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






Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup
















Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup







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
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This graph presents the grade level outcomes the in categories of Advanced Proficient, Proficient, and Partially Proficient over the last four years.





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












Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup










