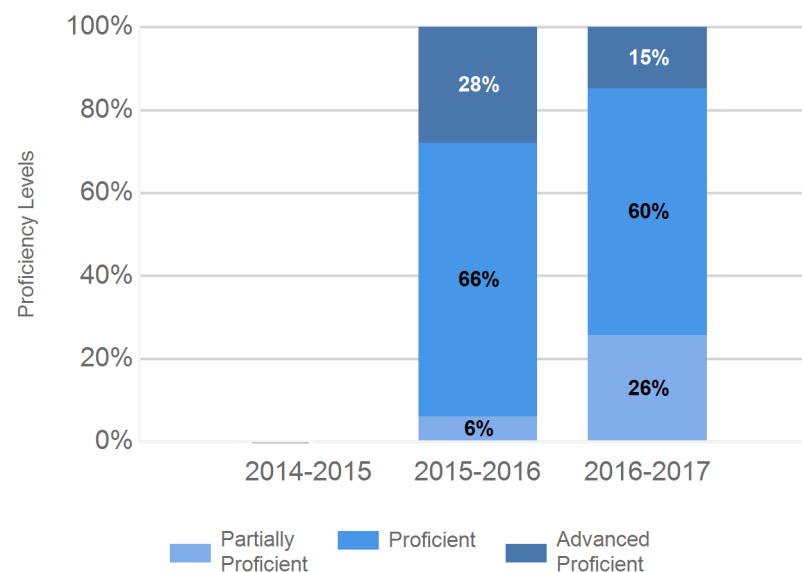

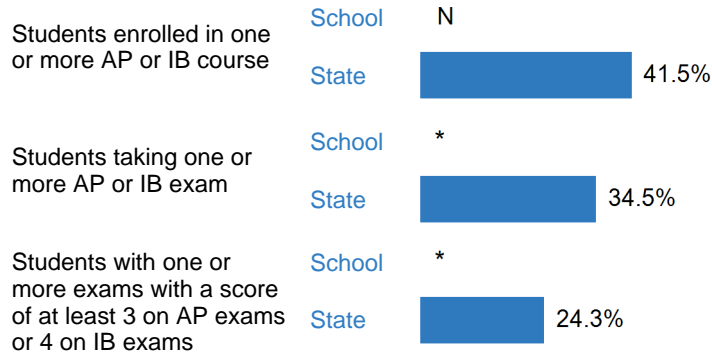

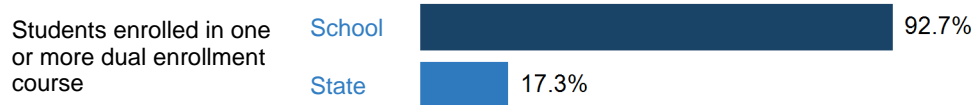

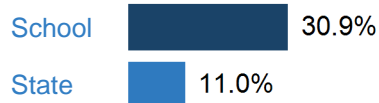

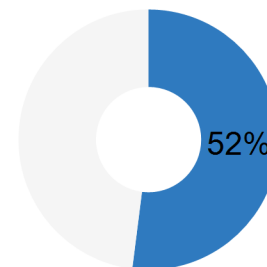

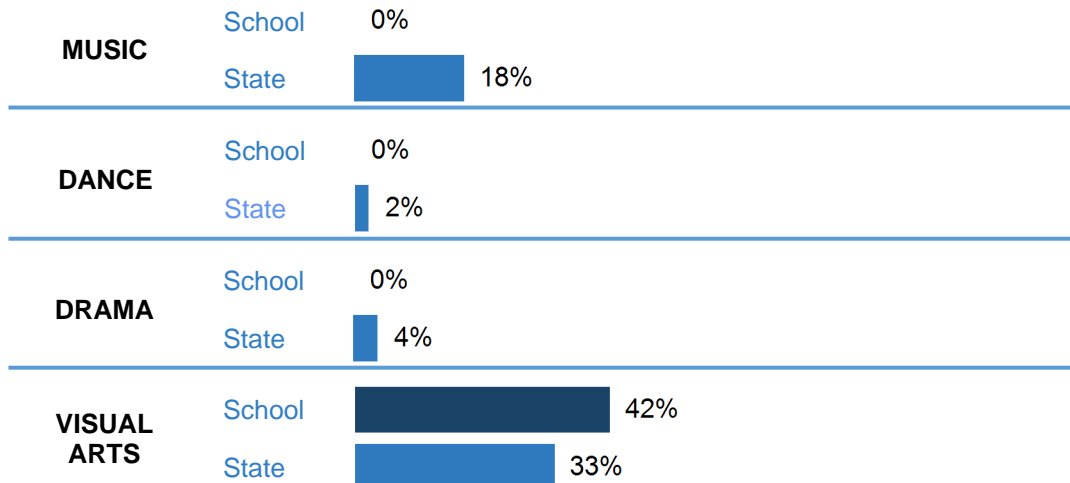

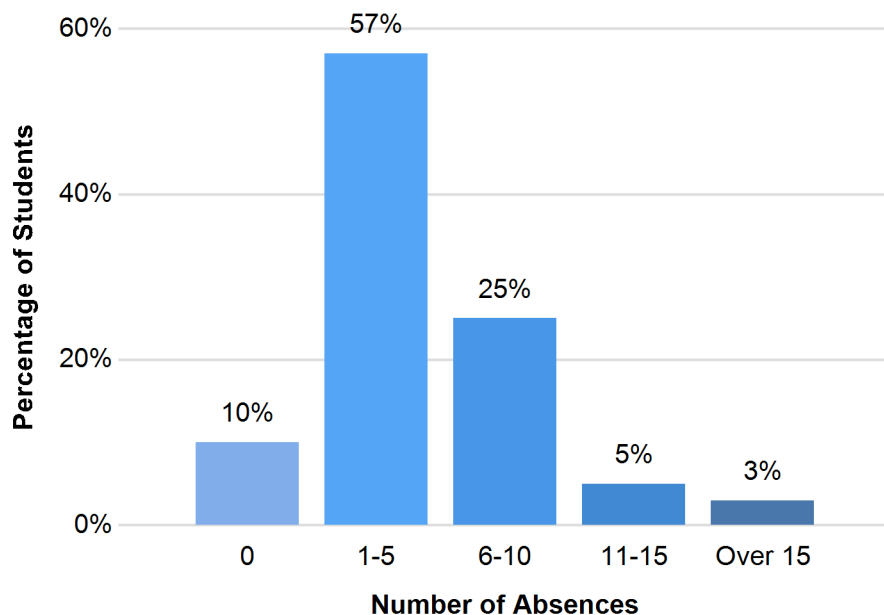

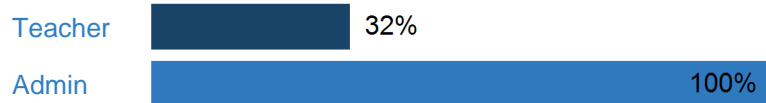

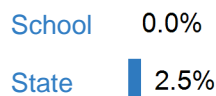

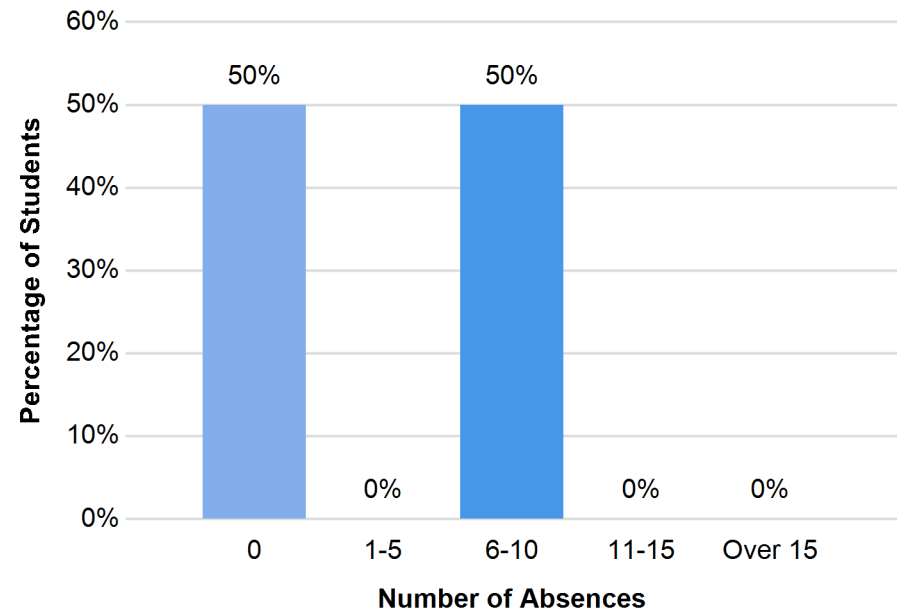

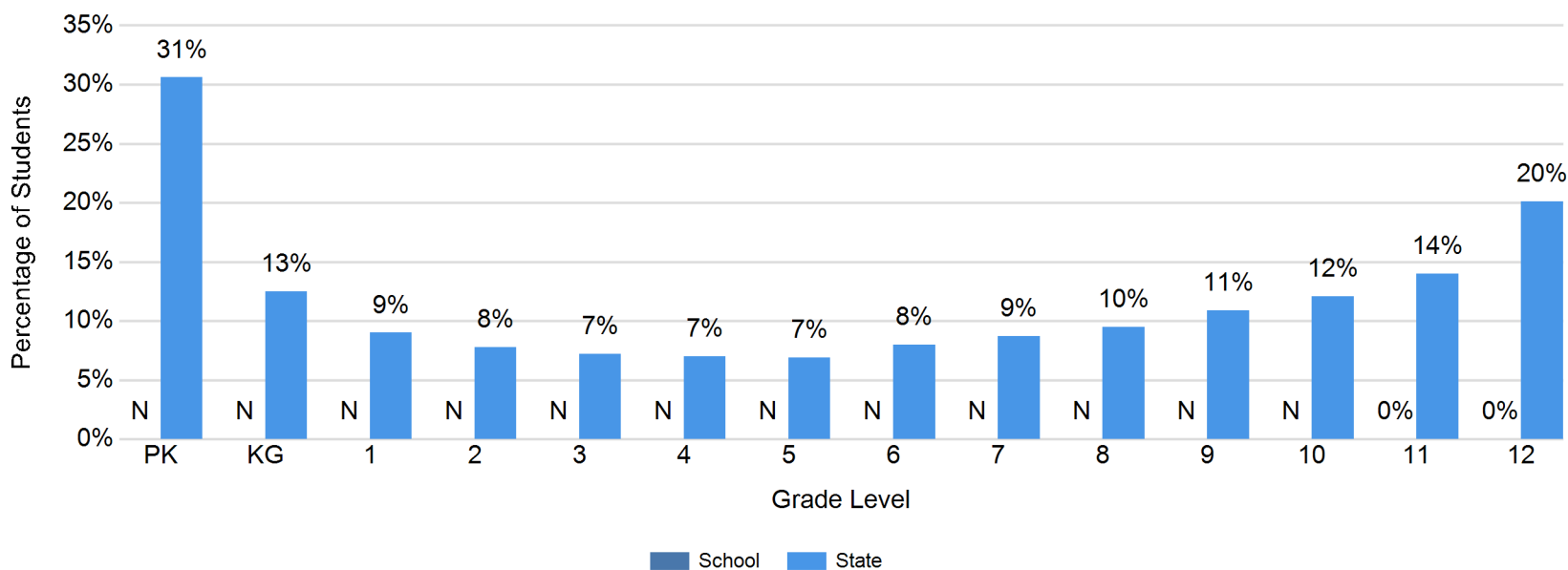

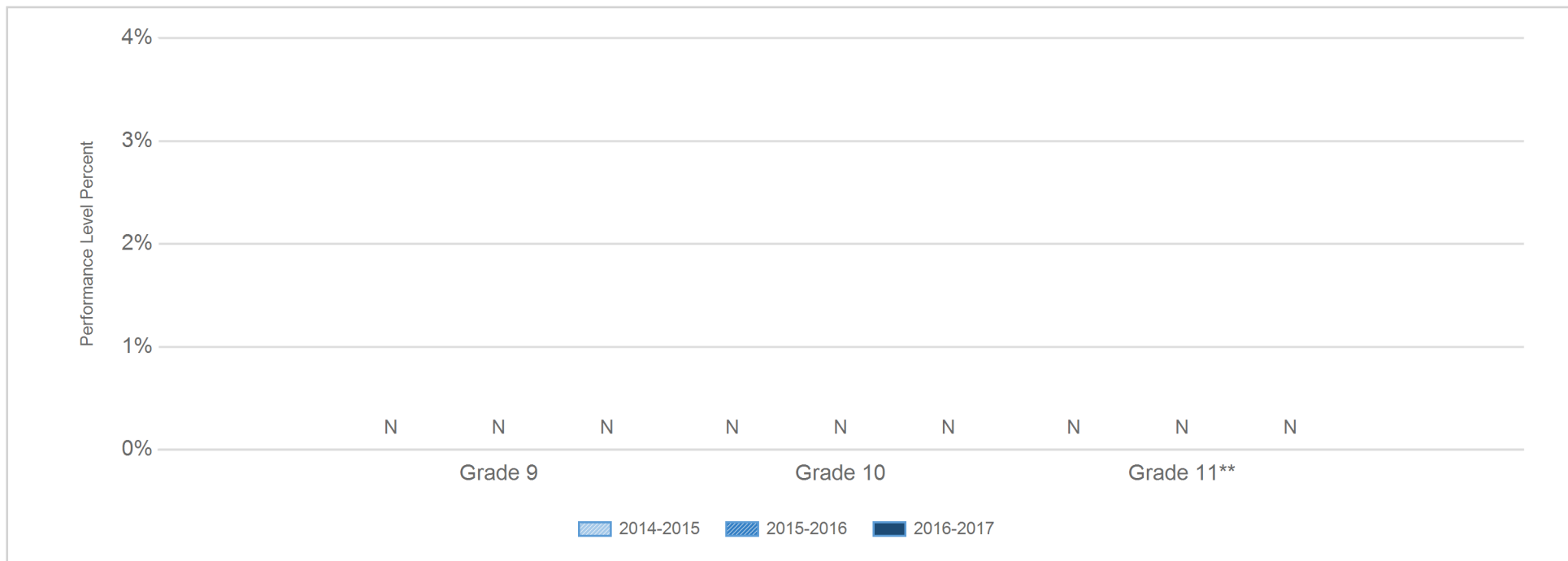

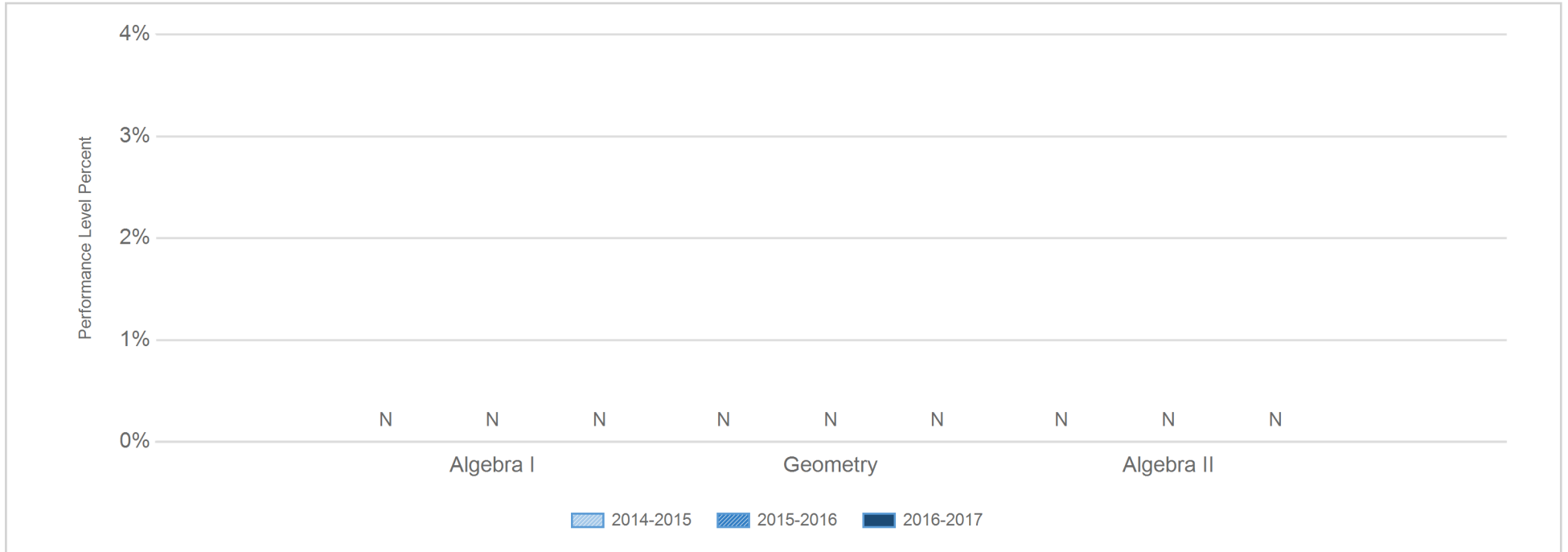

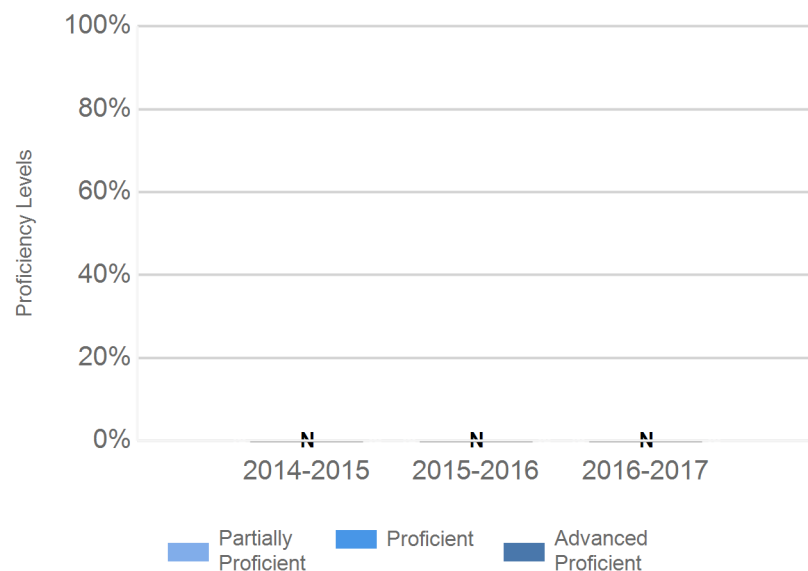

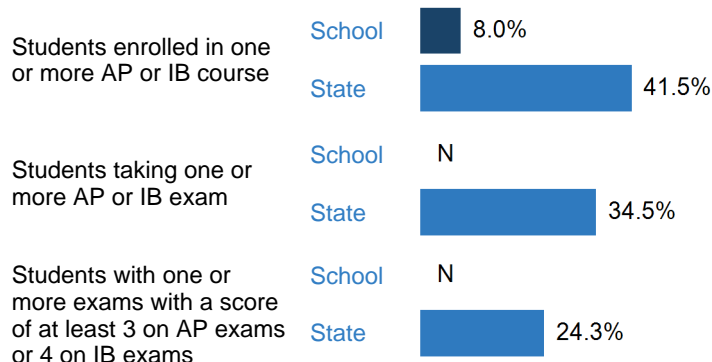

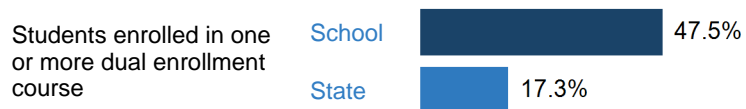

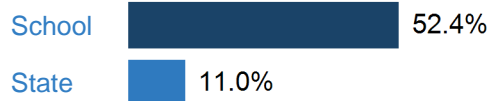

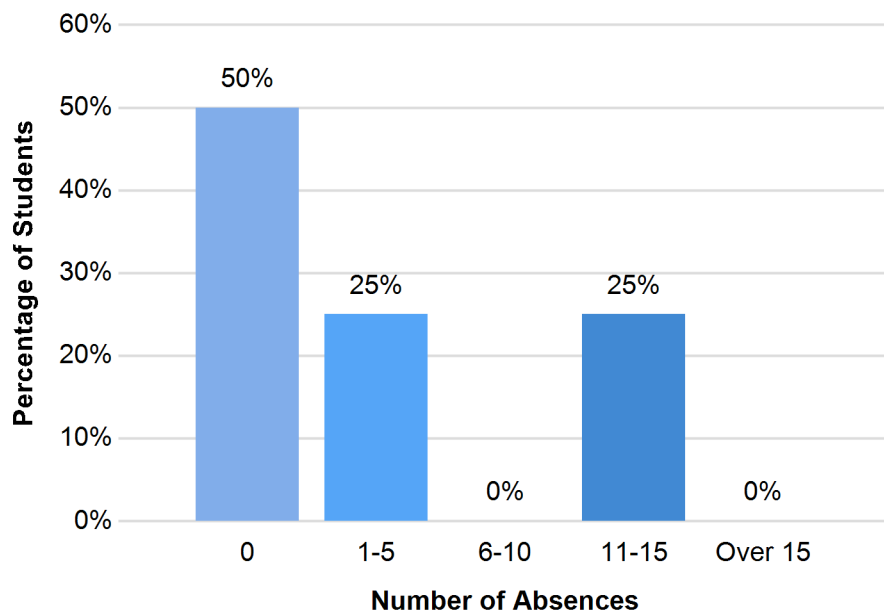

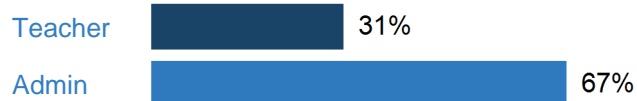

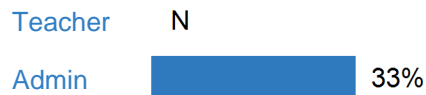
Bachelor's Degree
