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I. SUMMARY OF STATE RELIEF CASE LOAD

THE SIZE OF THE RELIEF LOAD

In April 1938, there were 270,935 persons on the relief rolls of 441 municipalities which in turn represented 97 per cent of the state's general population.

Of these 270,935 persons on relief, 247,589 were members of 62,635 family groups, and 23,346 were single persons not connected with any families. The 62,635 families and the 23,346 single persons constituted a total of 85,981 groups which were handled as cases.

The highest number on the relief rolls in New Jersey ever recorded was in February 1935, when 617,176 persons representing 168,785 cases were receiving home relief.

There are considerable divergencies in the size of the relief load in the 441 municipalities reporting in April 1938.

RELATION OF RELIEF LOAD TO GENERAL POPULATION

Taking the state as a whole 6.9 per cent of the general population was on the relief rolls in April 1938. In the municipalities with a population of 20,000 and over and included in this special relief survey, 8.3 per cent of the total population was on relief.

In February 1935, when the relief activities were at their peak in New Jersey, 15 per cent of the general population was on relief.

There is a considerable range in the relative proportion of the people on relief in the different municipalities in April 1938 as the following table shows:

RELATION OF RELIEF COSTS TO GENERAL POPULATION AND RATABLES

A per capita (per New Jersey inhabitant) cost of administration and relief of 56 cents was reported in April 1938. The per capita cost of relief alone was 53 cents.

The cost per \$1000 Ratables for the state as a whole was 39 cents for administration and relief, and 37 cents for relief alone.

II. RELIEF CASE LOAD OF 30 MUNICIPALITIES

AGE DISTRIBUTION OF THE RELIEF LOAD

Thirty municipalities reported 116,593 individuals on relief in December 1936 in a special caseload study made by the State Financial Assistance Commission in cooperation with the Department of Institutions and Agencies. Their age composition, important from the relief and embloyment standpoint, was as follows:

NEGROES ON THE RELIEF ROLLS

Negroes constituted 25 per cent of the families on relief in the twenty mine thirty municipalities included in this case load survey. The proportion of Negro families in the general population was 5.4 per cent.

In some municipalities the proportion of Negro families on relief is considerably higher. In Newark, for example, 37.5 per cent of all relief families were Negroes, in Camden 34.4 per cent, in East Grange, 35,8 per cent and in Montclair 58.7 per cent.

TYPE OF RELIEF FAMILIES

Designation of Head and Normal Breadwinners of the Family

From the relief standpoint it is important to know what type of families we have to provide for, viz:

- (a) whether it is the normal family with man, wife and children, the father being the natural breadwinner and under ordinary circumstances capable of providing for his family;
- (b) the woman as the head of the family, with the male breadwinner either dead or out of the running for other reasons, with children too young to work and who need her protective care;
- (c) the man at the head of the family, without a living spouse, with children under 16 to care for;
- (d) non-family persons with ages beyond the customary employment limit, or having physical or mental disabilities.

The relief survey disclosed the following line-up of the 116,593 individuals representing 36,316 cases.

THE EMPLOYABLES: 16 TO 64 YEARS OF AGE

The total number of persons between the ages of 16 - 64 on the relief rolls were 63,204. Of these 51,945, equal to 82.2 per cent, were sufficiently able-bodied to earn their own living if employment were available. Of these 51,945 employable persons between the ages of 16 and 64, 81.8 per cent were completely unemployed at the time of the census and 18,2 per cent has some kind of employment classified as follows:

- 15.1 per cent private employment
- 1.4 per cent W.P.A. employment
- 0.2 per cent local relief employment
- 1.5 per cent other employment

More than 50 per cent of all the families on relief had children under 16. The 8,989 families with the woman as the head involved 29,944 individuals of whom more than 46 per cent were under 16 years of age.
