Acting Governor Shares Personal Experiences as Former Sheriff, Commends Examples of Outstanding Law Enforcement in New Jersey

The annual event is organized by Rabbi Mendy Carlebach, Rabbi Joel Eisdorfer, and Mr. David Gold, Esq. Rabbi Carlebach and Rabbi Eisdorfer serve as Chaplains to the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey Police Department. Mr. Gold is a member of the New York Centurion Foundation, a not-for-profit organization that provides funds to various police societies and spouses of police officers who have been killed or injured on the job.
