SUBJECT: Medicare Part B Premium Increase - January 1988

Effective with the January 1988 Social Security checks, the premiums for Medicare Part B (SMI) coverage increased from \$17.90 to \$24.80. However, the Social Security Act provides that the new premium amount will be less than the \$24.80 for certain Social Security beneficiaries.

This year's cost-of-living increase in Social Security benefits was 4.2%. The effect of the benefit increase in conjunction with the \$6.90 increase in the SMI premium, would have resulted in a decrease in the net Social Security benefits to persons with already low entitlement. The law requires that no one suffer a reduction in net Social Security benefit due to the increase in the SMI premium. The provision affects persons whose pre-January 1988 Social Security benefit was \$165.00 or less. For the affected persons, the new SMI premium is equal to the amount of the Social Security increase plus the old premium amount of \$17.90 (not to exceed \$24.80).

The Social Security Administration has advised that the amount of the new SMI premium may be verified through the submission of a Third Party Query with the "H" field completed.

For new Medicaid Only applications for the affected population, it is important in the completion of the Form PA-3L, <u>Statement Of Income Available For</u> <u>Medicaid Payment</u>, that the reduced SMI premium amounts be reflected for the two months before the State assumes responsibility for the buy-in premium.
