New Jersey's nonfarm payroll employment edged up in November by 1,400 to a seasonally adjusted total of 3,036,200. Although the monthly increase was quite small, it continued a positive trend in employment that began in August. The job level remained, however, at 44,300 below the February 1980 high point.

A seasonally adjusted employment increase of 5,700 in the service sector was primarily responsible for the overall job gain. The service rise was attributable to continued casino expansion and larger than seasonally expected hiring in business services.

In the rest of the nonmanufacturing sector, construction levels held fairly steady in November on a seasonally adjusted basis; this industry has rebounded slowly from the May low point with a recovery of 6,700 jobs. The largest losses after seasonal adjustment in the nonfactory sector were in government and retail trade.

Government declines were at the local level where employment increases in educational support personnel were smaller than usual for November and reductions in other municipal jobs were more than seasonally expected due to fiscal restraints. The downturn in retail trade employment resulted from smaller than seasonal expansion for the holidays in general merchandise stores.

Jobholding in manufacturing industries has remained at a virtual standstill for the past three months with the November seasonally adjusted job level at 768,000. This was 4,600 above the August low point but far short of the highs of over 800,000 reached in the first few months of 1980.

The miscellaneous manufacturing group, which includes makers of toys, jewelry, and sporting goods, showed a gain of 1,100 jobs on a seasonally adjusted basis. The manufacturing industries with the largest over-the-month job losses were apparel and transportation equipment with declines of 1,300 and 800, respectively.

Weekly earnings of manufacturing production workers averaged \$314.91 in November, an increase of \$7.07 from October and an increase of \$24.12 from November 1979. After seasonal adjustment, the workweek edged up by 0.1 hour in November to 41.2 hours after seasonal adjustment.

LABOR AREA DEVELOPMENTS

A comparison of the unadjusted nonagricultural wage and salary employment by labor area for November shows that all labor areas except the Vineland-Millville-Bridgeton area had gains over the month.

The Atlantic City area enjoyed an employment increase that was noticeably greater than expected for this time of year. The increase was concentrated in the service sector where casino-related development is taking place. The Long Branch-Asbury Park area also saw service sector employment gains which were not expected for the October-to-November period.

Conversely, the employment increases in Paterson-Clifton-Passaic, Hackensack, and Camden areas did not meet the normal seasonal expectations.

On the positive side, the recession-impacted manufacturing sector showed employment increases in nearly every major labor area after allowing for some normal seasonal fluctuations. Only Paterson-Clifton-Passaic and Atlantic City saw manufacturing employment drop over the month and these declines were minimal.

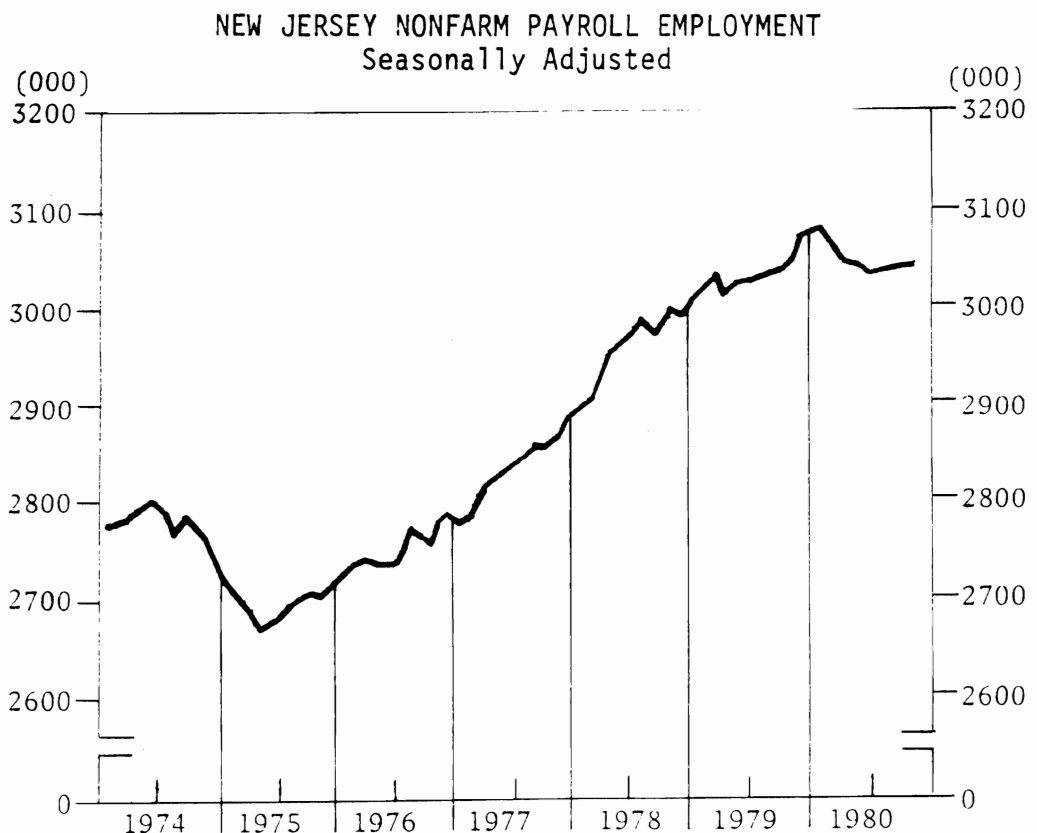

TECHNICAL NOTES

Nonfarm Wage and Salary Employment

Employment data refer to persons on establishment payrolls who received pay for any part of the pay period which includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude proprietors, the self-employed, unpaid family workers, farm workers, and domestic workers in households. Salaried officers of corporations are included. Government employment covers only civilian employees; federal military personnel are excluded.

Persons on an establishment payroll who are on paid sick leave (when pay is received directly from the firm), on paid holiday or paid vacation, or who work during any part of the pay period but are unemployed or on strike during the rest of the period, are counted as employed. Not counted as employed are persons who, during the pay period which includes the 12th, are laid off, on leave without pay or on strike for the entire period, or who are hired but do not work during the period.

Average Hours and Earnings

Hours and earnings data are derived from reports of payroll and man-hours for production and related workers in manufacturing. When the reported pay period exceeds one week, the payroll and man-hour figures are reduced to a weekly basis.

Average hourly earnings for manufacturing are on a "gross" basis, reflecting not only changes in basic hourly rates, but also such variable factors as premium pay for overtime and shift work, and changes in output of workers paid on an incentive plan. Excluded from average earnings are irregular bonuses, retroactive items, payments of various welfare benefits, and payroll taxes paid by employers.
