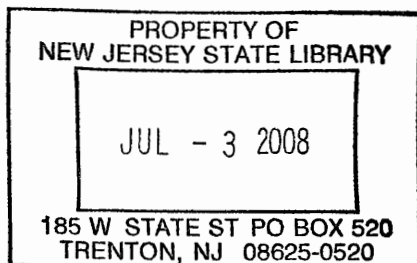

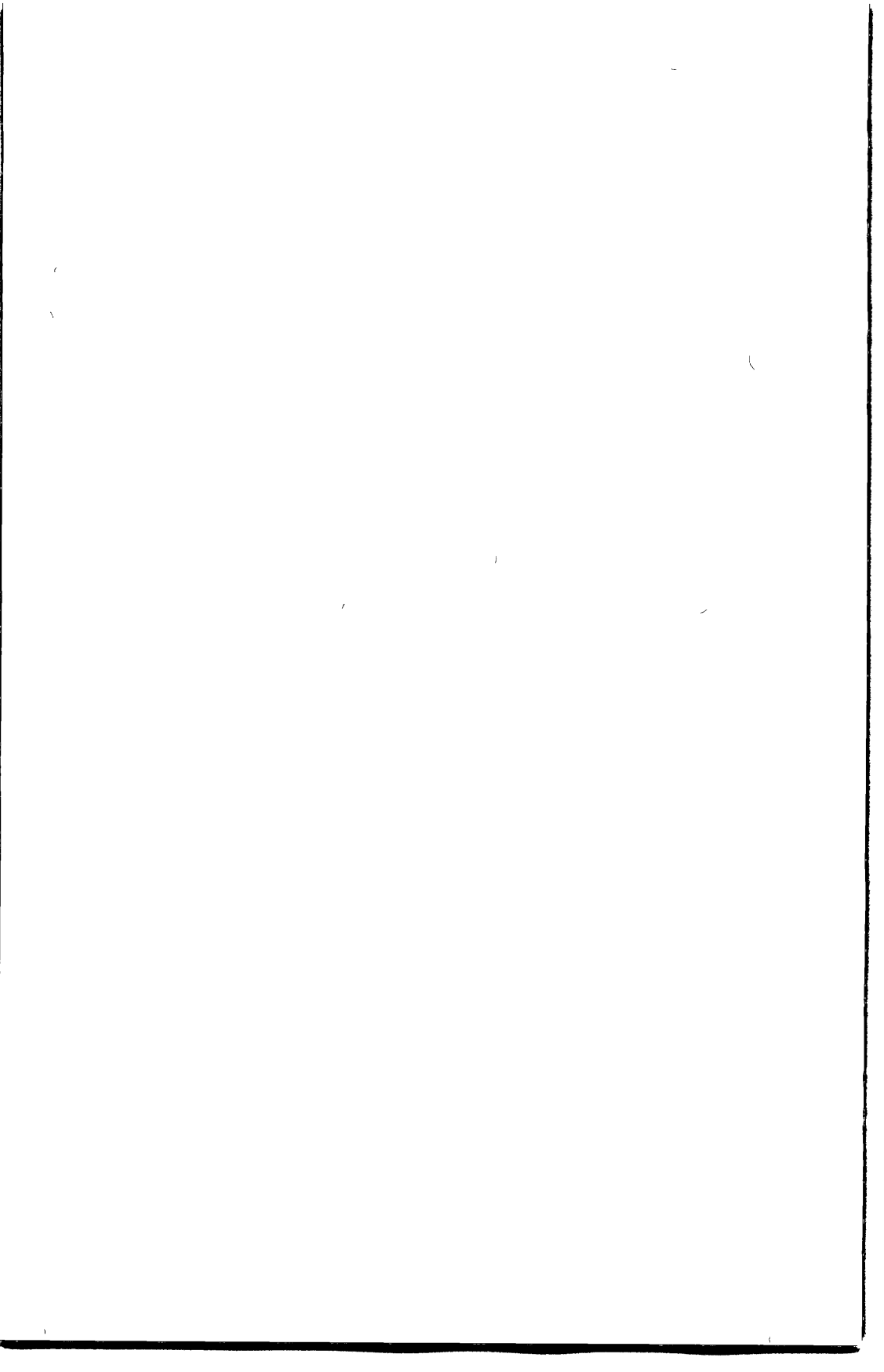

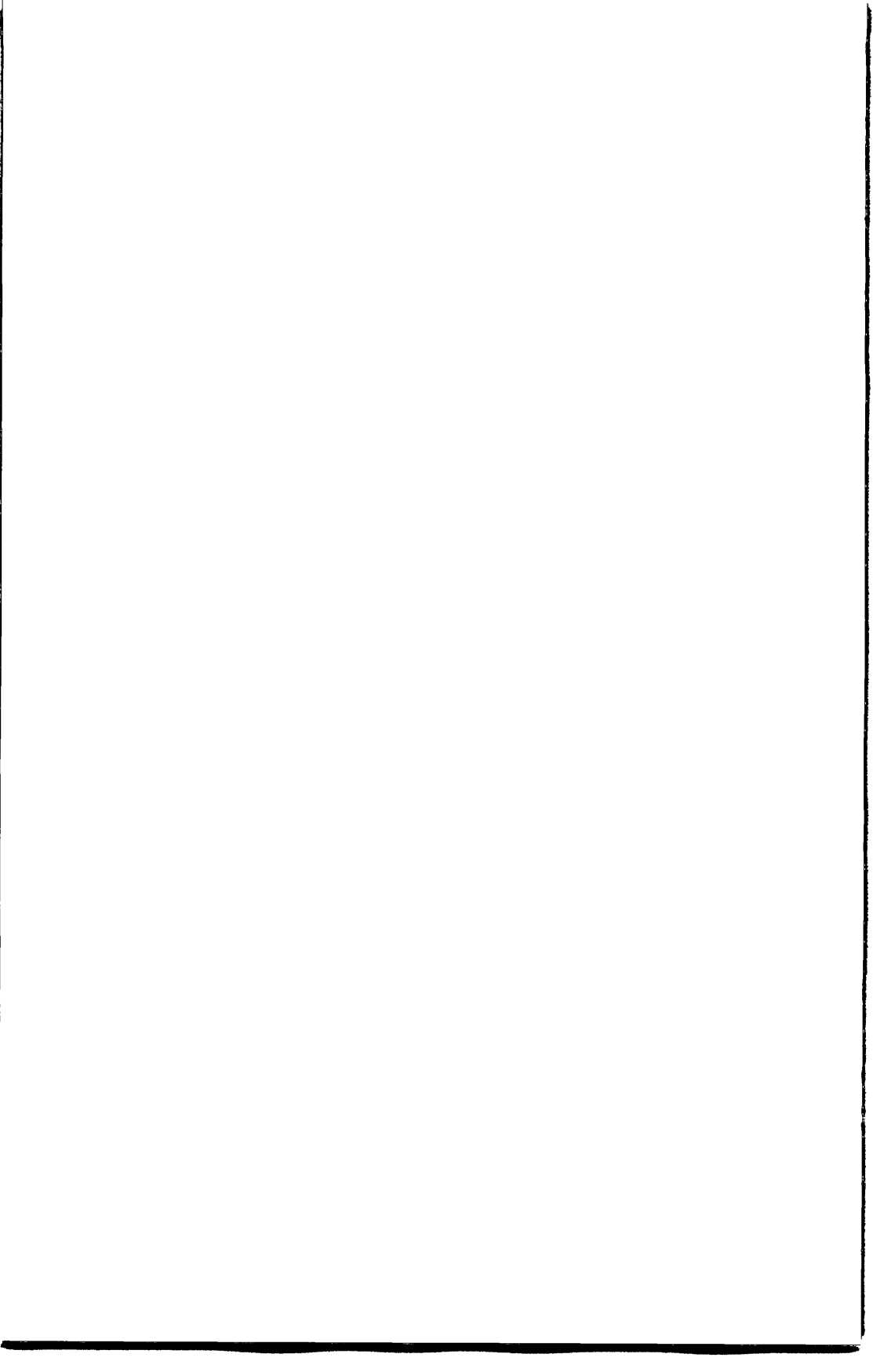

STATE OF NEW JERSEY SENATE CHAMBER

Tuesday, January 9, 2007

At 11 21 AM the Senate met

Upon calling the roll, the following Senators answered the call, and the President declared a quorum present

On motion of Senator Kenny the reading of the Journal of the previous session was dispensed with

On motion of Senator Smith the following Concurrent Resolution was read and adopted by voice vote

Be It Resolved by the Senate of the State of New Jersey (the General Assembly concurring)

1 That on Tuesday, January 9, 2007, at 12 00 o'clock noon, or as soon thereafter as is practicable, both houses of the Legislature meet in joint session in the War Memorial auditorium for the purpose of receiving the State of the State Address of the Honorable Jon S Corzine, Governor of the State of New Jersey

2 That the President appoint Senators Bark, Bucco, Madden and Smith to wait on the Governor

To be Commissioner of the Department of Health and Senior Services, the Honorable Fred Martin Jacobs, M D , J D , of Short Hills, to succeed himself, for the term prescribed by law

To be a member of the Commission on Uniform Legislation, Jeffrey S Mandel, Esq , of Parsippany, to replace Joseph Donegan, Esq , for the term prescribed by law

To be a member of the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission, Thomas W Sumners, Jr , Esq , of Lawrenceville, to replace James P McManimon, for the term prescribed by law

To be a member of the New Jersey Commission on Higher Education, Steven D Weinstein, Esq , of Haddonfield, to replace Ralph Izzo, resigned, for the term prescribed by law

The above nominations were referred to the Judiciary Committee

The following bills were read for the first time by their titles and referred to committees as indicated

Senate No 12, by Senator B Smith, without reference, on second reading --Establishes "Local Unit Alignment, Reorganization, and Consolidation Commission", establishes measures for local government efficiency, appropriates \$95,000

Senate No 14, by Senators Adler, Karcher and Codey, without reference, on second reading --Provides for mandatory forfeiture of retirement benefits and mandatory imprisonment for public officers or employees convicted of certain crimes

Senate No 15, by Senator Kenny, without reference, on second reading --Establishes an independent Office of State Comptroller and consolidates financial audit and performance reviews of State and local government units

Senate No 16, by Senators Codey and Karcher, without reference, on second reading --Implements various recommendations of Joint Legislative

Committee on Public Employee Benefits Reform concerning benefits and certain terms and conditions of public office and employment

Senate No 2446, by Senator Martin, Transportation Committee --Provides towers remedy for nonpayment of certain charges

Senate No 2447, by Senator Sweeney, Transportation Committee --Authorizes special licence plates for former freeholders

Senate No 2448, by Senator Doria, Education Committee --Establishes pilot program to conduct comprehensive eye examinations for second grade students

Senate No 2449, by Senator Lesniak, State Government Committee --Transfers Division of Elections from Department of Law and Public Safety to Department of State, designates Secretary of State as chief election official

Senate No 2450, by Senator Gill, Health, Human Services and Senior Citizens Committee --Requires health care providers to obtain informed consent from patients for use of certain reprocessed medical devices

Senate No 2451, by Senators Adler and Gill, Community and Urban Affairs Committee --Eliminates regional contribution agreements, creates housing rehabilitation and assistance program for grants to municipalities

Senate No 2452, by Senator Bark, Labor Committee --Renames the "Temporary Disability Benefits Law" as the "Temporary Disability and Pregnancy Benefits Law "

Senate No 2453, by Senator Sweeney, Economic Growth Committee --Authorizes civil action for certain economic damages against owner or keeper of pet animal that injures or kills another person's pet animal

Senate No 2454, by Senator Ciesla, Labor Committee --Requires dockbuilders and workers who come into contact with creosote-treated marine piling, and their employers, to comply with certain established safety and health protection procedures

Senate No 2455, by Senators Kavanaugh and L Connors, Education Committee --Establishes a formula for the distribution of State aid to school districts

Senate No 2456, by Senator McNamara, Community and Urban Affairs Committee --Permits municipal board of library commissioners to reduce library tax rate when municipality acquires new ratables

Senate No 2457, by Senator Doria, Labor Committee --Requires prevailing wages to be paid for construction work on State-owned properties

Senate No 2458, by Senator Madden, Labor Committee --Prohibits debarred contractor from using new business entity to circumvent

prevailing wage requirements, provides for suspension of contractor's registration pending hearing

Senate No 2459, by Senators Inverso and Allen, Law and Public Safety and Veterans' Affairs Committee --Creates New Jersey Cold War ribbon, appropriates \$5,000

Senate No 2460, by Senator McNamara, Judiciary Committee --Provides that public official may refuse to solemnize civil unions if solemnization conflicts with public official's conscience or sincerely held moral or religious beliefs

Senate No 2461, by Senators Littell and T Kean, Transportation Committee --Prohibits DOT from putting tolls on I-78 and I-80 and from transferring jurisdiction to independent authority or entity

Senate No 2462, by Senators McNamara and Littell, Budget and Appropriations Committee --Exempts certain lake association membership fees and dues from sales and use tax

Senate No 2463, by Senator Rice, Community and Urban Affairs Committee --Requires retail businesses to be licensed by the municipality, requires Director of Division of Public Interest Advocacy to create and maintain a public website that catalogues those licensed businesses

Senate No 2464, by Senator Littell, Economic Growth Committee --Establishes farm pesticide collection program

Senate No 2465, by Senator Littell, Economic Growth Committee --Creates Community Farmers' Market Study Commission and program promoting marketing opportunities for farmers

Senate No 2466, by Senator Littell, Economic Growth Committee --Provides that school districts may pay certain percentage price preference for "Jersey Fresh" and other NJ agricultural products

Senate No 2467, by Senator Littell, Economic Growth Committee --Appropriates \$200,000 for Garden State Agricultural Re-Engineering Program to assist dairy farmers

Senate No 2468, by Senator Littell, Community and Urban Affairs Committee --Prohibits the imposition of any fees under the "Fair Housing Act" under certain circumstances

Senate No 2469, by Senator Inverso, State Government Committee --Regulates receipt of things of value by members and employees of Legislature and officers and employees of Executive Branch

Senate No 2470, by Senator Turner, Law and Public Safety and Veterans' Affairs Committee --Regulates sale of ammunition

Senate No 2471, by Senator Turner, Judiciary Committee --Eliminates the death penalty and replaces it with life imprisonment without eligibility for parole

Senate No 2472, by Senator Rice, Economic Growth Committee --Allows municipalities to provide broadband telecommunications infrastructure and service in partnership with private entities

Senate No 2473, by Senator Rice, Transportation Committee --Authorizes court to waive license revocation process for certain child support obligors

Senate No 2474, by Senators Karcher and Vitale, Commerce Committee --Regulates the disclosure and use of privately negotiated in-network fees and reimbursement rates

Senate No 2475, by Senator Weinberg, Transportation Committee --"Port Authority of New York and New Jersey Oversight Act "

Senate No 2476, by Senator Codey, State Government Committee --Revises requirements for voter disqualification of persons lacking capacity to understand the act of voting

Senate Concurrent Resolution No 133, by Senators L Connors and Ciesla, Budget and Appropriations Committee --Proposes constitutional amendment to provide Statewide initiative and referendum for directing State fiscal restraint

Senate Concurrent Resolution No 134, by Senator Codey, State Government Committee --Proposes constitutional amendment to clarify provision denying right of suffrage to certain persons lacking capacity to understand act of voting

Senate Resolution No 85, by Senator Littell, Economic Growth Committee --Encourages food service providers in the State House Complex to use New Jersey grown products and requests NJ Dept of Agriculture assistance to vendors
