SUBJECT: NJ KidCare Outreach Activities

This is a follow-up to Medicaid Communication 98-4, which advised that the Division would be sending outreach letters about NJ KidCare directly to the parents or guardians of children who were previously terminated from the maternal and child health segments of the New Jersey Care...Special Medicaid Programs. Children affected were identified by Program Status Codes 480, 481, 482, and 483.

Over the course of the next few months, the attached letter will be sent (2,500 per week) to approximately 50,000 former beneficiaries. You will note that the County Welfare Agency/Board of Social Services is included as a point of contact. As a result of this mailing, your agency can anticipate a number of inquiries from individuals who may have questions or may be interested in initiating an application on behalf of a child for NJ KidCare, including Medicaid Expansion.

Since we are unable at this time to anticipate the number of responses which will ensue, we ask that your agency determine how best to respond to these inquiries, including the mailing out of NJ KidCare applications to interested individuals.

As part of the process in determining eligibility for NJ KidCare, including Medicaid Expansion, it is important to screen for any current or potential eligibility under other Medicaid programs, including AFDC Medicaid through Work First New Jersey. You may find that some children have had Medicaid eligibility reestablished or may be eligible for other Medicaid programs.

For cases in which a NJ KidCare application is evaluated by your agency and determined ineligible for Plan A, but based on age and family income could qualify for Plans B or C, the original application, along with required verification, should be mailed to:

Your agency should retain a copy of the application and verification for your files. A Medicaid Communication regarding transfer procedures will be forthcoming.

Also attached for your information is a sample NJ KidCare program outreach message which will appear on future Medicaid cards for the New Jersey Care...Special Medicaid Programs, NJ KidCare and Medically Needy populations. If you have any questions regarding this Communication, please contact the field service staff assigned to your county.

AN IMPORTANT NOTICE ABOUT NJ KIDCARE

DEAR PARENT OR GUARDIAN:

According to our records, your child previously lost his or her eligibility for the New Jersey Care...Special Medicaid Programs. A new program has just started called NJ KidCare. Under this program, if your child is uninsured, he or she may be eligible for health care coverage. If you have any other uninsured children under 19 years of age living in your household, they may also qualify for health care coverage.

If your child is eligible, NJ KidCare will provide your child with most of the same benefits as he or she received under Medicaid. Depending on your family's income, you may have to pay a monthly premium of \$15 per household and a small copayment for some services.

Enclosed is a brochure that will provide you with more information about NJ KidCare. If you have any questions, call the NJ KidCare toll-free hotline at 1-800-701-0710 or contact your County Welfare Agency/Board of Social Services. If your child is currently receiving Medicaid benefits, please disregard this notice.
