Attached please find CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS for February 2001. Included are TANF-oriented data, and the WFNJ Statistical Summary. Some items of interest include:

- The TANF caseload continues to decline. Since February of 2000 there has been a decrease of 13.5%.
- Food Stamp households decreased by over 6,200 since February 2000.
- For GA, recipient figures reported are for June 2000, which are 5.8% below June 1999.

Highlights of **CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS**

TANF

(Tables 1 and 5, Graphs 1 and 4)

[The number of single parent families is reduced by the number of companion cases listed for payment on the source table FF-012, to avoid double counting.]

As of February 2001, 44,544 eligible families in New Jersey were receiving TANF cash assistance:

- **43,718 single head of household families**
- **826 two-parent families.**

The largest number of TANF families receiving cash assistance, by county:

Essex — 14,989, Hudson — 6,958, Camden — 4,559, Passaic — 3,189 Union — 2,594

The number of TANF cash assistance families in the other 16 counties ranged from:

- **46 families in Hunterdon County to 2,013 in Mercer County,**
with eleven counties below **1000 families**

There were 18,141 fewer eligible TANF families receiving cash assistance in February 2001 than in February 1999, a decline of 28.9 percent.

- **Single head families: 17,256 below two years ago in February 1999, a drop of 28.3%.**
- **Two parent families: declined by 885 or 51.7 percent from February 1999.**

FOOD STAMP PROGRAM

(Tables 2 and 6, Graphs 2, 5, and 6)

At the end of February 2001, 134,286 households participated in the Food Stamp Program.

- **TANF: 34,645 households with 110,908 persons.**
- **Other low income: 99,641 households with 180,831 persons.**
- **Total persons: 291,739, including 143,600 adults and 148,139 children**
- **By County: 56.5 percent of the households were in:**

Essex	30,933
Hudson	19,570
Passaic	13,426
Camden	11,920

Two years ago in February 1999, 156,028 households participated in Food Stamps in New Jersey. Over the next two years the number declined by 21,742, or 13.9 percent, to 134,286 by February 2001.

- **TANF(FS)** households steadily declined by **29,948** from **64,593** in February 1999 to **34,645** two years later. There were **91,435 Other Low Income** households in February 1999 and **8,206 more** two years later.
- **Total FS Recipients:** were **349,747** in February 1999, and declined to **291,739** by February 2001, a drop of **58,008, or 16.6 percent**.
- **Adult FS Recipients:** declined from **167,648** in February 1999 to **143,600** in February 2001, a drop of **24,048 (14.3 percent)**.
- **Recipient FS Children:** declined by **33,960 (18.6 percent)**, from **182,099** in February 1999 to **148,139** in February 2001.

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

(Tables 3, 7 and 9, Graphs 3, 7 and 9)

In February 2001 Emergency Assistance (EA) payments were made for 1,804 eligible TANF families and 392 SSI recipients in New Jersey. For TANF families this included payments for:

- **Temporary Rental Assistance (TRA)** for **226** families
- **Motel** placements for **289** families and **emergency shelter** placements for **354** families
- **All other TANF-EA** for **935** families (including back rent, back utilities, security deposits, furnishings, clothing and food allowance, or transitional housing)
- **521** families in **Essex** County, **213** in **Mercer** County, **151** in **Passaic** County, **148** in **Middlesex**.

In the past two years, the average number of EA payments for TANF families was 1,864 in 1999 and 1,822 for 2000. Payments were made to 7.7% less families in February 2001 as compared to January 2001.

- TRA payments were **12.5 %** of the number in February 2001.
- Motel payments were up from two years ago.; **217** to **289**.

TANF PARTICIPATION RATES

(Table 8, Graph 8)

The TANF participation rate for February 2001 was 39.22% for the State as a whole. This is a increase of 1.74 percentage points from January 2001.

Participation rates by county:

- Eight counties had a participation rate greater than 40 percent, **Essex, Monmouth, Morris**
- Salem, Somerset Sussex, Union, and Warren.

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

(Table 9, Graph 9)

There were 22,701 GA recipients in June 2000, down from 23,704 in May.

- There were 12,356 **Employable GA** and 10,345 **Unemployable GA** recipients in June 2000.

CHILD SUPPORT AND PATERNITY

(Table 10)

For FFY 2001, the total collections of the Child Support and Paternity Program was about **\$388,938,137**, an increase of over **6 percent** over the same period for **FFY 2000**.

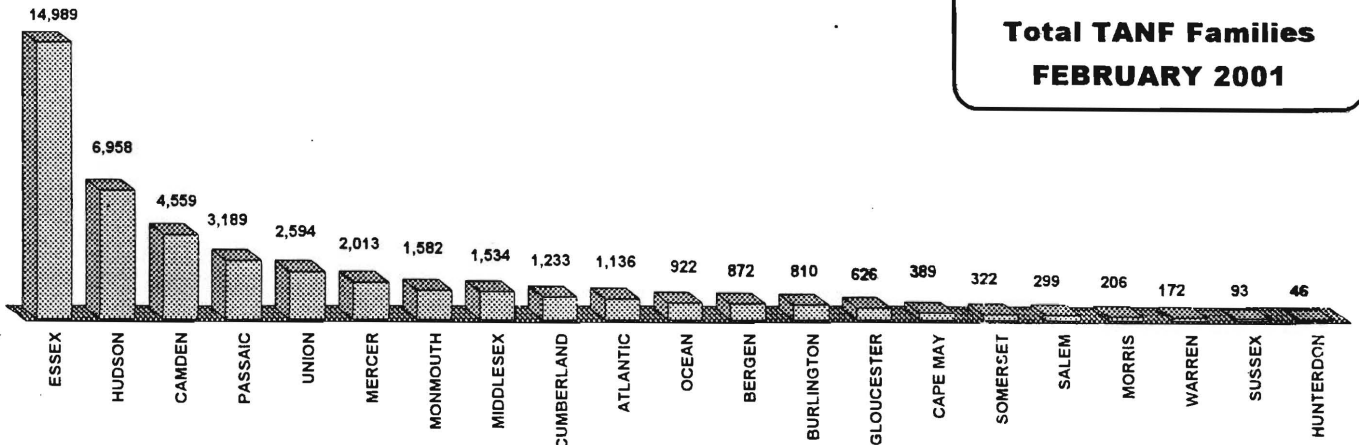

FEBRUARY 2001**



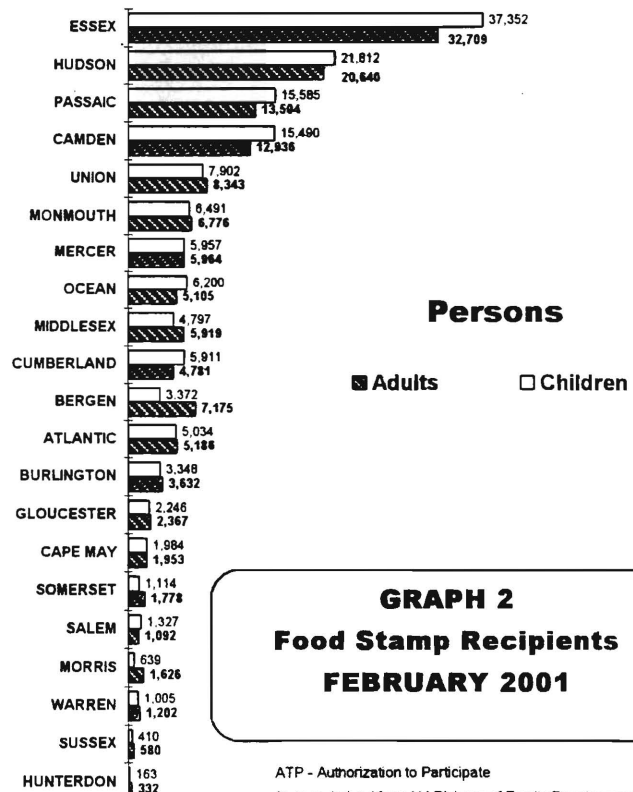
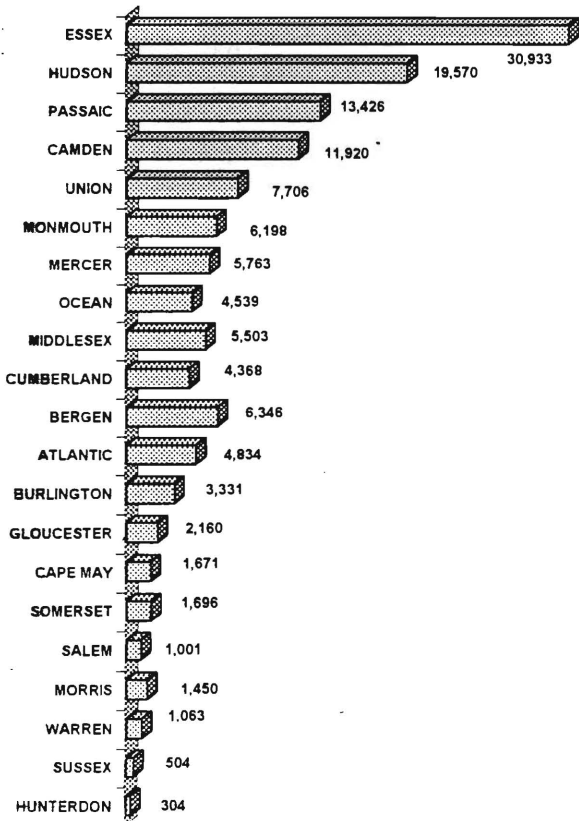

FEBRUARY 2001

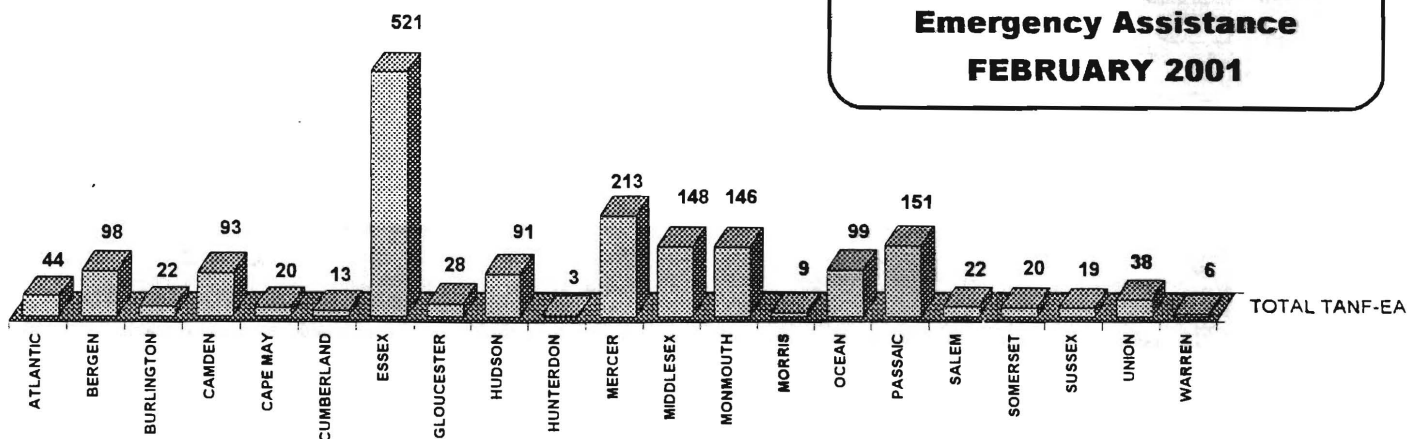

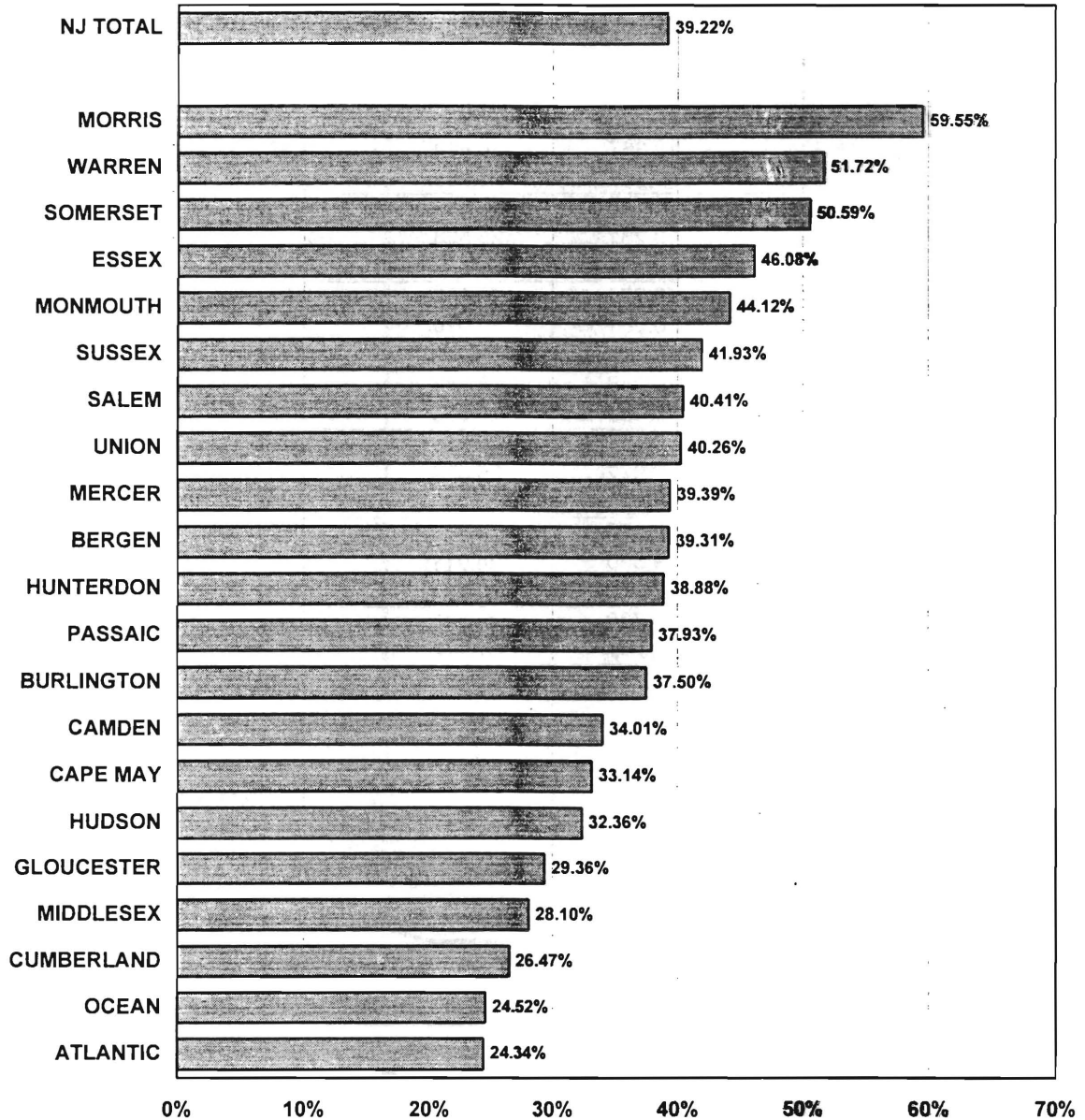

TANF PARTICIPATION RATES

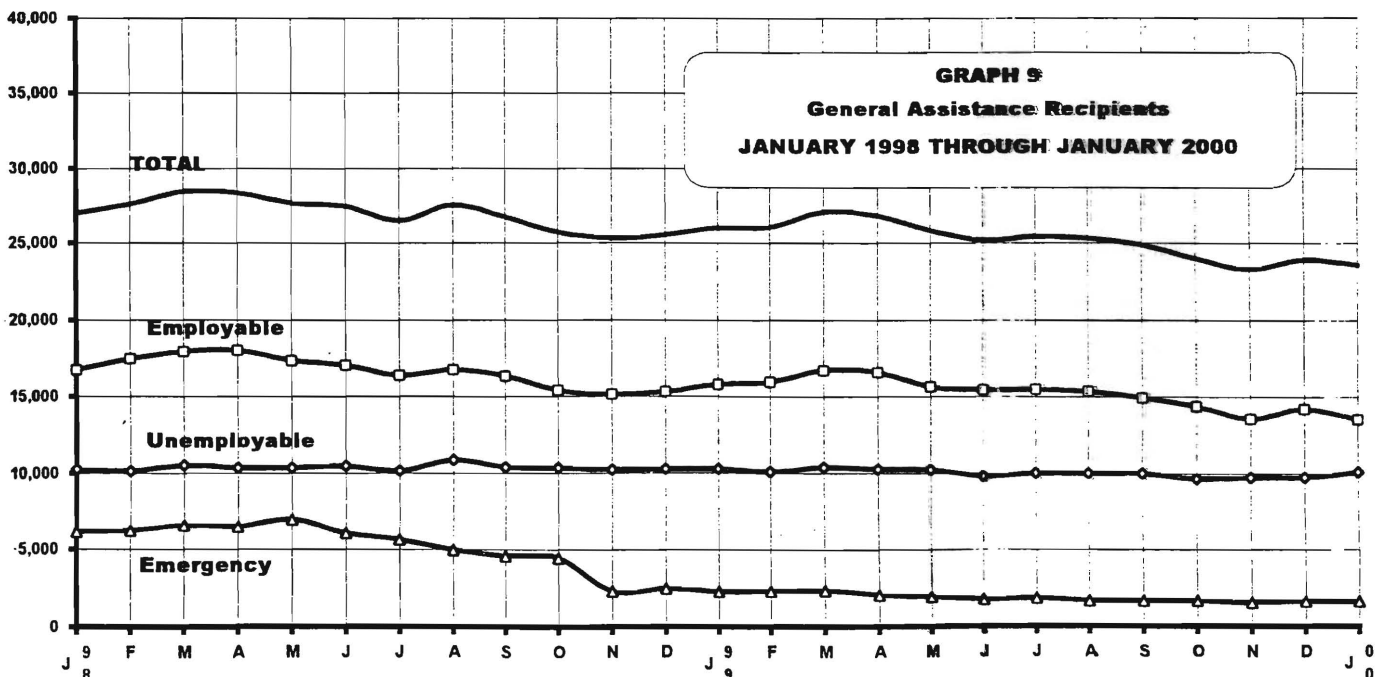

Explanatory Notes

The Department of Human Services Division of Family Development provides basic income and an opportunity to achieve self-sufficiency for individuals and families served by the Division's programs. The Division provides leadership, direction and supervision to those public agencies responsible for administering those programs and plans for and develops policies to promote self-sufficiency.

WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ) - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (PRWORA) of 1996. PRWORA establishes Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, WFNJ/TANF for families with children, and WFNJ/GA (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. The emphasis is on achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.

Number of Persons Employed This Month, Still Receiving TANF – Individuals with open "empl" activity on OMEGA. Ad hoc report.

Participants Receiving Child Care Services - From Issuance Disbursement Summary (OMEGA report # RM703). Total number of active participants who show receipt of **Child Care**.

Number of Persons Closed on FAMIS Due to Employment- From FAMIS report # FM463.

Post TANF and Receiving Child Care - Persons no longer in receipt of TANF but still receiving child care. From Issuance Disbursement Summary (OMEGA report # RM703).

MEDICAID ONLY FAMILIES no longer receive TANF financial assistance but remain eligible for Medicaid under applicable provisions which extend coverage beyond the period of assistance. These are shown separately in these tables because cash assistance and Medicaid have been de-linked.

FOOD STAMP PROGRAM (FS) - Authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refer certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if the eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.
