Attached please find *Current Program Statistics* for April 2002. Included are TANF-oriented and Food Stamps data, General Assistance data, and the WFNJ Statistical Summary.

Some items of interest include:

- The TANF caseload continues to decline. Since April of 2001 there has been a decrease of 8.0%.
- Food Stamp households increased by 4,554 since April 2001.
- For GA, recipient figures reported are for April 2002, which are 13.2% above April 2001.

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Highlights of CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS

WFNJ/TANF

(Tables 1 and 5, Graphs 1 and 4)

As of April 2002, 42,905 eligible families in New Jersey were receiving WFNJ/TANF cash assistance:

- 41,339 single head of household families
- 1,566 two-parent families.

The largest number of WFNJ/TANF families receiving cash assistance, by county: Essex — 12,277, Hudson — 6,131, Camden — 4,453, Passaic — 3,466 Union — 2,685

The number of WFNJ/TANF cash assistance families in the other 16 counties ranged from:

 38 families in Hunterdon County to 2,375 in Mercer County, with eleven counties below 1000 families

There were 10,457 fewer eligible WFNJ/TANF families receiving cash assistance in April 2002 than in April 2000, a decline of 19.6 percent.

- Single head families: 10,193 below two years ago in April 2000, a drop of 19.8%.
- Two parent families: decreased by 264 or 14.4 percent from April 2000.

FOOD STAMP PROGRAM

(Tables 2 and 6, Graphs 2, 5, and 6)

As of report month of April 2002, 137,961 households participated in the Food Stamp Program.

- TANF: 30,963 households with 96,674 persons.
- Other low income: 106,998 households with 196,961 persons.
- Total persons: 293,635, including 144,741 adults and 148,894 children

By County: 54.8 percent of the households were in: Essex 29,735

Two years ago in April 2000, 139,888 households participated in Food Stamps in New Jersey. Over the next two years the number declined by 1,927, or 1.4 percent, to 137,961 by April 2002.

- TANF(FS) households steadily declined by 7,531 from 38,494 in April 2000 to 30,963 two years later. There were 101,394 Other Low Income households in April 2000 and 5,604 more two years later.
- Total FS Recipients: were 311,045 in April 2000, and declined to 293,635 by April 2002, a drop of 17,410, or 5.6 percent.
- Adult FS Recipients: declined from 150,572 in April 2000 to 144,741 in April 2002, a drop of 5,831 (3.9 percent).
- Recipient FS Children: declined by 11,579 (7.2 percent), from 160,473 in April 2000 to 148,894 in April 2002.

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

(Tables 3, 7 and 9, Graphs 3, 7 and 9)

In April 2002 Emergency Assistance (EA) payments were made for 2,812 eligible TANF families and 572 SSI recipients in New Jersey. For TANF families this included payments for:

- Temporary Rental Assistance (TRA) for 330 families
- Motel placements for 548 families and emergency shelter placements for 426 families
- All other TANF-EA for 1,508 families (including back rent, back utilities, security deposits, furnishings, clothing and food allowance, or transitional housing)
- 682 families in Essex County, 374 in Mercer County, 289 in Monmouth County,
 178 in Passaic.

In the past two years, the number of EA payments for TANF families increased from 1,636 in April 2000 to 2,812 in April 2002.

- TRA payments were 11.7 % of the total EA Families in April 2002.
- Motel payments were up from two years ago.; 181 to 548.

TANF PARTICIPATION RATES

(Table 8, Graph 8)

The TANF participation rate for April 2002 was 38.57% for the State as a whole. This is a increase of .81 percentage points from March 2002.

Participation rates by county:

- Nine counties had a participation rate greater than 40 percent: Bergen, Cape May, Hunterdon,
- Monmouth, Morris, Salem, Somerset, Sussex, and Warren.

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

(Table 9, Graph 9)

There were 26,407 GA recipients in April 2002, up from 25,752 in April 2001.

■ There were 14,425 Employable GA and 11,982 Unemployable GA recipients in April 2002.

CHILD SUPPORT AND PATERNITY

(Table 10)

For FFY 2002, the total collections of the Child Support and Paternity Program was \$406,934,495, an increase of over 4 percent over the same period for FFY 2001.

TANF PARTICIPATION RATES








Explanatory Notes

The Department of Human Services Division of Family Development provides basic income and an opportunity to achieve self-sufficiency for individuals and families served by the Division's programs. The Division provides leadership, direction and supervision to those public agencies responsible for administering those programs and plans for and develops policies to promote self-sufficiency.

WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ) - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (PRWORA) of 1996. PRWORA establishes Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, WFNJ/TANF for families with children, and WFNJ/GA (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. The emphasis is on achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
