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SUMMARY OF FUNCTIONS OF THE SEVERAL BUREAUS OF THE DIVISION OF TAXATION

Office of the Director, Division of Taxation

In all features except appeals, the State Tax Department succeeded the State Board of Taxes and Assessment (P. L. 1931, c. 336). On July 1, 1944, the powers and duties vested by law in the State Tax Department were transferred to the Division of Taxation, in the Department of Taxation and Finance (P. L. 1944, c. 112). The chief officer of the State Tax Department was the State Tax Commissioner. The chief officer of the Division of Taxation, Department of Taxation and Finance, is the Director. Unless otherwise provided by law, the Director of the Division of Taxation performs all the acts formerly required by law to be performed by the State Tax Commissioner (P. L. 1944, c. 112).

The Director is charged with the levy of the property and franchise taxes on the several railroads of the State, and the levy and apportionment—for the benefit of the municipalities—of the franchise and gross receipts taxes on public utilities operating within the State.

He also levies and collects transfer inheritance and estate taxes, alcoholic beverage taxes, gasoline taxes, billboard licenses and taxes, domestic and foreign corporation taxes, foreign insurance company taxes, and domestic and foreign life insurance company taxes. He is also charged with the duty of distributing taxes collected by him from foreign fire and automobile insurance companies.

In addition, the Director is empowered to equalize assessments, check county equalization tables, prepare State equalization tables, and, in general, check the activities of local and county tax officials.

Executive—Administrative Bureau

The purpose of this Bureau is to co-ordinate the administrative functions of all Bureaus of the Division of Taxation.

The Bureau is in charge of employment, payrolls, personnel records, budgets, appropriations, printing, disbursements and purchases. It also

prepares statistical data and divisional and departmental financial statements.

With its centralized accounting machine equipment, it also performs many of the details involved in the assessment, collection, and apportionment of corporation, billboard, and utility taxes.

Transfer Inheritance Tax Bureau

(R. S. 54:33-1 to 54:38-16, as amended and supplemented by P. L. 1938, c. 278; P. L. 1939, c. 122 and 303; P. L. 1940, c. 220; P. L. 1941, c. 422; P. L. 1943, c. 38 and 165; and P. L. 1944, c. 74, 75, 112 and 220)

This Bureau has supervision over the administration of all transfer inheritance tax laws and the collection of all taxes assessed pursuant thereto. The tax is levied upon the transfer of property, real or personal, or of any interest therein or income therefrom, in trust or otherwise, to persons or corporations when such transfer is by will or intestate law, by deed, grant, bargain, sale or gift made in contemplation of or to take effect at or after death, and by survivorship in certain cases.

As to estates of resident decedents, the law applies to real property and tangible personal property (goods, wares, merchandise, etc.) located in New Jersey and to intangible personal property (stocks, bonds, mortgages, bank accounts, etc.) wherever located.

As to estates of nonresident decedents, the law applies only to real property and tangible personal property located in New Jersey.

The tax rates range from one to 16 per cent according to the value of the transfer and the relationship of the beneficiary to the deceased. Transfers to collateral relatives and nonrelatives, if under \$500, are exempt; if \$500 or over, are taxable at the rate of eight per cent, and upward. An exemption of \$5,000 each is granted to those of a close degree of relationship, such as husband, wife, children, mutually acknowledged children, stepchildren, father, mother, grandparents, the rate of tax on the excess being graduated from one per cent upward. An exemption of \$5,000 is also granted to charitable, religious and benevolent organizations, the excess being taxed at the rate of five per cent. Transfers to the State and its political subdivisions are wholly exempt.

Taxes are payable within the year following the death of the decedent, and if not paid bear interest at the rate of ten per cent per annum from one year following death, until paid. The inheritance tax

report must be filed as promptly after death as the circumstances of the case permit.

This Bureau also assesses and collects New Jersey estate taxes pursuant to R. S. 54:38-1 to 16. The amount of the tax is the difference between the credit allowed against federal estate taxes under the Federal Revenue Act of 1926 and the total amount of inheritance taxes paid this and other states.

Preparation of the five per cent refund to the counties of inheritance taxes collected from resident decedents (pursuant to R. S. 54:33-10) is also supervised by this Bureau.

Transfer inheritance and estate tax receipts, all of which, save five per cent of resident taxes returned to the counties, are available for general state uses, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1947, were:

Motor Fuel Tax Bureau

(R. S. 54:39-1 to 75, as amended and supplemented by P. L. 1938, c. 166 and 283; P. L. 1939, c. 209; P. L. 1940, c. 169, and P. L. 1941, c. 268)

This Bureau administers the Motor Fuel Tax Law and collects, through licensed motor fuel distributors, a tax of three cents per gallon on motor fuel sold in New Jersey to propel motor vehicles over its highways and motor boats over its waterways. It authorizes refund claims and combats tax evasion by investigations, inspections, audits and prosecutions.

All receipts are turned over to the State Treasurer to be credited to the State Highway Fund, with the exception of retail dealer license fees, which are credited by the Treasurer to the Director to defray the expenses incurred in the administration and enforcement of "An act to regulate the retail sale of motor fuels," being P. L. 1938, c. 163, as amended by P. L. 1938, c. 204 and 401, and P. L. 1939, c. 62 and 63, and P. L. 1942, c. 260.

The Bureau is charged with the administration of the control act just mentioned. By inspection, audit and investigation, it checks retail dealers for proper price-sign posting; selling at a price equal to or greater than cost, plus all selling expense; display of brand names; giving of rebates, allowances, etc.; use of lotteries, prizes, etc.; substitution and keeping of proper records. The Bureau, however, has no power to enforce the provisions of the Fair Trades Practice Law (R. S. 54:4), as amended by P. L. 1938, c. 165, which permits the making of contracts stipulating resale prices by retail dealers.

Beverage Tax Bureau

(R. S. 54:41-1 to 54:47-7, as amended and supplemented by P. L. 1938, c. 319 and 391; P. L. 1939, c. 357; P. L. 1940, c. 168; P. L. 1941, c. 209, 210 and 327; P. L. 1942, c. 171, and P. L. 1947, c. 250)

This Bureau collects taxes on all kinds of alcoholic beverages sold or delivered in New Jersey and intended for ultimate consumption. Tax rates range from 3⅓ cents per gallon on beer to \$1.50 per gallon on liquors, as fixed by statute. Taxes are collected principally from licensed manufacturers and wholesalers on sales made to retailers.

Net collections are deposited to the account of the State Treasurer and drawn upon by him monthly for the General State Fund.

Actual receipts of this Bureau for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1947 were \$13,169,336.72. An approximate classification based on book revenues follows:

Corporation Tax Bureau

(R. S. 54:12-1 to 54:18-7, as amended by P. L. 1938, c. 56 and 186; P. L. 1939, c. 137; P. L. 1945, c. 162, as amended by P. L. 1946, c. 174 and 307, as amended by P. L. 1947, c. 50 and 51; and R. S. 32A-1 to 53)

This Bureau administers and collects the following taxes:

- Corporation business tax
- Financial business tax
- Insurance premium tax

and performs the following miscellaneous services:

- Issuance of tax lien certificates
- Issuance of tax clearance certificates
- Issuance of release of corporation franchise tax liens
- Allocation of distributive share of municipalities and counties out of proceeds of financial business tax
- Distribution to the New Jersey Firemen's Home and the New Jersey State Firemen's Association of tax received from foreign fire insurance companies
- Allocation and distribution to State Police, County Police Pension and Municipal Police and Fire Pension Funds of ratable share of taxes collected from insurance companies of other States and foreign countries on premiums of insurance against automobile insurance risks in this State.

Disposition of Revenues:

All revenues are paid into the State Treasury except the insurance premium tax moneys to be distributed to the New Jersey Firemen's Home and the New Jersey State Firemen's Association (R. S. 54:17-4); the State Police (R. S. 53:5-6); and County Police Pension Funds and Municipal Police and Fire Pension Funds (R. S. 43:16-5d). These moneys are retained and distributed by the Bureau.

Dedicated Funds:

In addition to the pension fund distributions already indicated, the following funds, out of the moneys paid to the State Treasurer, are dedicated by law:

- (a) \$4,000,000 of the revenues under the corporation business tax are appropriated for school purposes (R. S. 54:10A-24).

- (b) All proceeds of the financial business tax are dedicated for distribution (R. S. 54:10B-24), on an equal share basis, to the municipality and county in which the taxpayer's place of business is located.

SUMMARY DESCRIPTION OF TAXES

A concise description of the taxes administered in this Bureau follows:

CORPORATION BUSINESS TAX

Statutory Citations:

Corporation Business Tax Act, P. L. 1945, c. 162 (R. S. 54:10A-1, et seq.); P. L. 1947, c. 50; P. L. 1947, c. 51; R. S. 54:11-1, et seq.; R. S. 54:12-1, et seq.; R. S. 54:13-11, 12, 15; R. S. 54:14-1, et seq.; R. S. 54:15-1, et seq.; State Tax Uniform Procedure Law, R. S. 54:48-1 to R. S. 54:52-4, inclusive.

Tax Applies To:

Every domestic corporation and every foreign corporation authorized or doing business or owning or employing capital or property or maintaining an office in this State, with certain specified exemptions.

Nature of Tax:

Franchise tax based upon taxpayer's net worth allocable to New Jersey. In general, it may be stated that the tax is based upon that portion of the taxpayer's net worth as corresponds to the ratio of the taxpayer's activity in New Jersey compared to its activity both within and without this State. In determining the "net worth," the taxpayer is permitted to deduct from the value of its assets the amount of all corporate liabilities. Of the resulting remainder, only such percentage is taxable as corresponds to the ratio above referred to—called the "Allocation Percentage."

Rate of Tax:

In general, 8/10 of a mill per dollar, or 80c per \$1,000 of allocated net worth; decreasing graduated scale where allocated net worth exceeds \$100,000,000.

FINANCIAL BUSINESS TAX

Statutory Citation:

Financial Business Tax Law, P. L. 1946, c. 174 (R. S. 54:10B-1, et seq.).

Tax Applies To:

All business enterprise, whether carried on by an individual, partnership, firm or corporation, which is in substantial competition with the business of national banks and which employs moneyed capital with the object of making profit by its use as money.

Specifically Included Are:

Businesses commonly known as industrial banks, dealers in commercial papers and acceptances, sales finance, personal finance, small loans and mortgage finance.

Specifically Excluded Are:

National banks, stock and mutual insurance companies, credit unions, savings banks, savings and loans and building and loan associations, state banks and trust companies.

Nature of Tax:

Franchise tax based upon that portion of the taxpayer's net worth as corresponds to the ratio of the taxpayer's financial activity in New Jersey compared to its financial business activity both within and without this State. In determining the "net worth" the taxpayer is permitted to deduct from the value of its assets the amount of corporate liabilities as well as certain other adjustments specified in the law. Of the resulting remainder, only such percentage is taxable as corresponds to the ratio above referred to—called the "Allocation Percentage."

Rate of Tax:

7½ mills per dollar or \$7.50 per \$1,000 of allocated net worth.

INSURANCE PREMIUM TAX

Statutory Citation:

P. L. 1945, c. 132 (R. S. 54:18A-1, et seq.; R. S. 54:16-1, et seq.; R. S. 54:17-4).

Tax Applies To:

Every stock, mutual and assessment insurance company organized or existing under any general or special law of this State, and every stock, mutual and assessment insurance company organized or existing under the laws of any other state or foreign country and transacting business in this State.

Nature of Tax:

This tax is measured by gross receipts; *i.e.*, gross premiums collected on insurance risks in this State.

Rate of Tax:

Life insurance companies—2% upon the taxable premiums collected by the taxpayer under all policies on residents of this State and 1% upon the taxable considerations collected under annuity contracts on residents of this State.

Insurance companies other than life—2% upon the taxable premiums collected by the taxpayer on all business of the company in this State.

12½% limit—Taxable premiums shall not exceed a sum equal to 12½% of total premiums.

Deductions—In computing the tax payable, taxpayers are permitted certain deductions on account of local personal property taxes, as provided in the law.

Railroad Tax Bureau

(P. L. 1941, c. 291, as amended by P. L. 1942, c. 115, 169 and 337; superseding R. S. 54:19 to 29, inclusive)

This Bureau values all railroad property, determines the property and franchise excise taxes, and certifies them to the State Comptroller for collection.

Under the Railroad Tax Law of 1941 there is assessed against each railroad or system a property tax at the rate of three per cent upon the true value of all property used for railroad purposes, and a franchise tax at the same rate on the excess of the "franchise base" over the total taxable valuation of the previous year of all classes of property of the taxpayer used for railroad purposes.

All property taxes, other than those assessed against Class II property, and one-half of the franchise tax are for state use. Property taxes assessed against Class II property and one-half of the franchise tax are for local use, apportioned by the State Comptroller, as the valuation by the Director of Class II property situated within the taxing district bears to the total valuation of such property in the State.

Public Utility—Local Tax Bureau Utility Tax

(P. L. 1940, c. 4 and 5, as amended by P. L. 1941, c. 20, 21, 400 and 401; P. L. 1947, c. 191; and R. S. 54:30-1 to 3)

This Bureau is charged with the assessment of utility franchise and gross receipts taxes and the apportionment thereof among the municipalities according to the relative values of utility property located therein.

The *franchise tax* assessed pursuant to P. L. 1940, c. 4 and 5, as amended by P. L. 1941, c. 20, 21, 400 and 401, on utilities, other than those specifically exempted, having lines or mains located along, in, on or over any street, highway or other public place (*e.g.*, telephone, telegraph, water, sewer, district messenger, oil and pipe line, street railway and gas and electric companies) is at the rate of five per cent of such proportion of the gross receipts of the taxpayer for the preceding calendar year as the length of its lines or mains in this State, located along, in, on or over any public street, highway, or other public place, exclusive of service connections, bears to the whole length of its lines or mains, exclusive of service connections.

The *gross receipts tax* assessed pursuant to P. L. 1940, c. 5, as amended by P. L. 1941, c. 21 and 401, on street railway, traction, gas and electric light, heat and power companies using the public streets, highways, roads or other public places (which is in addition to the franchise tax, mentioned in the previous paragraph and in lieu of local taxes on certain of the property of the utilities named), is at the same rate as the average rate of taxation in the State, upon the gross receipts of such taxpayer for the preceding calendar year from its business over, on, in, through or from its lines or mains in the State.

While this Bureau does not collect either the franchise or the gross receipts tax, it is charged with the duty of apportioning both taxes to the municipalities after deducting the expenses incurred by it in the administration of the utility tax laws. The franchise tax is apportioned to the various municipalities in the proportion that the value of the scheduled property of the taxpayer located in, on or over any public street, highway, road, or other public place in each municipality as of the preceding July first bears to the total value of the scheduled property of the taxpayer located in, on, or over any public street, highway,

road or other public place in the State. The gross receipts tax is apportioned in the proportion that the value of the scheduled property of the taxpayer located in each municipality as of the preceding July first bears to the total value of the scheduled property of the taxpayer in the State.

Both the franchise and gross receipts taxes are payable to the local tax collectors in three installments: one-third within thirty days after certification of the apportionment by the Director; one-third on September 1st; and one-third on December 1st.

Valuations of scheduled property upon which both taxes are apportioned to the municipalities are determined by the Bureau on the basis of the unit values thereof set forth in each act.

Franchise taxes for the calendar year 1947 were assessed pursuant to the provisions of P. L. 1940, c. 4 and 5, as amended, against 128 corporations and five individuals in the aggregate sum of \$11,447,396.34, classified as follows:

Local Tax

(R. S. 54:1-18 to 35)

The primary statutory function of this Bureau, to be carried out when funds are made available, is to try to bring about greater uniformity in local property tax assessments. The Bureau does not have, however, any authority to consider appeals from taxes as levied.

This Bureau is charged with the duty of investigating the accuracy of the county equalization tables and checks the county tables of abstracts of ratables. The preparation of the state equalization table, the preparation of the state table of tax ratables for certification to the Comptroller by the Director and the preparation of the annual report of the Director are included in the work of this Bureau.

The Bureau gives information to taxpayers about laws concerning local tax assessments and confers with and advises county boards and local tax assessors about their work. It also compiles state and local tax statistics.

The Bureau investigates complaints of taxpayers and taxing districts, and submits reports thereon to the Director; keeps a record of the status of tax map matters in local taxing districts; urges the making, completion and revision of such map; and finally, has authority to supervise investigations for the equalization of assessments under R. S. 54:1-26 to 30, inclusive.

Outdoor Advertising Tax Bureau

(R. S. 54:40-1 to 19; superseded by P. L. 1942, c. 168)

R. S. 54:40-1 to 19 provide for the collection of license fees and permit fees on billboards and other outdoor advertising matter. A license fee of \$100 must be paid by every person, firm or corporation engaged in the business of outdoor advertising for profit, and a permit fee of three cents per square foot of area of each taxable billboard and outdoor advertising space.

P. L. 1942, c. 168, repealing R. S. 54:40-1, *et seq.*, applicable to the calendar year 1943, and subsequent years, levies the same license fee of \$100, but provides for permit fees according to the following schedule:

- (a) \$.50 for a space not exceeding 50 square feet in area.
- (b) 1.00 for a space exceeding 50 square feet in area, but not exceeding 100 square feet in area.
- (c) 2.50 for a space exceeding 100 square feet in area, but not exceeding 250 square feet in area.
- (d) 5.00 for a space exceeding 250 square feet in area, but not exceeding 500 square feet in area.
- (e) 8.00 for a space exceeding 500 square feet in area, but not exceeding 800 square feet in area.
- (f) 25.00 for a space exceeding 800 square feet in area.

The law empowers the Director to regulate the erection and placing of billboards and other outdoor advertising matter.

All collections under the provisions of this act are first used to defray the expenses of collection and enforcement. Balances are distributed, in January of the subsequent year, among the various municipalities of the State, in the proportion that the amount of the tax collected in each municipality bears to the total amount collected.

Supp. 54:4-78), or by taking and delivery of the body of the delinquent to the sheriff or the jailer of the county, to be kept until payment be made—but there shall be no arrest or detention for default in payment of taxes on real estate. (R. S. 54:4-79.)

- November 15. **Fourth instalment of county tax due county by each municipality:** The governing body of each municipality shall cause to be paid to the county treasurer, the fourth instalment of county tax. (R. S. 54:4-74.)
- November 16. **County boards of taxation shall determine all appeals from assessed valuation:** The county boards of taxation shall hear and determine all appeals by taxpayers and taxing districts from assessed valuations on or before this date. (R. S. 54:3-26, am. by P. L. 1946, c. 161.)
- December 1. **Appeals from added assessments to county board of taxation:** On or before this date appeals shall be filed with the county board of taxation from added assessments. (P. L. 1941, c. 397, sec. 11; N.J.S.A. 54:4-63.11; R. S. Cum. Supp. 54:4-63.11.)
- December 1. **Franchise and gross receipts taxes due municipalities (third payment):** One-third of the franchise and gross receipts taxes becomes payable to the municipalities on this date. (P. L. 1940, c. 4, sec. 9; N.J.S.A. 54:31-15.22; R. S. Cum. Supp. 54:31-9; P. L. 1940, c. 5, sec. 14; N.J.S.A. 54:31-58; R. S. Cum. Supp. 54:31-29.)
- December 1. **One-half of bank stock tax due and payable to county treasurer:** (R. S. 54:9-11, as am. by P. L. 1946, c. 146.)
- December 10.
(On or before.) **Railroad tax receipts paid to county treasurers by state:** The Comptroller shall transmit to each county treasurer a certificate showing the amounts allotted to the taxing districts therein for Class II railroad taxes and one-half the railroad franchise tax, and, on or before December 10 of the year in which the taxes are payable, draw his warrant in favor of the several county treasurers for the amounts allotted to their several counties. (P. L. 1941, c. 291, sec. 24; N.J.S.A. 54:29A-24; R. S. Cum. Supp. 54:29A-24.)
- December 15.
(Not later than.) **Railroad tax receipts paid to collectors of taxing districts by county treasurers:** Each county treasurer, not later than December 15, shall pay to the collector of each taxing district the amount of railroad taxes allotted thereto, deducting, however, the amount due for county taxes. (P. L. 1941, c. 291, sec. 24; N.J.S.A. 54:29A-24; R. S. Cum. Supp. 54:29A-24.)
- December 16.
(On or before.) **Taxpayers and taxing districts may appeal to the Division of Tax Appeals from judgments of the county boards of taxation regarding assessed valuations:** Any appellant who is dissatisfied with the judgment of the county board of taxation upon his appeal, may appeal from that judgment to the Division of Tax Appeals within one month from the date fixed for final decisions by the county boards (November 15). (P. L. 1944, c. 240; N.J.S.A. 54:2-39; R. S. Cum. Supp. 54:2-39.)

- December 31.
(On or before.) **Omitted property to be assessed:** The county board of taxation shall cause to be entered upon the tax duplicate a proper assessment against any property omitted by the assessor. Such proceedings may be brought within one year from the date when taxes on real property become a lien (January 1. See N.J.S.A. 54:5-6; R. S. Cum. Supp. 54:5-6.) (R. S. 54:3-20.)
- Year following tax year:**
- January 2. **Appeals from added assessments to be heard by county board of taxation:** The county board of taxation shall hear all appeals from added assessments within one month after the last day for filing appeals (December 1). (P. L. 1941, c. 397, sec. 11; N.J.S.A. 54:4-63.11; R. S. Cum. Supp. 54:4-63.11.)
- February 2. **Appeals from added assessments to the Division of Tax Appeals:** Appeals to the Division of Tax Appeals from judgments of the county boards of taxation on added assessments shall be made within one month from the date fixed for final decision of the county board of taxation (January 2). (P. L. 1941, c. 397, sec. 11; N.J.S.A. 54:4-63.11; R. S. Cum. Supp. 54:4-63.11.)
- February 15. **State and county taxes on added assessments payable by municipality to county:** On this date the municipality shall pay to the county an amount determined by multiplying the total amount of assessments in the added assessment list for the previous year by the county and state rate for the preceding year, and such amount shall be for the use of the county. (P. L. 1941, c. 397, sec. 10; N.J.S.A. 54:4-63.10; R. S. Cum. Supp. 54:4-63.10; R. S. Cum. Supp. 54:4-63.10.)
- March 1.
(On or before.) **Tax collector's statement of receipts, added, cancelled, abated and delinquent taxes to chief financial officer of taxing district:** Tax collectors in all taxing districts shall file with the treasurer or chief financial officer of the taxing district and with the governing body thereof, a statement of his receipts during the preceding year, and of the amount of taxes added to the preceding year's assessment, taxes of the preceding year abated or cancelled and taxes of the preceding year remaining unpaid at the end of said year. (P. L. 1944, c. 115; N.J.S.A. 54:4-91; R. S. Cum. Supp. 54:4-91.)
- May 1.
(On or before.) **Tax collector's statement of uncollectible tax assessments to governing body of taxing district:** The tax collector shall file with the governing body of the taxing district a list in duplicate of delinquent taxes which he believes are not collectible by reason of fictitious, double or other palpably erroneous assessment or in the case of poll taxes, dog taxes or taxes on personal property, by reason of the re-

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moval, absence, death or insolvency of the taxpayer. (P. L. 1944, c. 115, sec. 2; N.J.S.A. 54:4-91.1; R. S. Cum. Supp. 54:4-91.1.)

June 30.
(On or before.)

Governing body of taxing district to cancel uncollectible tax assessments and release tax collector of duty of collecting same: Within 60 days of filing by tax collector of delinquent tax list, the governing body of the taxing district shall examine said list, by resolution cancel any tax which it is satisfied cannot be collected and release the tax collector of responsibility for collection thereof. (P. L. 1944, c. 115, sec. 3; N.J.S.A. 54:4-91.2; R. S. Cum. Supp. 54:4-91.2.)

July 1.
(After.)

Sale of property to enforce delinquent tax lien: Taxes or municipal liens on real property, which remain in arrears on July 1, in the calendar year following the calendar year when the same became in arrears, shall be enforced by the collector by selling the property. (P. L. 1944, c. 108; N.J.S.A. 54:5-19; R. S. Cum. Supp. 54:5-19.)

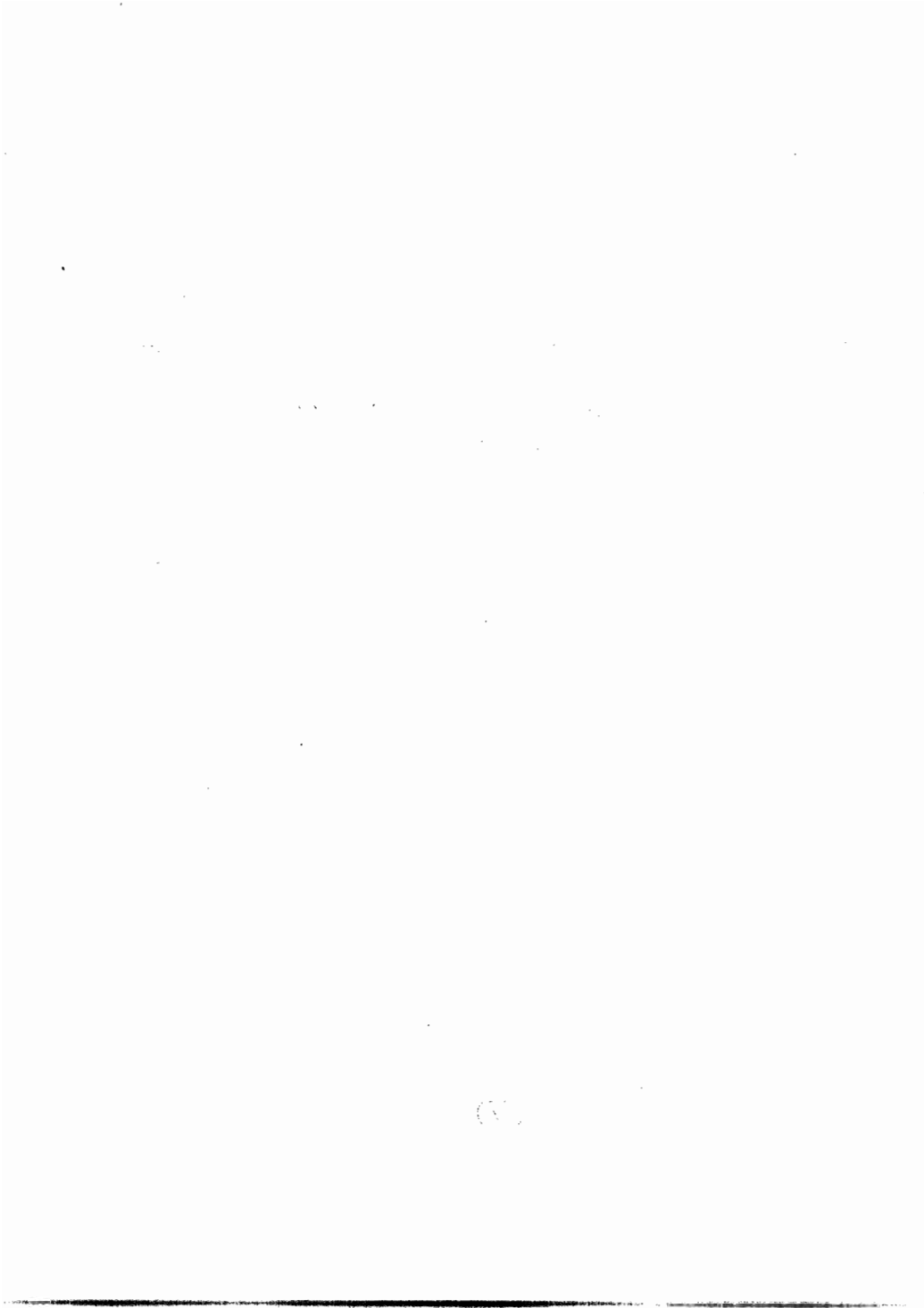
