## REPORT.

STATE OF NEW JERSEY,  
OFFICE OF THE QUARTER MASTER GENERAL, }  
TRENTON, November 30, 1871.

*To His Excellency, Theodore F. Randolph, Governor of New Jersey:*

SIR:—I have the honor to lay before your Excellency my report, agreeably to the provisions of the act entitled “An Act for the organization of the National Guard, of the State of New Jersey.”

In the statements hereto annexed, will be found a full return of the clothing, camp and garrison equipage, and quartermaster's stores, baggage train, ordnance and ordnance stores in the State Arsenal, October 31, 1871: the number of arms cleaned and repaired; clothing, camp and garrison equipage, ordnance and ordnance stores turned into the Arsenal by disbanded and other military companies; camp and garrison equipage, ordnance and ordnance stores issued from the State Arsenal, and hospital supplies issued during the year.

Four newly organized companies of infantry have been supplied with arms, upon the officers giving the proper bonds, with sufficient surety, as provided for in the act, approved March 9, 1869. The arms in the possession of the National Guard, are in good order, and are kept under the proper responsibility.

There have been received during your administration, from the United States, on account of claims of this State for arming and equipping troops in the service thereof, under the act of Congress of the seventeenth of July, 1861, the sum of one hundred and forty-seven thousand eight hundred and two dollars and thirty-seven cents (\$147,802.37). Of this sum there was received during the past year the following amounts:

There is still suspended the sum of fifty thousand four hundred and ninety-one dollars and sixty-five cents (\$50,491.65). Of this, the

State still claims thirty-two thousand eight hundred and sixty-four dollars and ninety-three cents (\$32,864.93), as properly re-imbursible under the act of Congress, and it is believed that the reasons for the disallowances and suspensions can be removed by explanations from this Department, when it will be allowed and paid to the State.

I am happy to inform you that your wishes, repeatedly expressed to me, that the National Guard of this State should be armed with the improved breech-loading musket, at as early a period as practicable, will soon be gratified. The delay has been occasioned by a desire on our part to adopt the most improved plan of breech-loaders. The Ordnance Department at Washington will very soon be able to announce the model adopted for small arms, based upon the comparative merits from the experimental trials in the field of six of the most improved systems. The arm adopted by the State should, if possible, conform to those in the service of the troops of the United States. It is confidently believed that we will be enabled to re-arm the entire National Guard with the improved breech-loaders during the coming year.

In the appendix will be found the following statements :

Statement A, contains an account of clothing, camp and garrison equipage, quartermaster's stores, baggage train, ordnance and ordnance stores, serviceable and unserviceable, remaining on hand at the State Arsenal on the thirty-first of October, 1871.

Statement B, the number of arms cleaned and repaired at the State Arsenal during the year ending October 31, 1871.

Statement C, clothing, camp and garrison equipage, ordnance and ordnance stores, turned into the State Arsenal by disbanded and other military companies during the year ending October 31, 1871.

Statement D, camp and garrison equipage issued to the uniformed companies of this State, upon requisition, approved by Commandants of Corps to which said companies are attached, during the year ending October 31, 1871.

Statement E, ordnance and ordnance stores issued to the uniformed companies of this State, upon their giving bonds according to law, during the year ending October 31, 1871.

Statement F, hospital supplies issued from the State Arsenal, during the year ending October 31, 1871
