College and Career Readiness

This school outperforms 28% of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile ranking and 42% of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile ranking in the performance area of College and Career Readiness. Additionally, this school is meeting 0% of its performance targets in the area of College and Career Readiness.

College and Career readiness measures the degree to which students are demonstrating behaviors that are indicative of future attendance and/or success in college and careers. 

This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.




Total School Enrollment Trends

Enrollment Trends by Program Participation






Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup





















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




