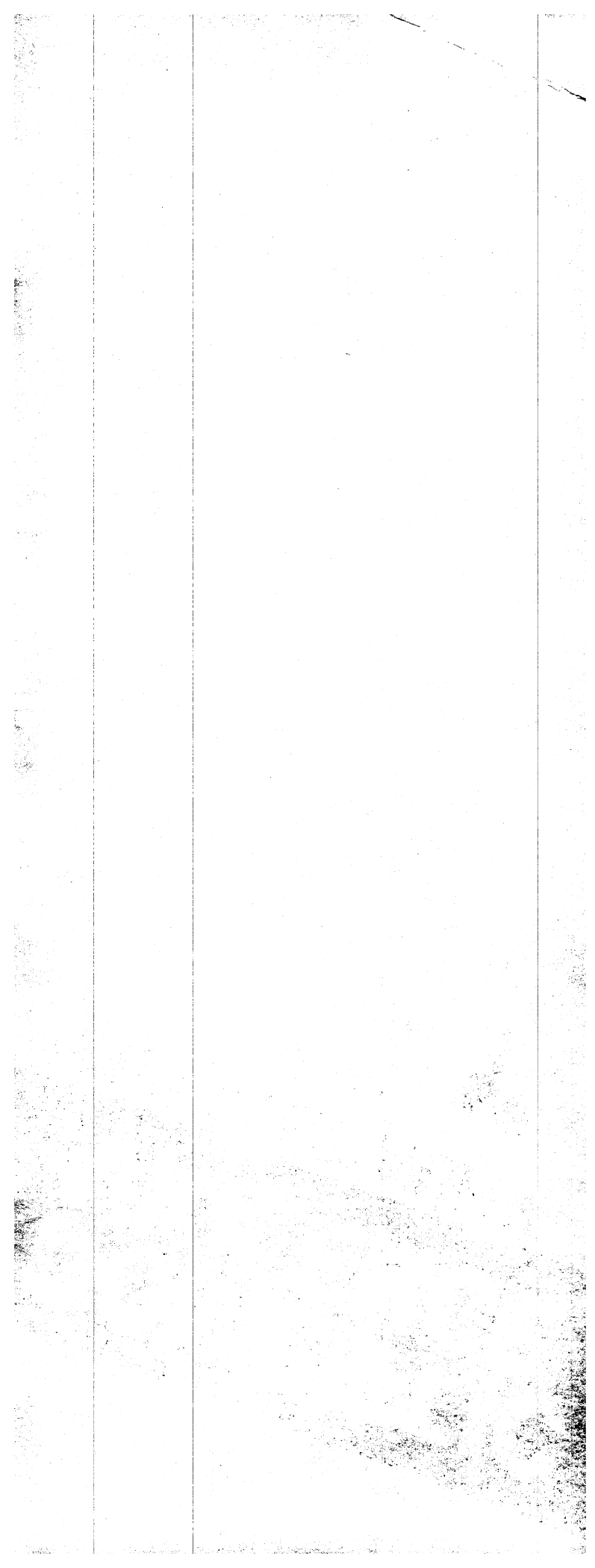

## FOREWORD

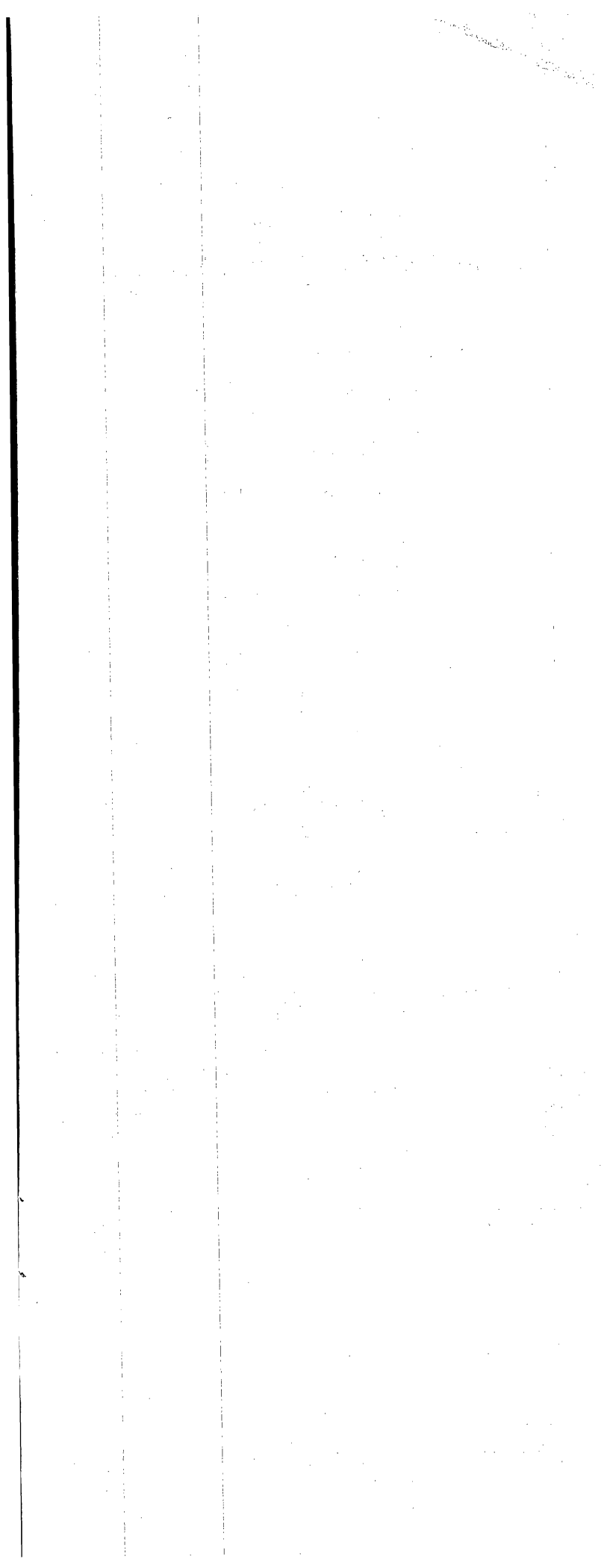

### NEW JERSEY DIVISION ON WOMEN

The NEW JERSEY DIVISION ON WOMEN within the Department of Community Affairs is the central permanent agency in New Jersey state government for the coordination of programs and services for women. The Division and its Advisory Commission on the Status of Women are the focus of a network of women's organizations statewide which work together to improve living and working conditions and the economic status of women.

### Domestic Violence Prevention Program

A major component of the Division is its Domestic Violence Prevention Program. With this Program, the Division works with the Administrative Office of the Courts and law enforcement personnel to ensure proper implementation of New Jersey's Prevention of Domestic Violence Act. This Program also conducts public awareness campaigns, and trains medical personnel, clergy and educators to address the needs of battered women.

The Program has as its goals --

- o Development and implementation of domestic violence awareness training programs for professionals in the educational, legal, medical, and religious fields;
- o Provision of public information and community outreach to enhance and support the efforts of domestic violence programs throughout New Jersey;
- o Evaluation, coordination, and promotion of legal protection and services to assist victims of domestic violence.

### BATTERED WOMEN'S SHELTER PROGRAMS/SUPPORT SERVICE PROGRAMS IN NEW JERSEY

Battered Women's Shelters and/or Support Service Programs for Women are in every county in New Jersey. They are multi-service agencies offering a variety of programs for battered women and their families. Agencies offering Battered Women's Shelter Programs provide legal advocacy, children's services, transportation, and financial advocacy. Support Services Programs are non-residential programs; however, a number offer access to emergency shelter through safe homes, motels, and/or neighboring shelters. Others offer some limited shelter in the immediate area of the program. A list of these agencies may be found in the Appendix.

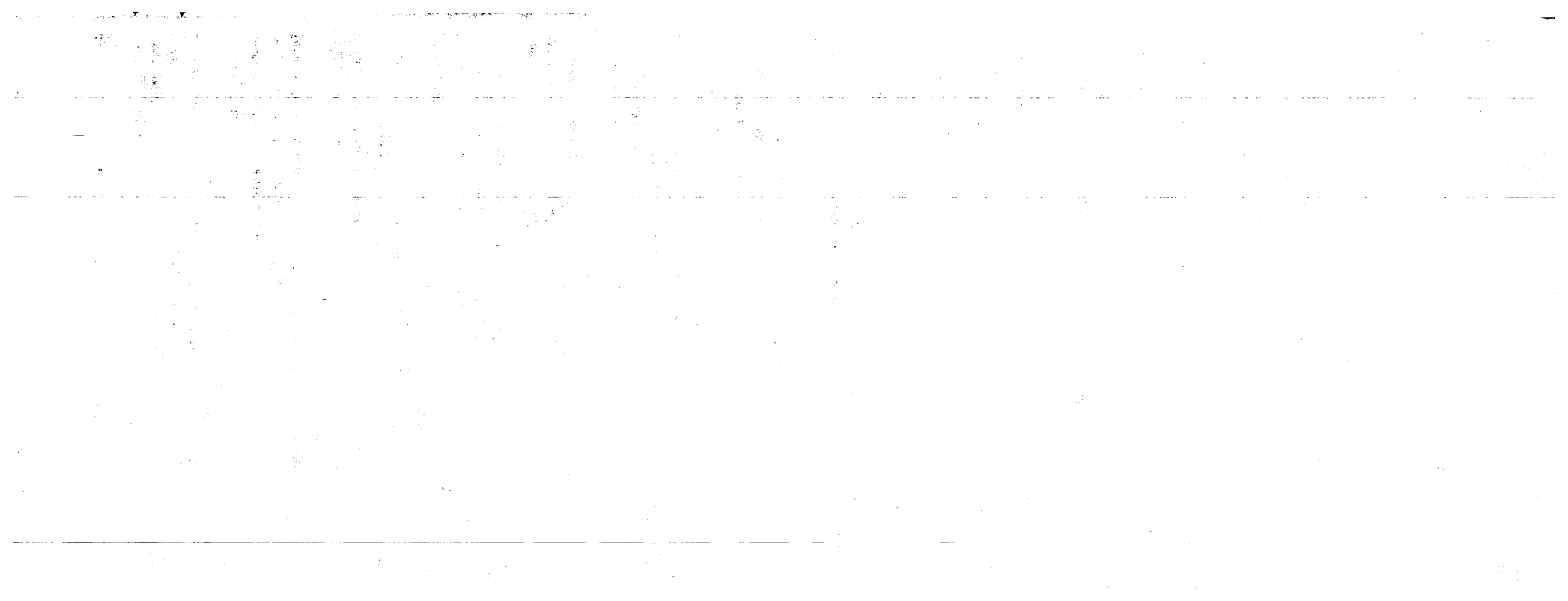
