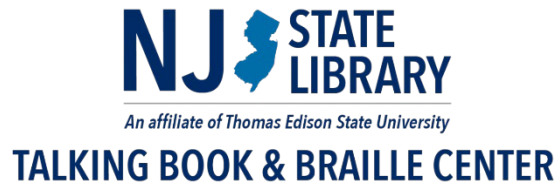

Highlights from TBBC – Summer, 2024

BARD Express Player

The Talking Book and Braille Center (TBBC) is happy to announce that the National Library Service for the Blind and Print Disabled (NLS) has now made their BARD Express Player available for your PC!

With the BARD Express Player, you can listen to any audiobook on your PC!

If you already have BARD Express on your PC, you just need to update it. When you open BARD Express, there will be an alert saying “A new version of BARD Express is available,” giving you the option to skip, remind you later, or to update. Or, when you are in BARD Express, on the top menu pick the third option, “Help.” The second item is “Check for updates.”

Much like BARD Mobile, the BARD Express Player allows you to adjust the narration speed; jump to navigation points such as part, chapter, and article; create bookmarks; and much more. You can also create global settings for narration speed, auto-play, auto-rewind, and more.

If you are using JAWS and NVDA, you can either use the tab key to move to each of the player’s functions or tap a single letter assigned to that function. For example, you can type F for fast forward, R for rewind, and B for bookmarks. A complete list of commands can be found under the BARD Express Help menu.

Scripts are built into the 2024 version of JAWS to optimize the BARD Express Player. If you are using JAWS 2022 or 2023, you can download the same scripts from the BARD Express page on the NLS website and import them into your screen reader.

NLS recommends reading Section 7 of the BARD Express user guide, which is dedicated to the BARD Express Player to familiarize yourself with the new player. Spanish Summer Reading Program

Thanks to the support of the Friends of the Library and the variety of activities we delivered to Spanish Summer Reading participants, TBBC was more connected with patrons this year. The participants spent time virtually discussing Latin authors and personal experiences with our library staff. They noted how difficult it can be to put down their Talking Books, especially when they find authors and stories mirroring their own lives.

Patrons who don't speak fluent Spanish Language were eager to learn more about Latin-American authors and their culture. We offered a list of audiobooks originally produced in Spanish and translated into the English language.

Summer Reading Program for Children and Teens

TBBC is wrapping up another successful Summer Reading Program. This year's theme was "Adventure Begins at Your Library" and it was most certainly an adventurous summer! By the end of the program, TBBC will have sent by mail 4 different activity packets in large print and braille, if requested, to all participants. The packages include booklists, craft ideas, activities, and prizes such as wooden snakes, plush stars, sand art, and more thanks to the generosity of the Friends of the Library. Additionally, special for this year, each participant had the opportunity to receive an Amazon Echo Dot thanks to a generous grant from the Bordentown Elks Lodge 2085 Elks National Foundation Committee.

We are already looking forward to next summer when things promise to get a bit more colorful as we "Color Our World!" Other Commercial Devices

NLS is doing an excellent job of allowing multiple devices to access BARD. Patrons can now use a device that fits their needs while being able to enjoy reading books and magazines.

The Alexa smart speaker is a commercial device that NLS is allowing patrons to use to download items from BARD. The recent grant from the Bordentown Elks Lodge 2085 allowing TBBC to distribute 40 Amazon Echo Dot smart speakers brought to light an issue that patrons will need to be made aware of.

Working with representatives from NLS as well as the United States Postal Service, the post office decided that since access to the BARD program was not the prime function of the Alexa smart speaker, TBBC could not send out

the Alexa smart speakers to children in the summer reading program under the provision of “Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped.”

The additional cost to ensure that children in the program receive this gift was in the hundreds of dollars. Fortunately for TBBC children, a bequest from the estate of Barbara Shalit will enable the children to receive the Alexa smart speakers.

This is only a reminder that as NLS opens more opportunities for patrons there may be circumstances where postage will need to be paid.

Magazines on Cartridges

TBBC has made some changes to the way we distribute our audio magazine cartridges. Previously, TBBC relied on distributors to send nationally produced magazines to you. These magazines came in a red box and were sent from states outside of New Jersey.

Now, those nationally produced magazines will be sent to you directly from TBBC in Trenton, New Jersey. These magazine cartridges will be identical to the book cartridges that you are used to receiving from us. This change in distribution will have no effect on the content of the magazines.

This change will allow for faster check-ins of your returning magazines, which should decrease the time it takes for you to receive new issues. Our bi-monthly audio catalog, Talking Book Topics, will continue to be mailed from outside New Jersey for the time being.

Registration Open for LEAP iPad and iPhone Classes

Registration is open for the next session of iPad and iPhone accessibility classes we are offering as part of the Library Equal Access Program (LEAP).

LEAP is a program sponsored by the New Jersey Department of Human Services Commission for the Blind and Visually Impaired (CBVI). LEAP offers classes for individuals aged 55 and above, who have a loss of vision. These classes teach participants how to use accessibility features available on

iPads and iPhones. These include features like VoiceOver and Siri voice commands.

Finding an apparently perfect world at Akenside Priory, in Northumberland, Catherine trusts herself to a group of twenty silent women, believing she is trusting herself to God. Cut off from the wider world for decades, the community has managed to evade accountability to any authority beyond itself. When

Who the skeleton was and how it got there were two of the long-held secrets kept by the residents of Chicken Hill, the dilapidated neighborhood where immigrant Jews and African Americans lived side by side and shared ambitions and sorrows. Chicken Hill was where Moshe and Chona Ludlow lived when Moshe integrated his theater and where Chona ran the Heaven and Earth Grocery Store. When the state came looking for a deaf boy to institutionalize him, it was Chona and Nate Timblin, the Black janitor at Moshe's theater and the unofficial leader of the Black community on Chicken Hill, who worked together to keep the boy safe. As these characters' stories overlap and deepen, it becomes clear how much the people who live on the margins of white, Christian America struggle and what they must do to survive. David Tatel has served nearly 30 years on America's second highest court, the United States Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit, where many of our most crucial cases are resolved—or teed up for the Supreme Court. He has championed equal justice for his entire adult life; decided landmark environmental and voting cases; and embodied the ideal of what a great judge should be. Yet he has been blind for the past 50 of his 80-plus years. Initially, he depended upon aides to read texts to him, and more recently, a suite of hi-tech solutions has allowed him to listen to reams of documents at high speeds. At first, he tried to hide his deteriorating vision, and for years, he denied that it had any impact on his career. Only recently, partly thanks to his first-ever guide dog, Vixen, has he come to fully accept his blindness and the role it's played in his personal and professional lives. His story of fighting for justice over many decades, with and without eyesight, is an inspiration to us all."-- Goodreads. Unrated. Commercial audiobook.

"It's watching. Liz Rocher is coming home reluctantly. As a Black woman, Liz doesn't exactly have fond memories of Johnstown, Pennsylvania, a predominantly white town. But her best friend is getting married, so she braces herself for a weekend of awkward, passive-aggressive reunions. Liz has grown, though; she can handle whatever awaits her. But on the day of the wedding, somewhere between dancing and dessert, the couple's daughter, Caroline, disappears—and the only thing left behind is a piece of white fabric covered in blood. It's taking. As a frantic search begins, with the police combing the trees for Caroline, Liz is the only one who notices a pattern: A summer night. A missing girl. A party in the woods. She's seen this before. Keisha Woodson, the only other Black girl in Liz's high school, walked into the woods with a mysterious man and was later found with her chest cavity ripped open and her heart removed. Liz shudders at the thought that it could have been her, and now, with Caroline missing, it can't be a coincidence. As Liz starts to dig through the town's history, she uncovers a horrifying secret about the place she once called home. Children have been going missing in these woods for years. All of them Black. All of them girls. It's your turn. With the evil in the forest creeping closer, Liz knows what she must do: find Caroline, or be entirely consumed by the

The Mango Tree: A Memoir of Fruit, Florida, and Felony DB120533

"When journalist Annabelle Tometich picks up the phone one June morning, she isn't expecting a collect call from an inmate at the Lee County Jail. And when she accepts, she certainly isn't prepared to hear her mother's voice on the other end of the line. However, explaining the situation to her younger siblings afterwards was easy; all she had to say was, "Mom shot at some guy. He was messing with her mangoes." They immediately understood. Answering the questions of the breaking-news reported at the same newspaper where Annabelle worked as a restaurant critic proved more difficult. Annabelle decided to go with a variation of the truth: it was complicated. So begins *The Mango Tree*, a poignant and deceptively entertaining memoir of growing up as a mixed-race Filipina "nobody" in suburban Florida as Annabelle traces the roots of her upbringing all the while reckoning with her erratic father's untimely death in a Fort Myers motel, her fiery mother's bitter yearning for the country she left behind, and her own journey in the pursuit of belonging. With clear-eyed compassion and piercing honesty, *The Mango Tree* is a family saga that navigates the tangled branches of Annabelle's life, from her childhood days in an overflowing house flooded by balikbayan boxes, vegetation, and juicy mangoes, to her winding path from medical school hopeful to restaurant critic. It is a love letter to her fellow Filipino Americans, her lost younger self, and the beloved fruit tree at the heart of her family. But above all, it is an ode to Annabelle's hot-blooded, whip-smart mother Josefina, a woman who made a life and a home of her own, and without whom Annabelle would not have herself."-- Goodreads. The Paris Novel DB120876

"When her estranged mother dies, Stella is left with an unusual inheritance: a one-way plane ticket and a note reading "Go to Paris." But Stella is hardly cut out for adventure; a childhood trauma, and her mother's negligent parenting style, have kept her strictly confined to her comfort zone, even in

adulthood. When her boss encourages her to time off, Stella resigns herself to honor her mother's wishes, even if a spontaneous trip to Paris is the last thing she wants. Even in a new city, Stella can't help but fall into old habits, living cautiously and frugally. But one day, she stumbles across a consignment store and tries on a fabulous vintage dress. The shopkeeper allows her to borrow it for the day if she goes on an adventure. So Stella decides to treat herself to oysters and wine for lunch, where she has a chance encounter with a dapper octogenarian art collector, Jules. He immediately recognizes Stella needs a proper introduction to the magical side of Paris and takes her under his wing. Amid decadent meals and encounters with a veritable who's who of the 1980s Paris art and culinary worlds, Stella begins to understand what it might mean to live a bigger life. As weeks pass, Stella ends up living at the bookstore Shakespeare and Company as a "tumbleweed," uncovering a hundred-year-old art mystery, and unlocking a passion for food that may be connected to her past, and the true reason she has been sent to Paris. A feast for the senses, this novel is a testament to what it means to live deliciously: to be authentic, to embrace adventure, and to find a home in the last place you might expect"-
