Academic Achievement measures the content knowledge students have in language arts literacy and math. A proficiency rate is calculated by summing the count of students who scored either proficient or advanced proficient on the assessment and dividing by the count of valid test scores.

College and Career Readiness

This school outperforms 53% of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and 18% of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of College and Career Readiness. Additionally, this school is meeting 40% of its performance targets in the area of College and Career Readiness



College and Career Readiness measures the degree to which students are demonstrating behaviors that are indicative of future attendance and/or success in college and careers. For high schools, this includes measures of participation in college readiness tests such as the SAT, ACT or PSAT and in rigorous coursework as defined by participation in AP or IB courses in English, math, social studies and science.

Graduation and Post-Secondary



This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.






Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup













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



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


Chronic Absenteeism Trend



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





This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.




Total School Enrollment Trends




Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup



This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.




Total School Enrollment Trends




Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup





















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

COLLEGE AND CAREER READINESS




Chronic Absenteeism Trend
