ChalleNGe cadets give of selves to Fort Mifflin

On Dec. 16-17, 28 cadets from the New Jersey Youth Challe**NG**e Academy, contributed over 348 service to community hours to help revitalize Fort Mifflin. Fort Mifflin is a National landmark in Pennsylvania, honoring the men who fought there during the War for Independence. Colonial troops manning the Fort, delayed vital supplies from sailing down the Delaware River for 6 weeks, preventing them from reaching the British troops who occupied Philadelphia. This delay gave General Washington time to escape the area and reach Valley Forge. Fort Mifflin remained an active Army post until the 1950s, acting as a prison during the Civil War and an ammo supply depot during World War II.

The cadets performed many tasks in small groups under the direction of the Fort Mifflin Project Manager. The four groups of seven cadets each tackled some heavy tasks. Group one worked with saws and axes to clear the brush on an old wagon trail that was under cover with heavy brush and vines. Group two policed the grounds picking up numerous bags of garbage including old tires and untangling a heavy mooring rope that had washed up on the sea wall and was tangled among heavy drift wood. They spent the second day sanding and scraping a disassembled Civil War cannon in need of repair and painting. Group three raked the picnic grounds, laid down several loads of mulch, removed 6 truck loads of logs out of the picnic area and ended the weekend scraping paint off of the park benches so that they could be repainted. Group four spent the two days reinforcing a retaining wall to keep the Delaware River from flooding the fort, and cutting a trail to the High Battery that is located outside the Fort. The High Battery was built during the Civil War as an added defense, however it was never completed. Years ago, it had a picnic ground and camping area, but that had long since been reclaimed by the swamp. The cadets managed to cut a quarter mile trail wide enough for the Fort's tractor to travel along. Their work now opens up this unused area to allow for more detailed clean up and the eventual opening of this section to the public.

The project manager was very pleased and thankful for the work the cadets completed. He receives very little help and almost no funding. With little supervision and direction, the Cadets took the initiative to be the driving force for success. This project ties in nicely with New Jersey Youth Challe**NG**e Academy because the academy

"Troops to Teachers" program helps service members become teachers

Pensacola, Fla. - Troops to Teachers, the government program helping former military members become public school teachers, has broken the 9,500 mark in hires. Latest data shows that 9,502 teachers have been hired through the program since 1994, with Troops to Teachers represented in more than 3,000 school districts across the country.

Troops to Teachers (www.ProudtoServeAgain.com) is administered by the Department of Defense and Department of Education and managed by the Defense Activity for Non-Traditional Education Support (DANTES). The program helps eligible military personnel begin second careers as public school teachers by providing referral assistance, placement services, and - for those electing to teach at high-need schools - financial stipends and bonuses.

Members of the National Guard and Reserves with 10 or more years of service are eligible for the program, provided they commit for an additional three years.

the Soldier and his/her family during mobilization and deployment. Their number is (609) 562-2767 or (800) 877-2380 and they are located in Building 5201 at Maryland Ave and 8th Street. Some of the programs available are:

- <u>Army Emergency Relief</u>: Provides emergency financial assistance to active duty military personnel, retirees, National Guard and Reserve Component on active duty for over 30 consecutive days and their family members (with ID Card and power of attorney).
- Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP): Entitles member to additional benefits through TRICARE's Extended Care Health Option (ECHO) Program. Provides information, referrals, crisis intervention, community support and assistance to meet individual needs.
- <u>Family Advocacy Program</u>: Provides for the identification, reporting, prevention, and treatment of child abuse and domestic violence.
- <u>Employment Readiness Program</u>: Offers information and referral for employment, education (resume writing, interviewing), volunteer & training opportunities.

Family Readiness Council offers Tier I and II grants

The New Jersey National Guard State Family Readiness Council has expanded its Family Grants Program to include an additional grant. There are now two levels of Family Grants; TIER I is the \$2,500 grant that has been in place for the past couple of years. The TIER II opens family grants to New Jersey Army and Air National Guard non-deployed service members who were on State Active Duty or State Missions (e.g., hurricanes, floods, border missions) for more than 20 consecutive days. Service members meeting these criteria are eligible to apply for a financial hardship grant up to \$1,500. Applications are available at all New Jersey Army and Air National Guard Family Assistance Centers.

Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System database. Applicants should ensure that they, as well as their sponsor, are enrolled in the DEERS database and have a current ID card. The applicant must be planning to attend, or already attending, an accredited college, or university full-time in the fall term of 2007, or enrolled in a program of studies designed to transfer directly into a four-year program. Applications for 2007, which includes an essay on "how and why" the applicant would change an historical event, must be turned in at a commissary by close of business on **February 21, 2007.** At least one \$1,500 scholarship will be awarded at every commissary location with qualified applicants.
