COURT-AUTHORIZED ELECTRONIC SURVEILLANCE 2009

Following is a summary of the attached 2009 electronic surveillance report.

- . In 2009, 235 applications were made and granted for electronic surveillance orders. Of the 235 orders granting electronic surveillance, 219 were installed and utilized. Eleven intercepts were never installed or utilized and five intercepts were installed but not used.
- . Extensions were requested and granted for 67 intercept orders. In addition to the first extension granted in 67 instances, second extensions were granted in 34 instances and third and fourth extensions in one instance.
- . Of the total 235 orders granted, 228 authorized wire (telephone) intercepts, six authorized oral intercepts and 15 authorized electronic intercepts. Fourteen of the orders granted more than one type of intercept.
- . A total of 35 intercepts were for stored communications: 18 for pre-recorded jail conversations, nine for text messages, four for voice mail, three for video and one for a pager.
- . Considering the most serious offense being investigated, the largest number, 149 (63%) involved controlled dangerous substance violations.
- . In addition, 29 (12%) of the orders involved racketeering, 27 (11%) involved murder offenses and 11 (5%) involved leader of a narcotics network.
- . At the close of the report year, 600 defendants were arrested statewide as a result of electronic surveillance orders while 414 defendants were indicted.
- . At the close of the report year, 198 defendants reached final disposition. Of those reaching final disposition, 147 were convicted through guilty pleas, 45 were admitted into pre-trial intervention programs and six defendants were dismissed.

Court-Authorized Electronic Surveillance

2009

The New Jersey Wiretapping and Electronic Surveillance Control Act requires the Attorney General to report annually on the use of court-authorized intercepts. To accomplish this, the Act directs the Attorney General to collect and maintain records of all court-authorized intercepts, regardless of whether the intercept is carried out by the Attorney General's Office, a county prosecutor's office, or a local law enforcement agency.

Data reported pursuant to *N.J.S.A. 2A:156A-23* were compiled to report on the operation of the New Jersey Wiretapping Act. As required by statute, this report contains data concerning:

- (1) The number of applications made.
- (2) The number of orders issued.
- (3) The effective periods of such orders.
- (4) The number and duration of any renewals.
- (5) The crime in connection with electronic surveillance orders.
- (6) The name of the applicants.
- (7) Indictments resulting from each application.
- (8) The crime which each indictment charges.
- (9) The disposition of each indictment.

In addition to the detailed information provided for 2009 applications and orders, supplemental follow-up data is provided for electronic surveillance orders reported in previous calendar years.

APPLICATIONS

In 2009, 235 applications for electronic surveillance orders were reported statewide pursuant to the Wiretap Act. The applications made were authorized by prosecution officials as follows.

ORDERS FOR ELECTRONIC SURVEILLANCE

In all, 235 court orders were entered granting court authorization for electronic surveillance in 2009.¹

¹ The United States Administrative Office of the Courts 2009 wiretap report (www.uscourts.gov/Statistics/WiretapReports/WiretapReport2009.aspx, Table B-1, pgs. 220-237) lists 255 electronic surveillance orders for New Jersey. The state report lists 235 electronic surveillance orders for New Jersey. Discrepancies between federal and state reports are described below.

Atlantic County. The federal report lists one order that should be listed under Burlington County: AO#2009-1: AJGBUR1409, which it incorrectly lists as narcotics, 30 days instead of Murder, 10 days. The US report is missing 4 wires: AJGATL1109 (4/7/09, robbery); AJGATL1909 (9/15/09, murder); AJGATL2209 (10/25/09, murder) and AJGATL2309 (11/17/09, murder).

Bergen County. The US AOC report lists the wrong order length for AO#2009-13, KGCBER4409, which should be 20 days. It also lists AO#2009-20 as a new wire, it is actually an extension of HGCBER0909. The federal report lists one order that should be listed under Burlington County: AO#2009-34, REBBUR0109, which is a stored jail communication authorized by Prosecutor Bernardi, not Molinelli. The US AOC reports 11 wires reported by the state in 2008: AO#2008-1 through AO#2008-11: RBSBER0108, RBSBER0208, RBSBR0308, RBSBER0408, RBSBER0508, RBSBER0608, RBSBER0708, RBSBER0808, RBSBER0908, RBSBER1108 and RBSBER1208..

Burlington County. The US AOC report erroneously reported the two Burlington orders under the wrong counties. AJGBUR1409 is listed as an Atlantic order (AO#2009-1) while REBBUR1009 is listed as a Bergen order (AO#2009-34).

Camden County. The federal report lists three orders that should be listed under Gloucester County: AO#2009-8, SDNGLO1209; AO#2009-3, SDNGLO0309; and AO#2009-4, SDNGLO0409, which also has the prosecutor listed as Sand. It should be Dalton. AO#2009-1 (SDNCAM0109), AO#2009-2 (SDNCAM0209) and AO#2009-5 (SDNCAM0509) were authorized by Prosecutor Faulk, not Mulholland. AO#2009-1 (SDNCAM0109) should have a total length of 50 days, not 40. Camden reports three orders not included in the federal report: SDNCAM1109 (7/17/09, CDS); SDNCAM1309 (9/3/09, CDS) and SDNCAM1509 (10/16/09, CDS).

Cape May County. The US AOC reports AO#2009-1 (AJGCPM0609) as authorized by Prosecutor Taylor. It should be Prosecutor Meyer. Cape May reports five additional orders not included in the federal report: AJGCPM0809 (1/23/09, leader of a narcotics network); AJGCPM2009 (10/1/09, assault); AJGCPM2109 (10/1/09, racketeering); AJGCPM2409 (11/9/09, murder) and AJGCPM2509 (12/02/09, assault).

Cumberland County. The federal report is missing nine orders reported to the state: AJGCUM0109 (1/08/09, murder); AJGCUM0209 (1/26/09, murder); AJGCUM0309 (1/26/09, murder); AJGCUM1309 (6/26/09, murder); AJGCUM1409 (6/26/09, murder); AJGCUM1509 (7/09/09, official misconduct); AJGCUM1609 (7/09/09, official misconduct); AJGCUM1709 (8/18/09, prostitution) and AJGCUM1809 (9/1/09, obstruction of justice).

Essex County. The federal report lists one wire that was reported by the state in 2008, AO#2009-1, PJVESS0108. Additionally, this order erroneously lists Judge Falcone, it should be Judge Vasquez. The federal report is missing 15 orders: PJVESS0208 (11/18/08, CDS); PJVESS0308 (11/18/08, murder); PJVESS0408 (12/23/08, CDS); PJVESS0508 (12/28/08, CDS); PJVESS0109 (1/15/09, CDS); PJVESS0209 (5/1/09, arson); PJVESS0309 (6/23/09, murder); PJVESS0409 (6/30/09, CDS); PJVESS0509 (6/30/09, CDS); PJVESS0609 (7/17/09, CDS); PJVESS0709 (7/3/09, murder); PJVESS0809 (7/31/09, CDS); PJVESS0909 (8/7/09, CDS); PJVESS1009 (10/21/09, forgery) and PJVESS1109 (11/20/09, forgery).

Gloucester County. The US AOC reports three of Gloucester's orders under Camden, SDNGLO0309, SDNGLO0409 and SDNGLO1209. The federal report includes a 2008 order, AO#2008-2 that was not in Gloucester's inventory for 2008 or 2009.

Hunterdon County. The US AOC reports one duplicate. AO#2009-2 is a duplicate of LRFHNT2709. AO#2009-1, should have obstruction of justice as the offense. AO#2009-3, YCHNT0109, should be under Judge Ciccone, not Judge Feinberg.

Mercer County. Three of the orders reported under Mercer are from Warren County. AO#2009-6 (LRFWRN1509), AO#2009-7 (LRFWRN1809) and AO#2009-8 (LRFWRN1909). For all three orders it should be Judge Feinberg, not Judge Sypek, and should be under Prosecutor Ferguson, not Prosecutor Bocchini.

Middlesex County. The federal report lists AO#2009-2 (TLFMID0209) as a 30 day order. It should be 20 days. Two orders, LMLMID1609 and LMLMID1709 are erroneously listed under Monmouth.

Monmouth County. The federal report lists AO#2009-1 as narcotics. It should be racketeering. AO#2009-3, AO#2009-4, AO#2009-5, AO#2009-19, AO#2009-25 and AO#2009-26 are duplicates. The federal report has incorrect dates for four orders: AO#2009-8, LMLMON0209 should be dated 1/07/2009; AO#2009-9, LMLMON0309, should be dated 1/7/09; AO#2009-11, LMLMON0609, should be dated 1/29/09 and

AO#2009-23, LMLMON2109, should be dated 10/09/09. Two orders, AO#2009-18 (LMLMID1609) and AO#2009-20 (LMLMID1709) should have been reported under Middlesex.

Morris County. The US AOC report lists the length of days for AO#2009-1, TVMMOR0109 as 30 days. It should be 20 days. One of the orders in the federal report (AO#2008-10, KGCMOR8108) was reported on the state report last year.

Ocean County. Reports one order that was not reported by the US AOC: AJGOCE1209 (6/11/09, CDS). The federal report includes 12 orders that were reported on the state report in 2008: AO#2008-1 through AO#2008-12: AJGOCE0608, AJGOCE1408, AJGOCE1608, AJGOCE1808, AJGOCE2708, AJGOCE2908, AJGOCE3008, AJGOCE3608, AJGOCE3708, AJGOCE3808, AJGOCE4008, AJGOCE4108, AJGOCE4208 and AJGOCE4308.

Passaic County. The federal report AO#2009-5 (HGCPAS0609) and AO#2009-19 (HGCPAS2009) should be authorized by Judge Carroll, not Judge Clark.

Salem County. Reports one order that was not reported by the US AOC: AJGSAL0909 (4/3/09, murder). The US AOC reports three orders that were included in the state report last year: AO#2008-1 (AJGSAL0908), AO#2008-2 (AJGSAL0908) and AO#2008-3 (AJGSAL1208).

Somerset County. The federal report AO#2009-9 (LRF SOM1009) is reported as 30 days authorized. It should be 20 days. The federal reports has the wrong dates listed for five orders. AO#2009-14, LRF SOM2809 should be 8/25/09; AO#2009-16, LRF SOM2009 should be 8/5/09; AO#2009-17, LRF SOM2209 should be 8/6/2009; AO#2009-18, LRF SOM2509 should be 8/19/09 and AO#2007-27, LRF SOM2109 should be 8/5/09. It was a 2009 wire, not a 2007 wire. Somerset reported one additional order that is not on the federal report, LRF SOM1709 (5/20/09, assault).

Union County. Reports two orders that were not reported by the US AOC: JSTUNI1609 (5/28/09, obstructing justice) and JSTUNI2009 (9/11/09, murder). AO#2009-1 (JPDUNI0109), AO#2009-2 (JPDUN0209) and AO#2009-3 (JPDUNI0309) should be listed as CDS, not conspiracy. The US AOC reports the wrong originally authorized order length for AO#2009-6, JSTUNI0609. It should be 20 days. AO#2009-18 (JPDUNI1909) should be listed as escape. AO#2009-20 (JSTUNI2309) had one extension for a total of 60 days.

Warren County. The US AOC report erroneously reported three of Warren's orders under Mercer County (AO#2009-06, 07 and 08): LRFWAR1509, LRFWAR1809 and LRFWAR1909.

State Attorney General. The US AOC reports 34 intercept orders; the state Attorney General's Office reports 16 intercept orders. AO# 2009-3 to 6, and AO#2009-8 to 21

Extensions were requested and granted for 67 intercept orders. In addition to the first extension granted in 67 instances, second extensions were granted in 34 instances and third and fourth extensions in one instance.

Of the 235 orders requesting interception of communication, 228 authorized wire (telephone) intercepts, 6 authorized oral intercepts, and 15 authorized electronic intercepts. Note that 14 of the orders granted more than one type of intercept.

There were a total of 35 requests for stored communications: 18 for pre-recorded jail conversations, 9 for text messages, 4 for voice mail, 3 for video and 1 for a pager.

Of the 235 orders requesting electronic surveillance, 219 were installed and utilized. Eleven intercepts were never installed or utilized and 5 intercepts were installed, but not used.

Of the total 235 original orders, 58 authorized use of intercepts for 30 days, 144 authorized use of intercepts for 20 days, 5 orders authorized use for 1 day, while there was one order each for 4 days, 10 days and 13 days respectively. The remaining 25 orders involved stored communications, so number of days authorized is not applicable.

Section 8 of the Wiretap Act specifies the crime for which electronic surveillance may be granted. Offense data collected and analyzed for court-authorized electronic surveillance consider the most serious offense investigated.

refer to intercepts used in conjunction with ongoing investigations and were not reported by the state in 2009. These 18 intercept orders will be reported by the Attorney General's Office at the conclusion of the investigation. AO#2009-2 should have Judge Clark as the judge and CDS as the offense. AO#2008-47, LMLMON2908, should have an authorized length of 20 days, not 30 days. AO#2008-51 is a stored jail communication. It was reported as 120 days in length with three extensions. This is not necessary for a stored communication.

Overall, electronic surveillance orders were granted in connection with investigations involving the following offense categories: controlled dangerous substance offenses, racketeering, murder offenses, leader of a narcotics network, obstructing justice, assault, official misconduct, weapons offenses, forgery, prostitution, arson, escape, child abuse, robbery and gambling.

Of the 235 orders authorizing electronic surveillance, considering the most serious offense, the majority, 149 (63%), involved controlled dangerous substance offenses.

In addition, 29 (12%) of the orders involved racketeering, 27 (11%) involved murder offenses, and 11 (5%) involved leader of a narcotics network.

Four of the orders had obstructing justice as the most serious offense and 3 were for assault. Official misconduct, weapons violations and forgery were involved in 2 orders each while arson, child abuse, escape, gambling, prostitution and robbery involved 1 order each.

DEFENDANT INDICTMENTS AND DISPOSITIONS

Summary information concerning defendant indictments resulting from electronic surveillance applications is provided below with detailed information on the following pages.² The information provided concerns defendant indictments resulting from each application, the offenses charged, and indictment dispositions.

- . At the close of the report year, a total of 600 defendants were arrested of which 414 were indicted statewide as a result of electronic surveillance applications and orders.
- . At the close of the report year, 1 defendant was awaiting grand jury, 213 defendants were awaiting trial and 2 defendants were listed as fugitives while 198 defendants indicted reached final disposition.
- . Of those defendants reaching final disposition, 147 were convicted through guilty pleas, 45 were admitted into a pre-trial intervention program and 6 defendants were dismissed.
- . Of those 414 defendants indicted, 296 (72%) were indicted for controlled dangerous substance offenses.
- . In addition, 72 defendants were indicted for racketeering, 29 for gambling offenses, 6 for obstruction of justice and 4 defendants were indicted for murder offenses.
- . Of the remaining 7 defendants indicted, 2 were for weapons offenses, 2 were for assault, 2 were for escape and 1 was indicted for money laundering.

MEMORANDUM TO: THE HONORABLE CHRIS CHRISTIE AND THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY

The New Jersey Wiretapping and Electronic Surveillance Control Act (N.J.S.A. 2A:156A-1 to -34) requires the Chief Justice to submit an annual report to the Governor and the Legislature (N.J.S.A. 2A:156A-23E). In accordance with that section, I am submitting this report to inform you of the operation of the Act during 2009.

N.J.S.A. 2A:156A-2(i) provides that only Superior Court judges designated by the Chief Justice are authorized to hear wiretap applications. For the year 2009, the following judges were authorized wiretap judges: by order dated April 26, 1994, Judge Kevin G. Callahan; by order dated July 22, 1997, Judge Linda R. Feinberg; by order dated December 3, 1997, Judge Samuel D. Natal; by order dated June 11, 1999, Judge Albert J. Garofolo; by order dated July 22, 1999, Judge Marilyn C. Clark; by order dated September 1, 2004, Judge Ronald B. Sokalski; by order dated December 27, 2004, Judge Maurice Gallipoli; by order dated July 1, 2005, Judge Maria M. Sypek; by order dated May 26, 2007, Judge Travis L. Francis and Judge Lawrence M. Lawson; by order dated July 14, 2008, Judge Peter J. Vazquez; by order dated February 1, 2009, Judge Joseph P. Donohue and Judge Thomas V. Manahan; by order dated February 18, 2009, Judge Peter E. Doyne and Judge Harry G. Carroll; by order dated September 1, 2009, Judge Ronald E. Bookbinder, Judge Ernest M. Caposela, Judge Yolanda Ciccone, Judge Francis R. Hodgson, Jr. and Judge Walter L. Marshall, Jr.

The data for the year 2009 includes reports of all orders granting permission to intercept wire, electronic and/or oral communications, or to perform electronic surveillance, for any period that ended in 2009. It is the actual termination date of the surveillance that governs which reports are included within the reporting year. During 2009, the reports to the Administrative Office of the Courts reflected 244 applications¹ seeking permission to intercept wire, electronic or oral communications. No applications were denied. Thus, in 2009 the authorized judges entered 244 orders granting permission to intercept wire, electronic and/or oral communications.

¹ Note that the Office of the Attorney General reports 235 applications. The numbers differ because of differences in reporting methods for the two reports. The Judiciary reports a wiretap in the year that it terminated. The Attorney General does not report a wiretap until the investigation in the case is complete.

Of the 244 orders entered, 212 permitted interception of wire communications, 4 permitted interception of electronic communications, and 5 permitted interception of oral communications. In addition, 23 applications were authorized for the retrieval of stored communications, rather than for the interception of wire, electronic and/or oral communications. There were 62 orders authorized for 30 days each, 164 were specified for 20 days each, and 18 others were authorized for less than 20 days each. Additionally, 109 extensions of previously entered orders were granted during the reporting year. Of these, 33 extensions were for 30 days and 1 extension was for 20 days. There were another 75 extensions for 10 days or less.

The distribution of orders and extensions among the judges authorized to issue orders during 2009 was as follows:
