Licensee pleads non vult to a charge alleging that on June 29, 1968, it sold a half pint of liqueur to a minor, age 16, in violation of Rule 1 of State Regulation No. 20.

Licensee pleads non vult to a charge alleging that on June 1, 1968 it sold drinks of alcoholic beverages to two minors, ages 19 and 20, in violation of Rule 1 of State Regulation No. 20.

Licensee has a previous record of suspension of license by the Commissioner for ten days effective September 21, 1943, again for twenty days effective April 28, 1944, and again for sixty days effective August 15, 1946, all for sale to minors. Re Silver Star Cafe, Inc., Bulletin 586, Item 5; Bulletin 616, Item 2; Bulletin 724, Item 6. In addition, the license was suspended by the municipal issuing authority for fifteen days effective February 8, 1960 and again for twenty-five days effective March 19, 1962, both for sale to minors; for fifteen days effective November 2, 1964, for sale during prohibited hours, for twenty-five days effective October 25, 1965, for sale to minors, and by the Director for fifty days effective February 1, 1968, for possession of alcoholic beverages not truly labeled. Re Silver Star Cafe, Inc., Bulletin 1783, Item 5.

The prior record of suspensions of license between 1943 and 1946 for similar violation occurring more than ten years ago disregarded, but considering the record of suspension for similar violation in 1965 within the past five years, the license will be suspended for twenty-five days (Re Maione, Bulletin 1685, Item 2), to which will be added ten days by reason of the record of two suspensions for similar violation in 1960 and 1962 more than five but less than ten years ago (Re Boysen's Sunset Tavern, Inc., Bulletin 1766, Item 3) and ten days by reason of the record of suspensions of license in 1964 and 1968 for dissimilar violation occurring within the past five years (Re Lotito, Bulletin 1797, Item 5), or a total of forty-five days, with remission of five days for the plea entered, leaving a net suspension of forty days.

BY THE DIRECTOR:

The Hearer has filed the following Report herein:

Hearer's Report

This matter came on for hearing pursuant to the provisions of R.S. 33:1-66 and State Regulation No. 28 to determine whether 74 containers of alcoholic beverages, \$219.30 in cash and miscellaneous personal property as set forth in an inventory hereinafter referred to, attached hereto, made part hereof and marked Schedule "A", seized on February 16, 1968 in the swimming pool area located in premises at 555 Elizabeth Avenue, Newark, New Jersey constitute unlawful property and should be forfeited.

The seizure was made by ABC agents because of the alleged unlawful sales of alcoholic beverages at the said premises. At the said hearing Harvey Chugerman, represented by counsel, appeared and sought the return of the seized property.

The file of this Division was admitted into evidence with the consent of the said claimant and contained the following: the affidavit of mailing, the affidavit of publication, the inventory, the chemist's report and the "marked" money, the record of the "marked" bills, all of which are part of the file. Reports of ABC agents and other documents in said file establish the following: On February 16, 1968 two ABC agents in possession of a "marked" \$5.00 bill and two \$1.00 bills, entered upon the premises in question. These premises are located in a multi-storied apartment building and consists of a swimming pool surrounded by an area on which there were lounge chairs and a bar. Opposite the bar was a table.

At the time they entered the premises there were about 50 males and females gathered around the pool, consuming alcoholic beverages; some of the guests were dancing. One of the agents approached the bar and sought to purchase two drinks of scotch whiskey. The bartender informed him that he must purchase tickets from a male seated at the table. The agents went to the table and purchased two tickets which he paid for with the "marked" \$10.00 bill for which he was charged 75¢ per ticket and received change. Upon receipt of the tickets the agent went to the bar, surrendered the tickets and received the two drinks of alcoholic beverages.

Shortly thereafter, the other agent left the premises, and returned an hour thereafter with local police. In the interval, the remaining agent purchased two additional tickets with "marked" money and was served drinks of alcoholic beverages in return for the tickets. When the second agent and local police arrived on the premises, the agents identified themselves to the bartender and to the ticket collector. Thereupon, the agents seized cash in a box in the possession of the ticket collector, and the alcoholic beverages.

Chugerman, who identified himself as the social director and the owner of the said alcoholic beverages, was arrested, charged with possession of alcoholic beverages without a license with intent to sell the same in violation of R.S. 33:1-50(b). Marie Townsend, the ticket collector, was arrested, charged with selling tickets for the sale of alcoholic beverages in violation of R.S. 33:1-50(a); and London Jones and John Flakes, who were employed as bartenders on the date herein charged, were also arrested, charged with selling alcoholic beverages without a license in violation of R.S. 33:1-50(a). All of these individuals were released in the custody of their attorney pending arraignment in the Newark Municipal Court.

Samples of the contents of seized bottles containing scotch whiskey were analyzed by the Division chemist who established that they were alcoholic beverages fit for beverage purposes with an alcoholic content by volume of 43.05%.

The records of this Division do not disclose any license or permit authorizing the sale of alcoholic beverages to any of the individuals herein named or for the premises where the violations took place. The seized alcoholic beverages are illicit because they were intended for sale without a license. R.S. 33:1-1(1). Such illicit alcoholic beverages, the personal property and the commingled cash as set forth in Schedule "A" herein constitute unlawful property and are subject to forfeiture. R.S. 33:1-66; R.S. 33:1-2; Seizure Case No. 11,860, Bulletin 1749, Item 5; Seizure Case No. 11,909, Bulletin 1779, Item 6.

At the hearing herein the attorney for Chugerman stipulated that there was a sale of alcoholic beverages on the day charged herein to the ABC agents; that the agents paid therefor with the "marked" money which was commingled with the seized cash; and that no permit or license was issued to the claimant or to anyone else authorizing the sale of alcoholic beverages at these premises.

Harvey Chugerman, testifying in support of his claim for the return of the seized property, gave the following account: He is a social director at these premises and is in charge of

organizing swim parties which were held about once a month. He purchases these alcoholic beverages with his own money and they are sold on a "drink" basis to tenants of the building and their friends. He admitted that the ABC agents were not tenants of the building and were admitted to the party through the "negligence" of the operator. He never gave any thought to whether it was necessary to obtain a permit or license to sell alcoholic beverages because he had no experience in these matters. However, he further admitted that he never made inquiry of this Division or any other authority. Finally, he avers that he makes no profit on these parties and runs these parties as a favor because he is a tenant in the building.

It is clear and indeed, admitted, that this claimant unlawfully possessed alcoholic beverages and sold the same without a license or permit. His professed ignorance of the law is obviously no excuse for his failure to obtain a proper permit. It is difficult to conceive that this claimant who has a good educational background, is sophisticated, and has business experience, was so ingenuous as to believe that the sale of alcoholic beverages could be made without lawful permit.

Under the above facts, I conclude that there has been an absence of good faith; his failure to establish good faith leaves the Director without authority to recognize the said claim.

Accordingly, it is recommended that the claim of Chugerman for the return of the said property be rejected, and that an Order be entered forfeiting the seized property, the commingled cash and the alcoholic beverages. Seizure Case No. 11,164, Bulletin 1565, Item 5; R.S. 33:1-2; R.S. 33:1-66.

#### Conclusions and Order

No exceptions were taken to the Hearer's report within the time limited by Rule 4 of State Regulation No. 28.

After carefully considering the facts and circumstances, I concur in the recommended conclusions in the Hearer's report and adopt them as my conclusions herein.

Accordingly, it is on this 11th day of September, 1968

DETERMINED and ORDERED that the miscellaneous personal property, \$219.30 in cash and the alcoholic beverages, as set forth in Schedule "A" attached hereto, constitute unlawful property, and the same be and hereby are forfeited in accordance with the provisions of R.S. 33:1-66, and shall be retained for the use of hospitals and State, county and municipal institutions, or destroyed, in whole, or in part, at the direction of the Director of the Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control.
