


## **Enrollment by Gender**

This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.




#### Enrollment by Ethnic/ Racial Subgroup

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










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








## Chronic Absenteeism Trend




#### Enrollment by Gender

This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.







This graph presents the percentage of students who met or exceeded expectations for the past two years.









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




#### **Enrollment by Gender**

This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.




#### Enrollment by Ethnic/ Racial Subgroup



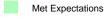



This graph presents the percentage of students who met or exceeded expectations for the past two years.





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



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



This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.




