NJ250 Exhibit: New Tour Dates for September

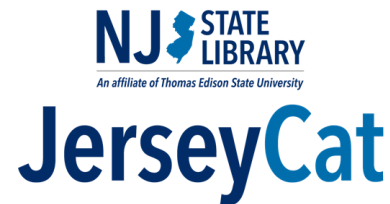
In our in-person exhibit, each of the three display cases represents a state Constitutional era and follows a different theme. Learn more about the documents on display [here](#).

Call for Reviewers – JerseyCat Procurement Committee

The New Jersey State Library currently seeks volunteers to serve on a JerseyCat Procurement Committee in 2026 and 2027.



JerseyCat, the free statewide interlibrary loan program comprised of services provided by Auto-Graphics, Inc., will be supported by New Jersey Library Network Funding and IMLS funding through June 2027. The JerseyCat Procurement committee will support the selection process for a statewide interlibrary loan vendor. This committee will operate from September 2026 through June 2027. Attendance at up to two virtual meetings per month will be expected.

Responsibilities of Committee Members will include:

- Appointment through June 2027
- Attendance at scheduled meetings
- Analysis of survey data collected in 2026
- Assistance with solicitation and evaluation of responses to the Request for Quotations
- Dissemination of information on Interlibrary Loan

LEAP iPad Classes - Fall 2026 Schedule

TBBC is taking registrations for the Fall 2026 round of iPad classes being offered as part of the Library Equal Access Program (LEAP). LEAP is a series of classes sponsored by the New Jersey Commission for the Blind and Visually Impaired (CBVI). These free classes teach individuals aged 55 and older who have a loss of vision how to use accessibility features on iPads, such as Siri and Voiceover. Classes are starting in September at several libraries throughout the state. iPads are available for participants to use in class, so owning one is not required to register. 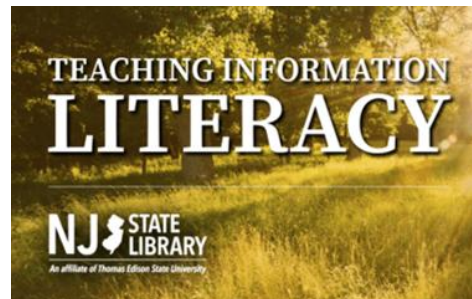


September Digital Skills Training User Group Meeting

The New Jersey Council for the Humanities is looking to partner with several new public libraries for its [Prime Time Family Reading program](#) in 2027.



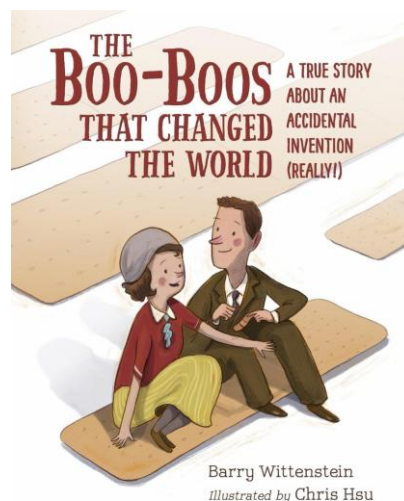
