Very High Performance is defined as being equal to or above the 80th percentile. High Performance is defined as being between the 60th and 79.9th percentiles. Average Performance is defined as being between the 40th and 59.9th percentiles. Lagging Performance is defined as being between the 20th and 39.9th percentiles. Significantly Lagging Performance is defined as being equal to or below the 19.9th percentile.

Peer Schools are schools that have similar grade levels and students with similar demographic characteristics, such as the percentage of students qualifying for Free/Reduced Lunch, Limited English Proficiency programs or Special Education programs.

Academic Achievement

This school outperforms 57% of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and 55% of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of Academic Achievement. Additionally, this school is meeting 88% of its performance targets in the area of Academic Achievement.

College and Career Readiness

This school outperforms 44% of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and 42% of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of College and Career Readiness. Additionally, this school is meeting 20% of its performance targets in the area of College and Career Readiness.

Graduation and Post-Secondary

This school outperforms 31% of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and 21% of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of Graduation and Post-Secondary. Additionally, this school is meeting 100% of its performance targets in the area of Graduation and Post-Secondary.

Academic Achievement measures the content knowledge students have in language arts literacy and math. For high schools, this includes measures of the school's proficiency rate on both the Language Arts Literacy and Math sections of the New Jersey High School Proficiency Assessment (HSPA). A proficiency rate is calculated by summing the count of students who scored either proficient or advanced proficient on the assessment and dividing by the count of valid test scores.

College and Career Readiness measures the degree to which students are demonstrating behaviors that are indicative of future attendance and/or success in college and careers. For high schools, this includes measures of participation in college readiness tests such as the SAT, ACT or PSAT and in rigorous coursework as defined by participation in AP or IB courses in English, math, social studies and science.

Graduation and Postsecondary measures the rate at which students who begin high school four years earlier graduate within four years. Also included is a measure of the rate at which students in a particular school drop out of school.



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
Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent

This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.



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



ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT






Proficiency Trends - Math

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COLLEGE AND CAREER READINESS

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Students in high schools begin to demonstrate college readiness behaviors long before they actually graduate from high school. 


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Scholastic Assessment Test (SAT) Results






Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent










NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03




NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03








Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent






Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup This graph presents the percentages of enrollment for each








NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03




NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03








Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent






Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup







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
NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03




NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03










Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent




Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup








NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03




NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03







Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent














NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 06




NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 06






