Seasonally adjusted nonfarm payroll employment increased by 4,500 in January to a record high of 2,854,300. This was 180,400, or 6.7%, above the recession low reached in May 1975. Private nonfarm employment increased 2,900 to 2,375,700 for the sixth consecutive monthly gain.

Before seasonal adjustment, nonfarm wage and salary employment fell by 66,800 in January to 2,796,600 due primarily to large seasonal declines in the nonmanufacturing sector. Private wage and salary employment dropped by 63,300 to 2,317,400. Despite the January drop, private sector employment remained 81,600 above its level in 1977.

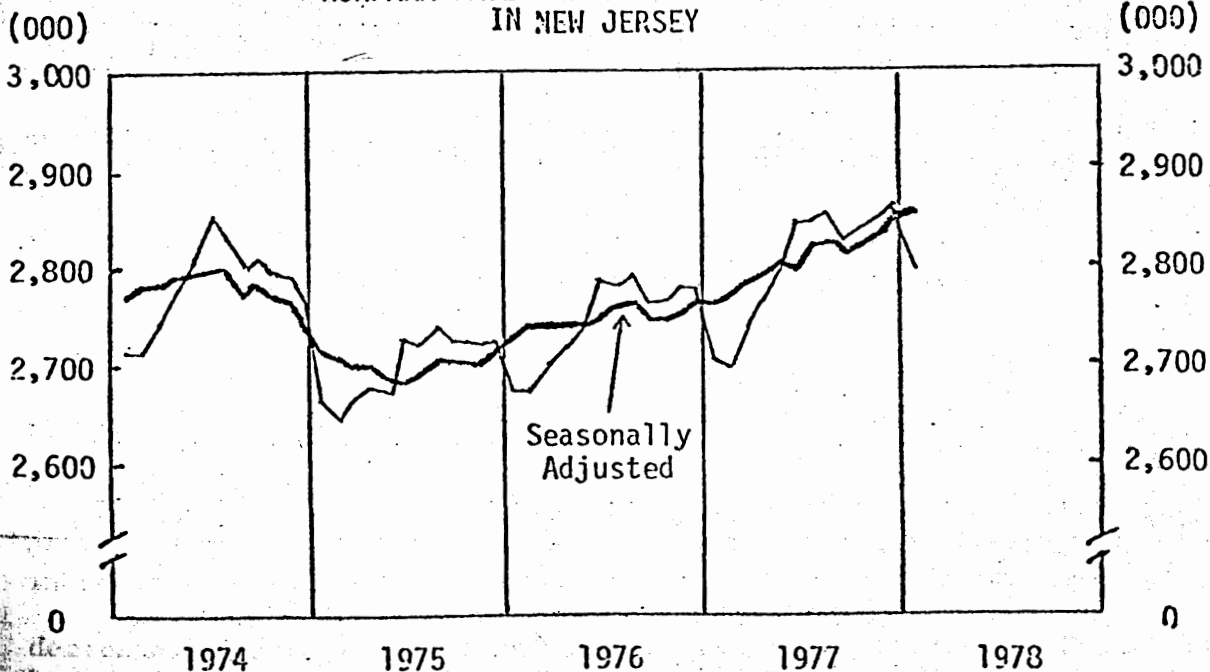

Nonmanufacturing dropped by 57,600 to 2,039,700 on an unadjusted basis with declines posted in all major industry groups. The largest over-the-month decline was 33,600 in wholesale and retail trade. There were also significant employment decreases of 11,500 in contract construction, 5,900 in services, and 3,500 in government.

Manufacturing employment fell by 9,200 in January with declines in both the durable and nondurable goods sectors. Nondurable goods employment dropped by 5,900 as most industries in this group declined over the month; only the tobacco and petroleum industries showed no change. The largest declines were 3,700 in apparel followed by 500 in paper and allied products.

Durable goods employment declined by 3,300 over the month as six out of ten industries registered decreases. The most significant were a seasonal drop of 1,500 in miscellaneous manufacturing, a decline of 800 in transportation equipment, and a 700 drop in fabricated metals.

#### EMPLOYMENT ROSE ON A SEASONALLY ADJUSTED BASIS

After seasonal adjustment employment in the nonmanufacturing sector increased by 4,300 to 2,085,100 and in manufacturing rose by 200 to 769,200--the highest since December 1974 when it was 791,500. Nondurable goods manufacturing employment rose by 500 over the month; the only declines were 900 in apparel and 100 in rubber products. Four nondurable goods industries showed no change, while the food, textile, and printing industries each rose by 400 and chemicals rose by 300. Employment in durable goods industries dipped 300 in January as most industry decreases were offset by corresponding increases. For example, the largest changes were an increase of 400 in stone, clay, and glass and an offsetting drop of 400 in nonelectrical machinery.

Nonmanufacturing employment, on a seasonally adjusted basis, reached a record high of 2,085,100 in January. Contract construction employment continued to expand with an 1,800 over-the-month increase. Other gains among nonmanufacturing industries were 1,600 in government and 1,500 in transportation and public utilities.

#### COMPARISONS WITH A YEAR AGO

Since January 1977 unadjusted nonagricultural wage and salary employment increased by 92,300 or 3.4%. Manufacturing employment rose by 16,400 with increases of 8,400 in the durable goods sector and 8,000 in the nondurable goods sector.

Miscellaneous manufacturing was the only durable goods industry to decline from a year ago with a drop of 1,800. The largest over-the-year increase in the durable goods sector was 2,800 in electrical equipment.

Among the nondurable goods industries the only over-the-year decreases were 1,900 in apparel and 500 in leather products. Chemicals had the largest increase rising 3,300 from January 1977.

Nonmanufacturing employment expanded by 75,900 over the past year as all major sectors increased. The largest growth was 24,600 in services followed by 14,300 in wholesale and retail trade and 13,900 in contract construction.

#### NONFARM EMPLOYMENT DROPS SEASONALLY IN ALL MAJOR LABOR AREAS

Although nonfarm employment, before seasonal adjustment, decreased in all 10 major labor areas, the declines were in line with prior December-to-January dips. All significant decreases occurred in the nonmanufacturing sector, led by contract construction and wholesale and retail trade. Most manufacturing industries in all major areas were characterized by small declines. A few industries reported slight increases, such as the food industry, up in four areas, and the electrical machinery industry, up in three areas.

The over-the-year figures showed employment up in all major areas. The largest increase was 30,100 in the Newark Labor Area. Most of this gain came in the nonmanufacturing sector with increases of 12,000 in both the services and miscellaneous industries, 5,900 in government, and 4,300 in wholesale and retail trade. The Perth Amboy-New Brunswick-Sayreville Labor Area rose by 12,600, the next largest over-the-year increase, with an expansion of 6,600 in nonmanufacturing and 6,000 in manufacturing. Manufacturing employment increased in all major areas except Atlantic City and Hackensack; nonmanufacturing increased in all 10 major areas.

#### WEEKLY EARNINGS DIP AS THE WORKWEEK SHORTENS

The weekly earnings of manufacturing production workers averaged \$247.64 in January, down \$3.39 from December but up \$20.35 from a year ago. The average hourly earnings of \$6.04 were up 2 cents from December and up 40 cents from a year ago. During the January survey week production workers averaged 41.0 hours compared with 41.7 hours a month ago.

After seasonal adjustment, the average weekly hours increased to 41.5 hours from 41.2 hours in December and 40.8 hours in January 1977. The seasonally adjusted workweek was only 12 minutes shorter than last summer when it averaged 41.7 hours. However, it was 1.3 hours longer than the recession low of May 1975.

On an unadjusted basis, 15 of the primary industry groups had decreases in weekly earnings over the month and 4 had increases. The largest decrease was \$14.20 in fabricated metals due to a sharp drop in overtime hours and earnings. The largest increase was \$9.66 in food products because of increased overtime.

The highest weekly earnings in January were in the petroleum industry with \$372.88 for a 48.3-hour workweek. The transportation equipment industry registered the highest hourly wage of \$8.09. The lowest average weekly earnings were in the leather products industry with \$146.31 for a 38.3-hour workweek.

## TECHNICAL NOTES

### Nonfarm Wage and Salary Employment

Employment data refer to persons on establishment payrolls who received pay for any part of the pay period which includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude proprietors, the self-employed, unpaid family workers, farm workers, and domestic workers in households. Salaried officers of corporations are included. Government employment covers only civilian employees; federal military personnel are excluded.

Persons on an establishment payroll who are on paid sick leave (when pay is received directly from the firm), on paid holiday or paid vacation, or who work during any part of the pay period but are unemployed or on strike during the rest of the period, are counted as employed. Not counted as employed are persons who, during the pay period which includes the 12th, are laid off, on leave without pay or on strike for the entire period, or who are hired but do not work during the period.

### Average Hours and Earnings

Hours and earnings data are derived from reports of payroll and man-hours for production and related workers in manufacturing. When the reported pay period exceeds one week, the payroll and man-hour figures are reduced to a weekly basis.

Average hourly earnings for manufacturing are on a "gross" basis, reflecting not only changes in basic hourly rates, but also such variable factors as premium pay for overtime and shift work, and changes in output of workers paid on an incentive plan. Excluded from average earnings are irregular bonuses, retroactive items, payments of various welfare benefits, and payroll taxes paid by employers.
